TRIPLE CROWN RIVALS HEADED TO

HASKELL It looks like **Real Quiet** (Quiet American) and **Victory Gallop** (Cryptoclearance) will renew their rivalry in the \$1 million GI Haskell Invitational at Monmouth Park August 9, and jockey Gary Stevens will have his choice of the mounts. Stevens was aboard Real Quiet three times last season, finishing third in a pair of stakes at Santa Fe Downs and fourth in a maiden race at Del Mar. Now riding first call for trainer Bob Baffert, he can have the mount on the Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner if he wants. But as far as trainer Elliott Walden knows, Stevens will stick with his charge, Belmont S. winner Victory Gallop. "I talked to his agent (Ron Anderson) (Wednesday), and he basically told me that Gary is Victory Gallop's rider," said Walden from his Churchill Downs barn yesterday. "I say that with confidence, but not 100-percent confidence. He told me he doesn't anticipate making a change, but anything can happen." Walden added that the three-year-old is "doing great." The trainer, who has a string stabled at Monmouth this summer, hasn't decided yet when his Haskell hopeful will ship to the Jersey Shore.

SILVER CHARM UPDATE **Silver Charm** (Silver Buck), who was not entered in Sunday's GI Hollywood Gold Cup due to a fever, was showing signs of progress yesterday, but trainer Bob Baffert predicted his horse will be out of action for at least 30 days. Silver Charm's temperature dropped to 101 degrees yesterday, down from 102 the day before. "He ate (Wednesday) night and his temperature was down, but we took blood and it showed that he did have a bug. We'll have to give him five days off. The workout probably brought it out, but it's not a killer bug. I can't run him now for at least 30 days. When you lose five days with him, it's like losing two weeks with any other horse. I'll have to sit down with Bob Lewis and figure out a plan for him now."

HAWLEY TO RETIRE Jockey Sandy Hawley, who has recorded 6,449 wins and purse earnings near the \$90 million mark, will ride the final race of his career on Canada Day, July 1 at Woodbine. After an appearance in the Gill Dominion Day S., The Ontario Jockey Club will honor Hawley in a ceremony in front of fans, friends and family on the E.P. Taylor Turf Course. Hawley, a member of the Hall of Fame in both Canada and the United States, had stated 1998 was going to be his final year of riding, but it wasn't until last week he decided July 1 would be the best day for his farewell to racing fans. "I'm proud of Canada, of being Canadian and of Canadian racing, so I felt it would be appropriate as a proud Canuck to ride my last race on Canada's day," Hawley said. The 49-year-old, winner of four Queen's Plates, earned the 1976 Eclipse Award and the 1978 and 1988 Sovereign Awards.

June 20, suffered a fractured right front cannon bone during a morning gallop Wednesday and has been retired. The four-year-old filly, trained by Warren "Jimmy" Croll Jr., won six of her 18 career starts and earned \$139,460. "She won't need surgery," said Bill Croll, son of the trainer. "We'll just give her time and then breed her. It's really a shame--she was just getting good." Ironically, the filly earned not only the \$20,000 second-place purse, but also a season to the Vinery stallion Tinnors Way in the Matchmaker. Sam Huff, owner of Matchmaker winner **Bursting Forth**, chose the season to Dare and Go, and Prestonwood Farm and G. Arthur Seelbinder's Gastro-nomical earned a season to Lite the Fuse with her third-place Matchmaker finish.

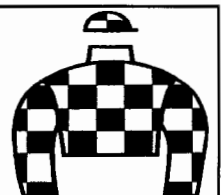

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

PEDIGREE SHORTS

There seems to be something special about the combination of the three-parts brothers Nureyev and Sadler's Wells with mares by Affirmed and his sire, Exclusive Native. Sunday's G1 Grand Prix de Paris was won by **Limpid (GB) (c, 3, Soviet Star--Isle Of Glass, by Affirmed)**, and the G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot June 17 was captured by **Exclusive (GB) (f, 3, Polar Falcon--Exclusive Order, by Exclusive Native)**. Others bred on the cross include last year's English 2,000 Guineas victor Entrepreneur and Dance a Dream, both by Sadler's Wells, and the Irish 1,000 Guineas winner Mehthaaf, Heart Lake, Red Slippers and Romanov, all by Nureyev. In fact, this cross is an extension of an affinity between Northern Dancer and Exclusive Native which accounts for over one-third of all unrestricted stakes winners out of Exclusive Native-line mares. Of course, every time they meet, Northern Dancer and Exclusive Native supply a son and daughter of Native Dancer, but it is also worth noting that Northern Dancer's fourth dam, Mother Goose, has a very similar background to Shut Out, the broodmare sire of Exclusive Native. Where Nureyev and Sadler's Wells are concerned, the key might well be that they carry Nantallah, whose dam, Shimmer, is bred on very similar lines to Won't Tell You, the dam of Affirmed.

Sunday's Nearctic S. (G1C), Canada's premier sprint event, was taken by **Rushiscomingup (h, 5, Bold Executive--Should Say, by Oh Say)**. Bold Executive is out of the mare Arctic Vixen, and she is by Victoria Park out of a mare by Nearctic. Rushiscomingup's second dam is by Viceregal, who is by a son of Nearctic out of a half-sister to Victoria Park. The success of this pattern does not appear to be a fluke, as Viceregal's brother, Vice Regent, appears in the pedigrees of stakes winners Lynclar and Timely Ruckus, who, with Rushiscomingup, make up three of Bold Executive's four highest earners.

Old Trieste (c, 3, A.P. Indy--Lovlier Linda, by Vigors), who made a bold show on the lead in the Kentucky Derby, scored his first stakes win in his first start since that race when cruising home 4 1/2-lengths clear in Sunday's GIII Affirmed H. at Hollywood Park. Out of the Grade I-winning mare Lovlier Linda, Old Trieste is another example of the seeming affinity between Seattle Slew and Grey Dawn II. Seattle Slew has sired a stakes winner out of a Grey Dawn II mare, and so have three other sons, Thirty Six Red, Slewpy and Houston. Meanwhile, Grey Dawn II himself has sired four stakes winners out of Seattle Slew mares.

Mossflower (f, 4, Affirmed--Chinguetti {Fr}, by Green Dancer), who extended her winning sequence to six with a stunning 12-lengths victory in Saturday's G1 Hempstead H., looks as if she is Affirmed's best daughter since twice champion Flawlessly. Oddly enough, there are some pedigree parallels between Flawlessly and Mossflower: Flawlessly is out of a mare by Nijinsky II, with a second dam by Round Table, and Mossflower is out of a mare by a son of Nijinsky II and her second dam is by a son of Round Table.

Lear Fan has sired three very good horses--Verveine, Loup Solitaire and Fantastic Fellow--out of mares by Nureyev, a mating which gives the brother and sister Lt. Stevens and Thong. This formula was reversed in the pedigree of **Go Boldly (Ire) (c, 4, Sadler's Wells--Diabolina, by Lear Fan)**, a son of Nureyev's three-parts brother Sadler's Wells who won the listed Grand Prix Galop Aeroport Lyon Satolas over 1 1/2-miles at Lyon Saturday.
