GIANT'S CAUSEWAY TO ASHFORD

After standing his first season at stud in Ireland, **Giant's Causeway** (Storm Cat--Mariah's Storm, by Rahy) will stand the 2001 season at Ashford Stud in Versailles, Kentucky. Nicknamed the Iron Horse, Giant's Causeway won six Group 1 events and ended his racing career with a thrilling runner-up finish behind Tiznow in the Breeders' Cup Classic last November. The four-year-old put together a string of five straight Group 1 victories last year, including wins in the G1 St James's Palace S., G1 Irish Champion S. and G1 Juddmonte International. American breeders sent Giant's Causeway 41 mares during his initial season. His stud fee has not been announced.

SUPER SATURDAY SPECTACULAR

Belmont Park will offer fans a cornucopia of top racing tomorrow in a Super Saturday chock full of Grade I events. In the G1 Woodward S., reigning Horse of the Year **Tiznow** (Cee's Tizzy) will tackle four rivals in his first racetrack appearance since taking the Mar. 3 G1 Santa Anita H. by five lengths. The four-year-old colt was sidelined by a troublesome back which almost forced him into retirement. "We got to the point in early July when we were giving him two weeks to get right or retire him," said owner Michael Cooper. "When he first started training after he'd been off, he was going so bad I figured, 'Well, he's done.' The fact that he's doing so well is a major bonus. Chris McCarron, who has ridden him in all his races and works over the past 13 months, said Tiznow is better than 100 percent." Tiznow will break from post two in his fourth start since winning the Breeders' Cup Classic last November. A talented international field of eight has been assembled for the G1 Man o' War in which German invader **Silvano (Ger)** (Lomitas {GB}) will seek to add to his win in the Aug. 18 G1 Arlington Million. He will face **Fusaichi Zenon (Jpn)** (Sunday Silence), a group winner in Japan and a game runner-up in his July 26 U.S. bow. "We've been happy with his progress in this country," said trainer Neil Drysdale. "We wouldn't be coming if we thought he couldn't be a factor." In the G1 Gazelle, **Fleet Renee** (Seattle Slew) makes her first start since winning the June 30 G1 Mother Goose. The Woodward and Man o' War will be shown on ESPN2 at 5 p.m.

ROUND TWO: FANTASTIC LIGHT VS. GALILEO

Galileo (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) will meet **Fantastic Light** (Rahy) for the second time in tomorrow's G1 Ireland the Food Island Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown, as eight horses stood their ground yesterday. In addition to Fantastic Light, Godolphin has left in **Give The Slip (GB)** (Slip Anchor {GB}) to fulfil pacemaking duties for Fantastic Light. Trainer Aidan O'Brien will saddle favored Galileo as well as **Bach (Ire)** (Caerleon) and **Ice Dancer (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells). Galileo is quoted the 4-9 favourite to repeat his G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. defeat of Fantastic Light, who is available at odds of 7-4 with Cashmans bookmakers. The ground at Leopardstown remained "good" yesterday. The Champion S. also serves as the fifth leg of the 12-race Emirates World Series. Galileo currently shares the lead in the series with 12 points.

IMAGINE RETIRED

Imagine (Ire) (Sadler's Wells--Doff the Derby, by Master Derby), winner of this year's G1 Irish 1000 Guineas and G1 Epsom Oaks, has been retired from racing. Trainer Aidan O'Brien's filly was being pointed towards the July 15 G1 Irish Oaks when she suffered a stone bruise. O'Brien was keen to get the filly back for the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe Lucien-Barriere at Longchamp Oct. 7, but time has run out. O'Brien told the *Racing Post* yesterday, "We decided that we were running out of time in our efforts to have Imagine ready for the Arc. She suffered a stone bruise after Epsom and took a long time to recover. During her break, she put on weight and became unfit and trying to get her ready to race again has proved a slower process than we expected." Imagine, owned in partnership by Susan Magnier and Diane Nagle, will now be retired at Coolmore as a dual Classic winner and the last foal of Doff The Derby. O'Brien added, "Imagine was an exceptional filly and we can now look forward to training her offspring."

