### BREEDERS' CUP ANNOUNCES NEW RACE

**ORDER** Breeders' Cup Limited has announced a new order of races for the 15th Breeders' Cup Championship, to be held November 7 at Churchill Downs. Returning to its original format from 1984, the order of this year's Breeders' Cup Championship races is as follows: \$1 million Breeders' Cup Juvenile, \$1 million Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, \$1 million Breeders' Cup Sprint, \$1 million Breeders' Cup Mile, \$2 million Breeders' Cup Distaff, \$2 million Breeders' Cup Turf and \$4 million Breeders' Cup Classic. "With its increased stature and \$2 million purse, we feel that the Distaff should be placed after the million (dollar) races have been run," said D.G. Van Clief, Jr., president of Breeders' Cup Ltd. "We also believe that returning two-year-old races to the beginning of the program provides a better progression of events for the day." In addition to the new race order, for the first time, fans will be able to wager on a maximum of 14 betting interests in the Championship races, instead of the previous limit of 11.

**HASKELL HOPEFULS WORK** GI Belmont S. winner **Victory Gallop** (Cryptoclearance) worked a bullet six furlongs at Churchill yesterday morning in preparation for Monmouth Park's August 9 GI Haskell Invitational. "He's doing great," said trainer Elliott Walden. "He worked in 1:11 3/5, galloped out in 1:24 3/5 and pulled up the mile in 1:38. He started out about 10 lengths behind two other horses and beat them by about 15 lengths. The next fastest six-furlong work was in 1:15 and change. It was an awful good work." The Walden stable, including Victory Gallop, will ship to Saratoga Friday. Also pointing towards the Haskell, **Coronado's Quest** (Forty Niner), winner of the GII Dwyer in his last start, worked a half mile Tuesday at Belmont in :48 4/5. "He came out of the Dwyer good," trainer Shug McGaughey said. "We'll ship up to Saratoga Sunday and bring him down to Monmouth the Wednesday before the Haskell. We'll school him in the paddock one day. We want to get him in there and get him settled in."

## FASIG TIPTON RESULTS

**DEHERE COLT TOPS FASIG-TIPTON** Hip number 264, a dark bay colt by Dehere--Storm of Glory (Dactylographer) brought a final bid of \$220,000 to top yesterday's Fasig-Tipton Selected Yearlings Sale in Lexington, Kentucky. The colt, named Happy Sport and consigned by Marion G. Montanari, Cornerstone Stable, agent, was purchased by Lazy E Racing. After signing the ticket for the yearling, E. K. Gaylord II said, "He is the nicest colt in the sale. I might be a little prejudiced since I already have him, but I think he's got great balance, he's athletic and he's smart. I just love him. When I saw him I knew this was the one I wanted to have." Hip number 255, a daughter of Dehere--Spadina (Sharpen Up {GB}) consigned by Denali Stud, Agent IX, was the highest-priced filly of the sale, bringing a final bid of \$210,000 from Samantha Siegel. "I like Dehere as a sire and I took a little risk on that," Siegel explained. Asked if she expected to pay that much for the yearling, Siegel commented, "It's a little high, but the market is extremely high and with this new math, I give them a value and add 50 percent." Overall, gross sales increased 44 percent, from \$9,751,000 for 185 head in 1997 to \$14,036,500 for 253 in 1998. The average price increased five percent, from \$52,708 in 1997 to \$55,480 in 1998 and the median price increased 27 percent from \$37,000 in 1997 to \$47,000 in 1998.

**NO TIARA FOR JERSEY GIRL** Two-thirds of the way toward a sweep of New York Racing Association's Triple Tiara series, **Jersey Girl** (Belong to Me) will pass the final leg, Saturday's GI Coaching Club American Oaks at Belmont. Concerned that his three-year-old filly could have problems with the mile-and-a-half distance in the Oaks, trainer Todd Pletcher will instead point Jersey Girl toward the Aug. 1 GI Test at seven furlongs at Saratoga. "It was a tough decision," Pletcher said, adding that the recent heat wave in the area had contributed to his decision. "The mile and a half was probably the ultimate deciding factor, especially with the conditions we've had the last few days. If she didn't handle the mile and a half, the temperature was 98 degrees and she ran over a tiring surface, we might come out of it without the same horse we had going in. She's doing very well, but we think we're doing what's best for Jersey Girl." There have been eight winners of the Triple Tiara, which consists of the Acorn, Mother Goose and Coaching Club. The last was Sky Beauty in 1993.

**HARRY ORNEST SUFFERS FATAL STROKE**

Harry Ornest, the largest shareholder of Hollywood Park, died Tuesday after suffering a massive stroke Monday, according to published reports. He was 75. Ornest, vice chairman of the Hollywood Park board of directors, was a shareholder at the California track since 1992. Services will be held Thursday at Hillside Memorial Park in Los Angeles.

**BRIAN MAYBERRY DEAD** Brian Mayberry, trainer of 1994 Kentucky Oaks winner Sardula, died late Monday in Huntington Beach, California after a long battle with cancer. Mayberry's grandfather, J.P. Mayberry, trained 1903 Kentucky Derby winner Judge Himes. His daughter, April, is a Churchill Downs-based trainer who also works as an assistant to Bob Baffert. Mayberry was 60. He is survived by his wife, Jeanne, and another daughter, Summer.

**NYRA WITHHOLDS IN-HOME SIGNAL TO NEW YORK CITY**

With still no settlement in sight in its quest for a new agreement with New York City Off-Track Betting to provide its racing signal in homes in New York City, the New York Racing Association withheld the video signal of its races to homes in New York Wednesday morning. "It's about making sure an industry that has a direct, indirect and induced effect on gross domestic product of \$2.6 billion in New York State and directly provides more than 45,000 jobs survives and, indeed, thrives," said NYRA President and COO Terry Meyocks. "In a show of good faith, we did not immediately withhold the signal when the Appellate Division, First Department, in Manhattan confirmed our right to do so more than two months ago in mid-May. We wanted to reach a fair and equitable agreement with the new leadership at NYC OTB. The most recent agreement with OTB expired over a year ago on June 30, 1997. In-home simulcasting continues to have a drastic negative effect on the on-track business and has been a boom to NYC OTB. We feel we have reached a point where there is little alternative to exerting our legal rights which the court has upheld. We are only asking to be fairly compensated for the on-track losses due to in-home simulcasting in New York City." In response, NYC OTB President William Carnevale said, "This is an absolute disgrace and a slap in the faces of NYRA's best customers. Every time we've made an offer, they change the parameters. Their demands continue to escalate. Our most recent offer provides formulas that would raise the ante from \$4.2 million up to \$7 million. They came back looking for more than \$10 million guaranteed. This, in addition to \$41.5 million in statutory payments (in 1997)."
