TAKING KEENELAND BY STORM

The opening session of the 2001 Keeneland September Yearling Sale, held yesterday in Lexington, saw nine yearlings reach seven figures, and it was no surprise that a third of them were by superstar sire Storm Cat. Topping the day's bidding was Hip# 203, a colt by Storm Cat out La Affirmed (Affirmed), from the consignment of Eaton Sales, agent. A full brother to graded-stakes winners Caress and Country Cat and to Irish Group winner Bernstein, the chestnut as stood as still as a statue in the sales ring, occasionally flicking an ear at the auctioneer as he presided over a battle between the factions from Coolmore, Sheikh Mohammed and The Thoroughbred Corp. But it was the Sheikh who held out the longest, going to \$5.5 million to take the colt home. What makes a yearling worth that much? "First of all, you go through the catalogue weeks before the sale and there are certain pedigrees which hit you straight between the eyes," The Sheikh's racing manager, John Fergus, told TVG. "This colt had one of the A+ pedigrees in the sale. But you can be disappointed if the horse doesn't match up to the pedigree. You have to have the horse, that's the first and foremost thing." Hip# 203 lived up to his billing. "When we saw him the first time, we were quietly excited--we didn't want to be too obvious," Ferguson said. "But we think he has a real chance to be a real athlete, and he has a stallion's pedigree. When you are paying this much money for a horse, it's important that he has that residual value." The Sheikh's Godolphin operation spans the globe, but Ferguson sees this one returning to America. "I believe this horse will go to Raceland, our farm here in Paris, then he'll go to Dubai to be broken and have his early training. At this stage, I would say he would then go to California, but Sheikh Mohammed hasn't told me that."

DONCASTER ST LEGER YEARLING SALE

STARTS TODAY Doncaster's St Leger Sales begin today, offering 480 lots over four days. The sale features yearlings by such top-class young sires as Danehill Dancer (Ire), Royal Applause (GB), Ali-Royal (Ire), Desert King (Ire), Alhaarth (Ire) and Zamindar (USA), as well as close relations of over 70 group and stakes performers. As an added bonus, graduates qualify for the £200,000 St Leger Yearling S. at the St Leger meeting next September. Star lot this year could be Taylor Made's entry in 354, a colt by Grand Lodge (USA) out of Lady Windley (USA) (Baillamont {USA}), a daughter of Northern Trick (USA), Europe's champion three-year-old filly of 1984. DBS Managing Director Henry Beeby said of the colt, who sold as a foal at TATDEC for 55,000gns, "We are delighted that Taylor Made have put their confidence in DBS with this most attractive colt. He certainly has star quality with excellent looks to match a superb pedigree and this March 14 colt is exactly the type of sharp individual that sells best at Doncaster. It is a great honour to be selling for one of the world's leading sales consignors and I am sure that this lot will attract maximum attention as he is tailor made for our sale." Duncan Taylor of Taylor Made, selling for the first time at this, commented: "We fully expect him to be the star of the show." Camas Park Stud offer another strong collection in their seven lots, including lot 231, the only other colt by Grand Lodge (USA) from the family of Shadeed (USA) and Forty Niner (USA). Timmy Hyde's operation also offer a choice lot in 312, a colt by Alhaarth out of a half sister to G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Carroll House (Ire). Lot 359, a colt by Baratheia (Ire) from the family of Bienamado (USA), Nureyev (USA) and Sadler's Wells (USA), heads the consignment from Rathbarry Stud. Also on show are the first crops of Air Express (Ire), Among Men (USA), Bahhare (USA), Starborough (GB) and Victory Note (USA). Beeby is looking forward to a busy four days: "The catalogue reads better than any of its predecessors, and we were offered a higher number of quality individuals to inspect than in any previous year." Bidding begins at 11 a.m. today and at 5:10 p.m. on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.

