TATTERSALLS OCTOBER PREVIEW

The Tattersalls October Sale, which begins at Park Paddocks in Newmarket, England this morning, is Europe's biggest yearling auction, catering to buyers in every category from the mid-six figures to the minimum 3,000 guineas. And after the successful Houghton Yearling Sales of two weeks ago, Tattersalls' Marketing Manager Jimmy George is hopeful that the momentum will continue. "The average at last year's October Yearling Sales went up by an enormous 62 percent and that will be a tough act to follow, but we have been genuinely encouraged by the Houghton results and have another quality catalogue this week," said George. Champion European sire Sadler's Wells has four entries, including lot 730, a half-brother to dual U.S. Grade I winner Dehere bred by a Coolmore partnership and consigned from Marc de Chambure's Haras d'Etreham. Lot 673, from Whatton Manor Stud, has had the most striking pedigree update since the catalogue's publication--the Danehill colt is a half-rother to Sulk (Ire), who landed the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac at Longchamp earlier this month. Lot 747, consigned from the Swinburn family's Genesis Green Stud, is a half-brother to the G1 French 2000 Guineas winner Victory Note by Hector Protector, while lot 300, a Polar Falcon filly from Scorrier House Stud, is expected to make considerably more than the 27,000 guineas her half-brother Firebreak (GB), winner of this season's G2 Mill Reef S., did at this sale 12 months ago. Those who have already made an impact at public auction include Lot 675, a Victory Note half-brother to useful sprinter Kier Park (Ire), who realised 105,000 guineas at last year's Tattersalls December Foal Sales and is consigned from Ciaran Conroy's Glenvale Stud in Co. Tipperary. The sale begins at 9:15 a.m. today, and on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday as well, with evening sessions on Thursday and Friday at 5:15 p.m., after racing.

LUKAS QUARTET ON WORK TAB

Trainer D. Wayne Lukas had four of his Breeders' Cup hopefuls out for workouts over the Belmont Park main track yesterday morning despite overnight rains which had the strip labeled muddy. "The track wasn't perfect, but I thought it was safe," Lukas said. The first to take to the track was last year's GI Distaff winner **Spain** (Thunder Gulch), who went a half mile while it was still dark. No time was taken for the move. The four-year-old filly made her second start after a four-month layoff in the GI Beldame S. at Belmont Oct. 6 and finished a troubled third. "I thought she needed the Beldame, although I thought she could have won it if she had a clean trip," her trainer said. "That race should put us in a position to be competitive on Oct. 27." The two Team Lukas Sprint candidates also breezed, with **Snow Ridge** (Tabasco Cat) clocking three furlongs in :37 and **Yonaguska** (Cherokee Run) going a half in :47 3/5. "Yonaguska worked terrific," Lukas said. "I'd say I just wanted to open up his lungs and stretch his legs, but when you...come home in :22 4/5, that's pretty strong." Gary Stevens, aboard for the move, will be back in the saddle on Breeders' Cup Day. **Jump Start** (A.P. Indy), runner-up to Officer in the GI Champagne S. last time out, went his half mile in :49.

SAKHEE MAY FACE THE LIGHT

Sakhee (Bahri) was nominated for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic as first preference at yesterday's pre-entry stage. Godolphin also chose the 10-furlong dirt contest as first preference for stable companion **Fantastic Light** (Rahy), suggesting a fascinating clash could be in the cards. Sakhee, a six-length winner in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe-Lucien Barriere at Longchamp Oct. 7, and Fantastic Light are also nominated to the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, but owner/breeder Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum seems likely to have recent GI Canadian International winner **Mutamam** (GB) (Darshaan {GB}) as his primary colorbearer in that event.

