WILL'S WAY RETIRED *Will's Way* (Easy Goer), winner of the 1996 GI Travers and 1997 GI Whitney, has been retired from racing and will enter stud for the 1999 breeding season. Will's Way suffered a condylar fracture of the left front leg when third in the '97 GI Woodward S. and, while training towards a comeback, incurred an unrelated suspensory injury in the same leg. "If they gave Eclipse Awards for courage, Will's Way would have won them the past two years," said trainer H. James Bond. "But heart alone doesn't win the Travers and Whitney back-to-back. This horse is all class." Will's Way earned \$956,400 from six wins in 13 starts.

REAL QUIET BACK ON TRACK Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner *Real Quiet* (Quiet American) returned to the track yesterday for the first time since his Preakness win. The colt, who will try to become the first Triple Crown winner in 20 years in the June 6 GI Belmont S., galloped 1 1/4 miles over Churchill's fast track. "We just gave him an easy gallop out there on his first day back," said trainer Bob Baffert. "If we keep him happy and fresh, we'll be ready to roll."

CORONADO'S QUEST TO RIVA RIDGE Trainer Shug McGaughey announced yesterday that his talented three-year-old *Coronado's Quest* (Forty Niner) will miss the June 6 GI Belmont S. and will run instead in the seven-furlong GII Riva Ridge S. on the Belmont undercard. The colt was forced to miss the Preakness with a bruised foot which left him with too little time to prepare for his next target, Monday's GI Met Mile. "He is 100-percent sound; that part of it is over," McGaughey said after *Coronado's Quest* galloped a mile over Belmont's main track yesterday. "I could probably have him fit enough to run in the Belmont S., but I think it would take too much out of him to try to make that race just off of works." *Coronado's Quest's* current schedule includes the July 12 GII Dwyer, Monmouth's August 9 GI Haskell Invitational and the August 29 GI Travers.

Blinkered for the first time in his career, Loup Sauvage returned to winning ways when running out a most impressive victor here. Having his first success in Group One company, Loup Sauvage took his career record to four wins from 10 lifetime starts. HIGHEST HIGH (GB) (Highest Honor {Fr}), acting as pacemaker for stable-mate Marathon, cut out strong early fractions. As the field swung into the top of the stretch he came off the rail, allowing Marathon to challenge from the inside as Astarabad came on the outer. Loup Sauvage, third in this year's Dubai World Cup, was traveling well midfield with jockey Olivier Peslier still sitting tight as Astarabad struck the front with three-sixteenths to go, but he was only leading on sufferance for as soon as Peslier let out an inch of rein, Loup Sauvage displayed instant acceleration to win going away. Alec Wildenstein, son of winning owner Daniel, commented, "The last race against Marathon came just a bit too soon after his run in the Dubai World Cup. He was in the lead too long that day, but the tactics were right here. He is a much better four-year-old than he was at three and he could have one more run now before we put him away for the Arc and America in the autumn. The horse will tell us if he needs a run. We aim to follow a similar programme to Arcangues (Fr), who won the Breeders' Cup Classic for us in 1993, the only difference being Loup Sauvage will not start at 133-1." Loup Sauvage may next run in the the G1 Coral Eclipse S. at Sandown, England, July 4. FAHRIS (IRE) (Generous {Ire}) missed the race due to a bruised foot.

The retirement ceremony for America's oldest active retired Thoroughbred, 16-year-old Playing Politics, on Mass'Cap day, May 30, at Suffolk Downs, will be held to raise awareness for the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation, a non-profit organization which provides dignified homes for racehorses without other retirement options. Owner/trainer Richard Fruzzetti plans to retire Playing Politics to his farm in East Bridgewater, Massachusetts, but agreed to bring the gelding out for the day's festivities to raise awareness of the plight of other retirees without homes. "Playing Politics happens to have a home, but there are so many racehorses with nowhere to go when they retire," said Fruzzetti. "If bringing him to Suffolk can help to raise the money to provide a home for even one horse, it will be worth it." Said TRF founder and president Monique Koehler, "I was happy and touched when I read that Mr. Fruzzetti had thought of us when he decided to retire Playing Politics. We're thankful that he's giving Playing Politics a home where he will be happy and comfortable. We're also very grateful that he is bringing him to Suffolk Downs for a public retirement to give exposure to the Foundation's cause and to call attention to the plight of horses who aren't so lucky." Playing Politics will be paraded down the Suffolk stretch before receiving gift presentations from representatives from the racing industry, Suffolk Downs and the TRF in a ceremony in the winner's circle. GI Belmont S. winner **Touch Gold** (Deputy Minister) worked four furlongs yesterday in :52 over a fast Churchill track. "We're bringing him along slowly and gradually," commented new trainer Pat Byrne. "As we get further along with the program, we'll pick up the pace a little bit." The four-year-old is being aimed for the GI Whitney at Saratoga August 8.

Veteran trainer William "Jenks" Fires is donating his 19-year-old Thoroughbred pony Sleepy to the Ohio County Special Olympics for use in the Beaver Dam, Kentucky organization's riding program for special needs children. "Even at his age, he still gets around as good as a four-year-old," said Fires. "This new home with the kids of the Special Olympics will be good for him and he'll be a good horse for them." Although unraced himself, Sleepy led the great John Henry to the post in the Hall of Fame runner's legendary photo-finish victory over The Bart in the first Arlington Million in 1981 and he served as pony during training for 1997 Derby third-place finisher Free House. Three members of the Special Olympics group will travel to Churchill Downs to accept Sleepy on Friday and they will also get an up-close look at Bob Baffert's Kentucky Derby winning duo of Silver Charm and Real Quiet during the visit.