DETTORI REFLECTS

Frankie Dettori was taking in the sights and sounds of Newcastle yesterday after a heady weekend of success at Leopardstown and Longchamp. Having won the G1 Irish Champion S. with **Fantastic Light (USA)** (Rahy {USA}), Dettori followed up 24 hours later in the G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp on **Slickly (Fr)** (Linamix {Fr}). He said yesterday: "There is no horse that could touch Dubai Millennium (GB)--he was a superstar. With what Fantastic Light has achieved now he could be compared with Swain (Ire) and Daylami (Ire). They were all good horses and he's working his way to be amongst them. He's achieved a lot and he's got a lot of miles on the clock but right now he doesn't show any signs of going bad--in fact he's showing signs of getting better and better. Slickly is a bit of a character and he needs things to go his way and Longchamp seems to be the perfect track for him. Including Sunday he has run there five times and won five times. As soon as I got him on the track and cantered down, I thought this horse feels completely different. It was a good performance--he made them look very ordinary."

MADAME MAKES HISTORY

Madame Jones (Ire) (Lycius {USA}) made history yesterday by becoming the first horse to win 10 handicaps in a season. Ridden to victory by Fran Ferris, the five-year-old mare had a half length to spare over Dovebrace (GB) at the end of the Arnold Palmer H. at Nottingham. Beating the record that had stood since 1874, her trainer David Evans is keen to add more: "Someone said to me the other day, 'When are you going to stop running her?' And I said, 'At the end of this summer when she's won about 13 and no one will catch her.'"

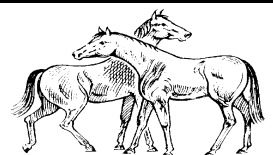

Sire Surprises...

While seeing Storm Cat at the top of the sires' list (three or more sold) after Day 1 is something people have come to expect, the second and third spots in the standings were something of a surprise. Theatrical (Ire) was second, with his four yearlings selling for a combined \$3,005,000, an average of \$751,250. He accounted for the top-selling filly on the day, Hip# 35. The bay, a full sister to GI Secretariat S. winner Startac from the Allen E. Paulson Living Trust offering, with Narvick International as agent, brought \$2 million from Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell Estate Co., Ltd. Kris S. just knocked the late Mr. Prospector out of the third spot, with his seven lots bringing \$4,405,000, an average of \$629,285; the four yearlings from Mr. P's last crop which sold averaged \$625,000. Emulating Storm Cat, Kris S. boasted three which sold for \$1 million or more.

Final Figures...

Both the average and the median on the opening day of Keeneland September showed nice gains over last year's first session, with the average rising 24.8 percent to \$386,737, and the median jumping 25 percent to \$250,000. But 88 of 244 horses which went through the rind failed to make there reserves. "It's a fickle market," bloodstock agent Reiley McDonald said. "Buyers are being very selective. They're not putting up with a lot of veterinary problems. You can tell whether a horse is going to sell well by how much looking there is, how much scoping, how many trips to the repository. If you don't want to keep a horse to race, then you've got to be realistic." Keeneland's Director of Sales, Geoffrey Russell, was pleased with the overall results. "They were as we expected," he said. "All our figures were up." But he added, "The buy-back rate was a little disappointing. Buyers were being very discriminating."

CURTAIN RAISER

See if this sounds familiar: the number catalogued, and therefore sold, was down. Buy-backs, as a percentage of those sent through the ring, were up, by 24 percent over the corresponding session last year (an ominous 36 percent, vs. 29 percent on opening day in 2000). Gross down 11 percent. But the average and median each rose 25 percent--for those sold. Welcome to the 2001 North American yearling market. Those they really liked, those that vetted--no problem. Otherwise, consignors leaping for the trenches. Profitability, which peaked in 1997-99, before the latest round of stud fee rises really kicked in, plunging. Now, more than ever, you have to have the 'big horse' for a consignment to show a profit.

One team that hit the ground running was Sheikh Mohammed's. Energized by Fantastic Light's gritty upset of previously unbeaten Galileo at Leopardstown last Saturday, the Godolphin entourage arrived ready for business, and they dominated proceedings. Nine horses brought \$1-million plus yesterday, and three--including the \$5.5-million Storm Cat colt--were bought by John Ferguson, and another three by Shadwell. In all, Maktoum connections bought 17 yearlings for a little over \$16-million--27 percent of the session's gross.

Demi O'Byrne bought a \$1.8-million Storm Cat colt. The leading American buyers were Seattle's own Dave and Jill Heerensperger, who bought five yearlings for \$3.4 million, headed by a \$1.7-million Quiet American colt. The Heerenspergers were leading buyers, albeit at a significantly lower level, at the Washington sale last week. Go, Mariners.