18 LEFT IN CHAMPION

A total of 18 contenders remain after yesterday's stage for Saturday's £400,000 G1 Dubai Champion S. at Newmarket. While most of the main protagonists stood their ground, **Golan (Ire)** (Spectrum {Ire}) and **Medicean (GB)** (Machiavellian {USA}) were withdrawn by their trainer, Sir Michael Stoute. Stoute's three remaining entries include, **Carnival Dancer (GB)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}), **No Excuse Needed (GB)** (Machiavellian {USA}) and **Tough Speed (USA)** (Miswaki {USA}), with the latter having been supplemented at a cost of £24,000. Trainer Aidan O'Brien has left **Galileo (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}) among the entries as a precautionary measure, but his primary goal remains the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Belmont Park a week later. The list of eligibles for the 10-furlong contest includes, **Beckett (Ire)** (Fairy King {USA}); **Hawkeye (Ire)** (Danehill {USA}); front-runner **Ice Dancer (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}); Godolphin's **Tobougg (Ire)** (Barathea {Ire}), **Equerry (USA)** (St.Jovite {USA}) and **Best Of The Bests (Ire)** (Machiavellian {USA}); trainer Marcus Tregoning's **Nayef (USA)** (Gulch {USA}) and the supplemented **Albarahin (USA)** (Silver Hawk {USA}).

O'BRIEN TOPS DEWHURST ENTRIES

Trainer Aidan O'Brien dominated the entries yesterday for Saturday's G1 Darley Dewhurst S. at Newmarket, accounting for nine of the 16 entries left in the seven-furlong contest. While **Hawk Wing (USA)** (Woodman {USA}) was not among those featured, **Rock of Gibraltar (Ire)** (Danehill {USA}) remains a probable runner. The 'Rock' will bid to reverse places with **Dubai Destination (USA)** (Kingmambo {USA}), after the latter won the G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster Sept. 14.

HAYDOCK OFF

Tomorrow's scheduled meeting at Haydock has been cancelled due to waterlogging. Stewards decided to abandon the meeting after an afternoon inspection revealed false patches of ground near the bend. Kirkland Tellwright, clerk of the course, told *PA Sport*: "It was pretty hopeless. The entire east-bend out of the back straight has extensive areas that have lost their integrity. We have had an inch of rain since last Tues-

day and we have been on the back foot since then."

A.P. INDY COLT TOPS OCTOBER OPENER A colt by leading sire A.P. Indy brought \$140,000 to top yesterday's opening session of the inaugural Keeneland October Yearling Sale in Lexington, Kentucky. Consigned by Paramount Sales as agent, the chestnut was purchased by the Kirkwood Stables of Kip Elser. "He's a big, strong, athletic colt," said Elser, who added that plans now call for the colt to be sent to Camden, South Carolina to be broken. The January foal is out of the Roberto mare Our Dear Sue, herself a full sister to champion grass horse Sunshine Forever, and is a half brother to MSW and GISP Don't Read My Lips. Florida-based bloodstock agent Becky Thomas accounted for the other six-figure horse of the session when she went to \$105,000 for hip 22, a colt by Quiet American. Consigned by Mill Ridge Sales as agent, the bay is out of Balancing Act (Spectacular Bid), a half sister to Canadian champion Peaks and Valleys. On the afternoon, Keeneland reported 160 horses as sold for gross receipts of \$2,110,500, yielding an average of \$13,191 and a median of \$5,000. The second and final day of bidding begins this morning at 10:30.

DIN'S DANCER DIES Din's Dancer (Sovereign Dancer) was euthanized Friday at Hideaway Farms near San Jacinto, California, after a paddock accident, according to the *Thoroughbred Times*. The 16-year-old stallion, who began his stud career in Florida and had stood at Hideaway for the past two years, fractured the pastern bone in his left foreleg. He is the sire of Grade I winner Ladies Din and graded stakes winner Shellbacks. On the racetrack, the multiple-stakes winning Din's Dancer ran second in the 1988 GI Jerome H. and third in the GI Jim Dandy S.


