CELESTIAL HEIGHTS AT F-T SARATOGA

His big sister Saudi Poetry sold at this sale for \$1.7 million in 1998 and has blossomed into a leading contender in this year's Distaff division. John Ferguson has similarly high expectations for hip number 88, the colt by Storm Cat out of Gone to Venus (Gone West), who was all the rage during last night's second session of the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Selected Yearling Sale. Ferguson, bloodstock adviser to Sheikh Mohammed, went to \$3.3 million for the colt, who was consigned to the sale by Taylor Made Sales Agency. "He was one of the standouts of the sale," Ferguson said. "Obviously coming in, he an outstanding pedigree. I had seen him on the farm before the sale and liked him very much. When he came up to Saratoga, I liked the way he had developed. We feel this is a horse with a chance to have a great career on the racetrack." Duncan Taylor of Taylor Made echoed that sentiment. "I think he is a great colt with all the potential in the world," he said. "He's just one of those kind you'd love to win a Grade 1 with and stand at stud. He's the kind you dream of having." Ferguson indicated that Sheikh Mohammed will make the decision during the September Sales as to whether the horse will stay in the U.S. with Eoin Harty or be turned over to David Loder in Newmarket. *(F-T Saratoga cont. p2)*

QUINN BAN REDUCED Trainer Mick Quinn yesterday had his ban reduced to 18 months after an appeal against the 30-month ban for neglect of horses under his care. The decision by the Jockey Club to ban Quinn from handling horses was originally due to a complaint that some of his horses were in a poor condition, isolated in a paddock. Jockey Club spokesman John Maxse told *PA Sport*: "The board was satisfied that the seriousness of Quinn's breach was such that it upheld the disciplinary committee's decision to withdraw Quinn's licence to train. However, despite the obvious gravity of the facts admitted by Quinn and the case proved against him, the board took the view that it would not be appropriate to the offence to impose such a penalty as might effectively end his career as a racehorse trainer on a permanent basis."

CHESTER CELEBRATES GOLDEN SUMMER

Chester racecourse were yesterday celebrating record attendances and a 15-percent increase from their summer racing programme. The track, known as "the Roodee", was yesterday boasting an average paying attendance of almost 20,000 per fixture from the first eight of the 11 fixtures from May to September. Chief Executive Richard Thomas said yesterday: "We're enjoying a fabulous year. We got off to a great start with the May Festival, which was up almost 10 percent on 2000, and it's just gone on growing since then."

MORE BANS HANDED OUT

Richard Quinn was the latest jockey to fall foul of the stewards yesterday, picking up a three-day ban. The ban, which runs from Aug. 17-19 inclusive, was handed out as a result of irresponsible riding of a minor nature in a Brighton handicap. Dean Mernagh was also under the hammer, being found guilty of irresponsible riding of a major nature at Newcastle yesterday. His ban will run from Aug. 17-24 inclusive, meaning he will miss the York Ebor meeting.

CHAMPAGNE ENTRIES UP AGAIN

Doncaster's £100,000 G2 Rothmans Royals Champagne S. Sept. 14 has attracted a total of 107 entries, an increase of 26 percent from last year. Leading the entries are 22 Aidan O'Brien-trained juveniles. The unbeaten **Johannesburg (USA)** (Hennessy {USA}) heads the Ballydoyle contingent alongside G3 Railway S. (The Curragh July 1) winner **Rock of Gibraltar (Ire)** (Danehill {USA}); **Landseer (GB)** (Danehill {USA}), winner of the G3 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot June 19; and **Roar of the Tiger (USA)** (Storm Cat {USA}), the full-brother to Giant's Causeway (USA) and winner of a Naas maiden June 21. David Loder, responsible for last year's winner Noverre (USA), has a total of 18 two-year-olds in the list, including **Dubai Destination (USA)** (Kingmambo {USA}), winner of a Newmarket maiden July 10. Also included from Godolphin stables are **Meshaheer (USA)** (Nureyev {USA}), winner of the G3 July S. at that meeting July 11, and **Naheef (Ire)** (Marju {Ire}), winner of the G3 Vintage S. at Goodwood Aug. 1. Barry Hills, who has won this event four times, including in 1999 with Distant Music (USA), has **Serieux (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) among his entries this time and that colt created an impression when winning a Goodwood maiden July 31. Tim Betteridge, General Manager at Doncaster Racecourse, said, "The Rothmans Royals Champagne Stakes is one of the most prestigious two-year-old races of the season and we are delighted by the massive entry which has been received this year. Noverre's success last season indicates that only a top-class horse will be capable of succeeding in the race next month."

