## DANEHILL DOMINATES DAY TWO

A half brother by Danehill to 1997 two-year-old champion Second Empire (Ire) (Fairy King) and Hemingway (Ire) (Spectrum {Ire}) was bought for Ir£2.1 million to top yesterday's second and final session of the Goffs Orby Sale in County Kildare, Ireland. The colt, consigned for Kilcarn Stud, was bought by Demi O'Byrne after a protracted duel with Shadwell Estates and The Thoroughbred Corporation and was the second highest price ever paid for a yearling at Goffs since the 3.1 million guineas paid for Authaal in 1984. He was a superb looker and O'Byrne arrived late on the scene after Shadwell and the Thoroughbred Corporation battled it out until they reached the Ir£2 million barrier. But the Coolmore advisor had the final say. "Second Empire was a good horse," O'Byrne commented. "The champion two-year-old in 1997. This is his brother by the champion stallion and he was the horse of the sale." O'Byrne also bought the second highest lot of the day, a Ir£550,000 full brother to Rock of Gibraltar (Ire), who took the G1 Grand Criterium impressively on Sunday. Selling as lot 248, the bay son of Danehill--Offshore Boom (Ire) was offered by Ashtown House Stud. Peter Doyle went to Ir£520,000 for yet another son of Danehill. Lot 350 was offered from Abbeville and Meadow Court Studs and had plenty of admirers, but Doyle fended off all comers to secure the colt from the family of Evening Performance and Tirol. "I have bought him for an overseas client who wishes to remain anonymous. He is a very nice horse," Doyle explained. Shadwell Estates signed the ticket for lot 305, a bay colt by Unfuwain who was purchased for Ir£65,000 as a foal last year by Clodagh McStay of Oaklawn Stud. However, on this occasion he went for £380,000. Luke Lillingston of Kern Lillingston Bloodstock paid Ir£450,000 for lot 384, a bay filly by Danehill out of a half sister to the dam of GISW Danish (Ire). "She has been bought for a client of Henry Cecil's and will go into training with him," Lillingston said. "She is a gorgeous filly and Danehill has worked well in the family through Danish and Hawkeye." *Orby Statistics, p2*

## FIREBREAK TO BE SOLD AT TATTERSALLS

**Firebreak (GB)** (Charnwood Forest {Ire}), winner of the G2 Dubai Duty Free Mill Reef S. at Newbury Sept. 21, is to be sold at the upcoming Autumn Horses in Training Sale at Tattersalls in Newmarket, scheduled for Oct. 29 to Nov. 2. Trained by Ian Balding and owned by Kennet Valley Thoroughbreds I, Firebreak has won four of his six starts to date and is officially the equal third-highest rated juvenile colt in Britain. He won his first two starts and was then a neck second to Landseer (GB) in the G3 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot June 19, finishing ahead of recent G1 Grand Criterium winner Rock Of Gibraltar (Ire). The bay was also successful in the G3 Prix de Cabourg at Deauville Aug. 4, and returned to the same track to finish fourth to treble G1 winner Johannesburg in the Prix Morny Aug. 26. Commenting on the upcoming sale, Kennet Valley Thoroughbreds Chairman Nick Robinson said, "Firebreak has been a little bit special from the word go. He is undoubtedly the best horse that Kennet Valley has ever owned, and obviously it is with some regret that we are offering him for sale, but those are the terms of the partnership agreement." Firebreak is a half-brother to five other winners out of the stakes-placed mare Breakaway (GB) (Song {GB}). He was sold at last year's Tattersalls October Yearling Sale by Scorrier House Stud and was purchased for 27,000 guineas by bloodstock agent Charlie Gordon-Watson.

