GODOLPHIN GRABS ANOTHER GROUP 1

Following up on the success of Fantastic Light in the G1 Irish Champion S. Saturday, **Slickly (Fr)** (Linamix {Fr}) led from pillar to post to win the G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp yesterday afternoon and thus provide Godolphin with a memorable Group 1 double. After the unforgettable defeat of Galileo (Ire) the previous day, Frankie Dettori could not have expected more, but Slickly stepped forward to crown a big weekend for his connections, blowing away the opposition on his favoured track and ground. The five-year-old loves Longchamp and it has been the scene of many of his best performances. Trained by Andre Fabre for his first two seasons, he recorded wins in the G2 Prix Noailles and G1 Grand Prix de Paris over the course at three. Last year, he took the G3 La Coupe and G2 Prix Dollar at this track and he returned to add to that tally with a career-best performance here. Taken to the front early from his wide draw, he did not find it hard to settle into an uncontested lead against a field of hold-up horses and by halfway he had a four-length advantage over his nearest rival. Kieren Fallon looked momentarily threatening on **Warningford (GB)** (Warning {GB}) at the top of the straight, but Dettori was stretching away again. Slickly never stopped lengthening in front, powering clear before being eased to a smooth success. Dettori was delighted with the performance. "He went really well and felt great," he said. "Everybody knows this horse loves Longchamp--he's a lot better horse here and I don't know why. I looked at the screen at the 200 on the right and when I saw the big gap I couldn't believe it. I had some very good horses behind me and I expected a little bit of a challenge." **Vahorimix (Fr)** (Linamix {Fr}), sent off the odds-on favourite, was settled in last in the early stages and had to race widest of all in the straight. He never threatened to make an impact, running on at one pace in the closing stages.

POINT GIVEN TO THREE CHIMNEYS

Prince Ahmed bin Salman announced yesterday that **Point Given** (Thunder Gulch), retired just last week with a tendon strain in his left front leg, will stand at Three Chimneys Farm in Midway, Kentucky. Three Chimneys' owner Robert Clay said that the stud fee for the Preakness and Belmont S. winner would be \$125,000 and that the horse would be owned by a syndicate. "It's an honor and privilege that Prince Ahmed has chosen Three Chimneys to be Point Given's home and for him to entrust us with the horse's stallion career, because we know how very much this horse means to him," Clay said yesterday. Prince Ahmed's The Thoroughbred Corporation will keep a significant number of shares in the horse and will breed many of their top mares to him, including MGISW Sharp Cat (Storm Cat). "As one would expect, there is tremendous interest in Point Given," Clay continued. "Between the breeders who wish to purchase shares and the people who have expressed interest to The Thoroughbred Corporation in breeding to the horse, we know already that he will have an outstanding book of mares." Point Given is slated to arrive at the farm in the next few weeks.

WILLIAMS HEADED HOME

Jockey Craig Williams ended his visit to Britain Saturday with a winner on his last ride, guiding **Artifice (GB)** (Green Desert {USA}) to victory at Thirsk. He now travels to Hong Kong for stint before heading home to Australia. "What a way to finish--it's amazing," Williams said. "It's like my first win here two years ago--it's given me a real big buzz and something to go home and rave about." The rider will, however, be back on the road soon. "I've just recently taken out a contract with Mr Sadler in Dubai, so I'm really looking forward to that," he said. "If I have a real good season in Dubai, I'd like to come straight back here for the start of the season. I love the racing and it's been very good to me--I'd love to come back and see if I can get more than 26 winners and put some more feathers in my cap."

Mutamam (GB) (Darshaan {GB}), who took his second consecutive renewal of the G3 September S. at Kempton Saturday, yesterday was reported on course for the GI Canadian International at Woodbine Sept. 30. Trainer Alec Stewart told *PA Sport*, "He's come out of the race really well. It's our intention now to run in the Canadian International at Woodbine and then take it from there. He's the most wonderful horse. He really sticks his toes out and goes for it. I've always believed he deserves a Group 1 success."

HUGE SUCCESS FOR LEOPARDSTOWN

After the phenomenal battle between **Fantastic Light (USA)** (Rahy {USA}) and **Galileo (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}) in Saturday's G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown, Course Racing Manager Tom Burke was delighted. Saturday's crowd of 16,987 was a new record for Irish Champion Day at Leopardstown, easily exceeding last year's record attendance of just over 13,000. On-course Tote turnover was Ir£475,144.91, a huge increase on the Ir£355,215 bet at the fixture 12 months ago and also a new standard for Leopardstown. Bookmakers' turnover was Ir£1,589,241, compared with Ir£917,683 last year, an increase of Ir£671,558. Burke commented, "There was a fantastic atmosphere through the whole day and it was one of the best races ever seen at Leopardstown or anywhere in the world. We have seen two of the best horses that one would hope to see in a lifetime of racing. Being part of the Emirates World Racing Series has raised the profile of the race and Irish racing, and Leopardstown is very proud to be part of it."

