\$1.85 MILLION COLT TOPS FASIG OPENER

With the sale just minutes old, bloodstock agent Buzz Chace, acting on behalf of Roger King, and Padua Stable's Satish Sanan engaged in a spirited bidding duel that ended with Chace walking away with the session-topping \$1.85 million colt at last night's opening session of the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Selected Yearlings Sale in Saratoga Springs, New York. After the dust settled, Sanan walked the few rows up to offer to be King's partner in the colt, but King declined. The much-prized yearling is a son of Breeders' Cup Juvenile champion Unbridled's Song out of the Crafty Prospector mare Win Crafty Lady. "He was an outstanding individual out of a great producing young mare," Chace explained. "He was the first I looked at when I got here. When Roger called and asked me if I liked anything, I said, 'This is a special horse.' He's got a beautiful head on him just like Unbridled's Song. He's got a lot of the mare in him, too." The bay yearling is a half brother to multiple graded stakes winner **Graeme Hall** (Dehere) and to the stakes-winning **Harmony Lodge** (Hennessy), a \$1.65 million two-year-old. He was consigned by Blackburn Farm, agent. Despite losing out on the session topper, Sanan was active throughout the auction, taking home four fillies for \$1.82 million. Asked about Padua Stables' current focus, Sanan said, "We're more interested in the fillies than the colts right now because we're trying to build a broodmare band. We're still focusing on quality and we have a certain amount of money to spend on the top quality horses, but we're also looking for some runners. We're not concentrating on top-class pedigree only." Padua's latest acquisitions will go to a variety of trainers, including the stable's longtime trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "We're spreading them around. We'll give a few to Bob Baffert, Todd Pletcher, Bill Mott, Michael Dickinson, Steve Asmussen, and Wayne still has a few," Sanan said. Padua's advisors at the sale included Lukas, farm manager Bruce Hill and Sanan's daughter Nadia. "[Nadia] has been working with Wayne the last two or three years," Sanan explained. "Wayne is still advising us. We're just using more than Wayne now." The sale continues today at 7:30 p.m. and concludes on Thursday.

KINANE LURED TO JOHANNESBURG Trainer Aidan O'Brien looks set to send **Johannesburg (USA)** (Hennessy {USA}) to the G1 Independent Wedgewood Phoenix S. at Leopardstown on Sunday and the winner of the G3 Norfolk S. at Royal Ascot June 21 and G3 Anglesey S. at The Curragh July 14 is likely to be partnered by Irish jockey Michael Kinane. Johannesburg is currently quoted the 16-1 ante-post favourite for next year's G1 2000 Guineas with William Hill. Kinane also has the option of heading to Deauville to partner either **Minardi (USA)** (Boundary {USA}) or **King Charlemagne (USA)** (Nureyev {USA}) in the G1 Prix Maurice Du Gheest. O'Brien told *Irish Racing online*, "I have not discussed it with Mick yet so I am not sure where he will be, but I imagine it will be Leopardstown. Minardi has been fine since his last race and is working well." Minardi also features among the entries for the £100,000 Dubai Duty Free Shergar Cup Sprint at Ascot on Saturday alongside stable companion **Juniper (USA)** (Danzig {USA}). O'Brien told *PA Sport* yesterday, "The plan is to drop Minardi back in trip and it's possible that one of the two could run in the Shergar Cup Sprint. We will probably decide on Wednesday." Blue Square offer Minardi as the 5-2 favourite for Saturday's six-furlong contest, with Ben Hanbury's **Mugharreb (USA)** (Gone West {USA}) and Jeremy Nosedá's **Hurricane Floyd (Ire)** (Pennekamp {USA}) quoted next best at 9-2.

Having finished third in his sole juvenile start, Ange Gabriel won his first three outings this season, all in the provinces, before winning his first metropolitan start in a valuable conditions event at Saint-Cloud June 13. The home-bred was kept close to the pace in fourth as British challenger **Island Sound (GB)** (**Turtle Island {Ire}**) led from **Maximum Security**. The latter was given the office inside the final quarter mile, but Ange Gabriel was soon in the ideal position to pounce. He grabbed the lead inside the last 100 yards and held on to win in determined style over **Maximum Security** with **Epitre** a promising third.

