**DOUBLE STUD DUTY FOR REAL QUIET** Kentucky Derby and Preakness hero **Real Quiet** (Quiet American) will join the ever-expanding shuttle traffic to Australia when his racing career is complete, according to Arrowfield Stud managing director John Messara. Messara purchased the Hunter Valley, Australia stud formerly known as Segenhoe for investor George Hofmeister. Now known as Stone Lodge, Hofmeister took over the New South Wales property June 1 and Real Quiet will eventually shuttle from his newly developed northern base, Highland Farms in Kentucky, to Stone Lodge. "Real Quiet is definitely coming here, but we don't know exactly when it will be," Messara confirmed. "If he stays sound, he could continue racing as a four-year-old and five-year-old, so stud duties could be a year or two away."

**BELMONT STAKES RATINGS UP** ABC's telecast of Saturday's Belmont S. received an overnight rating of 6.5, up about 5 percent from last year. Viewership increased as the show went on, with the overnight rating increasing to a 7.5 in the 5 to 6 p.m. hour. "Anything in the 6 to 7 range is out of this world," ABC spokesman Mark Mandel said. "When you see a steady diet of 1s and 2s for weekend afternoon sports viewing, anything in this range is terrific and it proves once again that if you provide a compelling story it can sustain an hour and a half of viewing." The rating in 1996, the last time a horse was not going for the Triple Crown, was just a 2.9

**GENTLEMEN SHARP AT HOLLYWOOD** Getting ready to defend his title in the \$1 million GI Hollywood Gold Cup, **Gentlemen (Arg)** (Robin des Bois) worked a mile in 1:36 3/5 Monday under Belmont-winning jockey Gary Stevens. "He worked awesome," said Stevens. "It was a pretty stiff work for him, but he was relaxed. He was enthusiastic this morning. I think with me being on his back, he knew he was about to do something pretty serious." Gentlemen clipped off fractions of :11 3/5, :23 3/5, :47 3/5, :59 3/5, 1:12 2/5 and 1:24 3/5.

Getting ready for his first start since taking the \$4 million GI Dubai World Cup, **Silver Charm** (Silver Buck) zipped five furlongs in a bullet :59 yesterday morning at Churchill Downs. After splits of :23 3/5 and :47, the four-year-old galloped out three-quarters in 1:13 1/5. Also working five-eighths Monday morning, Foster rival **Announce** (Forty Niner) started his breeze five lengths in front of Silver Charm, but was passed in the stretch and completed the distance in 1:00 2/5. "I know I can beat Announce," said trainer Bob Baffert. "Silver Charm worked great. He loves a target. He loves to take off after something and run 'em down. He came out of it good." Silver Charm will carry highweight of 127 pounds Saturday.

**Local News: Colonial Downs**

According to the Harness Tracks of America newsletter, Colonial Downs chairman Jeffrey Jacobs plans to ask both Thoroughbred and harness horsemen to agree to a reduction in the number of races per day run at the track to avoid financial problems. Jacobs said he believes the Virginia track, which opened last season, has a bright future as long as, "we keep all our options open, including potentially filing for protection under Chapter 11 if we had to. But I happen to think we will be successful. There's too much at stake here for everyone...Start-up years are not always easy, but we're very, very optimistic about the coming years." Jacobs added that the track is not for sale, and will look to add another off-track betting facility in Northern Virginia next year.

**Local News: Suffolk Downs**

Both attendance and handle showed slight gains at the 1998 Suffolk Downs Spring Meet which ended Saturday. The daily average attendance, 4,455, was up two percent, while daily average total handle, \$998,473, was up four percent. "Obviously, we're happy to see the increases," said Executive Vice President of Racing Lou Raffetto Jr. "But the important thing is to look ahead even further, to make sure Suffolk Downs can be competitive in terms of purses with other East Coast tracks. That's what drives the bottom line in any successful racing operation."

## WHAT'S DOING DOWN UNDER

The connections of **Might And Power (NZ)** (Zabeel {NZ}), who smashed records during an arduous Brisbane winter campaign, will face increasing pressure in the coming months to let the indomitable gelding take on the world in the Japan Cup. Might And Power concluded his four-year-old season with four straight wins, culminating with his record-setting G1 Doomben Cup victory, by a combined total of 22 3/4 lengths. He's now the highest-ever single season money earner in Australian racing, with earnings of \$2,234,829 for the season, eclipsing Better Loosen Up's (Aus) 1990-91 earnings of \$2,231,461.

