### TRIPLE CROWN HEROS PREP FOR HASKELL

Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner **Real Quiet** (Quiet American) and Belmont S. victor **Victory Gallop** (Cryptoclearance), who were separated by only a nose at the end of the 1 1/2-mile Belmont S. June 6, continued their preparations yesterday for the Aug. 9 GI Buick Haskell Invitational at Monmouth Park. Victory Gallop worked six furlongs at Churchill Downs. "He's doing really well," said trainer Elliott Walden. "He breezed in 1:17. He worked in company, and he beat the other horse by three or four lengths. He went the last eighth in :11 2/5." Walden's stable will ship from Churchill Downs to Saratoga July 24. While the \$250,000 Gil Jim Dandy S., to be run at the upstate New York track on the same day as Monmouth's million-dollar event, had been under consideration for Victory Gallop, the trainer said yesterday, "We're leaning toward the Haskell." Real Quiet breezed Tuesday as well, going five furlongs in 1:01 under exercise rider Dana Barnes at Santa Anita. "He went good, nice and easy," said trainer Bob Baffert, who will keep the colt in California until just before the Haskell.

### SUNDAY SILENCE COLT TOPS JRHA SALE

Sunday Silence continued his domination of the Japan Racing Horse Association's Selected Sales of Foals and Yearlings yesterday at Northern Horse Park in Hokkaido, Japan. Hip number 148, a colt by the Kentucky Derby-winning sire out of the Fappiano mare Fadetta brought 190,000,000 yen (\$1,335,207) to top both sessions of the two-day sale. The weanling was consigned by Northern Farm and purchased by Riichi Kondo. The second-highest price of yesterday's session was brought by hip number 183, a weanling daughter of Sunday Silence--Stella Madrid (Alydar), consigned by Shadai Farm and purchased for 175,000,000 yen (\$1,229,796) by T. M. International Inc. Of the 16 yearlings sold at the sale, top bid was for hip number 205, a colt by Caerleon--Lady Chatterley (Roberto). Consigned by Northern Farm, the colt sold for \$386,507 to Hisae Shimakura. During Tuesday's session, 65 horses sold for an aggregate of 2,138,000,000 yen (\$15,024,596) and an average of 32,892,308 yen (\$231,148). Overall, 149 horses sold for 4,851,000,000 yen (\$34,089,951) and an average of 32,557,047 yen (\$228,792).

Isle de France claimed her first Group success here, catching Minority (GB) in the final strides. In her previous start, her only race this year, she finished third in the listed Prix Tuileries at Longchamp June 27; in her final start last season, she was second in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac at Longchamp in October. THEATRIKEN (Theatrical {Ire}) led at a steady pace early, with Isle De France restrained in the rear. As the field came into the stretch, Amusing Time (Ire) took command as Theatriken began to fade. Amusing Time opened a one-length gap, but was soon challenged by Minority, who looked the likely winner. With three-sixteenths remaining, Isle De France, having been outpaced early in the stretch, began a run outside and finished strongly to grab the lead at the wire. Plans for Michael Tabor's daughter of Nureyev are fluid, with possible targets being the G2 Prix de Pomone at Deauville August 26 or the G1 Prix Vermeille at Longchamp September 13.

Prince Khaled Abdullah's three-year-old colt **Xaar (GB)** (Zafonic), away from the races since finishing a disappointing fourth in the G1 Sagitta 2000 Guineas May 2, looks set to reappear in this Sunday's mile and a quarter G2 Prix Eugene Adam at Maisons-Laffitte, his first start over further than a mile. Last season's Champion Juvenile in Europe, Xaar began 1998 with a win in the G3 Craven S. at Newmarket April 14. Following his failure in the 2000 Guineas, he has been given a long layoff, but only bad ground will prevent his reappearance Sunday, when a good run will mean another trip to England in August for the G1 Juddmonte International at York, run over an extended mile and a quarter and sponsored by his owner. Among those expected to oppose Xaar Sunday is **Dr Fong (Kris S.)**, winner of the G1 St James' Palace S. over a mile at Royal Ascot June 16.

## WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

### KIRBY'S SONG (f, 3, Sultry Song--Impulsive Lady, by Strike the Anvil)

Now a winner of six of her 12 starts, Canadian Oaks heroine Kirby's Song showed herself to be among the better three-year-old fillies of her crop with a decisive victory under top weight in Saturday's GII Monmouth Breeders' Cup Oaks.

