### SKIP AWAY PROBABLE FOR PACIFIC CLASSIC

**Skip Away** (Skip Trial) returned from his victory in Sunday's GI Hollywood Gold Cup in excellent shape, trainer Sonny Hine reported yesterday, adding that he was encouraged about his chances of making the Aug. 15 GI Pacific Classic at Del Mar and another rematch with **Gentlemen (Arg)** (Robin des Bois). "We'll probably go," Hine said. "We can always travel and run with him. We're certainly planning on it, but I want to enjoy this first and think about it. I've got to give him some time off first and work on his feet." After his win Sunday, Hine revealed that the five-year-old's feet had suffered some wear and tear after he got loose at Belmont nine days prior to the race. And, because the Gold Cup had appeared to be a grueling race for his charge, Hine said he had thought Skip Away would be fatigued afterward, but he was in for a pleasant surprise when he returned to his Hollywood Park barn yesterday morning. "He's unbelievable," said Hine. "He cleaned up everything and when we tried to walk him he was jumping all over the shedrow. He had a good rest. He slept all night and he's ready to go again."

**NUMBERS UP AT CHURCHILL DOWNS** Churchill Downs closed its 124th Spring Meet Sunday showing gains in both attendance and handle, making it the third consecutive meeting the numbers have been up. During the meet, daily average purses climbed to a record \$469,643, an increase of 14.5 percent over 1997. Attendance for the 47-day season was 692,725, up .8 percent, for a daily average of 14,739. Total handle from all sources was \$402,137,922, up 5.9 percent from 1997. The daily average handle was \$8,556,126. On-track wagering was up 1.4 percent, increasing to \$100,654,560, while on-track handle on full-card simulcasting was up 32.1 percent, accounting for \$14,104,041 of the on-track total. Off-track, the handle grew 6.8 percent to \$299,611,339. "The success of our season is attributed to the quality of our overall racing program and our ongoing marketing strategy," said Churchill Downs President and Chief Executive Officer Tom Meeker. "We have developed our racing program into one of the best in the nation." Jockey Pat Day earned a record 25th Churchill riding title with 65 wins, three more than Shane Sellers. Elliott Walden won his second consecutive training title at the track with 17 victories. The leading owners at the meet were Jan, Mace and Samantha Siegel, who edged Robert and Bea Roberts, 10-to-9.

**VICTORY GALLOP BACK ON WORK TAB** Having his first breeze since a gallant nose triumph in the GI Belmont S. June 6, **Victory Gallop** (Cryptoclearance) went a half mile in :48 2/5 over a fast main track at Churchill Downs yesterday morning with exercise rider Shannon Ritter aboard. "I told her to go in :49, and I told her to switch at him a little bit the last part because sometimes he wants to get a little lackadaisical on his own," said trainer Elliott Walden. "I was very happy with his work. We'll work him back in seven or eight days, depending on the weather." With the main target for the summer being the GI Travers at Saratoga August 29, the three-year-old is likely to make his next start in the \$1 million GI Haskell Invitational August 9 at Monmouth, but Walden is still considering the GII Jim Dandy at Saratoga the same day.

### Local News: Suffolk Downs

Although the track is closed for the summer, work is underway at Suffolk Downs to renovate the grandstand, the racing surface and the stable area. "The work crews are starting to crank it up," said Executive Vice President of Racing Lou Raffetto Jr. "Much of the renovations are behind the scenes and on the backstretch, but fans who come out for simulcasting will notice improvements underway on the first floor of the facility and outside on the track itself." Sunday's showdown between Skip Away and Gentlemen (Arg) in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup generated a Gold Cup record handle in excess of \$18 million. The previous mark of \$16,133,816 was set when Cigar won the race in 1995. The on-track attendance of 32,505 was the highest on Gold Cup Day since the advent of inter-track wagering the Los Angeles area in 1991. Attendance was 27,003 in 1995.