END OF THE ROAD FOR LAZY SLUSAN? Lazy Slusan (Slewvescent--Three Flights Up, by Topsider), a \$62,500 claim who ascended to the top of the California distaff ranks earlier this season, has likely run her last race, *The Blood-Horse* reports. The six-year-old, winner this season of the GI Santa Margarita H. and the GI Milady Breeders' Cup, was most recently ninth in the GI Spinster S. at Keeneland Oct. 7. Owner and trainer John Dolan indicated that he is unlikely to pre-enter the California-bred in the Breeders' Cup, which would cost upwards of \$50,000. "It's a little scary. I don't know what to do," Dolan told *The Blood-Horse*. "For me, that's a lot of money to gamble. I am on the conservative side." Since being claimed last summer, Lazy Slusan has won seven stakes and has banked nearly \$900,000. Dolan has entered the mare in the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale.


TURFWAY PARK WRAP-UP The Fall Meet at Turfway Park, which closed Oct. 4, showed dramatic drops in both handle and attendance. On-track attendance for the 21-day stand averaged 2,070, down 10 percent from last year's 23-day season, while on-track handle averaged \$373,072, off 11.6 percent from 2000. The total daily average handle was also down, decreasing 9.4 percent to \$3,382,467. Purses suffered as a result, dropping 13.6 percent to a daily average of \$200,398. Blaming the decline on the terrorist attacks of Sept. 11, Turfway Park President Robert Elliston said, "No one could have ever predicted the horrible events of Sept. 11, and the negative impact they would have on the country's economy. It was clear early on that this was not going to be a good meet for obvious reasons. The numbers are discouraging for all of Kentucky racing. The decline in business was felt across the state, not just at Turfway, which actually saw less of a decline than the other major facilities."

Monmouth requested 88 racing dates, from May 11 through Sept. 1. Racing would be Wednesday through Sunday from May until July 20 and Wednesday through Monday for the remainder of the meet. The Meadowlands's 53-day Thoroughbred meeting would run from Sept. 2 through Nov. 2, Monday through Saturday. The total of 309 dates for the two New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority tracks is the highest since it ran 313 live programs in 1994. The racing commission will consider the dates requests at its Nov. 20 meeting in Trenton.

Motion on the Move:

Trainer Graham Motion will be moving all of his horses out of Maryland, the *Thoroughbred Times* reports. ALYWOW IN SERIOUS CONDITION AFTER INJURY

Alywow (Alydar--Triple Wow, by Coastal), the 1994 Horse of the Year in Canada, is reported to be in serious condition in a County Kildare, Ireland veterinary hospital following a leg injury. "She crashed into a rail and got an infection deep in the bone of her hock," owner Pat O'Kelly told *Racing Post*. "She has now had three operations and, although she is still in foal to Sadler's Wells, I don't know whether she's going to come out of it." The 10-year-old's illness led O'Kelly to place a high reserve on the mare's yearling filly, which went unsold at Ir£700,000 at the Goffs Orby Sale last week. Each of Alywow's three previous foals have starred in the sales ring. Hidden Cat (Storm Cat), a minor stakes winner in the U.S., sold for \$600,000 at the 1998 Keeneland July Sale, while Suitably Discreet (Mr. Prospector) topped the 1999 Goffs Orby Sale at Ir£1.2 million. Her two-year-old of this season, Century City (Ire) (Danzig), brought Ir£2 million to top the 2000 Orby and was third on her racetrack debut in a Newmarket maiden Oct. 4.

MRLS PRICETAG: \$300 MILLION Mare reproductive loss syndrome, which hit Kentucky horse farms this past spring, will cost the state's Thoroughbred industry more than \$300 million, according to a survey conducted by the University of Louisville's Department of Equine Business. The survey, which was commissioned by Kentucky Governor Paul Patton, canvassed 1,024 breeders and stud farms, representing six breeds of horses. It was found that the Thoroughbred industry suffered by far the biggest losses, accounting for 89 percent of the \$336 million that MRLS will cost horsemen. The financial impact was spread over four years, from 2000-2003, with 77 percent of the syndrome's effect to be felt in 2001 and 2002. According to the survey, there were 516 deaths and the loss of 2,998 pregnancies, which would have produced foals of 2002, among Kentucky Thoroughbreds. That represents a 30.5-percent hit to the 2002 crop, more than 10 percent higher than earlier estimates by The Jockey Club. Those said to be affected by MRLS include breeders, stallion owners, horse farm operations, sales companies, bloodstock agents and veterinarians. While the study did say that, because there will be fewer yearlings to send to auction in 2003, prices for those available could be inflated, but added that MRLS could have long-term repercussions if fewer mares are sent to Kentucky because their owners are worried about recurrences of the syndrome in the future.

