LOGIC WINS THE DAY

Queen's Logic (Ire) (Grand Lodge), sent off the 10-11 favourite, blitzed her opponents in the G1 Cheveley Park S. at Newmarket yesterday with a devastating display of speed to beat **Sophisticat** (Storm Cat) by seven lengths. Such was her authority here that Ladbrokes responded by making the unbeaten filly their 5-2 favourite for next year's G1 1000 Guineas back here in May. Jockey Steve Drowne, enjoying his first Group 1 success, was overwhelmed by her performance, "The filly gives you confidence--I thought she'd win this morning, but I never dreamt she'd win like that." Trainer Mick Channon, famed for his handling of the brilliant juvenile **Bint Allayl** (GB), commented, "She's got a great attitude, and from day one she's been a bit special. She has improved and held her form well throughout the year." Queen's Logic started her career in a five-furlong conditions event at Newbury in May before taking the step up to stakes company in stride with a half-length win in the G3 Queen Mary S. at Royal Ascot. Given a break after that outing, she returned in peak condition to take the G2 Lowther S. at York Aug. 23. Yesterday, she broke well before being settled in fourth behind the strong early pacesetter **Lahinch (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). As that filly continued to up the tempo passing the halfway marker, Drowne asked his filly to pick up the pace and she did so in a matter of strides. Hitting the front passing the quarter-mile pole, Queen's Logic quickened clear under a hand ride to leave **Sophisticat** and Michael Kinane trailing in her wake. "She goes on any ground, in any conditions--you can ride her however," Drowne explained. "She's not a filly that you have to think about getting cover on and she settles naturally--she's just got everything. She's taken on the best in her last three races and she's beaten the best. On everything else I've ridden today the ground felt soft, but on her it felt like good ground. In the last furlong she flew up the hill--she's just got such a fantastic attitude." Channon refused to be drawn on comparisons with **Bint Allayl** afterwards, but said, "Bint Allayl was a bit special, but I think this filly is probably a bit special again. This filly will get a mile standing on her head." **Silent Honor (Ire)** (Sunday Silence), withdrawn due to the soft conditions, will now winter in Dubai.

GREEN DESERT COLT IS HOUGHTON TOPPER

Irish bloodstock agent Demi O'Byrne signed the ticket for lot 25, the 1.3 million guineas topper at yesterday's opening session of the Tattersalls Houghton Yearling Sales in Newmarket, England. John Magnier actually made the final bid, outpointing John Ferguson, who usually acts for Godolphin. The prized yearling is by **Green Desert**. The Weinfeld family's Meon Valley Stud in Hampshire consigned the bay colt, out of **Colorvista** (GB) (Shirley Heights {GB}), an unraced daughter of the family's foundation mare **Reprocolor** (GB). The half brother to five winners, including G1SP **Mudeer** (GB), will race for Michael Tabor and Magnier's wife Sue. O'Byrne said, "He is a lovely horse and will be joining [trainer] Aidan O'Brien." The biggest purchaser of the evening was Sheikh Maktoum al Maktoum's Gainsborough Stud, which spent 1,990,000gns on three lots, the most expensive being the 1 million guineas spent to secure the second-highest priced yearling of the evening, lot 13, a colt by Grand Lodge out of the mare **Bonne Etoile** (GB) (Diesis {GB}). The sheikh's racing and stud manager Michael Goodbody, commented, "There is no plan for him at the moment--we take them all back and sort them out as we have a lot of homebreds to think about as well. He has everything you look for in a racehorse, presence, a great individual, with a stallion's pedigree by a good sire." Early interest in the colt came from the Japanese J S Company and Irish agent Peter Doyle, but the final battle was between Coolmore's agent O'Byrne and Goodbody, whose final bid failed to find a response from O'Byrne after discussions with Tabor and Magnier. The result was pinhooking bliss for Timmy Hyde, whose Camas Park Stud consigned the colt, purchased for 155,000gns in the same ring as a foal last December. **Cont. p. 2**