JOHANNESBURG FAVOURITE FOR PHOENIX

Aidan O'Brien's **Johannesburg (USA)** (Hennessy {USA}) was yesterday installed the 5-4 favourite with Cashmans for Sunday's G1 Independent Wedgewood Phoenix S. at Leopardstown. The winner of the G3 Norfolk S. at Royal Ascot June 21 and G3 Anglesey S. at The Curragh July 14, who is due to be ridden by Michael Kinane, is the current 16-1 ante-post favourite for next year's G1 2000 Guineas with William Hill. He looks the most likely of the five Ballydoyle entries to bid for a fourth consecutive renewal for the stable. Aidan O'Brien told *Irish Racing online*: "Johannesburg is our strongest possible for the race and everything is good with him so far. Obviously Johannesburg has done everything we have asked him to do. He couldn't have done anything more. Rock Of Gibraltar is a possible too, and we obviously might run others. None of ours would want soft ground."

VALID EXPECTATIONS TO STAY IN TEXAS

Valid Expectations (Valid Appeal--Mepache, by Iron Constitution), North America's leading freshman and juvenile sire who was represented by two new winners Tuesday alone, will remain at William S. Farish's Huisache Farm near Hempstead, Texas for the 2002 breeding season. "We wanted to let the Texas breeders know that the horse would be staying in Texas this year," said Bill Farish of Lane's End. "There were some rumors that he would be going to Kentucky, generated mostly because he was doing so well. However, the partnership consisting of Lane's End, Leland and Robert Ackerley, Joe Archer, Greg Goodman, and Robert and Janice McNair has decided to keep this exciting young stallion in Texas for the 2002 breeding season." Valid Expectations has now sired 13 winners and three stakes horses, including stakes winners Expected Program, winner of the Willard L. Proctor Memorial S. and the Haggin S. at Hollywood, and Expected Hour, winner of the Victoria S. His daughter Lost Expectations was placed in the GII Schuylerville S. at Saratoga. He will stand for \$12,500 live foal in 2002.

DREAMS GALLORE RETIRED

Dreams Gallore (Silver Ghost--Fitnah, by Fit To Fight), the winner of the 1999 GI Mother Goose S. at Belmont Park, has been retired due to a chipped bone in an ankle. The winner of the GIII Honeybee S. at Oaklawn Park early in her sophomore season, the bay was second to Silverbulletday in the GI Kentucky Oaks and the GII Black-Eyed Susan S. prior to her Belmont success. She followed with a second in the GI CCA Oaks in 1999, but was sidelined and did not return until this past March 12, when she took a Fair Grounds allowance, her only win in five starts this year. Seventh in the GI Go For Wand H. in her final start July 29, the five-year-old retires with five wins from 16 starts and earnings of \$588,615.

STRONACH INTERESTED IN NYRA Magna International Chairman Frank Stronach shook up the proceedings at a one-day racing law conference held Tuesday at the Gideon-Putnam Hotel in Saratoga Springs, New York. Stronach, who was not on the list of speakers at the conference, said, "We would not only love to buy NYRA, but would love to make it a major entertainment and destination center. It needs investment. It needs jazzing up." His statement comes just one week after Magna was announced as the winning bidder to purchase New York City Off-Track Betting Corporation. Stronach also butted heads with New York State Senator Howard Nolan, himself a horse owner and breeder, who was critical of Magna's management of their racetracks and failure to fulfill promises made to horsemen at their tracks. According to *Daily Racing Form*, the state of New York will not allow bidding on the NYRA franchise until 2005. NYRA's current franchise expires in 2007.