JOHNSTON KEEPS FAITH IN LUCKYMAN

Trainer Mark Johnston remained positive about his two-year-old **Leo's Luckyman (USA)** (Woodman {USA}) after a third place in the G3 Vintage S. at Goodwood Aug. 1. Beaten 2 1/2 lengths by Naheef (Ire) after tiring in the closing stages. He looks likely to re-appear in either the Listed Acomb S. at York Aug. 21 or the G2 Futurity S. at The Curragh Aug. 25. Johnston told *PA Sport* yesterday, "We have got to hope that the form wasn't correct and that he went too fast early on--several people have pointed out that he was the only one of the early leaders that was still there at the finish. Otherwise, the race turned around and the leaders fell out the back and those from behind stayed on and finished first, second, fourth and fifth. He was the only one to manage to go the pace and stay there. He is in good form, there are several opportunities for him and he will run somewhere before the end of the month. The Acomb S. at York and the Futurity S. at the Curragh are possibilities, so we will have to see." William Hill currently quotes the colt at odds of 25-1 for next year's G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket.

NEW IRISH BREEDERS' BONUS

Irish breeders received a welcome boost with the news that a Breeders' Prizes Scheme has been introduced. Breeders of Irish-foaled horses will be eligible to win over £500,000 over the next four years. The initiative will be funded by the recently established Thoroughbred foal levy and incorporates both flat and national hunt racing. The benefits include a £10,000 prize for the winning breeder of a special two-year-old race over six furlongs to be inaugurated in 2002. Dermot Cantillon, the breeders' representative on the IHA, told *Irish Thoroughbred Marketing*, "The fact that it is funded by money raised from breeders through the foal levy scheme is entirely appropriate."

IRISH FIXTURES TO INCREASE IN 2002

Following the publishing of the 2002 fixture list, Irish racing welcomed a nine-percent increase on this year's total. The 284 fixtures in the Irish racing calendar include an increase to the Listowel Harvest Festival in September, which now joins Galway's Festival as a seven-day event. The G1 Irish 2000 and 1000 Guineas will be staged May 25 and 26, respectively, at The Curragh. The G1 Irish Derby will be held June 30, the G1 Irish Oaks on July 14 and the G1 Irish Champion S. is set for Leopardstown Sept. 7.

PHONE TRICK CALLS ON EMPIRE STATE

Walmac International's **Phone Trick** (Clever Trick--Over the Phone, by Finnegan) has been sold for an undisclosed sum and will stand the 2002 breeding season at Dr. Jonathan Davis' Milfer Farm near Unadilla, New York. The 19-year-old stallion, who stood for a syndicate, covered mares this year at a fee of \$30,000. His stud fee for 2002 will be announced following the September yearling sales. "He's been a very notable stallion and a tremendous success and I wish him the best," John T.L. Jones, owner of Walmac International commented. "As the syndicate manager, I felt that they made an offer that should be brought to the shareholders' attention. I thought it was the fair thing to do. It was a very fair deal for the buyer and seller alike." The *Blood-Horse* reports that Davis and his partners purchased 39 of the 40 shares in the horse, with Louisiana breeder and owner Russ Sherrod maintaining his share. Phone Trick is the sire of 45 stakes winners to date, including 1997 Horse of the Year Favorite Trick, champion filly Phone Chatter and top sprinter Caller One.

Iron Mask Stays in States:

Three-year-old **Iron Mask** (Danzig), who was sixth on his stateside dirt debut in the GII AG Vanderbilt H. at Saratoga on Sunday, will continue his racing career under the care of Todd Pletcher. The winner of Singapore's KrisFlyer Sprint and G3 Prix d'Arenberg at Deauville, the bay colt was away slowly and never made an impact against Five Star Day. Trainer Criquelette Head-Maarek said, "He didn't break properly and the first time on the dirt was hard for him, but we had to try. He will remain in training in the States with Todd Pletcher, and I'm sure when he gets used to everything, he will be a nice horse. He will probably be suited by a longer distance there."

Thunder Rumble Returns to New York:

Thunder Rumble (Thunder Puddles--Lyphette {Fr}, by Lyphard), winner of the 1992 GI Travers S., will return to The Stallion Park in Millbrook. The 12-year-old stallion began his stud career at The Stallion Park and stood there from 1995 through 1998. He stood the last three seasons in Virginia. From four crops to race, Thunder Rumble's progeny have earned over \$1.3 million. He is owned by Braeburn Farm Corp., for whom he raced to victory in the GII Jim Dandy and Saratoga Cup H.