A winner of three Grade I events in her native Canada, including the Canadian Oaks, Kirby's Song comes from the first crop by the Cox's Ridge stallion Sultry Song. Her pedigree at six generations is something of an outcross, the only duplications being the three-quarters brothers Royal Charger and Nasrullah, who appear 5x5x6, Polynesian 6x5 and Sir Gallahad III 6x6. This isn't the case, however, when we come to Kirby's Song's broodmare sire, the rarely seen Strike the Anvil. He is inbred 4x3 to the mare Broad Ripple, the duplication coming through her daughters Shimmer and Lois F. This pair are seven-eighths relatives, as one is by a son of Sir Gallahad III and one by a grandson. Shimmer and Lois F. are themselves both closely inbred, Shimmer having Sir Gallahad III 3x3 and Lois F. the same horse 3x2. It is also notable that Broad Ripple is a product of one of the fundamental crosses of the American Thoroughbred, that of Teddy (sire of Sir Gallahad III) and Commando. Shimmer has a second Teddy/Commando combination through her grandsire, Gallant Fox, and Strike the Anvil also has two more Teddy/Commando combinations close up in his pedigree.

A look at the pedigree of Buckfinder, the broodmare sire of Sultry Song, also reveals considerable concentrations of the Teddy/Commando cross. Two of these--Gaga and Businesslike--are in his sire Buckpasser, one featuring Bull Dog, a brother to Sir Gallahad III, and the other La Troienne, the most important daughter of Teddy. The third combination is in the distaff side of Buckfinder's pedigree, and comes through Fighting Fox, a brother to Gallant Fox, who is found in Kirby's Song's dam.

Working by accumulating strains which are related relatively deep in the pedigree is less predictable than inbreeding and linebreeding around the fourth, fifth and six generations, but when concentrations are involved, and especially when they involve genetic relatives (such as the siblings Fighting Fox/Gallant Fox and Bull Dog/Sir Gallahad III found here), good results can occur.

### PEDIGREE SHORTS

The well-bred Keos (c, 4, Riverman--Konafa, by Damascus) sprinted into the spotlight with a victory in Monday's G3 Prix de Ris-Orangis. Keos is a brother to graded stakes winner Korveya (dam of Hector Protector and Bosra Sham) and very closely related to the Group 1 winning Brief Truce (by a son of Riverman from this immediate family). The cross of Riverman and Damascus found here has supplied an earlier European Champion in the excellent miler Lahib. The reverse cross of Damascus over Riverman's sire, Never Bend, produced the excellent runner Desert Wine. That Damascus and Never Bend should combine successfully together is no surprise. Damascus is out of a mare by My Babu, and Never Bend and My Babu share a common genetic heritage. Never Bend is by Nasrullah out of a mare by a son of Djebel, and My Babu is by Djebel out of Nasrullah's close genetic relative, Perfume II.

Although she had been Group 1 placed, Winona (Ire) (f, 3, Alzao--My Potters, by Irish River {Fr}) had never won a stakes event until storming home seven lengths clear in Sunday's G1 Kildangan Stud Irish Oaks. Winona is linebred to the outstanding tap-root mare Source Sucree, who appears through a son, Turn-to, and a daughter, Black Brook. Turn-to is in the male line of Alzao's broodmare sire, Sir Ivor, and Black Brook in the female line of Irish River. Two other stallions out of Sir Ivor mares have sired stakes winners from daughters of Irish River--Be My Chief (Shigeru Summit) and Bluebird (Erin Bird and Dolphin Street).

The long awaited stakes debut of Manistique (f, 3, Unbridled--Astaire Step, by Nureyev) was everything that might have been hoped for, as the undefeated filly captured Sunday's GII Hollywood Oaks by 10 lengths. Manistique has linebreeding to Native Dancer, Nasrullah and Princequillo, but not through any apparently significant pattern. Nor has the cross of Fappiano (sire of Unbridled)-line stallions over mares by Nureyev worked before. It is interesting, however, to note that Unbridled has the French Derby winner Le Fabuleux as his broodmare sire, and there does seem to be a distinct Nureyev/Le Fabuleux affinity. Nureyev has sired four stakes winners out of mares by Le Fabuleux, three of them (Joyeux Danseur, Stately Don, Zilzal) Group or Grade 1 winners.

The very successful "trifecta" of My Babu, Turn-to and Ambiorix appears again in the pedigree of two-year-old stakes winner Crosswater (c, 2, Ogygian--Shucky Darn, by Ruhlmann), who kept his unbeaten record intact when taking Sunday's Emerald Express S. Ambiorix is a son of the mare Lavendula, and My Babu and Turn-to are grandsons.