IRISH RIVER FILLY TOPS ITALIAN SALE

The first auction ever organized by the newly created Italian Thoroughbred Sales was held at Allevamento Rima near Rome Saturday evening, with a yearling filly by Irish River (Fr) out of the stakes-placed American mare Political Parody (USA) (Doonesbury {USA}) attracting the top bid of L230,000,000. Consigned by Haras des Capucines, the bay was purchased by All. La Nuova Sbarra and will be trained by Lorenzo Brogi. The filly is a half-sister to multiple stakes-winner Politcal Whit (USA), a winner in America of \$347,190; and three-year-old Panis, who has two Group 3 victories in France to his credit. Brogi signed the ticket for 12 lots on the evening, making All. La Nuova Sbarra the leading buyer. With British auctioneer Henry Beeby at the gavel, the sale saw 66 of 100 yearlings change hands.

VISION AND VERSE TO HILL 'N' DALE Vision and Verse (Storm Cat--Bunting, by Private Account), the winner of the 1999 GII Illinois Derby and second to Lemon Drop Kid in the GI Belmont S. that season, will stand the 2002 breeding season at John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Farm near Lexington, Kentucky for a fee of \$7,500. Trained by Bill Mott, the five-year-old was also second in the GI Travers S. in 1999 and was third to Albert the Great in last year's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup. "With the recent move of leading sire Theatrical (Ire) and Jade Hunter, along with the acquisition of a controlling interest in Grade I winner El Corredor, we feel Vision and Verse is a strong addition to a powerful and promising Hill 'n' Dale stallion roster for 2002," said Hill 'n' Dale owner John Sikura.

SELLERS TAKES TIME OFF Jockey Shane Sellers, who resumed riding at Arlington Park August 26 after an eight-month layoff following a career-threatening knee injury, put his comeback bid on hold at the conclusion of Saturday's race card. The 34-year-old made the announcement to a stunned Arlington crowd moments after winning the \$75,000 Spectacular Bid S. aboard Double Zero Seven. "This is a very emotional moment for me after coming back," said Sellers. "My knee is just not good. The pain is just too much. I'm going to have to take some time off now. I'm going to go home (to Louisville, Kentucky) and consult with my doctors. It (taking some time off) is just something I have to do. I just have to go back and regroup. Maybe it's time to call it quits but I hope not." Since his Aug. 26 return to action, Sellers had won four of 35 races.

Eight and a Half on the Inner:

For the first time in four years, races will be carded at the distance of 1 1/16 miles on the inner turf course at Belmont Park. The races start out of a chute between the Widener (outer) turf course and main track that empties onto the clubhouse turn of the course. "There were a disproportionate amount of races on the Widener course over the spring and we thought this would help even it out," Assistant Track Superintendent Jerry Porcelli said. The Widener Turf Course is primarily used for 1 1/16-mile races, while the inner turf serves races carded for longer distances.

Gold Mover won her first two starts of 2001, including a 7 1/2-length tally in the GIII Forward Gal S. at Gulfstream, before testing the two-turn game. Second by 1/2 length in the GII Davona Dale S. Feb. 25, the Edward Evans homebred was a distant eighth in the GI Ashland S. before returning to sprint distances. Sixth in the May 17 Miss Preakness S. at Pimlico, the chestnut was rested and resurfaced with a solid second in the GIII Duchess S. at Woodbine Aug. 11. Racing against her elders for the first time, Gold Mover rated along the inside from third, advanced nearing the stretch and rallied past pacesetter favorite Dat You Miz Blue for the win. The latter broke through the gate prior to the start of the race. "We had some pace to run at today and that helped a lot," commented winning rider Edgar Prado. "She really responded when we turned for home."

KEENELAND SEPTEMBER STARTS TODAY All summer long, Geoffrey Russell, Keeneland's newest director of sales, has been keeping a watchful eye on the comings and goings in the Thoroughbred market-places. He has watched for trends. He has looked for signs. He has wondered how the prices for Thoroughbred yearlings would fare at a time of general economic uncertainty. "I think everybody was wondering how the yearling market would do this summer," said Russell, who took over the reins at Keeneland earlier this year. "But the success of the July summer sales and the August summer sales have certainly been encouraging. Now, we just keep our fingers crossed and hope the sales stay strong." The hoping--and the 13-day Keeneland September Sale--begin this morning at 10. Keeneland September has become the largest and one of the most important Thoroughbred sales in the world. This year, buyers will have the opportunity to examine, probe and bid on the 4,483 yearlings which have been catalogued for this year's auction. Included in the voluminous catalogues are 2,372 colts, 2,110 fillies and one gelding. "We really do think that it will be a very good sale," said Russell.

