SILVER CHARM TO GOLD CUP Trainer Bob Baffert said yesterday he will likely run **Silver Charm** (Silver Buck), runner-up in the GII Stephen Foster H. June 13, right back in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup June 28. The four-year-old is scheduled to ship from Churchill Downs to Hollywood Park Sunday, and work Tuesday. Baffert said, "The plan is to run Silver Charm in the Gold Cup. I'm confident he'll work well and if he does, the Gold Cup is a go." Baffert also said that jockey Gary Stevens, who was set to ride **Gentlemen (Arg)** (Robin des Bois) in the Gold Cup, will stick with Silver Charm.

"SKIPPY'S" EXCELLENT ADVENTURE MGISW **Skip Away** (Skip Trial) took an unscheduled tour of the Belmont Park main track yesterday morning after getting loose during his morning gallop. The two-time Eclipse champion dropped his exercise rider after a horse that was galloping in front of him, GSW **Pacificbounty** (Pirate's Bounty), stumbled on the far turn of the muddy track and fell. Skip Away ducked from the fallen horse and rider, and his rider, Jose Sanchez, came off. He went back the wrong way to the five-eighths pole and stood until a set of horses galloped by, then joined that group until the top of the stretch. "He left them at the top of the lane," said trainer Sonny Hine. "He was playing, slapping his feet. He came past the wire and they got him into a crowd of horses. That's when the out-rider got him." The five-year-old, scheduled to ship to California for the \$1 million GI Hollywood Gold Cup June 28, was apparently uninjured in the incident. "I've been all over him and nothing seems to be wrong," said Hine. "Sometimes, though, something might turn up in a day or so. We're not leaving for California until Thursday, and the only way we wouldn't go is if something came up where we couldn't work him over the weekend or early next week."

Champion three-year-old filly **Ajina** (Strawberry Road {Aus}) began 1998 with a listless debut, finishing last in the Bayakoa S. at Oaklawn April 11. The winner of last year's GI Breeders' Cup Distaff regained her old form, however, in the GIII Pimlico Distaff May 16 when posting a three-length victory. **Colonial Minstrel** (Pleasant Colony), winner of the GIII Humana Distaff at Churchill May 2 and GII Shuvee H. at Belmont May 23, seeks her sixth victory in a row. A crack sprinter this spring, she will be attempting a dirt route for the first time this year. **Mossflower** (Affirmed) is undefeated in five starts, but runs into a tough field for her first stakes attempt.

The veteran Posidonas (GB), ridden by Pat Eddery instead of suspended stable jockey Richard Quinn, reversed the form he showed in the G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom June 5, when he was beaten 10 lengths by Swain (Ire), to capture his fourth Group race and his eighth win in 22 lifetime starts, taking his earnings to \$740,907. After sharing the early lead with **STAGE AFFAIR** (Theatrical {Ire}), Posidonas led for almost a mile until challenged by Swain at the three-eighths pole, with the Dubai World Cup runner-up taking command at the quarter-mile mark and Germano (GB) making his challenge on the wide outside. But Swain failed to go clear and Posidonas fought back like a tiger and would not be denied, reclaiming the lead inside the final 100 yards and repelling the threat from Germano. "He loves a good scrap," said winning trainer Paul Cole. "He's sound and genuine and is very difficult to beat in a battle. The conditions suited him, too. He was a bit off color last year, but he's spot on this year. We might bring him back here for the (G1) King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. (July 25), but it would not be ideal for him if the ground is too firm. He ran in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe last year and that might be another target for him, too." Godolphin's racing manager Simon Crisford was baffled by Swain's disappointing effort. He said, "Going into the race he was fine and we expected better from him than that. We'll have to see what, if anything, turns up. There'll be no quick decision about his next race."

Even without blinkers--which were left off in error--the veteran Bolshoi (Ire) showed that his first Group race success in the G2 Temple S. at Sandown May 25 was no fluke. But he looked in an impossible position after the first three-eighths of a mile, with a wall of horses in front of him as the filly Lochangel (GB), whom he had beaten at Sandown, took command. But apprentice jockey Carl Lowther, who was also on board in the Temple S., found the perfect split between horses at the eighth pole and Bolshoi quickened brilliantly to catch the leaders and win going away at the wire. "I cannot believe it," said trainer Jack Berry, who was winning his second Group race at the meet, following Rosselli in Thursday's Norfolk S. "To have a double at Royal Ascot is something else. I forgot to declare the blinkers for Bolshoi, but I'm not sure it made any difference. We had planned to leave them off one day, but not in this race, more likely in a claimer somewhere! This old horse has just kept on improving and now we just let him run his own race. We used to bury him in the field and try and come late, but inevitably he used to get caught in traffic. What a marvellous day." Lochangel's trainer Ian Balding was delighted with his filly, saying: "She ran very well, but bloody old Bolshoi! At this stage of her career I would say this filly is better than her half-sister Lochsong (champion sprinter in Europe). She will now go for the (G3) King George S. (over five furlongs at Goodwood (July 28))."

A second Group win of the meet for Prince Ahmad Salman's The Thoroughbred Corporation, following Dr Fong's score in Tuesday's G1 St. James' Palace S. Extending his unbeaten record to three-for-three, Royal Anthem, who was unraced as a juvenile, could not have been more impressive and now looks set for the big time, with trainer Henry Cecil keen to let him have a shot at the best older horses in the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. over this track and distance July 25. Kilimanjaro (GB) set the pace from the gate, with Royal Anthem sitting in third and the entire field racing around the outside of the track to find the better ground. At the three-eighths pole Kilimanjaro still led while racing wide; COURTEOUS (GB) (Generous {Ire}) and FRUITS OF LOVE (Hansel) attempted to sneak up on his inside, but his jockey Mick Kinane shut the door on those two on the final turn (a maneuver which led to a four-day suspension for causing interference). However, Kinane had no answer to Royal Anthem, who swept through to lead at the three-sixteenths pole and raced home for a comfortable win. "He was very big and backward as a two-year-old and I couldn't train him properly," said Cecil. "He only began to show his potential when he won his maiden on his debut at Newbury (May 16). He then broke the course record at Newmarket (Fairway S. June 6) over a trip too short for him. He's a lovely horse with tremendous potential. He's 17 hands and although we need to take care of him and will give him a rest, I will talk to the owner about bringing him back for the King George at the end of July. But he'll be an even better four-year-old." Kinane will serve his suspension from June 28 to July 1, which means he will miss the G1 Budweiser Irish Derby June 28.

Group races in France and Ireland will also count towards the total, but sellers, claimers and races on all-weather tracks are excluded. "More prize money is what we recognize to be the key to a successful future for British racing," said Voute, one of Europe's leading consignors. "There is an additional £300,000 (\$487,884) available for any yearling we sell next year." To be eligible, horses must be trained in the United Kingdom. No horse can win bonuses at both two and three.