## PINT GIVEN

James Given, one of Britain's emerging trainers, will be chasing the Autumn Double when he saddles 16-1 chance **Hugs Dancer (Fr)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) in the 2 1/4-mile £120,000 Tote Cesarewitch H. on Champions' Day at Newmarket Oct. 20. Should Hugs Dancer be successful, Given's 12 staff will share the Tote's £10,000 stable staff bonus for any yard landing the double and will also celebrate the win with 1000 cans of beer courtesy of local brewer Greene King. No trainer has pulled off the Cambridgeshire--Cesarewitch H. double since Sam Darling in 1925, but Given has a realistic chance following I Cried For You (Ire)'s win in last weekend's first leg. The third year trainer said, "The relentless gallop of the Cesarewitch will suit him down to the ground. He stayed and stayed over two and a half miles at Goodwood and the only doubt I would have would be if it came up soft at Newmarket. He's a much better horse on good ground. He worked well yesterday and it would be lovely to pull of the double and it would be a great bonus for the staff to win."

## HUGHES TRANSFERRED

Khalid Abdullah's retained jockey Richard Hughes has been transferred from Cambridge's Addenbrooke's Hospital to Evelyn Hospital, also in the university city, where he will remain for an unspecified period after fracturing his left tibia in an accident at Newmarket last Saturday. It is believed that his family felt the move would make the rider feel more comfortable. Doctors are still waiting to apply a new caste to Hughes' leg, but cannot do so until the swelling subsides.

**ANOTHER INDEPENDENCE DAY?**

Cliveden Stud's **Independence (GB)** (Selkirk {USA}) may yet race again this season with the eight-furlong G1 Hong Kong Mile at Sha Tin Dec. 16 a possible target. The Ed Dunlop-trained homebred was gaining her fourth, and most important, win of the year when successful in last Saturday's G2 Sun Chariot S. at Newmarket. "There is no decision at this stage but if she does run again it will be in the Hong Kong Invitational." Cliveden Stud's Philip Freedman told *Racing Post*. He added, "There is no guarantee that she will run, but she has come out Saturday's race fine and the plan at this stage is very much towards training in England next year. The reason for the hesitancy in electing the Sha Tin race is that nominations for the races are not announced until November 9 and much will depend on numbers and actual participants in the races. I imagine she will be kept ticking over until then and if it looked like getting an invitation, we would take a view at that time."

**MURTAGH RETURNS**

Johnny Murtagh, who escaped serious injury in a nasty looking incident when unseated from **True Crystal (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}) at The Curragh last Saturday, is to resume race riding at Gowran Park's mixed card today. Murtagh, who required four stitches in his right foot, missed out on riding sixth-place finisher Little Rock (GB) (Warning {GB}) in Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe as a consequence of the injury. John Oxx's stable jockey sat out the first three days of this week because of a riding ban but is raring to get back into the action. He told *Racing Post*, "My foot feels very good. It was worse when it happened, it was very sore at the time. I got four stitches and the stitches seem to be knitting very well. The doctor is happy with it, the swelling has gone down so I'll be back tomorrow with three rides, two for John Oxx, and I ride Clare Rose in the other (flat) race."

## WRITERS UP

### HOPE SPRINGS ETERNAL FOR THE SADLER'S WELLS BREED

It would be fair to say that relations between the Australian Thoroughbred industry and the Sadler's Wells breed got off on the wrong foot. At the beginning of the nineties, when the Irish sire phenomenon was setting the foundations of his remarkable stud career, Sheikh Maktoum al Maktoum put his highly performed stayer Braashee (Ire) into the care of the Hayes family of Lindsay Park, South Australia, after having reaped considerable rewards from an exact same manoeuvre involving At Talaq (USA) a few years prior. Unfortunately for all concerned, Braashee's one and only campaign Down Under proved to be an absolute debacle and was swiftly brought to an end. The high-class son of Sadler's Wells, with a Group 1 victory in the Longchamp Prix Royal Oak under his belt, performed more like a third-rate handicapper--at best. Any aspirations held for the horse were sunk without a trace on the back of two or three abysmal runs, while the performances also did very little for the growing reputation of his sire, at least in this unique part of the world.