LOMITAS TO DALHAM HALL Top German sire **Lomitas (GB)** (Niniski {USA}--La Colorada {Ger}, by Surumu {Ger}) will now stand at Darley's Dalham Hall Stud in Newmarket for a fee of £12,000, Oct. 1 terms. He previously stood at Germany's Gestut Fahrhof. Horse of the Year at three in Germany, Lomitas has sired champions Belenus (Ger) and Sumitas (Ger) as well as globe-trotting millionaire Silvano (Ger) from just four crops to race. "He's one of the best racehorses and finest stallions Germany has ever produced, and moving him to Darley is certain to present him with mares of a very high quality and from diverse bloodlines," said Dr. Andreas Jacobs of Gestut Fahrhof. "I'm delighted Lomitas has an opportunity to prove himself on the world stage."

UNFUWAIN UNDERGOES SURGERY **Unfuwain (USA)** (Northern Dancer {Can}) will undergo treatment after a growth was discovered on the left side of his jaw, it was reported yesterday. The statement from Shadwell Estate Company read: "Richard Lancaster, general manager of Shadwell Stud, has expressed every confidence that Unfuwain will be fit in time for the 2002 covering season." Unfuwain's reputation has undergone a revival in recent times, having sired Petrushka (Ire), champion three-year-old filly of 2000, and Lailani (GB), who followed that filly's success in this year's G1 Irish Oaks at The Curragh July 15 and may yet assume the champion's mantle herself in 2001. Unfuwain is also the sire of Alhaarth (Ire), Lahan (GB), Bolas (GB), and Zahrat Dubai (GB).

SAKHEE HEADS 19 IN ARC **Sakhee (USA)** (Bahri {USA}) will face a maximum of 18 rivals in Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe Luciene Barriere at Longchamp. Godolphin left in stable companions **Ekraar (USA)** (Red Ransom {USA}) and **Wareed (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}), with the latter to be possibly deployed as a pacemaker in the 12-furlong event. Likewise, Aidan O'Brien may use **Shoal Creek (Ire)** (Fairy King {USA}) to ensure a strong pace for G1 St Leger winner **Milan (GB)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}). All the main protagonists stood their ground, the only notable withdrawal being James Fanshawe's **Grandera (Ire)** (Grand Lodge {USA}) as expected.

GENEROUS WILL SHUTTLE TO PLANTATION Champion **Generous (Ire)** (Caerleon {USA}--Doff the Derby {USA}, by Master Derby {USA}), recently purchased by New Zealand's Glenmorgan Farm, will stand the Northern Hemisphere breeding season at Newmarket's Plantation Stud. His fee will be £8,000, Oct. 1 terms. A dual Derby hero in 1991, he was sold to Japan in 1996. "With Kris moving into retirement this season, we were on the lookout for a suitable replacement," said Leslie Harrison, general manager of Plantation Stud. "When Generous was sold to Japan in 1996, I don't think anyone had realized or appreciated just how good a stallion he was. He simply had too short a time for the results to be achieved on the track." From four European crops, the chestnut sired champions Catella (Ger) and Lisieux Rose (Ire) as well as Highland Gift (Ire), dam of this year's G1 2,000 Guineas victor Golan (Ire). His half-sister, Imagine (Ire) (Sadler's Wells {USA}) captured both the G1 Irish 1,000 Guineas and the G1 Epsom Oaks.

£400,000 Tattersalls Houghton Sales S. cont.

