**RACING INDUSTRY SHUTS DOWN IN WAKE OF TERRORIST ATTACKS**

The terrorist attacks which yesterday brought down the twin towers of the World Trade Center in New York City and severely damaged the Pentagon outside Washington, D.C., brought business in America to a halt. The Thoroughbred racing industry was affected as live racing was called off at every track across the country, and the second session of the Keeneland September Yearling Sale in Lexington was postponed. Horses originally scheduled to go through the ring yesterday will be sold this morning beginning at 10 a.m. "Due to the events of the day, Keeneland believes the most appropriate action is to cancel today's session of the sale," Keeneland President Nick Nicholson told The Blood-Horse on-line. "We apologize if anyone is inconvenienced by the decision and, in the meantime, we will be doing what each of you is doing--praying for the victims and their families." He added, "It's more about humanity than it is about business. It's not appropriate to have a horse sale when so many people are suffering." All of the live cards scheduled yesterday were cancelled, with racing abandoned at Delaware Park, Fairmount Park, Fairplex Park, Finger Lakes, Great Lakes Downs, Meadowlands, Mountaineer Park and Philadelphia Park. Today's programs at Arlington Park, Pimlico and Turfway Park have also been called off, with more cancellations expected. The Kentucky Derby Museum was also closed Tuesday and will be closed again today, and simulcast wagering was virtually shut down yesterday. Churchill Downs Inc. closed down its entire operation of live racing and simulcast wagering facilities for yesterday and today. "Churchill Downs Incorporated and its employees are deeply saddened by today's events and we believe that it is in the best interests of our patrons, vendors and employees to close our...operations today and tomorrow," CDI President and Chief Executive Officer Thomas Meeker said. "Our thoughts and prayers are with the victims and their families." The Thoroughbred Daily News staff adds their heartfelt prayers to those of the entire Thoroughbred industry.

## DONCASTER SALE OFF TO STRONG START

Doncaster's St Leger Yearling Sales got underway yesterday, maintaining a solid trade from the outset. Top lot was achieved early in the session as lot six, a half brother to MSP Blue Iris (GB), was sold for 40,000 guineas. Consigned by Hedgeholme Stud, the colt by Case Law (Ire) out of Bo'Babbity (GB) (Strong Gale {Ire}) was sold to Chris Fairhurst. The top-priced filly, lot 31, was by Wolfhound (USA) out of Soba (GB) (Most Secret {GB}), the top older sprinter in Europe in 1983. The chestnut, consigned by Woodcote Stud, went for 25,000 guineas to J Nixon. Of 175 yearlings catalogued, 151 were sold, a clearance rate of 92 percent. The gross of 1,668,500 guineas showed a 15-percent increase on last year, and the average of £11,050 was up 17.4 percent on 2000. DBS Managing Director Henry Beeby commented, "I'm very pleased. I know the catalogue is very good and people kept telling me it was the best they had seen, so I expect it to continue." Selling today commences following racing at 5:10 p.m.

That effort followed a fine 3 1/2-length debut score from subsequent winner Tahitian Storm (Ire) at Ayr June 22, and he is sure to make his presence felt. **Captain Rio** was regarded highly enough by connections to make his debut in the Listed Roses S. at York Aug. 22, where he finished a creditable seventh to Pepperoni (Ire). **QUALITY RACING ON TOWN MOOR**

