

104 KNOCKING AT THE DOOR

Headlined by an exceptional European contingent, 104 horses have been pre-entered for the eight races of the Breeders' Cup next Saturday at Belmont Park. Last year's Horse of the Year **Tiznow** (Cee's Tizzy) will go postward in defense of his title and, while he will not face Giant's Causeway this time, as many as four new European contenders will offer a stiff challenge.

Godolphin has pre-entered the duo of **Fantastic Light** (Rahy) and **Sakhee** (Bahri) in both the \$4 million GI Breeders' Cup Classic and the \$2 million GI Breeders' Cup Turf, while trainer Aidan O'Brien plans to send the Magnier/Tabor pair of **Galileo (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) and **Black Minnaloushe** (Storm Cat) to the Classic. With the depth of the overseas entrants, Breeders' Cup President D.G. Van Clief, Jr. acknowledged that holding the Breeders' Cup in New York this year had a special significance. "Obviously, in the aftermath of the tragic attacks of Sept. 11, the Breeders' Cup takes on a different meaning than is normal," Van Clief remarked. "We have dedicated this year's Breeders' Cup to the people of New York in recognition of their courage and sacrifice and hope the event can be a building block in the rehabilitation process. We are proud to play even a small part in that process." When asked if it had been considered to move the Breeders' Cup from Belmont, he said, "After the events of Sept. 11, problems crossed everyone's mind, but the planning process was unimpeded. We are extremely gratified by the determination of owners and trainers travelling long distances [for the races]." Van Clief admitted that overall entries were down from recent years, but said that they were not impacted by the terrorist attacks. "It hasn't kept any of the good horses away," he said. "The strength of the core group of horses had more to do with the [fewer] number of entries." He added, "This year's Breeders' Cup pre-entries are deep in talent, as usual. I think it is of particular note, in a year when we are rebranding the event as the World Thoroughbred Championships, that there is a strong international flavor, with nine entries from England, seven from Ireland and four from France. This is indisputably the strongest group we have ever had from Europe."



FRANKEL HOPES TO BE A FORCE

Bobby Frankel is 0-36 to date in Breeders' Cup races, but the Brooklyn-born trainer may finally put that record to rest as he has entered six live runners in six of the races. **Aptitude** (A.P. Indy)

has finally justified Frankel's belief and will be among the favorites in the Classic, Distaff standout **Flute** (Seattle Slew) has reigned among three-year-old fillies and comes off a solid effort when second in the GI Beldame S., GI King's Bishop hero **Squirtle Squirt** (Marquetry) cuts back to six furlongs for the Sprint and **You** (You and I) earned a starring in the Juvenile Fillies with a big win in the GI Frizette S., while **Timboroa (GB)** (Salse) and **Starine (Fr)** (Mendocino) have been supplemented to the Turf and F/M Turf, respectively. Frankel feels that Aptitude's biggest challenge will come from the overseas raiders. "They're all exceptional horses," he said. "Hopefully, they won't handle the dirt. [I think] Fantastic Light will handle it; his pedigree says he will. He's the one I fear the most."