Storm Cat, sire of the session's final three seven-figure yearlings, including the \$5.5-million session-topper, finished the session with a \$1.6-million average for six sold, from nine offered. Mr. Prospector, who had been virtually tied with Storm Cat as leading sire on average at the sales so far, had a disappointing day. Only four of the 10 offered sold, and they averaged just \$625,000.

One sire who had a really good day was Kris S. Helen Alexander's Middlebrook Farm sold three colts by Kris S., yesterday--one a full brother to Arch and another a 3/4-brother. All three were bought by the Maktoums, and all three brought \$1-million plus. For the day, he finished fourth on average with two or more sold (\$629,286) behind Storm Cat, Quiet American (2 at \$1,050,000), and Theatrical (4 at \$751,250), one place ahead of Mr. Prospector. A.P. Indy, who sold inconsistently in the summer, did so again yesterday: just five of nine sold, averaging \$546,000, placing him sixth on average.

Among first-year sires with two or more sold, both Awesome Again and Swain had yearlings sell in the high six-figure range. Headed by a \$900,000 filly bought by Bob and Beverly Lewis, Awesome Again had three of five sell, averaging \$416,667, heading this group. Swain had three of four sell, averaging \$348,333, headed by a \$750,000 colt bought by Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell Farm--he, of course, bred, raced, and stands Swain. The two were split by Tale of the Cat (2 at \$350,000) and followed by Coronado's Quest (6 at \$298,333, from 11 offered).

The general feeling is that today's figures will look better. Tuesday last year grossed almost \$95 million, \$27 million more than Monday, and the average was more than \$100,000 higher. And Lane's End is back. It will take a \$100-million session to equal last year's Book 1 gross. Expect some fireworks in any case.

Though it's said that no good horse has a bad name, I fear there are plenty of exceptions to this unwritten rule. For example, back in the 'seventies, a Grey Dawn filly was burdened with the name of Dumtadumtadum, but this (dumb) choice of name didn't prove too great a hindrance because Dumtadumtadum managed to become a minor stakes winner. The mare then embarked on what was to prove a very successful career as a broodmare.

When the late Allen Paulson acquired Dumtadumtadum's yearling daughter by Star de Naska in 1982, the temptation apparently proved too great and Dumdedum-dedum was unleashed on the Thoroughbred world, to make racetrack callers cringe whenever the filly ran. Once again, though, the name didn't prove a barrier to success and Dumdedumdedum used her speed to win a division of the GIII Barbara Fritchie H. as a four-year-old.

In 1982 Dumtadumtadum, carrying a filly by Alleged, was sold for \$225,000, and her buyer, Mrs. Curtis Phillips, resorted to the old ploy of joining parts of the parents' names to come up with Allegedum. This mare showed more speed than some of Alleged's daughters, taking the Joe Namath H. over a mile to become her dam's third stakes winner. The first, Nepal, had won two Grade II events at up to nine furlongs on dirt and

turf, equalling the track record on each occasion.

The careers of Dumdedumdedum and Allegedum converged in 1988 when both mares visited the excellent Theatrical in his first season at Brookside Farm. This crop enjoyed spectacular success, with Dumdedumdedum's daughter Sing For Free taking the 1992 Ak-Sar-Ben Oaks to become one of its 13 stakes winners. However, Allegedum fared less well with her Theatrical filly. Named Dramatical, she finished a well-beaten last on each of her starts as a two-year-old in Ireland, with Turform's Annual commenting that she "seems of little account."

Dramatical returned to the U.S., where she was covered by Runaway Groom as a three-year-old. She first made her mark when her Ogygian colt Berry Blvd won two of his three starts as a juvenile, one in record time at Lone Star Park, and finished second in the Clarendon S. on the other. This didn't help Dramatical much when she appeared at Keeneland in November of 1997 as part of the dispersal of the Estate of Patrick Ballentine, as she was purchased for only \$20,000. Perhaps she would have sold better had prospective buyers been able to see her good-looking Numerous weanling, which had been scheduled to follow her into the ring. When the colt finally appeared in the sales ring two months later, he sold for \$63,000 and his price jumped to \$165,000 at Keeneland in September. The colt had clearly developed into a very good individual, as his price made him the highest-priced of the 59 sale yearlings from the first crop by Numerous. His buyer's judgement has since been thoroughly vindicated, with the colt--Numerous Times--establishing an uninterrupted sequence of six wins, culminating in his last-stride victory over Affirmed Success and Quiet Resolve in Sunday's Atto Mile.

