GENERATIONS CLASH IN YORKSHIRE OAKS

Since this race was opened to older fillies and mares in 1991, the three-year-old class has failed only three times. **Mot Juste (GB)** (Mtoto {GB}) has every chance of maintaining that stranglehold here. Fourth in the G1 Epsom Oaks June 8 behind **Imagine (Ire)**, she was beaten a neck by **Lailani (GB)** in the Irish version at The Curragh July 15, where **Karsavina (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) was a length further back in third. Earlier **Mot Juste** had **Head in the Clouds (Ire)** (Rainbow Quest) over three lengths back in fourth in the Listed Pretty Polly S. at Newmarket May 6. Trainer Henry Cecil, who has won this race four times, has yet to win a Group 1 race this year, but **Sacred Song** (Diesis {GB}) could provide the first in this competitive event. Successful last time in the G3 Lancashire Oaks at Haydock July 7, she bids to follow in the steps of past stable star **Catchascatchcan (GB)**, who took that route in 1998. She showed last year when winning the G3 Princess Royal S. at Newmarket in October that she was a filly on the upgrade, an impression confirmed in her first two runs this year. Third behind **Water Jump (Ire)** and stable companion **Sandmason (GB)** in the Listed Aston Park S. at Newbury May 19 on her first start, she then filled the same position behind **Zindabad (Fr)** and **Mubtaker** in the Listed Leicester Mercury S. at Leicester June 17. Her latest run, an impressive four-length triumph over **Ranin (GB)** at Haydock, was a fine effort and she will be a force to be reckoned with here provided the ground does not get too fast. **Head in the Clouds** has improved markedly recently, learning to settle better as evidenced by her impressive win in a maiden here July 15. She produced a career-best effort last time when a half-length second to **Abitara** in the G2 Prix de Pomone at Deauville Aug. 5, where **Super Tassa (Ire)** (Lahib) was five lengths away in fifth. **Zanzibar (Ire)** (In The Wings {GB}) was the impressive seven-length winner of the G1 Oaks d'Italia in Milan May 20 before finishing a disappointing last of 14 in the Epsom Classic. Michael Bell remains convinced that was not her true running, however, saying on Monday, "She was never travelling from the moment that the stalls opened and even if you question what the Italian form is worth, she should have been able to keep up with them." *Field, p7*

SAKH IT TO 'EM

Sakhee (Bahri), sent off the 7-4 favourite, annihilated his rivals with a powerful display to take yesterday's G1 Juddmonte International S. at York. He was never in danger once sent for home by **Frankie Dettori** with quarter of a mile remaining, going away in a few strides before being eased to a seven-length success from **Grandera (Ire)** (Grand Lodge). In doing so, he avenged defeat for his sire **Bahri**, who was second to **Halling** in 1995 and provided **Godolphin** with their third success in this event. He has had to wait for a long time for his first Group 1 success, having been beaten only a length by **Sinndar (Ire)** in last year's G1 Epsom Derby in June and finishing a disappointing fourth in the G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown the following month. He advertised his well-being last time in the Listed **Steventon S.** at Newbury July 21, beating **Aldwych (GB)** by three lengths there, and had reportedly thrived on the gallops since. *Juddmonte International cont., p2*

TIGER RETURNS TO GERMANY Baron Georg von Ullmann's champion and two-time German Horse of the Year **Tiger Hill (Ire)** (Danehill {USA}--The Filly {Ger}, by Appiani {Ity}) will return to Germany for the 2002 breeding season. The nine-time Group winner, who captured two consecutive runnings of the G1 Grosser Preis von Baden, was retired to stud at the Haras du Val Henry in France in 2000. Tiger Hill will stand at Gestut Schlenderhan, with his nomination fee at DM18,000.

GREEK DANCE RETIRED **Greek Dance (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}--Hellenic {Ire}, by Darshaan {GB}), the highweight horse in Germany from 9 1/2 to 11 furlongs last year, has been retired and will stand stud at Gestut Gorldorf for 2002. Trained by Sir Michael Stoute for Lord Weinstock, the six-year-old had four wins and six seconds in his 17 career starts for earnings of \$887,705. The winner of the G1 Grosser Dallmayr-Preis last year and G3 Rose Of Lancaster S. in 1999, he was also runner-up in the G1 Juddmonte International at four and the G1 Hong Kong Cup, G1 Prix Ganay, G1 Irish Champion S. and G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at five. "We are delighted to be able to provide the German bloodstock industry with a sire prospect who combines a top-class international pedigree with Group 1 international performances," Suzanne Roberts, manager of Gestut Gorldorf, said. "Lord Weinstock have retained breeding rights in Greek Dance and we are delighted with their vote of confidence in the horse's stud career."

