**CAPE VERDI TO EPSOM DERBY** Godolphin's G1 Sagitta 1,000 Guineas heroine **Cape Verdi (Ire)** (Caerleon) will be supplemented to the G1 Vodafone Epsom Derby June 6, it was confirmed yesterday. Supplementary entries close Saturday at a cost of \$125,208. "Cape Verdi will be supplemented for the Epsom Derby on Saturday and is an intended runner, provided the ground at Epsom is safe," said Godolphin's racing manager, Simon Crisford. "Frankie Dettori will ride her and John Reid will partner our other runner, **City Honours (Darshaan {GB})**." Cape Verdi, now posted as the 2-1 favorite by leading bookmakers, will attempt to become the first filly since Fifiella in 1916 to win Britain's premier classic. It was also announced that Michael Tabor's May 13 G2 Grosvenor Casinos Dante S. winner **Saratoga Springs (El Gran Senor)**, a probable for Sunday's G1 Prix du Jockey Club (French Derby) at Chantilly, may also join stable companion and G1 Sagitta 2,000 Guineas hero **King of Kings (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) in the Vodafone Derby six days later. Tabor's charges are listed at 8-1 and 5-1, respectively. Newmarket trainer Geoffrey Wragg confirmed that Mollers Racing's G3 Chester Vase winner **Gulland (GB)** (Unfuwain) will also take his chance in the race. Wragg, concerned about the state of the going at Epsom, had considered re-routing the colt to Sunday's French Derby. However, after walking Epsom Tuesday, he said of the track and of his 8-1 charge, "It is genuine good ground at Epsom and unsettled weather is forecast, so the decision has been made that Gulland will go to Epsom." Another longshot set to run is Prince Fahd Salman's G3 Thresher Classic Trial winner **Courteous (GB)** (Generous {Ire}), who had been a possible for Sunday's French Derby.

**SURGERY FOR RUBIYAT** Multiple graded stakes-placed **Rubiyat (Rubiano)**, second in Sunday's GII Peter Pan S. at Belmont, underwent surgery earlier this week to remove a chip from his left front knee, according to his trainer, Scotty Schulhofer. Schulhofer said the three-year-old colt, a winner of two of six starts and second in the GII Withers S. in his previous start, would return to the races in the fall.

**Saturday, June 6, Belmont Park:**

**BELMONT S.-GI, \$1,000,000, 3yo, 1 1/2m**

**Raffie's Majesty** (Cormorant) worked a mile in 1:37 yesterday morning over Belmont Park's main track. The move came in company with stablemate Behrens (Pleasant Colony), who turned in a time of 1:38. "There are not many three-year-olds around that can get (the Belmont Stakes) distance," said trainer H. James Bond of Raffie's Majesty. "I know this horse will. I've believed in him from the start." The New York-bred, who has made just four lifetime starts, was second in the GIII Flamingo and fourth in the GII Illinois Derby in his last start. Jorge Chavez will be aboard for the Belmont.

**Hanuman Highway (Ire)** (Alzao) worked a mile in 1:38 2/5 under jockey Jose Santos on Belmont's main track. Trainer Kathy Walsh, who scratched the Arkansas Derby runner-up from Sunday's GII Peter Pan when she detected heat in the inside quarter of his right front foot, said she would reserve decision on the Belmont, mentioning the June 14 GIII Hill Prince at 1 1/8 miles on the turf as another option.

Probable Milady Breeders' Cup favorite **I Ain't Bluffing** (Pine Bluff) breezed five furlongs in 1:01 1/5 Tuesday at Hollywood Park. The four-year-old Louisiana-bred filly won the GII Hawthorne H. over the Milady course and distance in her most recent start May 3. **Toda Una Dama (Arg)** (Cipayo {Arg}), winner of the GI Santa Margarita H. March 8, will miss the Milady due to a minor ailment, trainer Ron McAnally said yesterday. Doubtful for the Grade I event is MSW **Corona Lake** (Storm Cat), who tied up following a recent workout, according to assistant trainer Gary Mandella.

