SUNDAY SILENCE DOMINATES JHRA SALES

OPENER The top seven sellers of the opening session of the Japan Racing Horse Association's Selected Sales of Foals and Yearlings, held yesterday at the Northern Horse Park in Hokkaido, Japan, were by the country's leading sire, Sunday Silence. A total of 84 foals were sold during the opener, topped by a colt by Sunday Silence out of Triple Wow (Coastal), a graded-stakes winner of \$706,695 who produced Canadian Horse of the Year Alywow (Alysheba). Consigned by Shadai Farm, the foal was purchased for 180,000,000 yen (\$1,264,933) by Fusaro Sekiguchi. The second highest price of the day was 140,000,000 yen (\$983,837), paid for a colt by Sunday Silence--Ballet Queen (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). The half-brother to Japanese Derby winner Fusaichi Concorde (Jpn) (Caerleon), consigned by Northern Farm, was also bought by Sekiguchi. Also on offer during the opening session were foals by such American-bred sires as Afleet, Forty Niner, Holy Bull, Ogygian, Scan and Timber Country. A colt by Gone West out of MGSW Sixieme Sens (Septieme Ciel), consigned by Chiyoda Farm, was purchased by Yoshimi Ichikawa for 60,000,000 yen (\$421,644), while a full sister to top American grass mare Maxzene (Cozzene--Jacky Max {Ire}, by Sexton Blake {GB}), consigned by Northern Far, sold for 42,000,000 yen (\$295,151) to Masato Kaneko. The gross for the first day of the sale was \$19,065,354 for an average of \$226,969. The yearling session of the sale will be held today.

BACK TO WORK FOR INDIAN CHARLIE

Indian Charlie (In Excess {Ire}), who had not had a workout since May 12, breezed three furlongs in :36 yesterday morning at Santa Anita. "It was a nice little work," trainer Bob Baffert said. "I'm getting him cranked up again. The Derby was hard on him. When there's nothing for them down the road, I like to back off on them. I just didn't want to chew him up. You didn't see the real Indian Charlie in the Derby. He ran good on heart and ability." Baffert said that he has no immediate goals for the colt, who was third as the favorite in the Derby May 2, and will not set one until the horse is further along in his training. It was a busy morning for Baffert, who also sent out **Silver Charm** (Silver Buck) for a seven-furlong workout in 1:25 3/5. He is on target for the July 25 San Diego H. at Del Mar, which will now carry a purse of \$250,000. This year's Derby and Preakness hero **Real Quiet** (Quiet American) will work today or tomorrow.

A deserved and convincing success for Keos, who has now earned a serious step up to class in the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest at Deauville August 9, having shown that he can handle this sprint distance. He was placed twice over a mile in Group company earlier this season, in the G3 Prix Edmond-Blanc in April and then on his last start in the G2 Prix du Muguet May 1, both times beaten by Marathon. Settled in the rear by Cash Asmussen, Keos made his move on the extreme outside at the quarter-mile pole and once in the clear quickened impressively to hit the front at the sixteenth pole and draw away for the win, with pacesetter Dyhim Diamond (Ire) staying on well for second. The unlucky horse of the race was Andreyev (Ire), who hit traffic problems in the stretch and was last at the eighth pole. Once he found room he finished fast but all too late.

Local News: Florida

Donald Rudder and two other Thoroughbred owners have won a suit over the constitutionality of the state statute that they said compelled them to pay one-percent of their purse money to the Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, but Kent Stirling, executive director of the FHBPA, responded to the judge's ruling in their favor by saying, "For the last four years, Rudder has been getting 100 percent of his purse money. When new owners get licensed in Florida they have 30 days to inform us and the state they don't want to be a member. If they write us a letter, we tell the horsemen's bookkeeper to pay all of the purse money to them." While Rudder has not been contributing to the FHBPA, he does allow one-percent of the purse money he wins in New York to go to that horsemen's group. "I know Rudder belongs to the New York horsemen's group and he doesn't have a choice," said Stirling. "He has to pay one-percent to them." Robert Flynn, executive director of the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, confirmed, "Rudder is a member of our organization and he pays the one percent." Asked if Rudder ever sued over the constitutionality of the New York law, Flynn said, "No." Scott Savin, president of the FHBPA said, "A couple of years ago Rudder and his buddies complained there were no owners on our board. We've revised our by-laws to include eight owners and seven trainers on the board, which is where we're at now. He has another agenda. I'm not sure what it is." Ken Dunn, president of Calder said, "We have a contract with the horsemen and we are honoring the contract which calls for us to pay the one-percent."

Local News: Colonial Downs

According to the Harness Tracks of America newsletter, Virginia's Colonial Downs and its Thoroughbred horsemen have reached an agreement which will shorten the track's fall meet from 30 to 25 days. The Virginia Racing Commission, which meets Wednesday, must now give its approval of the plan.