NEW ZEALAND STUD BUYS GENEROUS European Horse of the Year **Generous (Ire)** (Caerleon {USA}-Doff the Derby {USA}, Master Derby {USA}) has been sold to Glenmorgan Stud in New Zealand, it was announced yesterday. The winner of the G1 Epsom Derby, G1 Irish Derby and G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S., retired to British stud Banstead Manor in 1992 and was later sold to the Japan Bloodhorse Breeders' Association (JBBA) after four seasons. Glenmorgan Stud, chosen by the JBBA over a "long list" of major European stud farms, has been standing the 13-year-old stallion for the last two Southern Hemisphere seasons. New Zealand Bloodstock Ltd. Chairman Peter Vela said, "Owning a great horse like Generous not only brings international attention and respect; it brings the all important flow of foreign funds into the New Zealand Thoroughbred industry and the economy as a whole." Generous sired German champion mare Catella (Ger) and multiple group winners Bahr (GB) and Blueprint (Ire).

SILLERY DIES **Sillery (USA)** (Blushing Groom {Fr}), sire of G1 Breeders' Cup Mile winner Silic (Fr) has died at Alec Head's Haras du Quesnay in France, reports *The Blood-Horse*. The homebred raced in France, Italy and North America, winning seven of 18 races and earning \$712,571. The 13-year-old recorded his biggest win in the G1 Prix Jean Prat and he entered stud in 1993, after a second-place finish in the G1 Budweiser International.

DEFLECTIONS MOUNT FOR LEGER FIELD

Doncaster's G1 Rothmans Royals St Leger Sept. 15 yesterday suffered a blow as hopefuls **Artillery (Ire)** (Darshaan {GB}) and **Beekeeper (GB)** (Rainbow Quest {USA}) were removed from the list by trainer Sir Michael Stoute. Artillery, a 16-1 shot with William Hill, raced yesterday at Salisbury while 12-1 chance Beekeeper is headed to Dubai. The colt will leave Newmarket soon, having been bought earlier in August by Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum's second son, Sheikh Maktoum bin Mohammed al Maktoum. **Roman Saddle (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}) looks likely to be retired with knee problems, while trainer Michael Jarvis has ruled out **Morshdi (GB)** (Slip Anchor {GB}) and **Putra Sandhurst (Ire)** (Royal Academy {USA}).

SOLID SEASON CLOSURES AT DEL MAR The 2001 meeting at Del Mar closed Wednesday after seeing an 8.5 percent gain in attendance and a 2.7 percent increase in total handle. The daily average attendance during the 43-day meet was 15,456. The total handle from all sources hit an all-time high of \$518,376,508, averaging a record \$12,055,268 per day. Alex Solis picked up his second riding title at the track with 36 victories, two more than runner-up Laffit Pincay, Jr., while Bob Baffert topped the trainers for the fifth straight year with 29 victories. Bobby Frankel was second with 18 wins. Juddmonte Farms, whose horses are trained by Frankel, became the first owner in the track's history to win more than \$1 million in purses during the meet. Led by GII San Diego H. and GI Pacific Classic winner Skimming, the stable earned \$1,150,624.50 to top the standings.

TVG TO COVER KEENELAND SEPTEMBER OPENS TVG, the satellite television network, will offer live coverage of the first two sessions of the 2001 Keeneland September Yearling Sale, to be held Monday, Sept. 10 and Tuesday, Sept. 11 in Lexington. The broadcasts will run from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. both days, with analyst Jeff Lifson reporting from the sales pavilion. The telecast will preempt all live racing on TVG other than the races from Calder, but the network will continue to air the stretch calls from other tracks over the two days.

A \$40,000 Keeneland January yearling, \$27,000 Keeneland September yearling and \$270,000 Ocala Breeders' Sales Company April two-year-old, Flame Thrower collected four wins and two seconds from seven starts and \$458,200 for owner Gary Garber. He is currently recovering from surgery at The Thoroughbred Corporation's farm in Bradbury, California. It has not yet been decided where he will stand at stud.

Ajina, who captured the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, GI Coaching Club American Oaks and GI Mother Goose S. during her Eclipse Award-winning season, was bought by Stonerside Stable from the Allen Paulson Living Trust while carrying her 2001 Storm Cat foal. The colt was born in April, but the seven-year-old mare is not in foal for 2002. Her first foal, a Deputy Minister colt, is a yearling. Storm Song, winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and GI Frizette in 1996, was purchased for \$1.4 million by Jaime S. Carrion at the 1997 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale. Carrion in turn sold the seven-year-old to Sheikh Mohammed this spring. Storm Song was bred to the late Dubai Millenium (GB) this year, and the resulting foal was to be owned jointly by Carrion and the Sheikh. After Dubai Millenium died Apr. 29, the Sheikh began buying some of the mares in foal to his champion, including Storm Song. The mare has three foals to date--a 2001 Kingmambo filly, a 2000 Coronado's Quest colt and a 1999 Gone West filly named Another Storm, a \$1 million Keeneland September yearling who broke her maiden at first asking, winning on the turf at Saratoga Aug. 15.

