THE LOGICAL CHOICE

Queen's Logic (Ire) (Grand Lodge) beat **Sophisticat** (Storm Cat) by 1 1/4 lengths the G2 Lowther S. at York Aug. 23 and rates the nod again in today's G1 Shadwell Stud Cheveley Park S. at Newmarket. Trainer Mick Channon's filly defied a three-pound penalty with that victory, a penalty she picked up in winning the G3 Queen Mary S. at Royal Ascot June 20, where she beat Sophisticat by a half length at level weights. Sophisticat came back to be a fine third to Quarter Moon (Ire) in the G1 Moyglare Stud S. going seven furlongs at The Curragh Sept. 2 and warrants respect dropping back down in trip. The connections of **Silent Honor (Ire)** (Sunday Silence), third in the Lowther, have made significant comments about their filly in the run-up to this race. Silent Honor carried a five-pound penalty at York due to a short head success in the G2 Cherry Hinton S. at Newmarket July 10. Last time out, she led until approaching the final furlong, but had no answer in the closing stages under her weight burden. The David Loder team remain convinced of her ability and they will adopt different tactics this time.

TATTERSALLS HOUGHTON GETS UNDERWAY

Tattersalls Marketing Manager Jimmy George was confident yesterday that the British company's flagship Houghton Yearling Sale, which begins this evening at 5:30, will be largely unaffected by gloomy global economic prospects. "Obviously, there are economic uncertainties, but we have a world-class catalogue which has been well received from the word go," said George. "The paddocks have been busy since the weekend and Houghton graduates have excelled themselves throughout the world all year." With an increasing number of the best yearlings not appearing at public auction and several vendors waiting with some lots for Tattersalls' October Sale, this year's catalogue is the smallest ever, with just 190 lots. But Coolmore and the Maktoum family, the two protagonists who annually account for the bulk of turnover at this sale, have been as busy as ever at the select sales this year and are expected to play a prominent part at the Houghton in Newmarket. With 27 entries, champion sire Sadler's Wells accounts for one in seven of the catalogue. Among those that stand out are Lot 14, Bosra's Valentine, a colt out of Classic winner Bosra Sham (Woodman) offered for Wafic Said through Watership Down Stud. Simon Marsh, manager of Watership Down, said, "I think this is a wonderful horse--he's a very loose mover and very typical of Sadler's Wells, but he has got an awful lot of the mare in him as well." Peintre Celebre (Nureyev) is the best-represented first-season sire with 14 entries, while Desert Prince (Ire) (Green Desert) perhaps boasts the best quality of any freshman. Lot 126, his colt out of Irish champion Park Express (Ire) (Ahonoora {GB}) from Lodge Park Stud, and Lot 155, a half brother to G1 Vodafone Derby winner Oath (Ire), are among his potential stars. Of the lots offered as foals, none made more than Lot 32, a Keeneland July withdrawal. By King Of Kings (Ire), he realised \$425,000 at Keeneland November. He is consigned by Ashtown House Stud of Coolmore's Paul Shanahan. One notable withdrawal is Lot 82, a Zafonic half-brother to leading sire Grand Lodge who made two million guineas as a foal. The colt sustained an injury and now could race for the Howard de Walden family's Plantation Stud, his breeder. Selling starts at 4 p.m. tomorrow and at 5:30 p.m. Thursday.

That form looks rock-solid, with runner-up Firebreak (GB), third-placed Meshaheer (USA) and sixth-placed Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) following up in Group company subsequently. David Loder is double-handed here, with Leicester maiden winner **Indian Dreamer**, the choice of

jockey Frankie Dettori over **Desert Warning**. The latter ran fourth behind Expected Bonus in a competitive Kempton conditions event Sept. 8 last time.

ARC PICTURE CLEARING

With the prospect of soft ground at Longchamp for Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, the race's definition was taking shape yesterday. Although Longchamp officials do not expect the heavy conditions in which Montjeu (Ire) triumphed in 1999, heavy recent rainfall has turned the going to "very soft". **Sakhee (USA)** (Bahri {USA}), confirmed a definite runner by Godolphin on Saturday unless the ground is "very heavy", may face a small field as potential challengers avoid the testing ground. However, while **Grandera (Ire)** (Grand Lodge {USA}) looks increasingly unlikely to line up, owner Jean-Luc Lagardere has given the go-ahead for trainer Andre Fabre to supplement **Diamilina (Fr)** (Linamix {Fr}) at Thursday's stage. The runner-up in the G1 Prix Vermeille at Longchamp Sept. 16 is set to join stable companion **Sagacity (Fr)** (Highest Honor {Fr}), half brother to 1998 winner Sagamix (Fr).