### Local News, Belmont Park:

The 1997 Horse of the Year **Favorite Trick** (Phone Trick) breezed three furlongs in :37 4/5 on Belmont's main track Monday morning. Trainer Bill Mott said the colt's next start would likely come in the \$150,000 GII Dwyer S. July 12 at 1 1/8 miles.

**Keeper Hill** (Deputy Minister), victorious in the GI Kentucky Oaks in her last outing May 1, will make her next start in the GI Acorn S. at Belmont June 7. The three-year-old filly breezed five furlongs in 1:02 4/5 Tuesday at Hollywood Park in preparation for the \$150,000 event.

Jockey Kent Desormeaux will have a busy schedule Belmont Stakes week, beginning Monday with an appearance on The Tonight Show with Jay Leno. He is also scheduled to ring the bell to open the New York Stock Exchange Thursday and to throw out the first pitch at Yankee Stadium Friday night.

## WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

### PEDIGREE SHORTS...

With a record-breaking win in Monday's Kentucky Breeders' Cup S., **Yes It's True** (c, 2, **Is It True--Clever Monique**, by **Clever Trick**) assumed early leadership of the two-year-old division. Since he is by a son of Raja Baba out of a Clever Trick mare, Yes It's True is bred on the reverse of a very successful cross, Clever Trick and his son Phone Trick having each sired a pair of stakes winners out of Raja Baba-line mares. This affinity may stem from the pedigree links between Missy Baba (dam of Raja Baba) and Golden Beach (granddam of Clever Trick). Both are by sons of Djebel and their second dams are five-eighths relatives. Yes It's True's sire, Is It True, is actually linebred to Djebel, each time in combination with Nasrullah (the sources being his sire, Raja Baba, and Never Bend). Yes It's True's dam, Clever Monique, supplements this with the previously mentioned extra cross of Djebel and a daughter strain of Nasrullah. Clever Monique has been bred back to Is It True, so it will be interesting to see if the combination can work again.

We have recently mentioned the disproportionate degree of success which some stallions achieve when bred to mares which give them duplications of their broodmare sires. There is another example of the pattern in the pedigree of Monday's Westchester S. winner **Sea Twister** (c, 2, **Ghazi--Society Doon**, by **Imp Society**). The first stakes winner from the first crop by his freshman sire, Sea Twister is inbred 3x4 to Damascus, the broodmare sire of Ghazi. Similarly, the first winner for another freshman sire, Dehere, **Arrested Dreams** (f, 2, **Dehere--Moment to Buy**, by **Timeless Moment**), has Damascus 4x3. Meanwhile, another recent stakes winner to benefit from inbreeding to the broodmare sire of the sire is **Saylo** (c, 4, **Oraibi--Mayan Dancer**, by **Al Nasr {Fr}**), winner of the Victoria Day H. at Hastings Park May 18. Only the second stakes winner for his sire, who is out of a Northern Dancer mare, Saylo has Northern Dancer 3x4.

Young English sire Deploy is half-brother to dual Derby winner Commander In Chief (by Dancing Brave), so what could be more logical than reversing the cross by sending Dancing Brave mares to Deploy? Logic paid off over the weekend when **Zomaradah (GB) (Deploy {GB}--Jawaher {Ire}, by Dancing Brave)** won the Oaks d'Italia to become Deploy's first Group One winner. Incidentally, Mons, the only other Group winner sired by Deploy, is out of a mare by Dancing Brave's sire, Lyphard.

We wonder if the victory by **Prime Meridian** (c, 3, **The Prime Minister--Watch the Time**, by **Timeless Moment**) in Sunday's \$150,000 Texas Turf Challenge is another pointer to an up-and-coming cross, that of Vice Regent and Damascus. The cross of Vice Regent over Damascus-line mares has been outperforming opportunity, examples including graded stakes winners Salty Perfume and Stolen Beauty. There is less chance for the reverse cross, but it has already produced the ill-fated Time Limit (by Gilded Time out of a Vice Regent mare).

# WRITERS UP

## SILVER ANNIVERSARY (Part 3)

On the 25th anniversary of Secretariat's Triple Crown, the *Thoroughbred Daily News* concludes a three-part interview with his trainer, Lucien Laurin. At 86, the Canadian-born trainer is recovering from a heart attack in his South Florida home. (Editor's Note: Laurin has seen Real Quiet's victories in the Kentucky Derby and Preakness on TV at home and said, "I think he's going to do it. I think he has a real chance of winning the Triple Crown. I'm feeling a lot better and wish I could be at Belmont to see him win.")

