NTRA ALL-STAR JOCKEY CHAMPIONSHIP

TONIGHT AT LONE STAR Twelve of the top jockeys on the continent will compete in the \$100,000 NTRA All-Star Jockey Championship at Lone Star Park in Grand Prairie, Texas tonight. The four-race event will be televised live on *espn2* from 10-11 p.m. EDT, and one percent of the mutuel handle on the four Championship races will go to benefit the Jockeys' Guild. Hall of Famers Jerry Bailey, Pat Day, Eddie Delahoussaye, Sandy Hawley, Chris McCarron, Laffit Pincay Jr. and Gary Stevens will ride against Kent Desormeaux, Julie Krone, Shane Sellers and Mike Smith; Marlon St. Julien will represent the Lone Star jockey colony. Between them, the 12 jockeys have won 38 Triple Crown races, 51 Breeders' Cup races and 20 Eclipse Awards. Their mounts have earned more than \$1.5 billion combined. Stevens, elected to the Hall of Fame last year, won the event last year. Riding assignments for the Championship were drawn at random, and the riders will be awarded points based on their finishes in each race. Win, place, show, exacta and trifecta wagering will be available on the event. Each riders' mounts will be combined into a single betting interest; the rider who earns the most points will win. The winner's share of the pot is \$25,000.

Maintaining Godolphin's hot streak, the lightly raced Kayf Tara (GB) surprised even his connections with this outstanding staying performance over two and a half miles on the soft track, taking his lifetime record to three wins from five starts for earnings of \$221,473. The 1995 Gold Cup winner Double Trigger (Ire) grabbed the lead and was clear entering the straight, but Kayf Tara, well in the rear early, took up the challenge with six furlongs to run and gained control a furlong from the wire. The gallant Double Trigger would not throw in the towel and, to huge cheers from the crowd, fought back gallantly in defeat. Godolphin's Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum said, "That was a very pleasant surprise as we were not certain he would stay the distance. It is wonderful to win the Gold Cup again (Godolphin's Classic Cliche won in 1996), especially as Double Trigger ran a marvellous race and was fighting back at the finish." Winning rider Frankie Dettori said, "Double Trigger gave me a real fright inside the final furlong and I'm just delighted to have won." Double Trigger's owner Roy Huggins was thrilled at his old veteran's gallant defeat, "We hope to take on Kayf Tara again in the (G2) Goodwood Cup (July 30)." Trigger's trainer Mark Johnston said, "I didn't care whether he won or not, because he was running so well. It was wonderful to watch him running down the straight in front like that."

Only 13 days after her defeat by Shahtoush (Ire) in the G1 Vodafone Oaks at Epsom June 5, Bahr (GB) bounced back to record her fourth win from five lifetime starts and take her earnings to \$289,469 with an impressive display here. Always travelling well in fourth while Italian Oaks winner ZOMARADAH (GB) (Deploy {GB}) set the pace, Bahr cruised through to take the lead at the quarter-mile pole and, despite wandering across the track in the closing stages, she was always in command. Godolphin's racing manager Simon Crisford said: "That's now three tough races in quick succession (Bahr won the G3 Musidora S. at York May 12 before her Epsom Oaks defeat), but all being well she'll now go for the (G1) Irish Oaks at The Curragh next month (July 11)." Trainer Saeed Bin Suroor said: "She ran so well in the Oaks and came out of the race so well that we decided to run her here. We thought she had improved since Epsom. She was relaxed and happy on the outside of the field and when Frankie (Dettori) asked her, she went clear."

A G3 winner at Hoppegarten in Germany last August, Tomba (GB) relished the soft ground here to take his earnings to \$303,544 by landing the ninth and most important win of his 22-race career. French challenger Dyhim Diamond (Ire) was always in the front rank and he shared the lead after a quarter mile with RAMBLING BEAR (GB) (Sharrood) before taking command at the quarter-mile pole. But Tomba quickened well on the outside and grabbed the lead at the eighth pole and ran on stoutly to resist all challengers. Brian Meehan, overjoyed with his first Royal Ascot win, said, "It's fantastic to have a winner at the Royal meeting. Great for the horse, the jockey (Michael Tebbutt) and the whole team at home. I was concerned at his wide draw, but when four horses drawn inside us were withdrawn because of the soft ground, we were able to move in and this undoubtedly helped us." Tebbutt added, "I've won some other Group 2 races, but this has to be my most important winner. This horse just loves the soft and we all think he's a Group One horse on this ground."