PEDIGREE INSIGHTS

IN THE MIX

Very few European stallions can claim to sire a Group winner in every 20 foals, and even fewer French stallions achieve this 5-percent strike rate. One notable exception is Haras du Val Henry's Linamix, who, with eight crops of racing age, has built up the impressive total of 18 Group winners, including seven Group 1 scorers. The 18 Group winners come from the 300 foals in his first seven crops, which works out to 6 percent, and it's only a matter of time before the Group winners start to flow from the 47 juveniles in his eighth crop.

You might think that, with his high strike rate, there's no secret to Linamix's success, but I have to admit that he mystifies me somewhat. I suspect that I am not alone in this, because only two of Linamix's 18 Group winners were bred by anyone other than Linamix's owner-breeder, Jean-Luc Lagardere.

What is the secret of Lagardere's success? Is it that the mares in his broodmare band--in the manner of the Aga Khan's mares--simply have the bloodlines to suit his excellent stallion? I doubt that this is the explanation, because Lagardere's Group winners have come from mares from a wide variety of male lines. This is predictable, as Linamix has a largely outcross pedigree for many of today's mares, even though Northern Dancer is one of his eight great-great-grandires.

Perhaps the secret of Lagardere's success with his 1990 French 2000 Guineas winner stems from his determined efforts to send him mares with distinguished racing records. Saganeca, the dam of Linamix's Arc winner Sagamix and his Group 2 winner Sage Et Jolie, was a good fifth in the Arc; the Group 2 winner Clodora is out of a Group 3 winner; and the Group 3 winner Artistique is out of a G2 winner. Another eight of Lagardere's 16 Group winners--Manninamix, Pinmix, Diamonixa, Diamond Mix, Fragrant Mix, Amilynx, Vahorimix and Diamilina--are all out of mares which were either Listed winners or Group-placed, so this is a

case of a stallion siring quality stock from quality mares.

Another consideration could be the soundness of the mares sent to Linamix. I must stress that there were never any doubts about his own soundness, but several of his early Group winners, some out of lightly raced mares, did not enjoy long careers. Is it just coincidence that some of his best, and most durable, representatives have been out of tough mares? Sagamix's dam Saganeca raced 25 times, while the dual Group 1 winner Amilynx is out of Amen, a veteran of 19 races. Then there's Slickly, who was recording the seventh Group success of his lengthy innings when he took the Premio Vittorio di Capua. This top-class miler is out of Slipstream Queen, a stakes-placed mare who packed 16 starts into two years on the track.

I describe Slickly as a miler on the strength of his recent Group 1 victories over that distance, firstly in France, where he took the Prix du Moulin by three lengths, and Italy, where he won by twice that margin. However, Slickly is very versatile by European standards. Unbeaten in two starts as a juvenile, he won a Group 2 over 1 3/8 miles on his reappearance at three to become a leading hope for the 1999 French Derby. His headstrong temperament didn't help his cause over 1 1/2 miles, but he immediately dropped back to win the G1 Grand Prix de Paris over 1 1/4 miles, a distance which continued to pay dividends last year.

Slickly's latest victory came only a day after No Slip, Slipstream Queen's three-year-old son, had taken the GII Oak Tree Derby on turf. Needless to say, this daughter of Conquistador Cielo has proved a great bargain, bringing \$110,000 from agent Eric Puerari at the 1995 Keeneland January Sale. The mare was immediately switched to France, where she conceived Slickly. She also produced the Group-placed Linamix colt Slipstream King in between her two Group winners and has a juvenile sister to Slickly called Silamixa.

Slickly's second dam, Country Queen, was a leading turf performer in California, where she took the GI Yellow Ribbon Invitational S. in 1979.