Flores's Excellent European Adventure:

California-based jockey David Flores is headed to ride in Europe this weekend, where he will participate as a member of the "Rest of the Word" team versus Team Europe in Saturday's Shergar Cup at Ascot. The afternoon features six races for which jockeys earn points based on the performance of their mounts. Flores, who won the UAE Derby earlier this year aboard Express Tour and rides first call for Godolphin at Del Mar, will tour the Godolphin operation at Newmarket Friday and will attempt to ride a few races at the Newmarket evening meeting on Friday. Flores will travel to Sweden on Sunday where he has accepted four mounts at Jägersro, including the ride aboard **Rickard** (Richard of York {GB}) in the Swedish Derby over 2400 meters on the dirt.

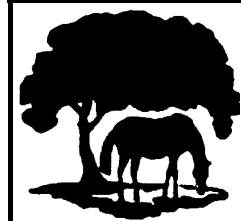

NUREYEV TO COVER RESTRICTED BOOK IN 2002

Walmac International stallion **Nureyev** (Northern Dancer--Special, by *Forli) will cover a limited book of "somewhere between 40 and 50 mares" in 2002, according to John T. L. Jones Jr., owner of Walmac International. The sire of a whopping 124 stakes winners to date, including 27 at the Group or Grade I level, the 24-year-old will be bred to mares owned or approved by the syndicate. "He will be 25 next year and his fertility has dropped to a point where we feel this is appropriate," said Jones Jr., who also acts as the syndicate manager. "We bred him around the clock on an on-call basis for 20 years, but we just can't do that anymore," he added. The champion three-year-old in France in 1980, Nureyev covered approximately 40 mares this season. His 10 stakes winners in 2001 include GII San Diego H. winner Skimming, who starts next in the GI Pacific Classic; Senure, who won the GI United Nations H. in his most recent start; and Black Hawk (GB), winner in Japan of the G1 Yasuda Kinen this season.

GOLDEN SNAKE RETIRED **Golden Snake** (Danzig--Dubian {GB}, by High Line {GB}) has been retired to the National Stud after sustaining a career-ending injury, it was announced yesterday. The five-year-old sustained a fracture to his near-fore knee during his run in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot July 28 where he finished sixth. Golden Snake, a half brother to the top-class miler Sayyedati, won four Group 1 races from three to five. Successful in the G1 Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly in June 1999, he returned as a four-year-old to take the G1 Preis von Europa at Cologne in September before winning the G1 Gran Premio del Jockey Club Italiano in Milan the following month. This term, he returned to win the G1 Prix Ganay at Longchamp Apr. 29 before finishing a neck behind Fantastic Light in the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at The Curragh May 27. Due to be retired at the end of the season, he was on course for the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp Oct. 7. Jockey Pat Eddery, who partnered the horse in all starts this year, said yesterday, "This is very sad news. Golden Snake showed plenty of speed to win the Prix Ganay and has a wonderful temperament. He is a brave, genuine horse." He was purchased by the National Stud early last year and is due to stand there for the 2002 season. He will stand at a fee of £8,000 Oct. 1 terms.

The Jim Dandy S. is named for the horse who caused one of the greatest upsets in Saratoga history. The 1930 renewal of the Travers S. looked to be a match between that year's Triple Crown winner Gallant Fox, and the highly fancied Whichone. Gallant Fox disposed of Whichone, but on a sloppy track was run down by Jim Dandy, a 100-1 shot.

The 2001 Jim Dandy didn't contain a Triple Crown winner, but it did feature A P Valentine and Congaree, the second and third in this year's GI Preakness S. Since the Preakness, Congaree had scored an impressive victory in the GI Swaps S. and A P Valentine finished a game second in the GI Belmont S., and this year's Jim Dandy looked like a dual between the pair. In the event, Congaree defeated A P Valentine by a length and a quarter, but their battle turned out to be for third and fourth as a pair of interlopers--Scorpion and Free of Love--fought for victory nearly six lengths in front of Congaree.

Unlike Jim Dandy, Scorpion, who prevailed by a half-length, was no apparently forlorn 100-1 shot, but he was recording his first stakes victory in 13 starts. He showed considerable promise last year when, after scoring on his racecourse debut, he earned places in four graded stakes, including a second in the GII Saratoga Special S. and a third in the GI Futurity S. After opening this year with a win in allowance company, he appeared to have lost his way, finishing unplaced in three stakes events. However, he returned to form to take a Belmont Park allowance race on July 4, and with his Jim Dandy triumph has finally begun to fulfill his potential.