If anything, matters only deteriorated over the next decade. Firstly, the fledgling stud career of Scenic (Ire), the initial son of Sadler's Wells to be made available to broodmare owners in Australia, went downhill after a relatively bright start. A notable shuttle stallion at the beginning of the period, Scenic was subsequently exiled by Irish breeders on the strength of his stud performance (or lack of it) in his homeland, and then subsequently allowed to join the unfashionable stallion ranks of Western Australia when commercial breeders based on the eastern seaboard also had their fill. When the expensive European purchase Chief Contender (Ire), a G1 Prix du Cadran winner with very similar European race performance to his paternal half-brother Braashee, managed to beat just one rival home in three inglorious outings during the Sydney autumn carnival of 1998, the signs were not good for a bloodline which was taking all before it on the lush, green, yielding race-tracks of Great Britain, Ireland and France.

As luck would have it, it was also about this time that five youngsters by Sadler's Wells, specifically conceived in Ireland to Southern Hemisphere time and subsequently foaled and reared in Australia, could be found in full training in stables around the country. Put through the Gold Coast Magic Millions (one lot) and Sydney Easter (four lots) yearling sales of 1997, the quintet was naturally afforded an enviable grounding to their collective racing career, but to no avail. Only one of the five, a filly by the name of Rose of Tralee,

showed any sort of return for her connections, the other four failing to record a single victory or even make a raceday appearance at all.

In fairness, things have not all been bad concerning the Sadler's Wells breed Down Under, though the successes have been few and far between. The imported gallopers Runyon (Ire) and Darazari (Ire) each picked up a nice Group 1 event during brief racing campaigns and were clearly very handy racehorses on their day, while Barathea (Ire) did a much better job at stud than he is actually given credit for during his couple of years of hemisphere hopping. In addition, Scenic has enjoyed a miraculous resurgence which, ironically, coincided with his departure to Western Australia. So much so, in fact, that he was placed second on the Australian General Sires Listing for 2000/01, behind only Danehill (USA), and looks headed for another bumper season.

In light of what has taken place over an extended period, however, the next 12 months is 'crunch time' for the Sadler's Wells breed in these parts. With two-year-olds from the respective first crop of English 2000 Guineas winners King of Kings (Ire) and Entrepreneur (GB) just about to set foot on the domestic racetracks, and three-year-olds by Arc de Triomphe winner Carnegie (Ire) among the current Classic crop, the time has arrived for one of the truly great Thoroughbred sires of our lifetime to have Australian representation commensurate with his standing on the world stage.

Happily, the signs are extremely encouraging. The Entrepreneurs sold particularly well at yearling sales earlier this year, and King of Kings' first crop is reported to be a cracking bunch of young horses. Not to be outdone, Carnegie has a smart selection of early runners--in particular, Sircarn Damon (NZ), Resoundingly (Aus) and Amalfi (NZ)--with the necessary scope to become quality middle-distance performers in another six months time. More relevantly, there was a performance by a grandson of Sadler's Wells at Flemington last weekend which has literally set the pulse of the domestic thoroughbred fraternity racing. When Royal Code (Aus), a first-crop son of King's Theatre (Ire), trounced a smart field of three-year-old males in winning the Listed VRC Concept Sports S. (1420m), the colt produced a performance which many enthusiasts domiciled in this neck of the woods would consider has been an age in coming.

Thankfully, it would now appear as if the memory of Braashee and his like will be erased sooner rather than later.

**DIXIE DOT COM RETIRED** Dixie Dot Com (Dixie Brass--Sky Meadows, by Conquistador Cielo), injured during a fifth-place effort in Sunday's GII Goodwood Breeders' Cup H. at Santa Anita, has been retired from racing. The six-year-old had previously returned thrice from fractures to his left front cannon bone and X-rays taken after the Goodwood revealed a fourth fracture. "We took precautionary X-rays and they showed the cannon bone starting to open up again," said trainer Billy Morey Jr. "It's a hairline fracture. It explains why he didn't run his race. He'll go to stud." Reflecting on the his relationship with the horse, Morey added, "It was a great ride. We had our disappointments, but just to be around a horse like him was a lot of fun. He was a very courageous horse. Even right now, with that crack, he wouldn't let you know he had it." Dixie Dot Com won the 1999 GII San Fernando Breeders' Cup S., the 2000 GII San Pasqual H. and both the GIII Texas Mile and GIII Lone Star Park H. in 2001. He was second behind Skimming in this year's GI Pacific Classic. On the board in 15 starts, Dixie Dot Com retires with eight wins in 23 starts and earnings of \$1,332,775.

