DERBY CHAMP DRAWS OUTSIDE IN PREAKNESS

Kentucky Derby winner **Real Quiet** (Quiet American) will break from post 11 as he attempts to win the second leg of the Triple Crown in Saturday's GI Preakness S. at Pimlico. With none of the hiccups that plagued the Kentucky Derby draw, Real Quiet was assigned the number 11 in a blind draw to determine the order in which connections would pick post positions. After everyone else had chosen their post, the outside hole was all that was left the Derby winner. Real Quiet was installed the 5-2 second choice in the morning line. **Coronado's Quest** (Forty Niner) will break from the number four post after his connections drew the number one choice. The GII Wood Memorial winner was made the 2-1 morning line favorite for the race. In explaining the decision, the colt's owner Stuart Janney III said, "(Trainer) Shug (McGaughey) and (rider) Mike Smith worked it out that each would tell the other what they wanted. They both wanted four." Connections of Derby runner-up **Victory Gallop** (Cryptoclearance), unlucky in the Derby draw, were again forced to pick late in the proceedings. After trainer Elliot Walden had chosen post position 10, he stoically said, "It's just something we can't control."

STEPHEN FOSTER NEXT FOR SILVER CHARM

Last year's three-year-old champion and Kentucky Derby winner **Silver Charm** (Silver Buck), who has not raced since winning the \$4 million Dubai World Cup March 28, will point for the June 13 GII Stephen Foster H. at Churchill Downs as his next start, according to trainer Bob Baffert. Churchill Downs management unveiled a purse boost for the nine-furlong race for three-year-olds and up in conjunction with the announcement. The Stephen Foster H. had been scheduled to carry a purse of \$500,000-added this year; it has now been raised to \$750,000-added. "I talked with (owner Bob) Lewis and he agrees that the Stephen Foster will be a perfect spot for Silver Charm to return to competition and that seeing him run under the twin spires of Churchill Downs once again will be great for racing," said Baffert. The purse increase for the race makes it the second-richest race on the Churchill schedule, behind only the \$1 million Derby. The race will be the highlight of Churchill's first 'Kentucky Derby Alumni Day,' with tributes to Derby winners and appearances by jockeys and trainers who have won the race over the years. Vice President, Racing, Don Richardson said, "This new commitment to the Stephen Foster will attract many of racing's brightest older stars to our track and this race each spring."

HALORY HUNTER RECOVERING Celtic Pride Stable's Halory Hunter (Jade Hunter) was recovering at New Bolton Center Wednesday after undergoing surgery Tuesday to repair a fractured left fetlock. Dr. Dan Dreyfuss, checking in on his patient via phone yesterday morning, reported Halory Hunter was, "bright, standing on his broken leg and looking out the window." Dreyfuss added, "He's much more comfortable even now than after the surgery. From that aspect, he's a bit ahead of schedule. It usually takes 24 to 36 hours." Halory Hunter, winner of the GII Toyota Blue Grass and fourth in the Kentucky Derby, suffered the injury at the end of a Tuesday work over a sloppy Pimlico track in preparation for Saturday's Preakness.

ST. JOVITE FILLY TOPS BARRETT'S TUESDAY

The filly **Sweetness Follows** (St. Jovite--Spring Innocence, by Sharpen Up {GB}) brought a final bid of \$150,000 from Stephan Herold to top Tuesday's final session of the Barretts Spring Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training in Pomona, California. The dark bay two-year-old was consigned by Sequel Bloodstock, Inc., Becky Thomas, agent. During the second session, 117 two-year-olds sold for a total of \$3,368,400 and an average of \$28,790. In all, 168 horses sold for an aggregate of \$4,827,400. At last year's sale, 194 horses grossed \$6,718,500. The sale average of \$28,735 decreased 17 percent from last year's figure of \$34,631. The median price declined 13 percent from \$23,000 in 1997 to \$20,000 this year.

HOLLYWOOD CANCELS RACING Hollywood Park canceled its live racing card yesterday due to inclement weather. Racing will continue today with a first post time of 1 p.m. "The track was fine for training this morning," said General Manager Eual G. Wyatt, Jr. "Before the races we tried to turn it over and air it out. That turned out to be a mistake because we got caught by the second storm and ran out of time. With the cancellation we have ample time to work the track and we will have an excellent surface tomorrow." More than an inch of rain fell in the area Tuesday night and early Wednesday.

