FANFRELUCHE THIEF CHARGED IN

SPONGING CASES According to published reports, William Michael McCandless, who was convicted of abducting the champion mare Fanfreluche in 1977, has been indicted on six felony counts in connection with the "sponging" of horses in Kentucky in 1996-97. McCandless, 51, a resident of Tennessee, is suspected of tampering with horses in three races at Churchill Downs (the fourth on May 30, 1996, the fourth on June 8, 1997 and the first on June 14, 1997), inserting sponges into the nasal passages of runners to "gain an advantage in gambling on the outcome of the races," the indictment said. McCandless, also charged with three counts of wire fraud because those races were simulcast out of state, could face a maximum 30-year jail sentence and up to \$1.5 million in fines if he is found guilty.

TAMPA BAY DOWNS CLOSES RECORD MEET

The 1998 Tampa Bay Downs season which ended Sunday set a combined mutuel handle record of \$108,208,659, up 46 percent from a year ago. It marked the fourth straight year that the Florida oval had established new handle records. The dramatic increase was credited to the track's expanding simulcast network. Daily average handle was \$1,189,106, up 39 percent over 1997. The highest single-day combined handle record was set January 6, when \$3,155,905 was wagered. On-track wagering remained steady, averaging \$258,785 daily. Purses at the track also reached record levels, with the daily average distribution at \$74,513, up 20 percent from last year. Total purses for the meet were \$6,780,713, an increase of 26 percent. The number of starters per race was 9.2, up 2.67 percent. Attendance for the 91-day meet was 302,621, with the second-largest crowd in track history witnessing the unveiling of the new turf course May 2. A total of 8,669 fans were on hand for the inaugural Tampa Bay Turf H., won by **Ship Liner** (Dawn Quixote). Joseph Cesarini led all trainers with 33 wins; Jesse Garcia was top jockey with 63 victories. Live racing will return to Tampa Bay Downs December 19.

Mejiro Bright (Jpn) was looking for his fourth straight graded stakes triumph after capturing the G2 Stayers S. last November and the G2 American Jockey Club Cup and March 22 G2 Hanshin Daishoten in two starts this year. The bay colt raced sixth after a slow start, but unleashed his bid four furlongs from the wire to take control in deep stretch and draw off to the wire. "The colt could not get a clear break, so we raced with (favored) **SILK JUSTICE (JPN)** (Brian's Time) in our sights," explained winning rider Hiroshi Kawachi. "After I asked him and switched him to the outside, he responded immediately and the race was ours." The expected duel between Silk Justice and Mejiro Bright did not develop as the favorite tired in the stretch and finished fourth.

JAPAN BECKONS MIGHT AND POWER

Autumn racing climaxed with frontrunner **Might And Power (NZ)**'s (Zabeel {NZ}) demoralising 10-1/2 length Queen Elizabeth S. win April 25 and the big question now is whether he might target the Japan Cup. The crushing score was his fourth Group 1 win and, amazingly, jockey Brian York maintained the four-year-old had "plenty more to spare."

His ability to lead makes him a formidable Japan Cup prospect. But trainer Jack Denham has his heart set on Australia's Cox Plate in late October and the race obviously clashes with Japan's prestigious invitation-only event. "The Cox Plate is our aim at this stage and we haven't looked any further than that," owner Nick Moraitis said.

Jockey Jim Cassidy, who rode **Might And Power** to win last year's Caulfield-Melbourne Cups double, says: "He made the Queen Elizabeth a chase, not a race. He's world class. The Japan Cup is not beyond him. If he gets to Japan, boy, look out."


Might And Power is expected to run in the G2 Hollindale Cup at the Gold Coast on May 13 en route to the G1 Doomben Cup 10 days later in Brisbane.



STONE LODGE DEAL MEANS BROODMARE BOOST

Dynamic former stockbroker John Messara, who heads publicly-listed Hunter Valley Stud Arrowfield, returns from the U.S. this week, where he has been engaged in talks with Stone Lodge principal, New York industrial investor George Hofmeister. Messara forged a strong association with Coolmore which lasted until three years ago, when a custody dispute over Danehill combined with Arrowfield's growing desire to have sires from other studs such as Brocco join its roster, saw Coolmore and Arrowfield cut ties.