**TACTICAL MOVE TOPS OBS MIXED SALE** Tactical Move (Tactical Advantage) brought a final bid of \$63,000 to top Tuesday's final consignor-preferred session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Fall Mixed Sale in Ocala, Florida. The five-year-old mare, in foal to Commitisize, was consigned by Wycombe House Stud, agent, and was purchased by Dapple Bloodstock, agent. The sale's first open session concluded last night and the final session of the auction begins today at 10 a.m.

Nasty Storm won her 2001 debut at Keeneland Apr. 18, but finished well behind Flute when 13th in the Kentucky Oaks May 4. Appreciating the drop in class, she narrowly took Churchill's GIII Dogwood S. May 26. After a fruitless attempt over the turf in the GIII Regret S. June 16, the chestnut filly ran third in the GI Test S. at Saratoga July 28 and most recently scored in the Weekend Delight S. at Turfway Sept. 15. Backed down to 4-5 favoritism to make it two straight, she kept close contact with the front after a solid :22 2/5 quarter, alternated for the lead with Forest Secrets on the turn for home and held an outright advantage late, but had to give a little extra to repel the late run of Hattiesburg. "She was much the best," said winning jockey Pat Day. "When Hattiesburg came up to us, I put her to the task and she drew away."

**NTRA Outlines Budget:**

The National Thoroughbred Racing Association and Breeders' Cup Limited outlined their combined \$59.8 million 2002 operating budget at the NTRA's second annual membership meeting in Lexington, Kentucky yesterday. The preliminary budget calls for \$58.3 million in operating expenses and a \$1.5 million surplus. The new budget reflects additional membership revenues from racetracks and horsemen's association that are expected to rejoin the organization in the coming year, as well as increased television and sponsorship revenue. The projected surplus will go towards a \$2.5 million "special stimulus package," in which the NTRA will substantially subsidize additional promotional days at member racetracks and OTBs next year. "The events of September 11 and the downturn in the nation's economy will likely have a negative effect on consumer spending," said NTRA Commissioner Tim Smith. "Recognizing this, we're offering our members some additional programs to get fans back to the races." The new package will be in addition to quarterly Mystery Mutuel Voucher promotions. "The promotions will be geared toward our 'light' or casual fans, who need additional incentives to come out to the racetrack more than once or twice a year," said Keith Chamblin, NTRA senior vice president-marketing and industry relations. "At the same time, they will be held on dates when fans will be exposed to great horseracing from coast to coast."

**ASHFORD STUD FEES ANNOUNCED** Ashford Stud has announced its stud fees for the 2002 breeding season. Europe's Iron Horse, **Giant's Causeway** (Storm Cat--Mariah's Storm, by Rahy), standing his first season in Kentucky after beginning his stud career in Ireland this year, will stand for \$135,000. While standing at Coolmore in 2001, Giant's Causeway's fee was Ir100,000gns (\$121,389). **Fusaichi Pegasus** (Mr. Prospector--Angel Fever, by Danzig), winner of the 2000 Kentucky Derby, had his stud fee cut from \$150,000 to \$135,000. "Owing to the current economic climate and the difficult year the industry has endured, Ashford Stud has decided to reduce almost all their fees in an effort to offer breeders excellent value," explained Ashford's director of sales Aisling Cross. "However, we are very excited about the season ahead as this is undoubtedly our strongest-ever team." **Thunder Gulch** (Gulch--Line of Thunder, by Storm Bird), who leads the 2001 sire earnings list, will stand for \$80,000, up \$5,000 from his fee from the end of 2001.