Doncaster's four-day St Leger meeting, featuring the oldest Classic, opens today on Town Moor. Saturday's 225th running of the £350,000 G1 Rothmans Royals St Leger S., over an extended 1 3/4 miles, offers a fitting finale to a quality meeting. Today's opening day is "Thoroughbred Breeders' Day," featuring the third running of the £200,000 St. Leger Yearling S. for the graduates of last year's St Leger Yearling Sales at Doncaster Bloodstock Sales. That juvenile dash supports the G3 Rothmans Royals Park Hill S., known traditionally as the "Fillies St Leger." Thursday features a trio of Group 3 races--the GNER Doncaster Cup for the stayers, the GNER White Rose Park S. and the Rothmans Royals May Hill S. Also included on the card are the Listed betabet Sceptre S. and Listed Kyoto Scarbrough S., which acknowledges the Japanese St Leger, held at Kyoto. Friday's actions centres around the 168th running of the G2 Rothmans Royals Champagne S., won last year by Noverre (USA), supported by the Listed AMCO Corporation Troy S. and the DBS St Leger Yearling S., a consolation contest for those two-year-olds ballotted out of Wednesday's big sales race. Saturday's Classic is supported by the G2 Polypipe Flying Childers S. for two-year-olds over five furlongs.

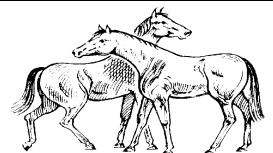

## WRITERS UP

### STABLE TOUR OF MARCUS TREGONING'S KINGWOOD HOUSE STABLES, LAMBOURN

#### NAYEF LEADS AUTUMN RAIDING PARTY

Marcus Tregoning assisted Major Dick Hern throughout the glory days of Nashwan (USA) and Dayjur (USA), and he still has the invaluable help of his mentor, but he has proved to be very much an individual of talent since taking up his own licence in 1997. Perhaps no horse has done more for his reputation than **Nayef (USA)** (Gulch {USA}), a half-brother to Nashwan and Unfuwain (USA) and one of the best juveniles of 2000. That colt is still capable of fulfilling the enormous potential of his two-year-old days and heads a select team, which Tregoning discussed last week.

#### Three-years-old and up...

**Nayef (USA)**, c, 3, **Gulch (USA)**--Height of Fashion (Fr), by Bustino (GB). O-Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum; B-Shadwell Farm Inc.

Having maintained his unbeaten record in the Listed Autumn S. at Ascot last October, he was quoted as low as 4-1 for this year's G1 2000 Guineas, but could only finish eighth in that Classic. Rested before returning to be third to Alexius (Ire) in the G3 Gordon S. at Goodwood July 31, he was then the authoritative winner of the G3 Rose of Lancaster S. at Haydock Aug. 11. He was not supplemented for the G1 St Leger on Saturday as expected. "I think Sheikh Hamdan takes the view that it would be a shame to push him at a distance that might be beyond him at three--we are looking at a four-year-old campaign with him, so I think we'll take in Group 2s at best this year and maybe he will go to France. He will race over 1 1/4 miles to 1 1/2 miles and probably goes on any ground. He looks as if he has come back to himself and he runs at Goodwood on Wednesday in the G3 Select S. He is used to undulations on our downs and gallops so hopefully it will be fine. For his size he is pretty athletic and although he has a similar action to Nashwan he is more like his mother."

**Albarahin (USA)**, h, 6, **Silver Hawk (USA)**--My Dear Lady (USA), by Mr Prospector (USA). O-Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum; B-Brereton C Jones.

A stable stalwart and consistent Group horse, he was a length second to Slickly (Fr) in last year's G2 Prix Dollar at Longchamp and may head there again Oct. 6. "He's put in everything from 1 1/4 miles to 1 1/2 miles and I think he will get 1 1/2 miles. I'm sure he's got a Group race in him this year and the Prix Dollar could be

a possibility. He's a tough old horse and must have good ground."

**Fath (USA)**, c, 4, **Danzig (USA)**--Desirable (Ire), by Lord Gayle (USA). O-Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum; B-Shadwell Farm Inc.

A half-brother to Shadayid (USA), Fath was runner-up in the G1 Middle Park S. at Newmarket at two before a below-par sophomore campaign. He seemed to return to form last time when winning the G3 Lennox S. at Goodwood Aug. 3. "We are done with sprinting with him now as he settles so much better. He's getting back to where he was as a two-year-old and we've put him in everything from seven furlongs to a mile. The G3 Concorde S. at Tipperary Oct. 7 is a possibility."