BUMPER EURO ENTRY FOR CUP Headed by multiple Group 1 winners **Galileo (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}) and **Fantastic Light (USA)** (Rahy {USA}), as well as Arc winner **Sakhee (USA)** (Bahri {USA}), a strong contingent of 15 European based horses has been entered for the Breeders' Cup meeting at Belmont Park a week from Saturday. Trainer Aidan O'Brien has seven runners nominated to the Cup, six of them owned alone or in partnership by owner Michael Tabor and Mrs. John Magnier. Tabor also sends out American-based horses **Left Bank (USA)** (French Deputy {USA}, Sprint) and 2000 G1 Oaks runner-up **Kalypso Katie (Ire)** (Fairy King {USA}, Filly/Mare Turf). O'Brien's two entries in the Juvenile divisions have connections to the Breeders' Cup and Belmont Park. Undefeated two-year-old colt **Johannesburg (USA)**, a Group 1 winner in three countries, is by Hennessy (USA), second by a neck to Unbridled's Song (USA) in the 1995 Juvenile at Belmont Park, while **Sophisticat (USA)** (Storm Cat {USA}) is a \$3.4 million yearling out of Serena's Song (USA), the U.S. champion three-year-old filly of 1995 and a four-time Grade I winner at Belmont Park. **Mozart (Ire)** (USA) (Danehill {USA}) will attempt to become the first European sprinter to win the Sprint since Sheikh Albadou (GB) in 1991. The blue silks of Godolphin will be paraded on at least seven, and perhaps eight horses, a week from Saturday. **Noverre (USA)** (Rahy {USA}), a 3/4 brother to 1991 Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Arazi (USA), figures as one of the choices in the Breeders' Cup Mile. Five of Godolphin's eight entries have been based in the U.S. this season under the tutelage of trainer Eoin Harty. He saddles two each in the Juvenile and Juvenile Fillies, the most accomplished of which are GII Sorrento S. winner **Tempera (USA)** (A.P. Indy {USA}) and GII Norfolk S. hero **Essence of Dubai (USA)** (Pulpit {USA}). G3 UAE Derby victor **Express Tour (USA)** (Tour d'Or {USA}) will need one defection to draw into the field for the Mile. European females look to have the upper hand in the third running of the Filly & Mare Turf. Jockey Jerry Bailey will pilot G1 Irish Oaks and Nassau S. winner **Lailani (GB)** (Unfuwain {USA}), looking to remain the only rider to have won the race. He has taken the first two renewals aboard Soaring Softly (USA) and Perfect Sting (USA). The winner in her American debut of the G1 Flower Bowl Invitational at Belmont, Lailani will face a stiff challenge from fellow Europeans **Banks Hill (GB)** (Danehill {USA}), conqueror of the G1 Coronation S., **Mot Juste (GB)** (Mtoto {GB}), runner-up in the G1 Prix de la Opera at Longchamp Oct. 7 and **Crystal Music (USA)** (Nureyev {USA}), second in the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas and runner-up to Banks Hill in the Coronation.

HOLDING COURT TO RACE IN SAUDI ARABIA

Holding Court (GB) (Hernando {Fr}), winner in 2000 of the G1 Prix du Jockey Club (French Derby), has been sold to Saudi Arabian interests to race in that country, *Racing Post* reports. He is set to leave the barn of trainer Michael Jarvis later this month and is scheduled to make his first start in the Crown Prince's Cup in Riyadh Nov. 9. The bay four-year-old has won one time in four starts this season, that victory coming in the G2 Grand Prix de Deauville Aug. 26. He was last seen when a distant 15th in the G1 Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp Oct. 7.

CHAMPION TAKING SHAPE

Newmarket's Champions Day features were beginning to take shape yesterday, with the weather threatening to turn against some of the main protagonists. The going at the track was changed to good, good to soft in places yesterday, with wet weather a possibility later this week. That forecast spelled doom to the chances of **Grandera (Ire)** (Grand Lodge {USA}) lining up for the £400,000 G1 Dubai Champion S. The colt, who was runner-up in the G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown July 8 and G1 International S. at York Aug. 21, will now be put away for the season with a view to a four-year-old campaign. Trainer James Fanshawe told *PA Sport* yesterday that "he has put up some tremendous performances at the highest level this season" and that "we felt it best to retire him for the year." That robs the ten-furlong event of another contender after **Medicean (GB)**, who beat Grandera in the Eclipse S., was withdrawn earlier in the week. The race may be diminished further by the possibility of **No Excuse Needed (GB)** (Machiavellian {USA}) and the supplemented **Tough Speed (USA)** (Miswaki {USA}) being pulled out of the race if significant rain falls by Saturday. That would cut the Sir Michael Stoute contingent from three to one and **Carnival Dancer (GB)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}) was reported by Chris Richardson, managing director of the colt's owners Cheveley Park Stud, as having "done very well." Godolphin will be represented by **Best Of The Bests (Ire)** (Machiavellian {USA}), who will be ridden by Frankie Dettori and **Equerry (USA)** (St. Jovite {USA}), who will be partnered by Jamie Spencer, while **Tobougg (Ire)** (Barathea {Ire}) will also take his chance. Simon Crisford, Godolphin's racing manager, told *PA Sport* yesterday, "Frankie will ride Best of the Bests unless it rains very hard and then he might switch to Equerry--but that's an 'if'. It's not a perfect comeback race for Best of the Bests, who has been off the track for a long time. Equerry obviously has form in very soft ground and is improving while Tobougg has been off since the Eclipse."