There seems little doubt this industry visionary has been instrumental in Stone Lodge's entry into the Southern Hemisphere. Messara believes importing up to 100 northern-bred mares will address an imbalance in southern hemisphere breeding--top heavy with world-class sires but lacking quality mares.

"This is absolutely, desperately needed, and I've convinced this group this is what we want. It is no good asking us to stand more stallions if they are not going to support it with high-quality mares," Messara said before leaving Sydney. "Segenhoe has great capacity, it is only three kilometers from Arrowfield and it will run as a sister stud to Arrowfield. We'll develop an imposing stallion roster. Stone Lodge, together with Arrowfield and Wakefield Stud to some extent, as they've just signed a strategic alliance with us, will have a strong punching power in the stallion market worldwide. Between all of these farms there is quite a strong broodmare strand and the financial clout to, between us, tie up some very nice stallions."



ALL EYES ON DEHERE

First-season sire **Dehere** (Deputy Minister), 7, is poised for success with his progeny exceptionally well-received at Sydney's recent Easter sale. One of 13 freshman sires represented, Dehere was among five who averaged over \$100,000 Australian (\$64,683) with his 24 lots averaging a respectable \$129,271 Australian (\$83,616). International cricketer turned bloodstock agent Simon O'Donnell gave \$315,000 Australian (\$203,752) for Dehere's top-priced lot, a filly from Seattle Dancer mare Serene Look (NZ) who is related to Al Hareb (El Gran Senor), a Group 1 winner in England. The Coolmore shuttle sire will be located at Coolmore this season after Segenhoe's takeover.

"He is the only horse I believe could seriously threaten Danehill," said Coolmore spokesman James Bester. "Especially with his two-year-olds, they generated so much excitement at the (U.S.) breeze-ups. I have never seen a stallion whose progeny so consistently had racehorse stamped all over them and his breeze-up juveniles exuded quality, power and speed. I'm his number one fan."

Dehere is currently at Coolmore's Kentucky base, Ashford Stud, where he is standing for \$40,000 U.S. His southern fee is \$25,000 Australian (\$16,170).

"He'll have his first racehorses anytime now. He's the one to watch," said Bester.

"QUEST" PAYS OFF

Woodlands Stud, the Hunter Valley nursery owned by "Chicken Kings" Jack and Bob Ingham, took a punt in early 1993 acquiring a half-share in 11-year-old **Quest For Fame (GB)** (Rainbow Quest). It paid off with second crop member Dracula (Aus)'s recent G1 Champagne S. win coinciding with an upsurge in demand for Quest For Fame, who will stand for \$25,000 Australian (\$16,170) this season.

"He was not originally that popular when he came to Australia," said Woodlands bloodstock manager Trevor Lobb, "but we were always happy with him, and he is backed up now by a lot of quality racehorses."

The 1990 English Derby winner recorded a U.S. Grade I win in the Hollywood Turf H. and was twice placed in the Breeders' Cup Turf. Woodlands entered into a 50-50 partnership with Quest For Fame's owner-breeder Khalid Abdullah and the horse shuttles to Juddmonte in Kentucky. In his first season here Quest For Fame covered 66 mares, but half were home mares so his \$15,000 Australian (\$9,702) fee was lowered to \$10,000 Australian (\$6,468) for his second season. He was bred to 44, again largely home mares. But breeders took notice when Noise (Aus)--a horse Inghams' trainer John Hawkes believes is good enough to contest the Australia's weight-for-age championship, the W.S. Cox Plate in Melbourne in October--was runner-up to multiple Group 1 winner Encounter (Aus) in the Listed AJC Breeders Plate and Hockney (Aus) won the Listed AJC Canonbury S. Their efforts were backed up with stakes-winning filly Salty (Aus), who tragically had to be destroyed after a track accident, and consistent efforts from other runners before Dracula, who has raced seven times for four wins, claimed the Champagne S.

"His book is just about full, he's been very, very sought after," said Lobb.

Quest For Fame has 109 named progeny with 51 starters, 27 winners including nine stakes winners and three stakes-placed.

"All his horses are really high quality and he leaves his stamp on them all," mused Hawkes. "They are good two-year-olds, three-year-olds and four-year-olds and they'll get better."