Very few horses generate what could be termed the "ooh factor," the ooh being the collective sigh of excitement which rises from the stands when a horse turns in an unusually spectacular display. Sadler's Wells' unbeaten daughter Gossamer has raced only three times, but she has caused this sharp intake of breath twice, first in the G3 Prestige S., then when winning the G1 Meon Valley Stud Fillies' Mile with a breathtaking burst.

Gossamer is the latest in an impressively long line of big winners to emerge from Gerald Leigh's Eydon Hall Farm, even though this very select breeding operation housed fewer than 20 mares throughout the '90s.

One pivotal moment in Eydon Hall's success story came at Keeneland in 1989, when Leigh stepped in to buy Korveya after the Riverman mare had been led out unsold at \$700,000. Remarkably, the two colts produced by Korveya prior to that sale--Hector Protector and Shanghai--both went on to win the French 2000 Guineas and the mare kept up the good work for Leigh, producing Bosra Sham. The filly topped the 1994

Houghton Sales prior to developing into her dam's third Classic winner.

Leigh shrewdly capitalised on Korveya's success, first selling a 50-percent share to Jayeff B Stables in 1995 and then selling the mare for a world record-breaking \$7,000,000 in 1998.

As Leigh explained in a recent interview in the *Racing Post*, "One of our strengths over the years has been a rigid policy of culling and I have always kept selling to replace the blood."

Last year, Leigh sold some of his young homebred mares at Tattersalls' December Sales, including Gossamer's half-sister Brocattelle. Even though the four-year-old had failed to win and was rated only 65 by Timeform, she topped the sale at 1,700,000 guineas, a price which constituted a record for a broodmare in Europe. Leigh therefore has the distinction of selling the highest-priced mares on both sides of the Atlantic.

Brocattelle's price reflects the enormous strides made by her family since her second dam, Canton Silk, became one of Leigh's foundation mares in the early '70s.

At the time, Canton Silk's pedigree could have been described as more blue-collar than white-collar, with few of her immediate relatives having ventured into stakes company. However, Canton Silk was undeniably bred for speed. Her sire Runnymede had been a five-furlong specialist, while her dam Clouded Lamp had won three times over sprint distances as a juvenile.

Canton Silk quickly showed she had inherited a full measure of her parents' speed, winning four times during a career spent exclusively at five furlongs. Although she didn't earn any black type, her Timeform rating of 108 as a juvenile stamped her as well above average. Clouded Lamp's next foal, a filly named after Irma Flintstone, confirmed that this could be a family with a future. Although Irma Flintstone also retired without any black type, Timeform rated this fast filly 110.

Gerald Leigh paid £22,500 for Canton Silk and decided to give her every chance as a broodmare, sending her to several top-class milers and to the Arc winner Rheingold. The mare justified his confidence, producing

a string of stakes performers headed by Brocade, a Habitat filly who rounded off a very good career with a victory in the G1 Prix de la Foret.

All four of Canton Silk's other daughters were sold, including Organza, whose first foal was the high-class sprinter and Classic sire Desert Style. Leigh could afford to lose them, though, because Brocade quickly showed that she was every bit as effective as a broodmare as she had been on the track. Gossamer is her fourth Group winner, following Free At Last, Zabar and Gossamer's top-class brother Barathea.

American racegoers will remember Free At Last for her win in the GIII Countess Fager H. and Barathea for his outstanding victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile. Free At Last in turn has become the dam of Coretta, a Caerleon filly who finished a close second in the 1999 GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf.

Coretta, who visited Seeking the Gold in 2000 and 2001, now ranks alongside Brocade and Brocade's daughters Free At Last, Bombazine and Zibilene as one of the 22 mares in this year's Eydon Hall stud book.

Gossamer is now a hot favorite for next year's 1000 Guineas. If she takes her chance, she will be bidding to become the fourth Classic winner sired by Sadler's Wells from a Habitat mare, following Barathea (Irish 2000 Guineas), Dance Design (Irish Oaks) and King of Kings (2000 Guineas). Amethyst, another filly bred to this pattern, was second in last year's Irish 1000 Guineas. Sadler's Wells has also sired the Group winners Alnasr Alwasheek, Batshoof and Kirov Premiere from daughters of Habitat. Even allowing for the fact that these good winners come from a sample of over 50, this is a striking success story. Apparently Sadler's Wells, whose stock has an average winning distance of around 11 furlongs, benefits greatly from the speed which gave Habitat's mature stock an average winning distance of just under a mile.

CLARIFICATION: Queenie Belle (Bertrando), winner of Saturday's GII Lady's Secret Breeders' Cup at Santa Anita, is fully nominated to the Breeders' Cup, contrary to a post-race quote from trainer Ben Cecil in Sunday's TDN, which indicated that the sire was not nominated to the Breeders' Cup. We regret any confusion.

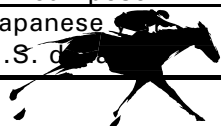