In the final Houghton Sales race, bargain purchase Sir George Turner provided his trainer with a fairytale success after a thrilling climax here. Third on his debut in an Ascot conditions event July 14, he followed up with a smooth success in a Leicester maiden July 25. Second last time to the smart Steenberg (Ire) in the Shergar Cup Juvenile at Ascot Aug. 11, he was targeted at this valuable event and duly delivered on rain-softened ground. Jockey Kevin Darley had to work to get Sir George Turner into a prominent position as Desert Warning led throughout the early stages. The leader increased the pressure past the halfway mark, but Darley kept him in his sights and when the gap came on the rail, he sent Sir George Turner through. Passing the game frontrunner with 150 yards remaining, he stayed on well under strong driving to deny the late thrust of Landseer and Michael Kinane. The latter was the subject of a stewards' enquiry after being manoeuvred out of a tight spot inside the final quarter mile by Kinane, but the placings remained unaltered. Winning trainer Mark Johnston reported that the colt will be aimed at the G1 Epsom Derby next June, sidestepping the G1 2000 Guineas here in May.

Coolmore's **Pistolet Bleu (Ire)** (Top Ville {Ire}--Pampa Bella {Fr}, by Armos {Ire}) died after a severe colic attack, *Racing Post* reported. He was taken to Troytown Veterinary Hospital, but could not be saved. Previously based at Haras d'Etream, the 13-year-old stallion had moved to Ireland in January to serve as a National Hunt sire. He sired three Group winners on the Flat this season: Maille Pistol (Fr), Bonnet Rouge (Fr) and Baldwina (Fr). Pistolet Bleu raced in the colors of breeder Daniel Wildenstein, winning the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud and the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud, and was the highweight older horse in France over 11-14 furlongs as a four-year-old.

KING CUGAT OUT FOR THE YEAR King Cugat (Kingmambo) has been sidelined for the remainder of the year due to ligament strain to his left foreleg. The injury, sustained during a second-place finish in last Saturday's GI Turf Classic Invitational at Belmont Park, will force the four-year-old to miss the GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Belmont Oct. 27. "[The ligament] has been a chronic problem with [King Cugat]. It's not the first time it's been an issue," trainer Bill Mott told *Daily Racing Form*. Dr. Steven Carr, manager of Centennial Farms told *The Blood-Horse*, "It is not career threatening, just an untimely injury." Carr said an ultrasound examination revealed that, "none of the other structures in the area are affected." King Cugat, winner of the GII Bowling Green H. at Belmont July 7, placed in three other Grade I races this year including, the GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic S. at Churchill Downs, the GI Manhattan H. and the GI Sword Dancer H. He has won seven of 16 lifetime starts with total earnings of \$1,293,782.

GRAND SLAM COLT TOPS FASIG MIDLANTIC A colt from the first crop of Grade I winner Grand Slam brought a final bid of \$140,000 to top yesterday's second session of the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Eastern Fall Yearlings Sale in Timonium, Maryland. The colt, consigned by Minerva Stud with Summerfield, agent, is the first foal of the unraced mare Minster Abbey (Dehere). Cam Allard made the winning bid. The sale's final session begins today at 10 a.m.

MACHO UNO STILL ON TRACK FOR CLASSIC Last year's champion juvenile **Macho Uno** (Holy Bull) is still on track to run in the Breeders' Cup Classic despite a third-place effort in Saturday's GII Ohio Derby. The smallest number of yearlings ever sold at an opening session of Tattersalls Houghton Sales, 32, produced a new record median of 170,000gns, up 31 percent. Last year saw 39 change hands with a median of 130,000gns, then an opening-session record. The average this year was fractionally up at 254,937gns and a new record for the session, with last year's average coming to 253,692gns. Since the 2000 top price of 3.4 million guineas was part of the opening session, turnover was not surprisingly down. There were three not solds at the lower end of the market plus 10 vendor buy-backs amounting to 1,310,000gns which do not appear in the figures, the highest being the 500,000gns for lot 14, the colt by Sadler's Wells--Bosra Sham (Woodman), consigned from Watership Down Stud. Tattersalls spokesman Jimmy George commented on the evening's results: "We have to be very pleased with how the opening session has gone considering events in the last few weeks. The average has matched last year's and the median has shown a 31-percent rise." The sale continues today at 4 p.m.