Numerous Times represents the finest achievement so far by Numerous, although the Hill 'n' Dale stallion has also sired several good winners during his time at Haras Firmamento in Argentina, including Mr Mat, winner of the G1 Gran Premio Estrellas Classic over a mile and a quarter on turf.

POINT GIVEN VALUED AT \$50 MILLION Three Chimneys' Farm owner Robert Clay yesterday confirmed that **Point Given** (Thunder Gulch--Turko's Turn, by Turkoman) will be syndicated into 50 shares, with each share selling for a cool \$1 million apiece. That values the three-year-old colt at \$50 million, a price which places him behind only Fusaichi Pegasus among newly retired stallions. Clay added that financing has been arranged for those who are interested.

EMIRATES LEADERS HEAD STRAIGHT TO BELMONT **Fantastic Light** (Rahy) and **Galileo (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), the co-leaders of the Emirates World Series Championship, will go next in the G1 Breeders' Cup Classic at Belmont Park Oct. 27. Although Galileo, beaten a head in Saturday's G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown, was expected to try a mile in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot Sept. 29, Aidan O'Brien effectively ruled that out on Sunday. He told the *Racing Post*, "Galileo seems fine after his race and he went out for stroll this morning. Before yesterday's race, the plan was always to go for the Classic. I always wanted him to go first for the Queen Elizabeth II S., but I now think we will miss that as it would be difficult to give Galileo enough time for a good preparation on the sand and that wouldn't be fair on him. Whatever horses we are going to run on the dirt at Belmont, including **Mozart** (Danahill), who goes for the Sprint, will be tried on the all-weather at Southwell a few weeks before they travel to New York." **Fantastic Light** will also head straight to Belmont as connections have officially forsaken the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe Oct. 7. Godolphin's Racing Manager Simon Crisford told the *Racing Post*, "We haven't seen anything that would give us any cause to doubt he would be able to handle the surface. He's trained for two years on sand in Dubai and has always worked well on it. The Classic mile-and-a-quarter-trip is ideal for him. He's a multiple Group 1 winner on turf and we think now is the right time to try and make that switch to dirt. Obviously, there are going to be some hard-seasoned professional older horses in America. It's completely different to what **Fantastic Light** has encountered before, but we are confident he can adapt."

BREEDERS' CUP OUTLINES SCHEDULE Breeders' Cup Ltd. has released a tentative schedule which outlines where the Breeders' Cup will be held the next four years. According to a plan given conditional approval by the Breeders' Cup board Friday, the \$13 million event will be held at Arlington Park in 2002, Santa Anita in 2003, Churchill Downs in 2004 and Lone Star Park in Texas in 2005. Both Arlington and Lone Star would be hosting the Breeders' Cup for the first time. But Breeders' Cup Ltd. President D.G. Van Clief cautioned, "Everyone should remember, however, that a significant number of issues must be resolved before the selection of any of these sites can be considered final."

Pedigree Insights cont.

It's not so surprising that **Numerous'** top sons are turf performers. Although by Mr. Prospector, he's a brother to **Jade Robbery**, winner of the G1 Grand Criterium, and his dam is **Number**, a high-class daughter of **Nijinsky**. **Number**, of course, shared the same dam, **Special**, as **Nureyev** and **Fairy Bridge**, the dam of **Sadler's Wells**. This family has been the source of endless high-class turf performers, a recent example being **Bienamado**.

Numerous was an exception. After topping the 1992 Keeneland July Sale at \$1,700,000, he raced mainly on the main track for **Charlie Whittingham**, notably winning the GIII Derby Trial S. However, he also won on the turf at **Del Mar** and his brother, **Chequer**, was another who won both on dirt and turf.

Another pointer towards **Numerous Times'** turf prowess is his 4x4 inbreeding to **Northern Dancer**, although **Skimming** has shown that very close in-breeding to the **Windfields** superstar can also produce a top dirt horse.