WHO'S HER DADDY?

As Amazing Philly frolicked in her paddock at Justaplain Farm in Chester County, Pennsylvania, she seemed as happy and as bright as a yearling can be, clearly oblivious to the fact she comes from a broken home. Who's her daddy? The scoundrel remains at large.

No one knew there was a father in this case until a cold January morning last year at Philadelphia Park. A three-year-old claiming filly named Speak Compelling was spending what was supposed to be a routine morning. It was anything but.

When her groom arrived at the barn, he discovered a second animal in her stall, something so scrawny he thought it was a goat. It was, instead, a newborn Thoroughbred foal. The arrival of Amazing Philly was, to say the least, a complete surprise. Though Speak Compelling had been badly off form, no one had the faintest idea she was pregnant nor could anyone figure out where, when, how and why this happened.

"We got a call at 6 a.m. from our trainer, Donald Reeder, who told us that Speak Compelling had a foal," said Lynda Gallagher, who owns mother and daughter along with her husband, Bill. "I couldn't believe it. My first reaction was to ask whether or not she was alive. Speak Compelling hadn't looked pregnant and she had not been getting any of the proper nutrition and care that a pregnant horse needs."

Worse yet, Speak Compelling gave birth while wearing a blanket that was firmly strapped around her belly. Luckily and astonishingly, Amazing Philly managed to get out of the trap and was by her mother's side when discovered.

"People were treating it like it was the birth of Christ," Bill Gallagher said. "When we got there, there must have been 50, 60 people around the stall. The first thing I said to Lynda was, 'What do we do now?'"

It was Reeder who provided the initial answers. Amazing Philly weighed just 55 pounds, about half the weight of a normal foal, and the trainer knew she had to get some place fast where she could get the proper care. That place was Justaplain Farm, which specializes in raising orphan horses.

"Amazing Philly came to us when she was very young, two or three hours old," said Gert Stearns, who runs the farm along with her mother, Helen. "She had absolutely no body strength. But she was able to nurse and she was relatively healthy. By the time she was four days old we had her in braces to help straighten her legs. And she just went on from there."

Four days later, Speak Compelling was sent back to Philadelphia Park to return to competition. She is still running and has won twice this year.

Having survived the first few turbulent days of Amazing Philly's life, the Gallaghers set out to solve the mystery. They backtracked and traced Speak Compelling's whereabouts around the time Amazing Philly would have been conceived. There were, however, a couple of problems. Speak Compelling had been in three different locations around that time and no one owned up to seeing anything. Bill Gallagher hoped that Randy Bradshaw, the first trainer of Speak Compelling, would have some answers.

"I spoke to Randy Bradshaw for about half an hour one morning and asked him how this happened," Gallagher said. "We didn't get anywhere. Finally, he said, 'Bill, it must have been immaculate conception.' That's the best answer I've gotten so far."

With The Jockey Club's help, dozens of tests were conducted on horses that Speak Compelling was around at the time of the illicit encounter. Nothing checked out. At least, though, The Jockey Club confirmed that Amazing Philly was 100 percent Thoroughbred and it has approved her for racing purposes.

The Gallaghers have said they won't spend any more time or effort trying to solve the mystery, but that doesn't mean they don't have their own theories. Lynda Gallagher thinks Speak Compelling was impregnated while she was at the Barretts Sale in California early in her two-year-old year.

"I picture her being walked by one hotwalker and another hotwalker walking a colt and nature took its course," she said. "Maybe there was nothing physically that the two hotwalkers could have done to stop it. They knew if they got caught they'd lose their jobs, so they decided not to say anything. No matter what happened, somebody had to have seen it."

Initially, the Gallaghers were upset that they had been handed such a strange surprise. But, in time, both have grown to love the filly and they are anxiously awaiting her racing career.

Because her sire is likely an undistinguished horse, it's hard to imagine that she'll be much of a runner, but stranger things have happened. No one knows that better than the Gallaghers.

"If you're in this game, all you do is dream," Bill Gallagher said. "It's the same whether you have a \$4,000 claimer at Philadelphia Park or a stakes horse at Saratoga. That's the best part of this game. Sometimes your dreams come true. With her, we're hoping that they will. I'll say this, I've got a very good feeling that something great is going to happen."