STEADY AS SHE GOES

It was always going to be open to question how much we would learn from an opening (after racing) evening session in which only 45 yearlings went through the ring. In the event, I think we learned plenty. Demi O'Byrne bought the first horse in the ring (170,000gns for a colt from the first crop by Bahri's half brother Bahhare {Woodman}). Shadwell bought the second, and away they went.

By close of business last night, there were 32 sold--a respectable 71 percent--for 8,158,000 gns, and an average of 254,938gns, which is nine percent higher than last year's overall sale average of 233,886gns. Sixteen of the horses were sold to the three Maktoum operations (nine), Charlie Gordon-Watson (four), or Demi (three). That half of the catalogue averaged 377,500gns and accounted for 74 percent of the session's gross. The other half of the catalogue averaged 132,375gns--just over a third of the top half's average.

There was, understandably, a lot of nervousness before last night's session. Would there be buyers for the horses the Maktoums or Coolmore didn't want? The consensus of the judges I spoke to was that Tattersalls, once again, had the individuals to match the sale's stature; but would the buyers appear for so many nice horses? On the whole on day one, the answer was a pretty resounding yes. Admittedly, the big players bought half the horses sold; but that just confirms there were plenty of horses there good enough for them to buy. We don't really know yet how many the Maktoum interests, in particular, are prepared to buy of the remaining 130 to be sold today and tomorrow, nor do we know whether there will be any depth to the market beyond the big players. But we do know there was plenty to attract the big players on the sale's opening night.

So the biggest trend so far is that Tattersalls sustained two critical aspects of the Houghton sale: a highly rated collection of individuals to match the pedigrees and the ability to interest and attract the game's very biggest players. Half the horses sold, and three-quarters of the money spent, is a great result, even if it does leave the vital question of other buyers up in the air for the time being. At least the big players are here and looking for horses to buy.

As far as any trends among stallions, there is only one that merits comment from last night's session, I thought. There were two horses sold for 1 million guineas or more (one to Demi, one to Gainsborough), and the two had an interesting, and significant pedigree link. Both were sired by Danzig-line sires. The first was Hip 13, a Grand Lodge colt out of a Diesis mare, from Timmy Hyde's consignment. Gainsborough won that one at an even million. This colt had a huge pedigree boost yesterday afternoon, in that he is bred on exactly the same cross as Queen's Logic, who demolished the field in the G1 Cheveley Park S. for two-year-old fillies. Last night's second million-guineas yearling, in fact the session topper, at 1.3 million, was a colt by Danzig's son Green Desert.

Queen's Logic's success, by the way, was a great win for quite a few of the game's familiar faces. She was bred by the popular Kip McCreery and bought as a yearling by Charlie Gordon-Watson for Jaber Abdullah, a longtime pal of Sheikh Maktoum's. This was Charlie's third Cheveley Park winner and his second in three years, after Seazun in 1999, trained by Mick Channon, who is increasingly gaining recognition as a top-flight trainer. Mick certainly organized a splendid campaign for Queen's Logic, who became the first filly since Dead Certain to win the Queen Mary (5f) at Royal Ascot, the Lowther (6f) at York, and the Cheveley Park. It may be seven months away, but the prospect of a meeting between Queen's Logic and Fillies' Mile winner Gossamer (Gerald Leigh's full sister to Barathea, L. Cumani directing) has a lot of hardened race-watchers excited. *Cont. p. 4*

Speaking of impressive performances, how about Sheikh Maktoum's filly Lailani, trained at his Gainsborough Stables by Ed Dunlop. She won her seventh straight in last weekend's GI Flower Bowl, and is now just about favorite for the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare turf race. That's impressive enough; but what's even more impressive is that she is one of no less than four high-class three-year-old fillies trained by E. Dunlop --all, if I'm not mistaken, for different owners. Mot Juste was second to stablemate Lailani in the Irish Oaks, for a stable Classic one-two, and the same outfit has two other group-winning three-year-old fillies in Ranin and Independence. He's campaigned them intelligently, and earned a lot of respect among professionals.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

Just two weeks ago we were talking about the rapidly increasing impact of the stallion sons of Storm Cat. The success story looked set to continue in the GI Oak Leaf S., where the Tabasco Cat filly HabibtI appeared a likely odds-on favorite. Unfortunately, HabibtI was scratched after developing a fever, but the race still went to a daughter of a Storm Cat stallion in the less predictable shape of the Delineator filly, Tali'sluckybusride.