*TDN: In 1973, it had been 25 years since Citation won the Triple Crown. After Secretariat won the Kentucky Derby and Preakness, was there any doubt in your mind that he wouldn't win the Belmont?*

LL: Oh, no. No way. I didn't think he'd get beat. There was no doubt in my mind--nobody could beat him. In the Belmont there were only six horses. In the other races there were more horses taking a shot at him. I was very, very confident.

*TDN: What do you remember about Belmont Day?*

LL: I told Ronnie (Turcotte, Secretariat's jockey) to go to the lead. I said, "Sit on him. Just leave him alone. Take a long hold, just like Shoemaker does. Leave him alone. If he gets beat, I won't blame you." Mrs. (Penny) Tweedy (Secretariat's owner) was there too. I said, "The idea of taking him back and fighting him, that's the way he got beat (in the Wood Memorial). I don't want that any more. If he gets beat, you won't be blamed. Just sit on him, take a long hold, I want him on the lead all the way. And I hope to God he gets to the wire."

*TDN: What were you thinking during the race?*

LL: He went three-quarters in 1:09 4/5 and I got kind of worried. I thought, "maybe I got the horse beat." I said to Mrs. Tweedy, "I made a mistake." But when he got to the quarter pole he was already 10 lengths in front, or more. Then I said, "He can let him gallop from here, Mrs. Tweedy. I hope he doesn't stumble and fall down or something like that." So, he goes on to set a new track record.

*TDN: He sets the world record for a mile and a half in 2:24 and wins by 31 lengths. What was the first thing you said to Ronnie?*

LL: I said, "Ronnie, he wasn't short was he? Was he out of wind?" He said, "He could have gone faster." I said, "Ronnie, don't tell that to anybody else."

*TDN: After winning the Triple Crown, Secretariat was in great demand. Was there a lot of pressure on you by the owner or other racetracks to run the horse in certain places? Did you race him at tracks where he hadn't raced before so people in other parts of the country could see him?*

LL: Mrs. Tweedy lived way out West, and she left me alone. She's a very bright woman, very intelligent. She didn't butt in. Lots of owners tell you what to do, but she didn't, she didn't butt in at all. We went to Chicago to the Arlington Invitational because the vice president called me and said, "I'm going to ask you a big favor." I said, "I think know what you're talking about. You want me to bring Secretariat to Chicago." I called Mrs. Tweedy and told her the race was for \$100,000. I said to her, "I'm going to tell them you want \$125,000." She said, "It's up to you." I think I could have asked for \$150,000.

*TDN: Secretariat ended his career running on the grass in the Man o' War (at Belmont) and the Canadian International at Woodbine. Why did you run him on the turf?*

LL: One day I put Ronnie on him to work on the grass at Belmont Park, and when he came back I asked him how he liked it. He said, "He likes the grass better than he likes the dirt. I'm telling you, he loved it." I wanted him to run on the grass, because I wanted him to be grass horse of the year. I wanted to be champion (on turf and dirt).

*TDN: How did you decide to run him in Canada for his last race?*

LL: I got calls from all over to run his last race. I got calls from California, from Kentucky, Maryland. I said, "I'm going to go to Canada. I'm a Canadian. I'd like to go there so that they can remember me some day." And the fellow who called me from Canada was a very good friend of mine, and he said, "You could really help me a lot if you could run here." I called Mrs. Tweedy and she said, "Do you think he'll win?" I said, "It'll be a walk-over." So we get there and it rained all afternoon. But that didn't bother him; he won the race like a champion.

*Secretariat, who had a record of 12-9-2-1 for the year, was named Champion Three-Year-Old, Champion Turf Horse and Horse of the Year in 1973. Retired to stud at the end of the season, he went on to sire Horse of the Year Lady's Secret and Preakness and Belmont Stakes winner Risen Star. Secretariat died October 4, 1989 at the age of 19.*