DUBAI 6-4 FAVOURITE FOR DEWHURST

David Loder's **Dubai Destination (USA)** (Kingmambo {USA}) was yesterday installed as the 6-4 favourite with Cashmans to confirm form with Aidan O'Brien's **Rock of Gibraltar (Ire)** (Danehill {USA}) in Saturday's G1 Darley Dewhurst S. at Newmarket. Dubai Destination beat "the Rock" by a length in the G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster Sept. 14. The latter, who has since won the G1 Grand Criterium at Longchamp Oct. 7 in impressive fashion, was rated a 7-4 chance by the Cork firm yesterday. Aidan O'Brien told *PA Sport* yesterday, "Rock of Gibraltar has taken his last race very well and the plan is to run. When he won the Gimcrack he was able to bowl along with him but after we ran at Doncaster, Michael (Kinane) said that he didn't think that was the way to ride him at seven furlongs. As for whether we can beat Dubai Destination, I'm never confident, I'm always hopeful--I'm looking forward to a big run."

COLSTAR & HOPPER TO THREE CHIMNEYS

Grade I winner **Colstar** (Opening Verse--Ascend, by Risen Star) and multiple stakes winner **The Happy Hopper** (El Prado {Ire}--Village Dancer, by Mythical Ruler) have been retired to Three Chimneys. The two distaffers arrived at the Midway, Kentucky farm this week and both are booked to be bred to Belmont S. winner Point Given (Thunder Gulch) in 2002. The five-year-old Colstar won the 2000 renewal of the GI Flower Bowl Invitational H., as well as the 2000 and 2001 GIII Locust Grove H. and 2001 GIII All Along Breeders' Cup S. She retires with 11 wins in 18 starts and earnings of \$1,038,056. The Happy Hopper is a seven-time stakes winner. The five-year-old won the Safely Kept S. at Arlington in August. She was also second in the 1999 GII Fantasy. On the board in 24 starts, The Happy Hopper won 12 of 38 outings and earned \$801,279.

BASSETT STEPS DOWN AT KEENELAND

James E. Bassett III yesterday announced his retirement as chairman of the Keeneland Association during the annual meeting of the Board of Directors. Bassett joined Keeneland in 1968, serving first as president and then as chairman of the board during his 33-year tenure. "It is an appropriate time to retire, with the young, talented and new team making excellent progress and assuming full responsibility for the Keeneland operation," Bassett said. "We have every confidence in their ability to succeed." Bassett will continue to serve as a Trustee and on the Board of Directors. Newly elected to the board during yesterday's meeting were Dr. A. Gary Lavin, Reiley McDonald and Duncan Taylor.