Tali'sluckybusride had won her only previous start, a Del Mar maiden event, by 2 1/2 lengths, but was the outsider of the entire field for the Oak Leaf. A comparative rarity, a Washington-bred Grade I winner, the filly realized \$23,000 at the Washington September Yearling Sales, a price which made her the most expensive of the three Delineator yearlings sold that year.

Delineator is not one of Storm Cat's better known stallion sons, but he was a more-than-useful performer, particularly at two, when he won four of his five starts, including the GIII Generous S. and Leland Stanford S. Delineator also owned plenty of pedigree. His dam, a daughter of Grey Dawn II, was out of the GI Matron S. winner Alpine Lass, herself a sister to Hopeful S. victor and sire Irish Castle. Delineator retired to stud at Woodstead Farm, Graham, Washington, at a fee of \$3,000, and has done relatively well at stud considering his modest price. From 99 named foals in his first four crops Delineator has sired six stakes winners, including the GIII Longacres Mile H. winner Edneator. Incidentally, Delineator's unraced brother Z Z Cat, who stands in Illinois, has sired MSW Q. P. Cat in his first crop.

Tali'sluckybusride is the fifth foal of her dam Springhurst, a daughter of the promising broodmare sire Lord At War. Springhurst never earned black-type, but she was a hard-knocking mare who amassed \$135,957 from seven victories over three seasons. Springhurst's dam Del Dun Gee, by the Bold Commander horse Bold Dun-Cee, was an even harder worker. She made 78 starts in four years, winning 12 races, including four black-type events, and earning \$192,255. Del Dun Gee is one of the many stakes winners to benefit from multiple strains of genetic relatives from the La Troienne family. She is inbred 4 x 4 to Better Self, who is by La Troienne's son Bimelech, and her dam is inbred 3 x 3 to Bimelech's half sister Belle of Troy (by Blue Larkspur, a grandson of Bimelech's sire, Black Toney, and so closely related to Bimelech).

Tali'sluckybusride's fifth dam Best Side, is by Better Self out of Belle of Troy, and so has La Troienne 3 x 2. Best Side only won one minor race, but in addition to Tali'sluckybusride, she is ancestress of other Grade I winners Cutlass Reality, Seldom Seen Sue, Bail Out Becky and More Than Ready.

Tali'sluckybusride doesn't have any additional La Troienne through her sire, but she still owns a clever pedigree. Her granddam Alpine Lass is by Bold Ruler out of a daughter of the Menow mare Longford. As mentioned above, Tali'sluckybusride's dam Springhurst carries Bold Commander, and he is by Bold Ruler and his second dam Dynamo is a three-parts sister to Longford. In addition to being daughters of Menow, Longford and Dynamo share a common granddam in Erin, an outstanding tap-root mare who is also ancestress of Icecapade, Ruffian, Private Terms, Coronado's Quest, Demons Begone, Pine Bluff, Epitome (dam of this weekend's graded stakes winning two-year-old Essence of Dubai), Majestic Light and Fusaichi Pegasus. Tali'sluckybusride is not the only Grade I winner with inbreeding to genetic relatives by Bold Ruler from the Erin family. Formal Gold, a dual Grade I winner of over \$1.5 million, combines Irish Castle (brother to Alpine Lass), with Bold Commander. The same pair are also found together in the pedigree of Conquistador Cielo's graded stakes winning daughter Freeport Flight.