Comfy was well-touted before his debut in an Ascot maiden July 27, but had to settle for third behind **Sohaib (USA)**. He came back against stakes company here and baptised the new relationship between owner **Khalid Abdullah** and trainer **Sir Michael Stoute** with a convincing success. Although he was a maiden entering the race, jockey **Kieren Fallon** was sure that he was of the highest class. "He's a horse that I like a lot," Fallon said. "The first time I rode him in work, I thought, 'he's going to be special.' He ran a nice race at Ascot and he has improved." Held up in fourth early behind **Saphir Indien (GB)** (**Bijou d'Inde {GB}**), he was always travelling well on the outside as the leader was sent clear. Asked to lengthen in the straight, he joined the pacesetter with a quarter of a mile remaining before being kicked clear for the win. Fallon, who rode the winner of this event for Stoute, **King's Best (USA)**, in 2000, added, "You'd have to think there's improvement to go." With that in mind, **Victor Chandler** quoted the colt at odds of 33-1 for next year's G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket, while **Paddy Power** offer only 20-1 for the mile Classic.

PROSPECTORS DELITE DEAD *Prospectors Delite* (Mr. Prospector), a two-time Grade I winner who in turn produced two-time Grade I winner Tomisue's Delight, was euthanized June 21 due to complications from laminitis, it was announced yesterday. The 12-year-old foaled a colt by Storm Cat at William S. Farish's Lane's End on Feb. 6, but foundered afterwards. The foal, her sixth, died Feb. 28; the mare never recovered and finally had to be put down two months ago. The Kentucky-bred started nine times, winning six races including the GI Ashland S. and GI Acorn S. and earning \$432,953. Her first foal, Tomisue's Delight, accounted for seven victories, among them the GI Personal Ensign S. and GI Ruffian H., and bankrolled \$1,207,536. She also produced Delta Music, a stakes winner in the U.S., and Monashee Mountain, a Group 3 winner in Ireland. That colt sold for \$1 million at the 1998 Keeneland July Sale.

DILIGENCE FILLY TOPS OBS TUESDAY A filly from the first crop by Diligence (Miswaki) brought a final bid of \$85,000 to top yesterday's first open session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's August Yearling Sale. Consigned by Summerfield, agent for Steppin' Out Farm, the gray was purchased by Buzz Chace, acting on behalf of William Lickle. The top-selling colt Tuesday was a son of Montbrook out of stakes winner Little Emotion (Nonparrell). Offered by Sugar Hill Farm, agent for McMaster Farm, the dark bay was purchased for \$77,000 by Trio Loco. The Open Sale continues today, with bidding beginning at 11 a.m., and runs through Friday.

After a titanic battle with Royal Rebel (GB) (Robellino) in the G1 Ascot Gold Cup at Royal Ascot June 21 in which he lost by a head, he returned to take the G2 Goodwood Cup Aug. 2 by 1 1/2 lengths from Double Honour (Fr). Richard Quinn, who was successful on the eight-year-old there, did not enjoy the lead today as Yorkshire (Ire) (Generous {Ire}) was sent clear in the early stages by Jimmy Fortune. Travelling easily nevertheless, he was moved up to take over with five furlongs remaining. From there he made this marathon his own, surging clear in the straight before being kept up to his work to maintain the advantage. Michael Kinane and Jardines Lookout arrived on the outside with a threat and, after taking the ground of Qatef inside the final three furlongs, was the only challenger. As he moved up to Persian Punch with 50 yards remaining, the old warrior found more to clinch his first success in this contest. Richard Quinn commented, "Everybody loves the horse and he always gives his all. He [Jardines Lookout] came early enough for my fellow to rally again. He never actually got headed, but came close to it. It was nice to get a lead for a mile and once he hit the front he set sail. He's definitely brave and he'd give his eye for you--he doesn't want to be beat. He's never moved as well as he does now."