**Sayedah (Ire)**, f, 3, **Darshaan (GB)**--Balaabel (USA), by Sadler's Wells (USA). O-Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum; B-Shadwell Estate Company Limited.

Having beaten Imagine (Ire) in last year's G2 Rockfel S. at Newmarket in October, Sayedah looked a Classic candidate, but was unplaced in the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket May 6. "Sayedah ran a good race last time [when second in the Listed Atlanta S. at Sandown Sept. 1] and, with a bit of luck, we'll go for the G3 Blandford S. at The Curragh Sept. 16. A mile and a quarter is what she likes."

Only last week, we were discussing the pedigree of a Grade I winner bred on the Mr. Prospector/Clever Trick cross, the GI Hopeful S. winner Came Home. This week, we have the GI Gazelle H. winner Exogenous, who is by Mr. Prospector's grandson Unbridled, out of a mare by Clever Trick's son, Phone Trick.

The Gazelle marked the first stakes victory for Exogenous, but she had already acquitted herself well in top-class company, finishing second in the GI Coaching Club American Oaks and GI Alabama S. and third in the GI Mother Goose S. For the Gazelle, trainer Scotty Schulhofer added blinkers and with the equipment change, Exogenous found the focus to move her game up a level. Incidentally, on an historical note it is worth recalling that at the beginning of his career, Schulhofer trained two-time champion sprinter Ta Wee, a half sister to both Magic--the third dam of Unbridled--and Dr. Fager, the broodmare sire of Unbridled's sire Fappiano.

Exogenous is the eighth Grade I winner from the first six crops sired by Unbridled. His very first crop yielded GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Unbridled's Song and GI Kentucky Derby victor Grindstone; champion Ban-shee Breeze and another excellent distaffer Manistique came in his third crop and his fifth crop produced champion two-year-old colt Anees, GI Preakness S. winner Red Bullet and GI Travers S. hero Unshaded.

Exogenous comes from what seems to be a very filly-oriented family. Her dam is half sister to a pair of distaff stakes winners in Count on a Change and T. V. Countess. Winner of the Politely H. at Pimlico, T.V. Countess became an even better producer than runner. Her first three runners were all stakes winners, headed by the champion two-year-old filly Countess Diana. She is also dam of Count on Numbers, a multiple stakes winner of \$254,624 and the only male stakes winner in the first three generations of Exogenous's pedigree, and of Fighting Countess, a stakes winner who is also dam of stakes-winning filly Dawn Princess. Exogenous's granddam Count on Kathy was not only stakes placed herself, but was also half sister to the graded-stakes winning fillies Barbarika and Lucky Lady Lauren (like Count on Kathy, a granddaughter of Northern Dancer). Exogenous's third dam War Exchange was yet another filly stakes winner.

Exogenous follows Roamin Rachel, Traitor and Came Home as the fourth Grade I winner bred on the Mr. Prospector/Clever Trick cross, both she and Traitor being by sons of Fappiano. Exogenous owns rather an outcross pedigree, in fact she's a complete outcross at five generations. However, both her parents are inbred individuals. Unbridled has Aspidistra 4x4 through the half brother and sister Dr. Fager and Magic and Tangled Up in Blue, the dam of Exogenous, has the three-quarters related Icecapade and Northern Dancer in the third generation of the pedigree.

Aspidistra is by Better Self, who is by Bimelech--a son of La Troienne--out of a War Admiral mare. Exogenous's broodmare sire Phone Trick picks up on this, as his granddam is by Mr. Busher, who is bred on a reverse cross to Better Self as he is by War Admiral out of a daughter of La Troienne.

It's also not surprising to see Unbridled's grandsire Mr. Prospector working well with a mare who has Icecapade and Northern Dancer. They are by a son of Nearco out of mares by Native Dancer and Mr. Prospector is by a son of Native Dancer out of a mare by a grandson of Nearco.