A September to Remember?


"We've got a very good book of horses," Russell said of the 2001 Keeneland September Sale. "The Select part of the sale is very, very strong and the yearlings will be of such good quality that many buyers will carry right on over into the weekend. That bodes well for the other horses in the sale. We think buyers will be here for the entire time." He added, "The great thing about the September Sales is that there is something here for everybody. There are yearlings that will most certainly go for \$1 million or more and there are others that will sell in the \$10,000 range. And, of course, there are horses that will fall in nearly every category in-between those two. That is one of the reasons that the sale lures so many people. You can come here, and within the span of the sale, you can certainly have a shot at filling all your orders with some very, very nice horses."

Picking Up Where It Left Off...

Last year's sale was certainly exciting, setting a number of records, including the highest gross in its storied history, amassing a total of \$291,827,100. Last year's average was a record \$88,085, and the number of yearlings sold reached a high mark at 3,313. This year's sale will have to be strong from start to finish to match the 2000 numbers, but the catalogues are full of potential. Some of the lots that will get special attention are the 23 yearlings that come from the last foal crop of the late Mr. Prospector. In addition, there will be hips by such outstanding stallions as Storm Cat, A.P. Indy, Danzig, Nureyev, Saint Ballado, Deputy Minister, Rahy, Sadler's Wells, Seattle Slew, Seeking the Gold, Kingmambo, Gone West, Danehill, Wild Again and Unbridled in the sale. The top first-year sires that will be represented include Awesome Again, Grand Slam, Coronado's Quest, King of Kings (Ire), Tale of the Cat, Swain (Ire), Touch Gold and Skip Away.

Could The Sales Topper Be...

One of the top contenders to be this year's sales topper is Hip 405, a Storm Cat half-brother to Lemon Drop Kid who is consigned by Lane's End Farm, as agent. "He really does look the part," said one bloodstock agent, who asked not to be identified. "We've looked at him several times and he just might be the one. But there are many of them in this sale. Believe me, if you get shot down on one, there's a whole bunch more to take a swing at."

Jockey Jerry Bailey sent Affirmed Success to the front turning for home and was still in front with one furlong to run, but Numerous Times, sent wide into the stretch, stormed down the center of the track and got his nose down just ahead of a game Affirmed Success. A claim of foul by Todd Kabel, rider of Quiet Resolve, against the winner for interference at the head of the stretch was disallowed. "He's a very nice horse," said winning trainer Sid Attard. "He does everything right." Robert Harvey, who heads the ownership group, confirms that the colt will be pointed for the Breeders' Cup Mile at Belmont Park Oct. 27.

She advanced inside on the second turn, came wide into the drive and drew away quickly under a hand ride for her first Grade I victory. "She was a little unlucky in California," said winning trainer Christophe Clement. "I ran her back too quick in that race. She was a bit rank and she bled a little bit too, which could have made a difference. Corey Nakatani rode her great today. She likes to wait, then she explodes. She's got a great turn of foot. I might run her in the Queen Elizabeth (GI, \$500,000 at Keeneland October 13)."

Nakatani added, "She's a temperamental filly and Chris (Clement) has done a great job with her. I let her take me where she wanted to. That's how she wants to run. She settled great and we were able to save ground. It was a big race from her." Nakatani had ridden Voodoo Dancer in one prior race this year, when the pair teamed up for victory in the May 28 Flawlessly S.

SUPER SATURDAY WRAP UP John and Jerome Amerman's **Lido Palace (Chi)** (Rich Man's Gold) emerged from his GI Woodward S. victory in good order, but it remains unclear where the four-year-old will make his next start. The colt is not nominated to the Breeders' Cup and would need to be supplemented by his owners for 20 percent of the Classic purse, or \$800,000. Lido Palace, the champion three-year-old in his native Chile, is now two for four in the U.S. and has earned over \$1 million in those four starts. Last-place finisher **Red Bullet** (Unbridled) also returned from his effort unscathed and will point next for the GII Meadowlands Cup Sept. 28. "Soundness wise he seemed fine this morning," trainer Joe Orseno commented. "He didn't seem tired at all. He pretty much wrapped himself up when he couldn't get hold of the track." A day after his victory in the GI Man o' War S., trainer Jonathan Sheppard was still in awe of his six-year-old pupil **With Anticipation** (Relaunch). "He is a special horse," the conditioner said. "I've had him since he was a yearling. To break him and train him for over five years and then watch him become a multiple Grade I winner is just amazing." The gray gelding has won four of his five turf starts this year, and would be undefeated, but for his disqualification from first to second in the GI United Nations H.