NUMBERS UP ON PENULTIMATE DAY The Agence Francaise August Yearling Sale continued to show growth from last year's figures as a FF700,000 colt by Zieten topped the Tuesday session. Out of the winning mare Valixa (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}), the grey colt was purchased by Anthony Stroud Bloodstock from the consignment of Haras du Mezeray. The top-priced filly on Tuesday was a daughter of Dr Devious (Ire) offered by Haras de la Louviere. Produced by the stakes-placed Shine on Me (GB) (Machiavellian), she was bought by Patrick Monfort for FF580,000. Despite fewer yearlings selling this year, the sale has grossed FF226,255,000 so far, comfortably up over the FF206,882,000 achieved in 2000. The concluding session begins today at 11 a.m.

A.P. INDY, KINGMAMBO STUD FEES RISE Lane's End Farm has announced its stud fees for 2002, with A.P. Indy going up to \$300,000 and Kingmambo to \$200,000, both live-foal guarantee. The 1992 Horse of the Year, A.P. Indy has had a pair of juvenile graded-stakes winners in recent weeks, Jump Start and Tempera, in addition to Aptitude's win on Sunday in the GII Saratoga Breeders' Cup H. One of Europe's leading milers of 1993, Kingmambo has sired five graded stakes winners this season, including King Cugat, Penny's Gold and Voodoo Dancer in the U.S. Both stallions were officially listed as private for 2001, but a no-guarantee season was trading at \$250,000 for A.P. Indy. The stud fee for second-year sire Lemon Drop Kid (Kingmambo) has dropped to \$75,000 from \$100,000. Last year's champion older horse, the bay entered stud in 2001 for the six-figure fee.

DEAUVILLE GOING STRONG

Continuing the trend established by the American yearling sales this summer (including Del Mar last week), the Agence Francaise's Deauville yearling sale--finishing tonight--is certain to return buoyant final figures. Even without a representative of the Allegretta family cracking the \$1-million barrier (as happened in 1998 and last year), the gross for the centerpiece Saturday-Sunday sessions was up 16 percent from last year's corresponding record, and the average was up 19 percent, to very nearly \$200,000.

Somewhat like a mini-September sale, the five-day Deauville sale breaks down into three separate categories: the 'select' Saturday-Sunday evening sessions after racing; an all-day third session on Monday; and then the final two sessions, after racing last night and all day today. But last night and today are just the clean-up; last year, for example, 85 percent of the gross had been raised by the end of the Monday session. Though there were 20 fewer offered at this year's Monday session, by the close of business Monday night this year's sale had already grossed over 206-million francs (up 8 percent), and the average of FF931,464 was up 19 percent over the corresponding sessions last year.

To translate all that from numbers to words, the phrase 'buoyant trade' comes to mind. The Deauville sale has been growing steadily in credibility and popularity, even compared to the overall market, which has grown so steadily itself since 1992. Philippe Augier (yes, he really is the mayor of Deauville) and his team have made the sale a place where the professionals really want to be, both as buyers and sellers, and the result is that the sale has virtually doubled, both in gross and average, just since 1997.

Time to Celebrate

One of the highlights of this year's catalogue was the first serious appearance in the ring of the first yearlings by Peintre Celebre, and the reception was very warm indeed. This may be a optimistic market, but it's a discriminating one, too, so the fact that there were 15 of them catalogued did not necessary mean they were going to be big sellers. But the reports from the Judges have been unstintingly positive ('racey,' one summarized), and they sure sold like it. There were 13 catalogued in the two select sessions; four were buy-backs, for the 'normal' (these days) 69-percent clearance rate. There was a 5-million colt, and three fillies brought 3.3 million, 2.6 million, and 2.2 million, respectively (multiply by .14, or, roughly, divide by seven to get the equivalent in U.S. dollars), and the nine averaged FF2,255,555 (about \$315,000). Even with two 'cheaper' Monday lots added in, his 11 Deauville yearlings averaged FF1,895,455 (about \$265,000).

