ELECTRIFYING NUMBERS AT SARATOGA

Electrical storms caused the power to go out approximately 10 minutes before yesterday's third session of the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Selected Yearlings Sale, but nothing could keep the energy out of this record-setting auction. When the lights came back on minutes later, energetic buyers continued their shopping sprees on what was hailed by many players as an excellent group of horses. "We had the kind of horses that could lead to a big sale," said Fasig-Tipton President Walt Robertson. "Consignors and buyers were looking for a big sale after they went through the horses." Two \$3 million colts shared session-topping honors on a night that saw five offerings, all colts, bring seven-figure amounts.

Which Blue Silks Will He Be Wearing?

The fireworks began when hip number 193, a bay colt by Kingmambo out of the Seattle Slew mare Seattle Way, came into the ring. As the bidding quickly passed \$2 million, the battle was between Coolmore's Demi O'Byrne and Godolphin representative John Ferguson. During the bidding, announcer Terence Collier told the captivated crowd, "We know he's going to be wearing blue silks, we just don't know which ones." O'Byrne, who had not taken home a horse on the first two nights, finally prevailed. "He's a big, good-looking colt and he has a little bit of pedigree on him, doesn't he?" said the Irish veterinarian. "He brought just about what we thought he would." The colt, whose second dam is champion handicap mare Waya (Fr), is a half-brother to Seattle Bay (Opening Verse), a multiple Group stakes-placed filly in France. He was consigned by Derry Meeting Farm, agent for George Strawbridge, Jr. During the days leading up to the sale, the colt resided in the same stall that had housed Danzig when Derry Meeting Farm sold him at the 1978 Saratoga Sale. "Well, I'm still in a big daze," said farm owner Bettina Jenney, wife of the late Marshall Jenney. "I am so proud of the farm and our staff for taking such good care of him. Mostly, I'm thinking about my late husband, and wishing he were here."

HOUGHTON CATALOGUES 190 Perennial champion sire Sadler's Wells (USA) looks set to dominate the Tattersalls Houghton Yearling Sale, to be held Oct. 2-4. The Coolmore stallion accounts for 27 of the 190 yearlings on offer, most notably a colt out of Bosra Sham (USA) and a three-parts brother to Crystal Music (USA), both from Watership Down Stud. Of his fillies, the standouts are a sister to the smart Xtra (GB) and a three-parts sister to Thady Quill (USA) out of a half-sister to Balanchine (USA), as well as the first foal from South African star Igreja (Arg). Among the other European sires represented are Anabaa (USA), Danehill (USA), Darshaan (GB), Indian Ridge (Ire), Machiavellian (USA), Nashwan (USA) and Rainbow Quest (USA). Some of the leading American sires also have yearlings catalogued, including Danzig (USA), Gone West (USA), Kingmambo (USA), Nureyev (USA), Rahy (USA), Saint Ballado (USA), Seattle Slew (USA) and Seeking the Gold (USA). Yearlings from the first crops of Bahhare (USA), Peintre Celebre (USA), Swain (Ire), Tale of the Cat (USA) and Tamarisk (Ire) will also be offered. The catalogue is studded with star relations, including a half-brother to Oath (Ire) by Desert Prince (Ire), a three-parts brother to Mozart (Ire) by Polish Precedent (USA) and a half-brother to champions Opera House (GB) and Kayf Tara (GB) by Singspiel (Ire). BHB DISAPPOINTED AT SUNDAY CUT-BACK

British racing will take place on 20 Sundays in 2002, one less than this year, it was revealed on Wednesday. Fixtures and evening meetings will increase marginally, and there will be new all-weather opportunities over the Christmas period, but the British Horseracing Board are mourning the loss of opportunity to expand Sunday racing. Managing Director Chris Reynolds said: "It is very disappointing that it has not been possible to strengthen the Sunday programme, but BHB accepts that trainers and their staff have needed time to discuss how best to ensure that flexible staffing arrangements can be introduced in the future."