CORONADO'S QUEST WORKS GII Wood Memorial S. winner **Coronado's Quest** (Forty Niner) worked a half mile in :49 3/5 yesterday at Belmont Park in preparation for Saturday's GI Preakness S, with a first quarter in :25 1/5 and galloped out in 1:02 3/5. "He was very relaxed out there and there was a lot of traffic," said McGaughey. "The track was a little heavy and he had the exercise rider up (Adolph Krajewski), so it was a good move." McGaughey said the colt would ship down to Pimlico from New York Saturday morning. "I want to keep him away from that zoo down there and I want to keep away from it, too," McGaughey explained.

SPARTAN CAT & HOT WELLS TUNE UP

Spartan Cat (Mountain Cat) worked five furlongs Wednesday at Laurel in 1:06. "He's never done much in his morning works," said trainer Dick Dutrow. "Time means nothing at all in his case." Also working yesterday, **Hot Wells** (Go and Go {Ire}) went four furlongs in :51 3/5 and galloped out in 1:06 with jockey Edgar Prado up at Pimlico. "The track is real greasy," Prado explained. "We didn't want to push him too much."

Owner Michael Tabor and trainer Aidan O'Brien were non-committal about Saratoga Springs taking his chance in the G1 Vodafone Derby at Epsom June 6 after their colt became the first Irish-trained winner of this highly regarded Derby trial. "We have three horses (possible for) the Derby--King Of Kings (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), Second Empire (Ire) (Fairy King) and Saratoga Springs--and any of them might run," said Tabor. Bookmakers were at variance as to how to bet on the Derby, with some quoting Saratoga Springs at 4-1 and others at 8-1, with the Godolphin filly Cape Verdi now at odds of 9-4, if she were to run. Saratoga Springs took command here with 100 yards to run and won more easily than the official margin suggests. "He's done well, but there's definitely more to come from him," said O'Brien. Said rider Michael Kinane, "If he turns up at Epsom, I'd like to ride him." With the win, Saratoga Springs, never off the board, brought his record to five wins in eight starts. Godolphin's racing manager Simon Crisford said City Honours, making his first start of the season, "definitely goes for the Derby." Border Arrow is also expected to head for Epsom, according to trainer Ian Balding. Trainer Henry Cecil said he would leave a Derby decision to Dr Fong's owners, the Thoroughbred Corp. "I thought he ran very well," said Cecil. "He'll be better on faster ground and over a mile and a half. And he should come on for the race."

Maple was voted the winner of the award by racing fans, jockeys around the country and members of the press. The honor is presented annually in memory of the rider killed in a spill at Belmont Park in 1988 to a jockey who exemplifies "extraordinary sportsmanship and citizenship."

The winner of her last three starts by a combined 17 lengths, Jersey Girl is now four-for-four in 1998, having rolled through a Gulfstream allowance, the GIII Cicada S. at Aqueduct and the New York Stallion Series April 19 in her last start. Nonetheless, she was overshadowed in the pre-race wagering here by last year's two-year-old champion filly and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner, Countess Diana, who was making her three-year-old debut and first start for trainer Bill Mott. Showing speed inside coming away from the gate, Jersey Girl laid down fast fractions of :21.75, :44.62 and 1:09.35 while increasing her lead at each of those calls. Turning for home three in front, she was kept to her task in a driving victory. The 3-5 favorite, Countess Diana, making her first start in six months after undergoing surgery to remove a chip in her right knee, stumbled at the start and was last in the field of four in the early going, but closed on the rail to be second. "I was a bit concerned drawing inside and spotting the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner three pounds," said winning trainer Todd Pletcher. "Countess Diana is obviously a top filly, but I thought we might have an edge with more recent activity." Pletcher indicated the GI Acorn June 7 at Belmont would be next. Said Mott of the beaten favorite, "This was her first start in some time, so I'm just glad to see that she ran a good race and that she put in a good effort, even considering that she stumbled at the start." Mott said the Acorn would also be next for his filly.