Scorpion is a member of the 19th crop sired by Seattle Slew, and this crop is turning out to be one of Slew's best. In addition to Scorpion, it also includes the 2001 Grade I winners Flute and Fleet Renee and English group winner Sahara Slew. Scorpion is out of Petiteness, a stakes-placed daughter of the up-and-coming broodmare sire Chief's Crown. The cross of Seattle Slew and his sons over Chief's Crown mares appears to be a promising one as Scorpion is the fourth stakes winner bred on the cross, which has produced another GISW in Excellent Meeting (by Seattle Slew's son General Meeting). It might well be significant that Chief's Crown is out of a mare by Secretariat, the ultimate example of the successful Nasrullah/Princequillo cross. Seattle Slew himself is bred on an extended version of the Nasrullah/Princequillo cross (with the Nasrullah coming through Bold Ruler, as in Secretariat) and his maternal grandsire Poker is by a son of Round Table out of a Nasrullah mare. Of course, the cross of Seattle Slew over a Secretariat mare produced one of Slew's best runners, A.P. Indy, now his most important stallion son.

Petiteness's dam, Affirmatively is a daughter of Affirmed out of champion Straight Deal, and thus is three-quarters sister to Belonging, a stakes winner who foaled the successful young stallion Belong to Me to the cover of Chief's Crown's sire Danzig. Affirmatively is also a half sister to Desiree and So Endearing, a pair of notable females by Affirmed's grandsire Raise a Native. Desiree won the GI Santa Barbara H., and to Scorpion's sire Seattle Slew, produced the dual GISW Adored. So Endearing is dam of the GI Del Mar Futurity winner Qualify, a son of Danzig and so closely related to Scorpion's dam. Another half sister to Affirmatively, Reminiscing, produced graded stakes winner Persevered (by Affirmed), and the high-class sprinters Premiership and Commemorate (both by Affirmed's sire, Exclusive Native).

Scorpion's fourth dam No Fiddling is a granddaughter of La Troienne, which is significant when one considers that Seattle Slew's dam is inbred to Striking and Busher, sisters who are also granddaughters of La Troienne. His third dam, Straight Deal is three-quarters sister to Regal Gleam, the granddam of G1 French Derby winner and champion sire Caerleon, and also to Priceless Gem, the dam of Allez France. This is also the same branch of the La Troienne family as such luminaries as Relaxing, Easy Goer, Easy Now, Cadillacing, Eastern Echo, Sea Hero, La Gueriere, Super Staff, Ordway and current Grade/Group I winners Tweedside and Mozart. You don't see pedigrees much stronger than this, and Scorpion looks sure to be in great demand as a sire when he retires from the racetrack.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

Sassy Hound (c, 4, Deerhound--Sassy Sue, by Invincible Dooley), winner of the Claiming Crown Rapid Transit S., has an unusual build up of Buckpasser's family. Not only does he have Buckpasser 3x4 (including as broodmare sire of the sire), he also has Buckpasser's dam Busanda 4x5x5. The second strain comes in via Buckpasser's half brother Bupers, Sassy Hound's granddam having Busanda 3x3 through Buckpasser and Bupers.

Another weekend stakes winner with a similar multiplication of a notable mare is **Lady Vye (f, 2, Vying Victor--Immediate Answer, by Beau Genius)**, winner of the B.C. Cup Debutante S. at Hastings Park. Her dam has the brothers Viceregal and Vice Regent 3x2 in the pedigree. Her sire, Vying Victor is a grandson of Victorian Heiress, who is a three-parts sister to Viceregal and Vice Regent as she is by Northern Dancer (sire of Viceregal and Vice Regent) out of that pair's granddam, the Windfields Farm tap-root mare, Victoriana. For good measure, Lady Vye's fourth dam is a daughter of Northern Dancer's sire, Nearctic.

FIFTH-CROP SIRE

The 'sire crop' which retired to stud in 1994, and whose first foals were born in 1995 (their first foals are six-year-olds in 2001), has not been all that influential. The early development among the North American contingent of sires proved to be *Belong to Me*, a sprinting son of *Danzig* who began his career in New York state and was bought by Lane's End for the 1998 breeding season. His first Kentucky crop is now two-year-olds. Among European sires, the early leader was *Tenby*, a son of *Caerleon* who had been sold by *Coolmore* to *Japan* before he even had runners.