The van ride up to Saratoga for the \$3.3 million colt. Somewhere along the way, he kicked the wall of the van and hit his hock. While the situation never proved serious, Duncan Taylor was full of praise for his team. "I've got to give a lot of credit to the staff," he said. "They stayed on top of it and got him ready." John Ferguson also monitored the situation closely. "We have vets and specialists here," he explained. "They discussed it with the consignor and it won't be an issue." In the end, little was going to dissuade Ferguson from the colt. "He had the three things we want to see in a yearling-- pedigree, conformation and athleticism. One always values a yearling before going in and he came within our evaluation pricewise"

You Win Some, You Lose Some

Eugene Melnyk was circling Saratoga overhead as he competed by phone for the eventual sales topper. He ultimately lost that battle, but bounced back to account for the evening's top-priced filly. Hip 120, by A.P. Indy out of Canada's champion two-year-old filly of 1996 Larkwhistle (Silver Deputy), was hammered down for a final bid of \$2,000,000. "She's a beautiful individual, who is fantastically bred and vetted immaculately," Melnyk said of the bay, who was consigned by Anderson Farms. "I'm trying to build a Canadian contingent and hopefully she's going to be a big part of it. She is a Canadian bred--for me that was a huge incentive." Of his misfortune on the topper, Melnyk waxed philosophical. "That colt is an exceptional colt, but that is a lot of money," he said. "You can't buy every great horse. September is going to come and that is my hunting ground."

A Good Day For Live Oak

Live Oak Plantation's GIII Fort Marcy H. winner Strategic Mission looked good winning the eighth race on Saratoga's Wednesday card and the victory had principal Charlotte Weber positively giddy. Trainer Bill Mott signed the ticket on behalf of Weber for hip number 135, the third and final seven-figure horse of the session. The colt, by Storm Cat out of GIII Cardinal H. winner La Caerleona (Fr) (Caerleon) was consigned to the sale by Lane's End, agent for Robert and Janice McNair's Stonerside Stable. "Physically he looks like he has what it takes to be a winner," Mott commented. "You wouldn't buy a horse like that if he didnt have a sire's pedigree. I thought he could bring a little more than that. We had discussed the figures before the bidding started and we werent too far off."

Calumet Takes Home Four

Calumet was listed as the successful bidder on four separate lots for gross receipts of \$1,520,000. The most expensive of their purchases was hip number 110, a colt by 1997 Belmont S. winner Touch Gold, whose is represented by his first crop of yearlings this year. The chestnut, consigned by Lane's End, agent, is out of the 10-year-old mare Innocently Astray (Gone West), a multiple stakes-placed performer and winner of five races. Calumet also took home hip 105, a filly by Coronado's Quest out of Hugsie (Summer Squall), herself a full sister to 1996 champion two-year-old filly Storm Song; hip 111, a filly by Unbridled's Song out Intriguing, a half sister to Quiet American; and hip 121, a colt by Gold Fever out of Lassie's Lady, making him a half to Shuailaan. The dam is a half to blue-hen mare Weekend Surprise.

Impressive Returns So Far

Last night's middle session featured sensational across-the-board gains in each of the important statistical categories. The gross of \$19.9 million represents a whopping 70-percent increase against 2000 while the session average of \$398,000 was up 56.5 percent from 2000. The median was also ahead by a healthy 29.2 percent. With one session to go, total gross receipts have jumped by 58.5 percent, the average has skyrocketed by over one third and the median is at a level 18.9 percent higher than a year ago.