Peintre Celebre hasn't gotten much ink in Europe in the last couple of years, when we've had superstars like Montjeu, Dubai Millennium, Galileo and Giant's Causeway to talk about. But this was a superstar, too. Bred by the Wildensteins, he was only the second Nureyev (Theatrical was the first) to be a star at a mile and a half. Of course, Theatrical is out of a Sassafra mare; Peintre Celebre's dam is by Alydar, so no prizes for working the rest of it out. But Peintre Celebre--rated 137 by Timeform--was an even better racehorse than Theatrical. He drowned the best field I have seen for the Arc in many years, in record time. Pilsudski, who was a distant second, had won the Irish Champion S. beforehand and came back to win Newmarket's Champion S., the Breeders' Cup Turf and the Japan Cup afterwards. Helissio, the previous year's winner, and Swain were among the bunch who finished seven lengths behind Peintre Celebre.

Mr. Prospector - Classy 'n Smart

We all know there are an infinite variety of hiccups between 'the best racehorse' and 'the best sire.' But the very best racehorses still must have the best chance, because of all the characteristics there to be transmitted, raw ability must figure at the very core of the matter. Whatever else does or doesn't happen, Peintre Celebre had the raw ability. He may have been out of the public eye for the last year or two, but he's back now. His name is likely to come up pretty regularly now for the next couple of months. This is a good commercial start for a world-class sire prospect.

Weekend Doubles

Though they don't compare with trainer Bobby Frankel's fantastic Group 1 double for Juddmonte with Flute and Skimming, there were some other interesting doubles last weekend. On Saturday afternoon, Newmarket trainer George Margaron saddled a 442-1 double (a 12-1 shot and a 33-1 shot) in the first two races at Newbury, both sired by Distant Relative. Considering the second of those was a wire-to-wire win by the 33-1 shot Atavus in the G3 Hungerford S., that's a pretty big accomplishment.

Later on Saturday, the aforementioned Theatrical had 1-2 finishers Startac and Strut the Stage in the GI Secretariat S., run at 10 furlongs on turf as part of the Arlington Million card. I was paying particular attention to this race, as I had bet two of the European shippers, Mizzen Mast and Snowstorm--both of whom, ironically, are far better on good ground, which they'd figure to get in Chicago. No chance: came up soft (called it 'yielding'), they both sank without trace. But take nothing away from the 1-2 for Theatrical, and both ran huge races.

The final double of the weekend, Sunday: Vahorimix, one of Europe's top three-year-old milers, wins his second Group 1 race of the year--both by disqualification. It's amazing. He got the French 2000 Guineas on the disqualification of Noverre, and he was awarded Sunday's G1 Jacques le Marois after the winner, Proudwings, knocked Noverre and Banks Hill sideways as they were trying to mount their runs. Vahorimix--who is exactly on a par with the other two in form terms--must be the only horse I know of whose two Group 1 wins so far have both been by disqualification. Fortunately for the sanity of the form book, both Noverre and Banks Hill both still have official Group 1 wins; Vahorimix's connections must be desperately hoping he can win something like the Prix du Moulin so all his Group 1 wins won't have asterisks.

Rock of Gibraltar represents the team behind the 1999 winner Mull of Kintyre here. Successful last time in the G3 Railway S. at The Curragh July 1, he handed a facile two-length beating to stable companion Hawk Wing there. Previously he had been denied a clear run when sixth in the G3 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot June 19, after which his trainer said, "he'd have had a harder time at home on the gallops" and where he was the choice of Mick Kinane over the winner Landseer (GB). On his debut in a Curragh maiden Apr. 21, he had looked a class act, beating the useful Sandford Park (Ire) and Mahsusie (Ire) with ease. If there is a chink in his armour it may be exposed by **Kulachi**, who was fourth behind Johannesburg in the G3 Norfolk S. at Royal Ascot June 20. His trainer regretted dropping him back to five furlongs afterwards, having sent him out for a smooth debut success in a Goodwood maiden over six June 8. Brought back up in trip after the Royal meeting, he got the better of the smart Approval (GB) by a neck in a tight finish to the Listed Rose Bowl S. at Newbury July 20. **Mister Cosmi** was under a half length back in fourth that day and followed that with a game length success from **Prince Dayjur** in the G2 Richmond S. at Goodwood July 31. He faces a stiff task here with a penalty for that win.

The G1 Secretariat S. resulted in a remarkable achievement by veteran sire Theatrical. Not only did Theatrical sire the first and second--Startac and Strut the Stage--who finished only a nose apart, but he was also responsible for the dam of the third, Sharp Performance.

