SHE'S A KEEPER: "HILL" TOPS IN KENTUCKY OAKS Keeper Hill (Deputy Minister), dismissed at 56-1 when she captured the GI Las Virgenes S. at Santa Anita in February, was top pick over 12 rivals in yesterday's GI Kentucky Oaks at Churchill Downs, and the 3-1 choice came through for the Oaks Day record crowd of 94,415. Checked while in traffic on the first turn, the bay was rated off the pace down the backstretch, but found running room between horses on the far turn and wore down 4-1 **Banshee Breeze** (Unbridled) in the final sixteenth to win it by a neck. "She got kind of rank down the backstretch," said winning jockey David Flores. "She was pulling me toward the front. At the quarter pole I had to wait for room, but after I got her in the clear, she was just wonderful. I hit her left-handed, and she really responded." Trainer Bobby Frankel was ecstatic with the victory. "This is next to the Japan Cup as my greatest thrill in racing," he said. "She looked great in the paddock today. I knew if she ran the way she looked, she was going to be a winner. She's really been doing well here. She's the easiest kind of filly to train. She does everything right. I'll probably go to New York with her for the Triple Tiara." (*Kentucky Oaks chart, p2*)

JIM BEAM TO BOW OUT? According to yesterday's *Lexington Herald Leader*, Jim Beam Brands Company may withdraw its sponsorship of the \$600,000 Jim Beam S. at Turfway Park. Turfway Chairman Jerry Carroll told the *Herald* that losing the sponsorship was "a possibility." Jim Beam Brands President Richard Reese, who took over the company last year, told the *Herald* that executives had yet to meet about the matter. Jim Beam has sponsored the race since 1981 and signed a three-year sponsorship deal in 1995.

ESPN: SPONGING INDICTMENTS NEAR According to a report on ESPN, after a year-long federal investigation a Louisville federal grand jury could hand down indictments by Monday in the Churchill Downs sponging cases. Law enforcement sources told ESPN the alleged perpetrator was "an industry insider with daily access to the horses and grounds." Possible federal charges involve tampering and interstate commerce, according to the network. Authorities have said they believed the sponging incidents began in the spring of 1996, with as many as 10 horses in seven different races involved.

Winner of the GI Las Virgenes at 56-1 February 15 for her first dirt score, Keeper Hill was 5-2 when second in the GI Santa Anita Oaks in her latest March 15. Coming off a short break as the slight choice, the Kentucky-bred was in tight quarters on the first turn, but pulled jockey David Flores into contention on the far turn, splitting horses to join the leaders in the stretch and running past Banshee Breeze late to take the photo. "She ran a very nice race," said trainer Bobby Frankel. "She made a big move around the turn. She's a wonderful filly." Jockey Jerry Bailey, aboard the runner-up, said, "I had a lot of horse left, but she tends to wait for other horses." The winner will head to Belmont Park for the Triple Tiara--the GI Acorn S. June 7, GI Mother Goose S. June 27 and GI Coaching Club American Oaks July 25.

Escena, winner of the GI Apple Blossom H. in her last outing April 10, made it two in a row here as the overwhelming 3-5 favorite. Ridden for the sixth straight time by Jerry Bailey, the 1997 Breeders' Cup Distaff third-place finisher settled in just behind the leaders early, closed ground on the second turn, took command entering the stretch and drew off for an easy victory. "Everything unfolded well," said trainer Bill Mott. "The speed horses went right to the front and Jerry was able to settle the filly behind the speed. There wasn't a straw in her path. She gained confidence the farther she went."

AMERICA'S DAY AT THE RACES TO RETURN

The Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association yesterday announced that *America's Day at the Races* will be back for 1998, with Del Mar, Philadelphia Park and River Downs hosting the featured Coast-to-Coast Triple. The three legs of the pick-three wager will be the GII Del Mar Derby, GIII Pennsylvania Derby and the Miller Genuine Draft Cradle S. *America's Day 1998*, set for Labor Day, Monday, September 7, will also have additional support from the Jockeys' Guild, which has designated the event as the Guild's annual day of donations to equine research. Guild members nationwide will be making contributions to the Grayson-Jockey Club Equine Research Foundation. "After last year's successful launch of *America's Day at the Races*, we are looking forward to an even better 1998 event," said TOBA President Drew Couto. "In 1997, participating race-tracks saw material gains in both attendance and handle, and many reported that family participation at the track was also higher for *America's Day*. Those are the kinds of trends racing needs. *America's Day* has proven it brings people to the races and, as a result, more tracks and industry organizations are jumping on board this year."