The "Horse of the Year" elect is also the best Japan Cup aspirant since Better Loosen Up claimed the race for Australasia in 1990. More importantly, Might And Power deserves the opportunity to prove he is better than the quaint "best stayer in the world" tag bestowed on him late last year. The International Classifications category Might And Power found himself in was the traditionally weak 2800 metres and upwards, and surely there is a compelling argument for testing Might And Power in a globally respected 2400-metre event.

Owner Nick Moraitis admits the odds of targeting Tokyo are shortening, although Australasia's weight-for-age championship, the Cox Plate at Moonee Valley, is Might And Power's priority. Trainer Jack Denham desperately wants to add the Cox Plate to his trophy cache before he retires. "Jack has run second in the last two Cox Plates with Filante (NZ) and it is the race he wants to win more than anything," said Moraitis. "Might And Power has to come back and find form again in the spring, he's got to be fit and healthy and he must earn an invitation for the Japan Cup."



A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a + will denote winners who are first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.

Might And Power's efforts ensured his sire **Zabeel (NZ)** (\*Sir Tristram), 12, has finally toppled **Danehill** (Danzig), 12. Zabeel's progeny have earned \$4.84 million to date this season compared with Danehill's \$4.28, although Danehill has 13 stakes winners here compared with Zabeel's 10.

Trainer Gai Waterhouse is among those singing the stallion's praises after her filly Zacheline (NZ), by Zabeel from American mare Castel Cheline (Avatar), broke her much publicized black-type drought. Waterhouse, the high profile daughter of turf legend Tommy Smith, enjoyed a record previous season with a Sydney premiership win and 10 Group 1 victories. But with many of her top guns retired, Waterhouse struggled this year until tough Zacheline collected both the South Australian Oaks and the Queensland Oaks.



**Quest For Fame (GB)** (Rainbow Quest), 11, consolidated his reputation for producing smart youngsters when Dracula (Aus) snared back-to-back Group 1 wins, following his Champagne S. victory with a QTC Sires' Produce S. win at Brisbane's Eagle Farm last week. In his first season, Dracula has won five from seven and trainer John Hawkes has labeled him a potential Cox Plate horse.

"It might look a bit ambitious, but we might as well aim high," says Hawkes.



Veteran shuttle stallion **Last Tycoon's (Ire)** (Try My Best) best-known southern son, **Mahogany (Aus)**, could come out of retirement for a special race at the Gold Coast next year. Magic Millions company co-owner John Singleton says Mahogany's owners, media magnate Kerry Packer and Crown Casino chief Lloyd Williams, aim to bring the seven-year-old back from the paddock for a crack at the \$310,694 Magic Millions H. The eight-time Group 1 winner was prepared by top Melbourne trainer Lee Freedman, who has denied reports he was to set up in Hong Kong.

Although the popular gelding Mahogany retired in March, Last Tycoon, 15, continues to be well represented here via stakes winners Tycoon Lil (Aus), Palia (Aus) and tough colt Iglesia (Aus), who is likely to improve as a three-year-old. Last Tycoon averaged a respectable \$52,579 at the Easter sales.

"He has stood his northern season in Japan for a few years now, but he won't keep going there forever," said Coolmore spokesman James Bester. "Last Tycoon was an exceptionally versatile racehorse and he won the Breeders' Cup Mile, a very good race for sires, with horses like Lure and Barathea (Ire) also having won it. He has tended to get speed horses here, but overseas they tend to be classic 10-furlong horses. He has had a particularly good year, and he's a very good sire on five continents." Last Tycoon will stand at Coolmore's Hunter Valley base this spring.



Leading Brisbane jockey Mike Pelling has been ordered to pay \$57,168 in damages plus costs to former apprentice rider Raymond Kliese after a Supreme Court judgment concerning a fall at Eagle Farm 14 years ago went against him. Pelling is likely to appeal. It is only the second time in Australia that a jockey has successfully sued another over injuries sustained in a fall. In an interesting judgment, Justice Chesterman said he doubted whether the opinions of stewards were admissible in a civil court. Sydney's chief steward Ray Murrin, who presided in Brisbane at the time of the incident, said he doubted Pelling was responsible for the accident and Pelling was not charged by stewards over the fall, which Kliese's lawyers argued ended his career.