FLORES' SATURDAY SPECIAL

American jockey David Flores, who takes on Team Europe as a member of the "Rest of the World" team in tomorrow's six-race Shergar Cup at Ascot, said yesterday, "I am happy ride to here--it is a privilege for me. I am happy to ride anytime, anywhere. I miss a pretty good week at Del Mar, but I can always go back and do well." Flores, making his first appearance at a British racetrack, added, "Two things are different here--the stretch is uphill at Ascot and you go the other way around. The horses know their way--I hope they take me there. I've had good advice. I will be saving some horse for the end, but otherwise the differences are just little things." Flores rides at Newmarket this evening and will ride out for Godolphin Saturday morning before competing at Ascot. He will be in Sweden Sunday to ride four, including Rickard (Swi) in the Swedish Derby. Britain and Ireland were yesterday quoted as the 1-2 favourites by the sponsors to win the Shergar Cup, with the "Rest Of The World" on 6-4. Kevin Darley, who will captain Britain and Ireland, commented yesterday, "I'm looking forward to Saturday, I'm sure its going to be a great day. I think it is a great opportunity for the foreign riders to compete against the best jockeys in England and Ireland in very competitive races. Obviously Ascot is not the easiest of tracks, so hopefully we'll be able to have a hand in tactics and whatever else is involved and show them how it's ridden." Japanese jockey Norihiro Yokoyama, who will also be on show on Saturday, remarked, "I have ridden in Hong Kong and Deauville, as well as against overseas jockeys in Japan. I have been watching videos of the big races at Ascot. It is not that much different to riding a race in other countries. I am confident about riding here. I am not worrying, but I will walk the course."

GOFFS REGISTER "SUBSTANTIAL INCREASE"

Goffs yesterday reported a 93-percent increase in after-tax profits from last year's Orby and Challenge Sales. Profits rose to Ir£1.42 million on the back of a record turnover of over Ir£39 million from the two sales. Goffs Chairman Michael Osborne told *Irish Racing Online*, "It is the second year in succession our profits registered a substantial increase, while resources supporting the business also increased significantly over the same period."

MINNALOUSHE TO YORK

Black Minnaloushe (USA) (Storm Cat {USA}) will continue on the path followed by Giant's Causeway (USA) last year by taking in the G1 Juddmonte International at York Aug. 21, it was revealed yesterday. Aidan O'Brien confirmed that the hero of the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas and G1 St James' Palace S. is on course for the 10-furlong contest. The colt was fifth in the G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown July 7, where his stable companion Bach (Ire) was third, and third in the G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood Aug. 1. O'Brien explained to *Irish Racing online*: "When the horse won the Irish Guineas, we found out the way to ride him was to drop him out and give him plenty of cover until the last minute. Michael [Kinane] came back after Goodwood and said he couldn't get any cover and got there a furlong and a half too quick. I'm not worried about the trip at York."

Domedriver, successful at two in the Listed Prix Isonomy at Maisons-Laffitte in October, added to his tally here in taking style. Third in the Listed Prix Djebel at Longchamp Apr. 13, he was a disappointing 13th in the G2 Premio Parioli (Italian 2000 Guineas) at Rome May 1. Last time he put up an improved effort when a half-length second to Aghnoyoh in the G3 Prix de la Jonchere at Chantilly June 18. He built on that performance to return to his winning ways here. Settled in fourth early by Thierry Jarnet as all bar Corne d'Auroch (Fr) (Snurge {Ire}) tracked wide for the better ground, he always had the measure of the long-time leader Mister Bold (Fr) (Poplar Bluff {GB}). Grabbing the lead with a furlong remaining, he was pushed out with hands and heels to comfortably account for Ratio's challenge. "He is a very consistent horse who has never run a bad race, except for his run in the Italian 2000 Guineas when the ground was too fast for him," said winning trainer Pascal Bary. "We will now move him back up in a class and he may run next in the G3 Prix Quincey at this track Aug. 28."