Not so immediately obvious is that the race also formed part of a great weekend for Theatrical's third dam Pange. Not only is Pange third dam of Theatrical, she is also third dam of Startac, and of Saranac Lake (f, 2, Smart Strike--Lake Champlain, by King's Lake), winner of the G3 Irish National Stud Debutante S. at The Curragh.

Of course outstanding achievement is nothing new to the descendents of Pange. In addition to Theatrical, champion turf horse of 1987, she also appears as the dam of Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe victor Prince Royal II, and is also ancestress of other Eclipse Award winners Landaluce and Paradise Creek (out of a half-sister to Theatrical) as well as additional grade one winners Forbidden Apple, Wild Event and Taiki Blizzard (a half-brother to Theatrical).

A cursory examination of the background of Pange shows nothing which would have engendered the expectation of her making such an impact. She won two of her three starts at two, the only season she raced, without showing spectacular ability. Her sire, King's Bench was a high-class two-year-old and miler in England, but only a modestly successful sire, eventually being exported to Japan towards the end of his career. Pange's dam, York Gala never raced, but she did breed three stakes winners, the best of which was Sterope, twice winner of the Cambridgeshire Handicap, then a prestigious event.

Pange was sold to Count Neni da Zara for 4,400gns in foal to Persian Gulf at the 1961 Newmarket December Sales (compared to that year's sale topper at 25,000 gns.). She was, however, about to become much more valuable. At the time of the sale Pange was dam of a weanling colt by Ribot. As Prince Royal II, that colt won the 1964 Gran Premio di Milano and Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. The Persian Gulf colt she was carrying at the time also became stakes-placed. Having made such a promising start, Pange then failed to produce another stakes winner from eight subsequent foals. Happily, her daughters were to more than make up for the omission. Four daughters of Pange became ancestresses of stakes winners, the most distinguished being Sensibility (1971, by Hail to Reason) and Strip Poker (1967, by Bold Bidder). Sensibility is dam of group winner Beyond the Lake and stakes winner Lake Champlain; granddam of Theatrical and Taiki Blizzard; and third dam of grade one winners Paradise Creek, Wild Event and Forbidden Apple. Strip Poker became dam of champion Landaluce and graded stakes winner Clout; and granddam of graded stakes winner Jade Flush, and black-type scorers Tenga and Royal Danzig.

The two most prolific strains of Pange--Sensibility and Strip Poker--come together in Startac, who is by Theatrical, out of Tenga (by Mr. Prospector out of Royal Strait Flush, a sister to Landaluce), and has Pange 4x4. Tenga strongly reinforces the pedigree of Sensibility, as she not only shares the same dam, but her sire, Seattle Slew, brings in Hail to Reason, the sire of Sensibility.

Ironically, it is this pattern of inbreeding to an outstanding mare which may be the impact of Pange herself. A look at Pange's own pedigree shows that she has the mare Malva 4x3. These strains come via Malva's sons, King Salmon and His Grace, both winners of the Coronation Cup, one of England's most prestigious contests for older horses. Malva produced an even better horse in the Epsom Derby winner Blenheim II, and Blenheim II appears nine times in the pedigree of Startac.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

There was another notable example of inbreeding to an outstanding mare when **Kifissos (GB)** (Spectrum {Ire}--Graphic {Ire}, by Scenic {Ire}) captured the Criterium du Fonds Europeen de l'Elevage at Deauville this weekend. Spectrum is a son of Rainbow Quest. Rainbow Quest is a grandson of Where You Lead, and so is Scenic, the maternal grandsire of Kirissos. Thus, Kifissos has Where You Lead 4x4.


Champion Sprinter Smoke Glacken was represented by a third stakes winner when his son, **Smokieisabandit** (c, 2, Smoke Glacken--Luck to Boot, by Tally Ho the Fox) captured the Aspirant S. at Finger Lakes. Winner of his only two starts, Smokieisabandit has an intriguing pedigree. He has the brothers King Emperor and The Irish Lord 4x3. He also has Nasrullah/Hail to Reason crosses through Courting Days (dam of Magesterial, the broodmare sire of Smoke Glacken), Queen's Crown (the granddam of Smoke Glacken) and Tally Ho The Fox.
