TALE OF THE CAT RETURNS FRIDAY Tale of the Cat (Storm Cat), winner of last year's GII King's Bishop S., will make his first start since running third in the GI Vosburgh S. at Belmont last September 27 in Friday's ninth race at Monmouth Park. A 50-percent interest in the four-year-old colt was purchased for \$7.1 million by the Coolmore-Ashford group last fall. Seven horses have been entered in the race, a one-mile-and-seventy-yard allowance contest. On his decision to run Tale of the Cat around two turns in his first start back, trainer John Forbes explained, "The objective has been to keep him sound, to try and get him to relax and back away from some of his speed a little bit. We want to make sure his legs hold together. We thought this would be easier on him, but it's not so far that we can't shorten him up to seven furlongs." Tale of the Cat tuned up for the race with a breeze Monday. "He went super," Forbes commented on the move. "He settled the first quarter and then took off running. He wound up going in :48 and out in a minute." Forbes cited Monmouth's August 1 GII Salvator Mile and Saratoga's GII Forego H. September 7 as possible next targets for his charge, with the ultimate goal the GI Vosburgh September 26.

FEASTING WITH FERNANDO THE JULY SALES

At around this time of the year, the place to be is Lexington, Kentucky, where the select yearling sales take center stage at Keeneland and Fasig-Tipton next week and where money flows like a bottle of good Bordeaux. For those of you out-of-towners with big-city style and tastes--yes you, who aren't going mufti in Madras shirts and khaki slacks like the locals--the question is: Where to eat and drink?

Follow the lead of an insider with impeccable and sophisticated culinary tastes: Frank Mitchell, formerly with *Daily Racing Form*, now with a major Lexington-based bloodstock agency. A bearded PhD who watches his weight and takes antioxidants (including two glasses of red wine with dinner), Mitchell has a knack for extracting some of the best and healthiest items from any given menu.

At the Kashmir Indian Restaurant at 341 South Lime Stone Street in Lexington (606-233-3060; owner Kashmira Singh), Mitchell was spotted eating one of the North Indian eatery's Tandoori specialties, Chicken Tandoori (\$7.95).

Prepared by chef Fingh Singh, the dish, half a chicken marinated in yogurt and spices and baked in traditional Indian style on a skewer in a charcoal-fired clay oven, was extraordinarily tender and visually appealing. "It's not spicy, but it's delicious," Mitchell said. "It has an exquisite smoky flavor."

Kashmir, which has been in operation for a year and a half, is one of two Indian restaurants in the Lexington area. Aside from its Tandoori specialties, the place offers an excellent array of lamb, chicken and vegetable dishes, including Lamb Bhuna (\$8.50), pan-fried cubes of lamb served with green peppers and onions; Lamb Korma (\$8.50), tender chunks of lamb cooked with spices, herbs and nuts in a cream sauce; and Lamb Rogan Josh (\$8.50), cubes of lamb cooked in butter, onions, ginger and garlic and simmered in spices and yogurt.

Be warned: the Chicken Vindaloo (\$8.25), which was comparable to what is served in New York-area Indian restaurants, is not recommended for the faint of heart: It is the spiciest curry dish on the menu and packs a mighty wallop.

Local News, England:

The English National Stud published its annual report yesterday, recapping an active year in which the organization leased Hector Protector (Woodman) and purchased Bahamian Bounty (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) and a controlling interest in Emarati (Danzig) as well as establishing the National Stud Breeders' Club. The Breeders' Club, launched in May, attracted 906 members who, for a one-time payment of £750 (\$1,254), will benefit from participating for five years in the ownership of broodmares and their offspring. Seven in-foal mares were purchased on behalf of the Club, all of which have had foals. The Stud's pre-tax net profit for the fiscal year was £142,000 (\$237,339).

The vegetarian dishes include the excellent Channa Saag (\$7.25), chick peas cooked in a tomato curry sauce, and Mutter Mushroom (\$7.25).

Kashmir, which has 17 tables, serves only beer and wine. Reservations are encouraged and credit cards and personal checks are accepted.

When Mitchell is not at Kashmir, he's usually at the upscale Roy and Nadine's, located at the Palomar Centre (606-223-0797; owner Roy Meyers; chef Jonathan Lundy). This is the place where Lexington's hipsters meet prepsters in a comfortably chic setting. The wine list here is excellent (try the Stag's Leap Cask #23 Cabernet Sauvignon 1994 at \$150 a bottle), as is the contemporary American cuisine and ambience.

Mitchell had the grilled salmon special, which he could tell you was high in the rich and important omega fatty acids, but he demurred: "It's very tasty and cooked beautifully, without being drenched in butter."

Other Mitchell favorites at R&N: the pasta dishes, including Primavera with Shrimp (\$14.95), Shrimp Linguine (\$14.95) and Grilled Chicken Fettuccine (\$11.95).

Also notable: Grilled NY Strip Steak (\$18.95), Grilled Rack of Lamb (\$21.95) and a Blackened Pork Tenderloin (\$13.95).

The chef also has a number of daily specials that are imaginatively created and attractively presented. Roy and Nadine's accepts credit cards and reservations.

Because he's a bloodstock agent, you'll find Mitchell on Monday or Tuesday night after the Keeneland sales at Dudley's at 380 South Mill Street (606-252-1010; owner Debbie Long; chef John Foster). Dudley's is an excellent restaurant, and a fancy one at that, but it is also where the big-time players gather to see and be seen after the hammer falls.

And owner Debbie Long is an extraordinarily accommodating hostess. "I've got some '89 Bordeaux, a few '82s and some '88s that I've been waiting to present," she said the other day. "And don't forget to mention that we'll stay open late during sales week and serve until midnight Monday and Tuesday."

Dudley's requires reservations (for the formal dining rooms) and accepts credit cards. I'll see you and Mitchell there Monday night. *Sid Fernando is Bloodstock Editor of Daily Racing Form.*