FOREIGNERS DOMINATE FRENCH SPRINT

Overseas challengers account for nine of the 10 horses entered in Sunday's G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest at Deauville. Pascal Bary's **Danger Over (GB)** (Warning {GB}), runner-up to Sartorial (Ire) in the G3 Prix de Ris-Orangis at the track July 8, is the sole domestic representative. He faces a strong English challenge again here, headed by Godolphin's **Three Points (GB)** (Bering {GB}). **Tertullian (USA)** (Miswaki {USA}), winner of the G3 Prix de la Porte Maillot at Longchamp June 26, is the sole German raider, while Aidan O'Brien looks likely to be represented by **Minardi (USA)** (Boundary {USA}), who misses the Shergar Cup Sprint at Ascot on Saturday due to a minor setback, and **King Charlemagne (USA)** (Nureyev {USA}).

SHOGUN LODGE TOPS NIGHT OF CHAMPIONS

Randwick trainer Bob Thomsen made three treks to the podium at last night's New South Wales Racing Night of Champions as **Shogun Lodge (Aus)** (Grand Lodge {USA}) scooped the pool. Five-year-old Shogun Lodge, a triple Group 1 winner, was named NSW Champion Horse Of The Year as well as Best Sprinter-Miler and best Middle Distance Performer. He won four races last season including the G1 Epsom H. and G1 Queen Elizabeth S., both at Randwick. "He is the sort of horse you dream about training and I am looking forward to a strong spring campaign. He's never disappointed us once, he looks great and he will gallop between races at Rosehill on Saturday," said Thomsen. AJC Australian Derby winner **Universal Prince (Aus)** (Scenic {Ire}) won Best Three-Year-Old as well as NSW Country Champion for horses trained outside the metropolitan area. **Viscount (Aus)** (Quest For Fame {GB}), named Best Two-Year-Old, becomes the second son of his sire to win the award, following Dracula (Aus). **Evergreen Yippyio (Aus)** (Interstellar {Aus}), who will aim to better his Melbourne Cup second-place finish this spring, won Best Stayer. 2001 G1 Rosehill Guineas victor **Sale Of Century (NZ)** (Prized {USA}) won best

New Zealand horse.

NEW SOUTH WALES' TOP HORSEMEN

Also accepting accolades at the NSW Racing Night of Champions, jockey Brian York won his second consecutive George Moore medal for riding excellence. Mitch Newman won the Theo Green apprentice medal and confessed, "I started off as a plumber and I am sort of glad I let that slide." Gai Waterhouse received the TJ Smith medal, named for her father. "This is so special because Dad was such a mentor, he was a very exacting person and if you were going to have a horse trained by him you had to do it his way. Owners--I don't know about the horses, but they seemed to handle it--had to withstand that," she told the gathering at Randwick. The sires' first crop of weanlings will be offered for sale in November.

Disco Rico Scares Everybody Off:

The Maryland Jockey Club has cancelled the \$75,000 Dave's Friend H., originally scheduled for Saturday, because none of the 12 trainers who nominated horses wanted to run against top sprinter **Disco Rico** (Citidancer). "We tried every avenue," said Lou Raffetto, COO for the Maryland Jockey Club. "Nobody had any interest in testing Disco Rico."

Dunkelberger Breaks Collarbone:

Travis Dunkelberger, the nation's leading jockey with 259 wins, broke his collarbone when his mount took a bad step and tossed him during the running of the seventh race at Charles Town Wednesday night. Dunkelberger's agent Steve Rushing reported that the 24-year-old will visit a specialist today to see if surgery is required.

Colonial Downs Wrap-Up:

The 2001 meet at Colonial Downs concluded Tuesday with gains in both attendance and handle. Conducting its first-ever summer Thoroughbred season, the track averaged 1,940 a day in attendance, up 61 percent from last year. The daily average on-track handle for the 25-day stand was \$165,829, up 21 percent, while out-of-state handle gained 27 percent to \$904,823. The total daily average for wagering was \$1,103,188, an increase of 27 percent from the 32-day meet in 2000. A. Ferris Allen, III won his fifth straight training title at the track with 10 winners. Mario Pino led all jockeys with 49 victories, while Alex Estrada was the top apprentice with 18 wins. The track, located in New Kent, Virginia, offers 82-percent turf racing; there was only one day during the meet when the races had to be switched from the grass to the

main track.

