NTRA SERIES ON NETWORK TV The National Thoroughbred Racing Association has planned a series of races for older horses which will, at least in part, be broadcast on network television, NTRA Chief Executive Officer and Commissioner Tim Smith said yesterday. The schedule for the series, set to begin in 1999, is expected to be unveiled within 30 days; Smith said he's still negotiating with more than one network regarding television rights. The NTRA's plans for 1999 also include a substantially expanded road to the Triple Crown series and grouping together races for horses in divisions other than the handicap division. "What you will see may not be a separate TV series for the three or four other divisions," Smith said. "But what we want to do is promote these horse and have rankings for them to increase awareness. Over time, they might evolve into several separate series. For now, if you have an important sprint race, we want the track to be able to say it is featuring the top-ranked sprinter in the country. That will be a step in the right direction." The series for older horses is expected to closely resemble the American Championship Racing Series. Some felt the Massachusetts H. would be pushed aside to make room for the Stephen Foster, but Smith said that the MassCap has been included in every proposed schedule that has been put forward. In a move designed to introduce new fans to the sport of Thoroughbred racing, the NTRA's 10-panel brochure entitled "How to Go Baby Go" hits newsstands this week in 3.2 million copies of the June 15 edition of *Sports Illustrated*. "This is a simple, easy-to-read introduction to the sport," said Rick Baedeker, senior vice president of marketing for the NTRA. "And *Sports Illustrated* gives us a direct link to a huge, prime, targeted audience." The pamphlet includes categories such as "A Menu of Bets," "What to Say at the Window," and "How to Talk the Talk," a glossary of basic terms. "Making the sport easier to understand is a vital component of the NTRA plan," Baedeker added. Additional pamphlets were printed for distribution through NTRA member tracks and 10,000 copies were given to fans in attendance at the Belmont S. last Saturday.

FORMAL GOLD TO GAINESWAY Formal Gold (Black Tie Affair {Ire}), winner of the GI Woodward, GI Donn H. and GI Iselin H. last year, will enter stud at Gainesway in Lexington, Kentucky in 1999. The five-year-old missed the '97 Breeders' Cup after suffering a condylar fracture to his right hind leg. He was back in training this spring after undergoing surgery, but injured his right front ankle and was retired at the beginning of April. Formal Gold won eight of his 16 career starts for earnings of \$1,533,600. "Formal Gold is very special to me and we took our time finding the right farm that will give him every opportunity to prove himself as a stallion," said John D. Murphy, Sr. "We are very pleased he will stand at Gainesway." The stallion's 1999 stud fee will be announced at a later date.

FIRST DERBY-WINNING TRAINER TO HALL

Ansel Williamson, a former slave who trained the first Kentucky Derby winner, will be inducted into the National Museum of Racing's Hall of Fame this summer. Williamson, who trained a number of 19th century champions, including Derby winner Aristides, will be inducted at the annual Hall of Fame Ceremonies at the Museum in Saratoga Springs, New York on August 10. "Several years ago, we established a Historic Review Committee for the purpose of examining the careers of figures who may have been passed over for one reason or another during the nearly half century of Hall of Fame elections," explained Museum President John von Stade. "The Committee felt strongly that the achievements of Ansel Williamson deserve his recognition as a Hall of Fame Trainer."

HOFMEISTERS BUY INTO VINERY Mr. and Mrs. Ben P. Walden Jr.'s Vinery has formed a partnership with George and Kay Hofmeister. The Hofmeisters have acquired a major interest in the 12-year-old Midway, Kentucky farm, which is home to three of the top four freshman sires in North America, Red Ransom, Farma Way and Gilded Time, and spans as a stallion facility across approximately 250 acres. The partnership intends to acquire additional stallions. Ben Walden, Jr. will be the managing partner. "It will be business as usual at Vinery, the only difference is that we will instantly become international in scope with the clout to move to the next level," Walden said. The partnership pertains to stallions and does not include the breeding stock of either individual farm. The broodmare operations of Vinery and of the Hofmeister's Highland Farm in Paris, Kentucky and Stone Lodge Farm in New South Wales, Australia will remain separate and privately owned. However, the commercial sales of the North American breeding farms will all be under the banner of Vinery.

The Harness Tracks of America newsletter reports that the handle on Delaware slot machines in the month of May was up 19 percent over the same period last year. The state's slots averaged \$11.78 million per day last month. Legalized in December of 1995, Delaware's slot machines have handled more than \$7.5 billion, with purses at harness and Thoroughbred tracks receiving \$70.6 million of that total. Tracks have received \$316.5 million and the state \$165.6 million. There have been two state income tax cuts as a result of the slot machine windfall.

Joseph DeFrancis, president and chief executive officer of The Maryland Jockey Club, announced yesterday that a substantial minority stock interest in Laurel Racing Association, Inc. and Pimlico National Corporation has been acquired by LUK-Flats, LLC, a subsidiary of Leucadia National Corporation. DeFrancis also announced that he and his partners, Karin DeFrancis and Martin Jacobs, have used the entire proceeds of the sale to pay in full and discharge completely their obligations to Jack Kent Cooke, Inc., as well as all remaining payments due to Robert and John Manfuso, Jr., formerly minority stockholders in Laurel and Pimlico. Leucadia National Corporation is a publicly traded company listed on the New York Stock Exchange under the symbol LUK, that specializes in distressed assets and undervalued companies. Leucadia has no other interest in the racing or gaming industries. "Our decision to become associated with the Maryland Jockey Club did not come easily," said Luis Medeiros, managing director of Leucadia. "The two principle factors in our decision were the talent and vision of the DeFrancis management team and a recognition of the underlying asset value of the Preakness and the real estate holdings of the Maryland Jockey Club. We are hopeful that Maryland public policy makers will recognize the value of the Maryland racing industry to the state of Maryland and provide it with the tools to remain competitive."