Taking his unbeaten record to three for three, 10-1 outsider Rosselli provided trainer Jack Berry and his former stable jockey John Carroll with their second Norfolk S. win, following Mind Games in 1994. Pursuing his pacesetting stablemate SPEEDY JAMES (IRE) (Fayruz {GB}) for the first three eighths, Rosselli quickened well along the rail and went clear of the field to score an impressive success. "I bought the horse for 34,000 guineas at the Newmarket sales," said Jack Berry, "and I told owner Terry Holdcroft that he closely resembled his colt Mind Games. After he saw him he decided to buy a half-share from me. He broke the track record for two-year-olds at Newcastle on his second start (May 21). He's a very decent colt. You've got to be to win a Group race at Royal Ascot."

It was a second win at the meet for trainer John Gosden, who said: "We were very pleased with the way **Rhapsodic** ran when finishing second at Goodwood (May 20), so we put him away for this race. We were hopeful that he'd run well, but not confident. I was worried about the ground, because his sire **Affirmed** was a dirt and fast surface horse, but Frankie (Dettori) rode him brilliantly."

Godolphin's G1 Sagitta 1000 Guineas winner **Cape Verdi (Ire)** (Caerleon), who disappointed when only ninth in the G1 Vodafone Derby at Epsom June 6, looks set to drop back to a mile for her next start in the G2 Amcor Falmouth S. at Newmarket July 8. Special Argentine Breeders' Cup Edition

SOUTHERN HALO (h, 15, Halo--Northern Sea, by Northern Dancer)

Southern Halo has been the dominant Argentinian stallion throughout most of the 1990s. The Leading Freshman Sire of 1992, he captured his first overall Championship in 1994 and has held the title for each of the succeeding three seasons. The events of Monday's Argentine Breeders' Cup equivalent have ensured Southern Halo of a fifth consecutive title, and took his dominance to new heights. Remarkably, three of the six Group 1 events contested went to the offspring of Southern Halo, his runners also bringing home two seconds and a third.

It's also interesting to note the scope of the success. Six-year-old **El Compinche (Arg) (h, 6, Southern Halo--La Copera {Arg}, by Good Manners)** won Monday's 10 furlong Premio Hotel Presidente by five lengths; three-year-old **Matthis (Arg) (Southern Halo--Mystique {Arg}, by Logical)** took the five furlong 75 Aniversario de la Revista Palmero; and the juvenile colt **Team (Arg) (c, 2, Southern Halo--Teocratica {Arg}, by Farnesio {Arg})** romped home six lengths clear in the one mile Copa Raul F Lottero-Premio Alfa Romeo.

Team is the current "poster boy" of Argentine racing, a horse who writers are beginning to mention in the same sentence as Forli. Team's dam, Teocratica, is by Farnesio (Group 1 winner in Argentina, stakes winner in California), who in turn is a son of the U.S.-bred Nashua stallion Good Manners. This is worth noting, as El Compinche is bred on a similar cross, his dam being a daughter of Good Manners. As a son of Halo out of a Northern Dancer mare, Southern Halo is inbred to Mahmoud's daughter Almahmoud. Add to this strains of Royal Charger and Nasrullah (one a grandson of Mahmoud's three-parts sister, Mumtaz Begum, and the other a son), it is not surprising that he is working with further strains of Nasrullah. However, Good Manners brings with him more than just Nasrullah. It's particularly interesting to compare Good Manners' pedigree with that of Shama, the third dam of Southern Halo. Both are Nasrullah/Bull Dog crosses, but the Shama/Nashua combination is given a little extra twist by the fact that Johnstown, the broodmare sire of Nashua, is a seven-eighths relative to Arena, the third dam of Shama.

Southern Halo's third Group 1 winner of the meet, Matthis, is out of a mare by Logical, a U.S.-bred son of Buckpasser-- Smart Deb (Dedicate). This cross has proved to be a highly successful one, as it has resulted in at least six other graded stakes winners. One important key here might be that Logical is inbred to Blue Larkspur, each time combined with Teddy. This echoes the cross which produced Nothirdchance, dam of Southern Halo's grandsire, Hail to Reason.

The other outstanding cross for Southern Halo--with four Group 1 winners to its name--involves another U.S. bred stallion, Salt Marsh (Tom Rolfe--Saline, by Sailor). Tom Rolfe often combines well with Hail to Reason, and Salt Marsh also has a Blue Larkspur/Teddy combination, this time through his third dam, La Troienne's daughter, Big Event.

Southern Halo has also scored with a mare by Northern Jove (giving Northern Dancer 3x3 through a son and daughter, and Almahmoud 4x5x5), and other familiar U.S. strains appear through broodmare sires such as Master Bold (brother to Raja Baba), Forever Sparkle (by Secretariat), Four Fingers (by New Policy, by Khaled) and Liloy (by Bold Bidder).

For the last two Northern Hemisphere seasons, Southern Halo has shuttled from Argentina to Coolmore Stud, Kentucky. Given his South American success with mares from predominantly North American strains, it is going to be interesting to watch his impact in this part of the world.
