SHARP WORK FOR REAL QUIET Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner **Real Quiet** (Quiet American) worked a handy five furlongs in :59 4/5 under exercise rider Dana Barnes yesterday morning at Churchill Downs. He galloped out strongly after the work and Barnes said she had trouble pulling him up, prompting optimism from trainer Bob Baffert. "That's the Real Quiet that I know," said Baffert. "We're looking good." Real Quiet had walked seven of the eight days following his Preakness victory, with Baffert explaining his colt was "knocked out" by his Preakness effort. Yesterday's work marked four consecutive days on the track, and Baffert said the strategy had been a good one, even if it had prompted rumors about the colt's condition. "I know he's doing good the way he worked today," said Baffert. "He did that easy and was full of himself." The trainer said he would have one more work before the Belmont, a five-furlong move scheduled for Tuesday at Churchill. He will depart for Belmont Wednesday.

KENTUCKY DOWNS ANNOUNCES DATES Kentucky Downs, formerly known as Dueling Grounds, announced its 1998 racing dates for the first live meet at the Franklin, Kentucky track since 1995. The track will run a total of 44 races over a span of seven days from Sept. 13 to Sept. 22. The meet will feature four stakes races on the grass for three-year-olds and up worth \$700,000 Saturday, Sept. 19 as part of the Kentucky Cup Turf Festival. Up for grabs: the \$300,000 Kentucky Cup Turf at about 1 1/2 miles; the \$200,000 Kentucky Cup Mile at about one mile; the \$100,000 Kentucky Cup Ladies Turf, for fillies and mares at about one mile; and the \$100,000 Kentucky Cup Turf Dash at about six furlongs. The track, which has four major shareholders, including Turfway Park and Churchill Downs, is managed by Turfway.

BELMONT S.-GI, \$1,000,000, 3yo, 1 1/2m

The Thoroughbred Corporation's **Orville N Wilbur's** (Out of Place) has been removed from consideration for the Belmont S. after a six-furlong work in 1:11 4/5 at Hollywood Park yesterday morning. The winner of the one-mile GII San Rafael at Santa Anita March 1, Orville N Wilbur's completed the first half-mile of his workout in :45 4/5, too fast to come back and race in the third leg of the Triple Crown, according to his trainer, Wally Dollase. "The owners were here and we felt he just went too fast," said Dollase. "The biggest thing was his half-mile. If he had gone in :47, I would have felt a lot better. But he's a loaded gun. If he were to go in the Belmont, it would be a pure fiasco. It looks like I've got a talented horse on my hands, but it looks like I've got a miler."

Owner/trainer Myung Kwon Cho said Kentucky Derby ninth **Nationalore** (Video Ranger), recently gelded, still lacks smooth action in his morning gallops and will miss the Belmont S.

News Continued.**DICKINSON UNVEILS STATE-OF-THE-ART**

FACILITY Always an innovator, trainer Michael Dickinson has unveiled a new 200-acre training center in North East, Maryland, which includes state-of-the-art equipment, three turf courses and a one-mile dirt track that appears to stay dry under any conditions. Dickinson believes the environment he has created for his 35 horses is superior to any other training conditions in North America and is hopeful that owners of top-class horses will be enticed by his unique training center, known as Tapeta (the Latin word for carpet) Farm. Dickinson has given the same name to the track surface which took him four years to perfect and which he believes is the safest dirt track in North America. It is made up of 53 percent sand, plus seven other ingredients which he declined to reveal. One, however, was obvious: chopped up rubber tires. In an experiment in front of the media, Dickinson poured buckets of water on the track, which drained immediately and was completely dry within seconds. "We have been using this surface for four months now and have had fewer injuries," Dickinson said. "The horses seem to love it and the riders love it also. We are so confident in our track that if a horse has a chip, fracture or quarter crack while in training at Tapeta Farm, we will pay for the surgery to be done at University of Pennsylvania New Bolton Center." Dickinson's facility also includes three separate turf courses for three different types of weather: rainy conditions, drought conditions and normal conditions. Each one consists of different types of grass and is based on different types of soil. Dickinson's new surface has already attracted one prominent owner: Jim McIngvale, who has gone through several trainers this year and has sent Dickinson 11 horses, all of them 2-year-olds. As for his 1996 Breeders' Cup Mile winner **Da Hoss** (Gone West), the six-year-old is still out of serious training after a series of minor injuries, but Dickinson expects to have him back by the fall and is pointing for this year's Breeders' Cup Mile.

WALDEN BREAKS ANKLE Elliott Walden, trainer of Kentucky Derby and Preakness runner-up **Victory Gallop** (Cryptoclearance), suffered a serious break of his right ankle Wednesday in a pickup basketball game at Monmouth College in West Long Branch, New Jersey. Walden was taken to Monmouth Medical Center in Long Branch, where he underwent surgery. According to witnesses, Walden went up for a rebound and landed on the foot of Matt Muzikar, a former college basketball player who is married to jockey Julie Krone. When reached in his hospital room, Walden declined to comment on the incident. He was scheduled to be released yesterday.

Trainer Edward Barker has been issued a 60-day suspension after his trainee, **Whitey's Star** (Academy Award), came back with a post-race positive for Clenbuterol after finishing second in a March 1 race at Aqueduct. Having waived his right to appeal, Barker has had his suspension reduced to 45 days. The trainer denied direct responsibility for the drug positive. "There is strong evidence that a third party is involved," Barker alleged. "Unfortunately, we're not able to make a 100 percent clarification that it was him. The stewards are investigating it and they're confident it was not me. It's embarrassing to me, it's embarrassing to my family and it's embarrassing to the sport." His suspension begins June 8. Barker's suspension came just five days after trainer Richard Stoklosa was suspended 15 days after a search of his barn revealed a dispenser containing Clenbuterol.