Bray Runners On Track for Arlington Festival:

Astra (Theatrical {Ire}), the projected favorite for the GI Beverly D. at Arlington Park Aug. 18, remains on target for the \$700,000 event, trainer Simon Bray said from his base at Del Mar. "She has been coming along very well," the conditioner said of the five-year-old mare, who won the GI Beverly Hills H. at Hollywood Park June 24. Owned by the Allen E. Paulson Living Trust, Astra will work just one more time in Southern California before shipping to Arlington Aug. 15. "We don't have to train her too much," Bray said. "She just seems to do everything on her own." She is to be accompanied on the flight by **Startac** (Theatrical {Ire}). Also campaigned by the Paulson Living Trust, the bay won the GIII Generous S. last season, but has made his last four starts on the dirt, including a 10th-place finish in the Kentucky Derby.

Fair Grounds Announces Stakes Schedule:

A record \$7.1 million in stakes purses will be offered at the 130th season of racing at Fair Grounds Race Course in New Orleans, Louisiana. The meet, which begins Nov. 22, will feature 60 stakes including the \$500,000 GII New Orleans H. Mar. 3, the \$750,000 GII Louisiana Derby Mar. 10 and the \$700,000 GII Explosive Bid H. Mar. 24. Fair Grounds will also offer a \$1 million bonus to any horse that can win the Louisiana Derby and the Kentucky Derby.

'You Had To Ante Up'

The other top-priced colt was hip number 215, a colt from the last crop of the late Mr. Prospector out of the unraced Storm Bird mare Stone Flower, who is herself a half sister to GISW Danger's Hour. Consigned by Eaton Sales, the dark bay was the subject of a fierce battle between Nadia Sanan, who was seated inside the sound booth on the upper level of the pavilion, and Bob Baffert, who was bidding via phone. Sanan, who was on the phone with her father, finally conceded at \$3 million. "I didn't want to go that high," said Baffert, who also took home a \$1.6 million son of Saint Ballado. "He's one of the last of the Mr. Prospectors, but I thought he'd go much cheaper than that. But, if you wanted to buy a horse up there, you had to ante up." Baffert purchased the colt for a group of clients who preferred to remain anonymous.

'We'd Like To Buy Them All'

Although Nadia Sanan was outbid for the Mr. Prospector, Padua did not go home empty-handed on the night. They took home hip number 219, a son of Seattle Slew out of the graded-stakes winning Strawberry Road (Aus) mare Strawberry Reason. Sanan said, "Dad really wanted this horse. It's good to finally get one. We'd like to buy them all, but we'll settle for this one. He's a very good-looking horse, scopey with a beautiful head."

One for the Books...

The numbers jumped across the board at Saratoga, with the cumulative gross hitting a sales record \$62,412,000, up 49 percent from last year. Only once before in the auction's history had the aggregate topped \$50 million, and that was back in 1985. "We started off with a record pace and ended up with a record sale," Fasig-Tipton Chairman D.G. Van Clief, Jr. said. "Ten years ago, the industry said that this sale was on life support. I've never seen as strong a yearling sale as I saw the last three days." The sale's average of \$385,259 increased by 26 percent, while the median of \$235,000 rose 24 percent. "Obviously, you have to be pleased," Executive Vice President and COO Boyd Browning, Jr. remarked. "What was also remarkable was the depth of the market--the percentage of horses which got sold was tremendous." Browning added that Fasig-Tipton was not caught off guard by the success of the sale. "Six weeks ago, everyone was slightly cautious, but after the July sales got done in Kentucky, when the press came in and said, 'what's next,' we said, 'we can't wait to get to Saratoga.' The strength of those sales has definitely carried forward," he said.

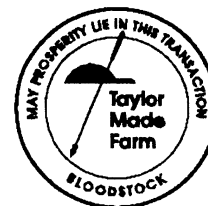