Churchill Downs to Sell Portion of Hoosier:

Churchill Downs Incorporated announced that a 15-percent interest in Hoosier Park will be sold to Centaur Racing LLC by year's end. The privately-held company's purchase of the racetrack and related off-track betting operations is contingent upon the approval of various regulatory agencies and the purchase of the entire 10-percent interest in Hoosier held by limited partner Conesco HPLP. The agreement will allow for Churchill Downs Management Company to retain 62-percent interest in the Anderson, IN oval and it will continue to manage day-to-day operations. Indiana-based Centaur, who currently owns 13 percent of the track, will increase its holdings to 38 percent and will have the option to purchase additional CDMC partnership interests. "We continue to view an increased ownership by Centaur as beneficial to the company [CDMC] and Hoosier Park. The transaction is not expected to have a material impact on our earnings and we the opportunity to realize a cash return on a portion of our investment in the racetrack," said Thomas Meeker, CDI's president and chief executive officer.

WORKING TOWARDS THE CUP

Mile hopeful **Affirmed Success** (Affirmed) tuned up with a five-furlong breeze in 1:00 $\frac{2}{5}$, handily around the dogs on the turf at Belmont yesterday morning. Also out for a spin on the Belmont lawn was Turf entrant **Blazing Fury** (Dynaformer), who went three-quarters in 1:15 $\frac{2}{5}$. "We're not kidding ourselves here," admitted trainer Jimmy Toner. "This is being a little ambitious. Being that it's the Breeders' Cup and it's being run right here at Belmont Park, it's worth a try. We don't have to ship anywhere, and this will be his last start of the year." Unbeaten **Publication** (Petionville) prepped for the Juvenile at Arlington by going six panels in 1:15 $\frac{4}{5}$.



GODOLPHIN GOING FOR GLORY

Godolphin will field as many as eight runners in the Breeders' Cup, with the headlining duo of **Fantastic Light** (Rahy) and **Sakhee** (Bahri) entered in both the Classic and the Turf. Also scheduled to carry the blue silks are **Imperial Gesture** (Langfuhr) and **Tempera** (A.P. Indy) in the Juvenile Fillies, **Essence of Dubai** (Pulpit) and **Ibn al Haitham (GB)** (Zafonic) in the Juvenile and **Noverre** (Rahy) in the Mile. In addition, **Express Tour** (Tour d'Or) is the first alternate for the over-subscribed Mile. "This is the best team we've ever had," said Simon Crisford, Godolphin's racing manager. Fantastic Light has been pointing for the Classic since handing Galileo (Ire) his first career defeat in the G1 Irish Champion S. Sept. 8, but Sakhee entered Breeders' Cup consideration following his dominating victory in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe Oct. 7. "He is coming into the Breeders' Cup very fresh, right on top of his game," Crisford said of the Arc hero. "The reports we have been getting back here in England are that he has adapted to the conditions at Belmont Park very well. Hopefully, his race in the Arc didn't take too much out of him." Godolphin will wait until final entries are taken next week to determine their representation. "We will delay a decision on whether he [Sakhee] runs in the Turf or the Classic until next Wednesday," Crisford added. "We want to see how he handles the dirt surface at Belmont. He really hasn't had much experience working on a dirt surface. We won't decide until we have to." Godolphin won the 1999 Turf with Daylami, but the closest they have come in the Classic is Swain's heartbreaking third to Awesome Again and Silver Charm in the 1998 renewal. "Obviously, the Classic is the premier dirt race of the year in North America," Crisford noted. "Everybody around the world wants to win it. When you have achieved all you can on the turf, you want to have a go and do something a little bit different. [Going in the Classic] is a very strong challenge, but if we believe we have the right horse that can make a real go of it, that's the race we want to go for."

BIG DAY FOR BALLYDOYLE?

Trainer Aidan O'Brien has pre-entered seven runners for the Breeders' Cup. In addition to his Classic duo of **Black Minnaloushe** (Storm Cat) and **Galileo (Ire)** (Sadlers' Wells), he has the unbeaten **Johannesburg** (Hennessy) pointing for the Juvenile, top European sprinter **Mozart (Ire)** (Danehill) for the Sprint, St. Leger hero **Milan (GB)** (Sadler's Wells) for the Turf and the \$3.4 million yearling **Sophisticat** (Storm Cat) in the Juvenile Fillies. **Bach (Ire)** (Caerleon) is the third alternate for Mile. The Ballydoyle runners are scheduled to ship in early next week. "The plan is to come still," said O'Brien. "We've been happy with the way the horses have been working, and that's the plan. If everything goes as planned, we'll be there. We plan to come Monday-Tuesday of next week. I'm not sure what might happen that could prevent us from coming."