Heavy favorites to head the F95 hit parade had been *Kingmambo* (by *Mr. Prospector* out of *Miesque*) in America and *Zafonic* (by *Gone West*) in Europe. The two were old rivals, and though I was among those favoring *Zafonic* over *Kingmambo* (he was justifiably rated five pounds higher as a racehorse), the truth is either or both were eligible to make sires.

For a while, it looked like neither would. A third of *Kingmambo's* already small first crop went to *Japan*, and at the end of 1997, he was languishing in the second 10 of the North American freshman sire list, and his sales prices were plummeting. *Zafonic* had the top-class two-year-old *Xaar*, but not a lot else that panned out in his first crop.

It wasn't really until the end of 1998, when his first-crop three-year-old *El Condor Pasa* defeated his elders in the *Japan Cup* and the U.S. two-year-old *Lemon Drop Kid* won the *GI Futurity*, that it began to look like that early negative reading for *Kingmambo* was misplaced, and the bandwagon reversed direction.

Following a succession of Group 1 colts in each of his first four crops (2000 English Guineas winner *King's Best* and French 2000 champion two-year-old *Okawango* completed the set), *Kingmambo* finished last year with an 'APEX A' Sire rating index of 4.06. Backed up by an average of more than five A Runners (top two percent earners in a year) in each of his first three crops, and with the likes of triple Grade II winner *King Cugat* and *Voodoo Dancer* flying the flag in 2001, it is this observer's view that *Kingmambo* is actually the youngest Top 12 sire in the world. The company doesn't get any headier than that.

9 STAKES WINNERS THIS YEAR

Xaar notwithstanding, just at the time it was becoming clear that Kingmambo was the Real Deal, Zafonic was threatening to sink without trace. It wasn't looking like quite as big a gaffe as when I tipped J.O. Tobin to be a better sire than Seattle Slew when they first went to stud (now, amazingly, more than 20 years ago), but it wasn't looking too good, either. By the end of 1999, when he'd had three crops reach the races, Zafonic had only three individual A Runners, and was looking a decidedly average sire at best.

Suddenly, the clocks changed and Zafonic came to life with a vengeance. Maybe he was always going to be a 21st century sire, because in the year 2000, Zafonic's fourth crop included four two-year-old group winners, and he more than doubled his previous output of individual A Runners, adding four new ones. This year, from a crop of 94 two-year-olds, he already has nine two-year-old winners, including G2 Prix Robert Papin winner Zipping, G2 Richmond S. close fourth (beaten a nose for third) Mr. Sandancer and the promising Tumbleweed Charm, like three of Zafonic's previous A Runners, out of a Sadler's Wells mare. He also had three-year-old fillies Canasita and Linea d'Ombra run 1-2 in Deauville's Prix de la Calonne (L) last weekend. Zafonic hasn't exactly risen from the dead since the beginning of last year, but he has gone from barely breathing to actually claim top position among European F95 sires in the category of A Runner Index (consider this a variant of the average-earnings index which reduces the undue influence of one huge earner).

A pedigree note: Kingmambo is by Mr. Prospector out of Miesque, by Nureyev; Zafonic is by Mr. Prospector's son, Gone West, out of a mare by The Minstrel. So both are bred on roughly the same cross, Mr. Prospector on Northern Dancer. And both work very well with mares who are themselves Northern Dancer-line: seven of Kingmambo's 18 A Runners (almost 40 percent) are out of Northern Dancer-line mares; Zafonic is four (three Sadler's Wells) for seven.

As the 2001 yearling sales swing into action, much will be forgotten or forgiven in both sires' cases. Not so much this month--Kingmambo has three at Saratoga and two at Deauville, Zafonic just three at Deauville--but more in September (especially in Kingmambo's case) and October. These are sires on their way up, not on their way down, though Kingmambo's pedigrees are starting to improve rapidly, whereas Zafonic's could just about still be going the other direction. Whatever his yearlings sell for this year, if Kingmambo is a Top 12 sire, like I think, they're going to look cheap in 12 months' time. If the Zafonic yearlings, on the other hand, sell like their sire is still in cold storage, there could be some good bargains among them.