"Her pedigree is ideal for the Oaks, being out of a Spectacular Bid mare," said Cummings of the filly whose second dam Barb's Bold is a half-sister to Lyphard and Washington D.C. BUSINESS UP ON DAY TWO As the better lots arrived in the ring, business predictably picked up yesterday at a marathon 12-hour second session of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sales at Newmarket. The day saw 13 six-figure lots and figures that had only been bettered once before--at last year's incredible renewal. An easy moving colt by Kahyasi (GB), sire of Kalanisi (Ire), topped the bill when local agent Dwayne Woods bought a half-brother to Group 3 winner Nautical Pet (Ire), offered from Yeomanstown Lodge Stud, for 200,000gns. Gill Richardson of Bloodhorse International was the underbidder. "He was as nice an individual as I have seen all year at the sales," said Woods, who was acting for an existing owner in partnership with his brother, Newmarket handler Sean Woods. "He was a stunning horse and I look at him as a mile-and-a-quarter prospect eventually." Demi O'Byrne picked up the day's second-highest priced lot, going to 170,000gns for a colt by Danehill Dancer (Ire). The yearling was one of several notable pinhooking coups yesterday, having been bought for Ir£19,000 by O'Byrne's brother John as a foal. Other pinhooking successes included the transformation of a 45,000gns King's Theatre (Ire) foal into a 160,000gns yearling by Co. Kildare agent John Osborne. John Ferguson, acting on behalf of Mollers Racing, was purchaser of the athletic half-brother to three winners who will be trained by Geoff Wragg. American owner Joe Albritton, who won the G1 Prix Morny with October graduate Bad As I Wanna Be (Ire), will be hoping lightning can strike twice after Johnny McKeever of McKeever-St Lawrence bid 160,000gns on his behalf for a Carrigbeg Stud-sold Grand Lodge colt from a strong German family. Cheveley Park Stud Manager Chris Richardson was underbidder for the colt, who will be joining Bad As I Wanna Be's trainer Brian Meehan. Agent John Warren had a notable success as a vendor when a Grand Lodge colt he had bred and consigned from Highclere Stud was bought for 140,000gns by colleague Charlie Gordon-Watson. "He is going to Michael Jarvis and looked a very nice athletic individual," said Gordon-Watson. The sale continues today, beginning at 9:15 a.m., with a post-racing session starting 5:15 p.m.

GODOLPHIN, GALILEO HEAD JAPAN CUP

The Godolphin duo of G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner **Sakhee** (Bahri) and **Fantastic Light** (Rahy) and super sophomore **Galileo (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) head a list of 59 nominees for the \$4 million G1 Japan Cup to be held Nov. 25 at Tokyo Racecourse. Sakhee and Fantastic Light, who ran third to **T.M. Opera O** (Opera House {GB}) in last year's event, have also been cross-entered in the Japan Cup Dirt on Nov. 24. North America is represented by 28 nominees, chief among those being **Senure** (Nureyev), winner in his most recent start of the G1 Clement L. Hirsch Turf Championship. Senure was not pre-entered for the Breeders' Cup and is a likely runner in the Japan Cup, according to trainer Bobby Frankel. The North American entry for the Japan Cup Dirt is a strong one, headed by G1 Woodward S. winner **Lido Palace (Chi)** (Rich Man's Gold), who was not supplemented to the Breeders' Cup. Also among the nominees from the U.S. are last year's Horse of the Year **Tiznow** (Cee's Tizzy) and 2000 G1 Preakness S. winner **Red Bullet** (Unbridled). Invitations for the two races are due Oct. 29.
