CLASSIC...Abert The Great (Go For Gin), who will be trying to end a three-race losing streak when he starts in the Classic, breezed five furlongs in 1:02 over the Belmont main track yesterday morning.

"That was the plan, we didn't want to go too fast," said trainer Nick Zito. Jockey Jorge Chavez was in the saddle for the move and will be back aboard the Tracy Farmer-owned four-year-old Saturday. Gary Stevens rode the bay to a fourth-place finish in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Oct. 6. "Jorge worked him in 1:05 before the Classic last year and he ran fourth," Zito continued. "He went 1:02 with him here, so maybe he'll win by 15." Riding assignments were secured yesterday for a pair of Classic contenders. GI Meadowlands Cup winner **Gander** (Cormorant), who breezed five-eighths of a mile yesterday in :59, will have Victor Espinoza in the irons for the first time Saturday. John Velazquez has the call aboard **Include** (Broad Brush) for trainer Bud DeP. Velazquez rode Gander to his Meadowlands Cup victory, but committed to Include when the connections of Gander were considering a run in Saturday's Empire Classic at Belmont. Third to Gander in the Meadowlands Cup, Include was the winner earlier this year of the GI Pin Ino Special. He will van to Belmont tomorrow and is scheduled to gallop up to the race.

PENSKE AUTO CENTER SPRINT...Three of the top candidates worked yesterday, with **Delaware Township** (Notebook) going a half in a rapid :45 2/5 at Belmont Park; **El Conedor** (Mr. Greeley) going five furlongs in :59 4/5 at Santa Anita; and defending champ **Kona Gold** (Java Gold) going an easy three furlongs in :37 at Santa Anita. Delaware Township has won three of his four starts over the Belmont surface, including the GI Forest Hills H. last time out. "He just always seems to be coming just right when we run him here," trainer Ben Perkins Jr. said. El Conedor, two-for-two on the year, comes off a victory in the Sept. 2 GI Del Mar Breeders' Cup H. at a mile. "The Sprint is a little bit short for him, but he's been training great," trainer Bob Baffert

said. As for Kona Gold, trainer Bruce Headley said, "He was jumping and squealing when he pulled up. He's coming up to the race perfect."

BESSEMER TRUST JUVENILE...The three favorites for Saturday's race recorded solid works yesterday morning. GI Champagne S. winner **Officer** (Bertando), who bombs the heaviest favorite on the card, stopped trainer Bob Baffert's clock in :59 2/5 for five furlongs at Santa Anita. "He worked great," the conditioner said of his unbeaten colt. "It was a nice steady five-eighths. I clocked him going out three-quarters in 1:11.74. He was really aggressive and he didn't get tired." John Toffan and Trudy McCaffery's **Came Home** (Gone West) also had his final prep at Santa Anita yesterday morning, getting his half mile in :48 2/5. The winner of the GI Hopeful S. at Saratoga Sept. 1, the colt is scheduled to arrive in New York this afternoon. Already stabled on the Belmont backstretch is GI Lane's End Breeders' Futurity hero **Siphonic** (Siphon {Brz}), who drilled six furlongs yesterday in 1:12 4/5. "He felt great, like an old horse," said jockey Jerry Bailey to trainer David Hofmann. Bailey will ride the undefeated colt on Saturday. Chris McCarron, who guided Siphonic to his Keeneland victory, has the call aboard Came Home.

TURF...Blueprint (Ire) (Generous {Ire}) has been declared out of the race after suffering an injury during a workout Saturday. The bay had not run since taking the GI Sunset H. at Hollywood Park July 15. "He suffered a strain in his right foreleg," trainer Bob Hess Jr. said from his barn at Santa Anita yesterday. "It's a strain in the inner branch of his suspensory ligament. We noticed the injury right after the workout." He added, "Considering his value, it's probably career-ending, but we'll have to wait and see." The six-year-old has nine wins, two seconds and four thirds for earnings of \$569,481. His other stakes wins include the G2 Jockey Club S. at Newmarket last year and the GI San Luis Rey H. at Santa Anita in March.

Bandari put up an awesome performance here to storm away with this competitive affair. He has developed into a highly effective front-runner and he displayed his power from that position here under Kevin Darley. Having made an impressive winning debut in a Beverley maiden Aug. 15, he was put in his place in the G3 Solaris S. at Sandown Sept. 1 when finishing seventh, having raced up with the pace until the straight. Making no mistake from the front next time at Ayr in a conditions event Sept. 22, he had Bit of Luck (GB) (First Trump (GB)) 3 1/2 lengths back in second. Here he showed the same early dash to grab the lead under Darley as Jamie Spencer tracked him in second on Infinite Spirit. That pair appeared to have the race between them approaching the turn into the straight as most of their rivals struggled on the slow ground off the pace. Yet it was Bandari who had all the answers once in the straight and with a shake of the reins he quickened away from the filly to go further clear the further he went. Mark Johnston said, "We have chickened out of some of the big ones and this horse was in Rome next Sunday-- I won't take him

now-- it is a Group race and you would have had to think he would have had a good chance. He will be trained for a Derby."

TWO-YEAR-OLD REVIEW by Tom Frary

With 10 of the 11 Group 1 events run so far in 2001 having been won by the favourite, judging the respective merit of the top two-year-olds has been relatively easy. Aidan O'Brien, who has captured eight of those, pulled off another clean sweep of Irish Group 1 juvenile events, replicating that achievement in 2000. It all started with the G1 Phoenix S. success of **Johannesburg (USA)** (Hennessy (USA)), who appears the best of all the two-year-olds to have graced the track this year. Brilliant at five and six furlongs, he became the first two-year-old since Zafonic in 1992 to win three Group 1 events at two, adding the Prix Morny and Middle Park to his resume. He will now bid to emulate the magnificent Arazi who extended his European superiority in the States in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile. While he pits everything against the best there, his stable companion **Rock of Gibraltar (Ire)** (Danehill (USA)) will be taking a well-earned rest back at Ballydoyle. One of the genuine stars of his generation this year, he carried two penalties in the G2 Gin crack S. at York and G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster and found only **Dubai Destination** (Kingmanbo (USA)) a length too good in the latter contest. Many thought he may be done for the year at that point but he returned with a vengeance to storm away with the G1 Grand Criterium de Longchamp in the mud on Arc day before scrambling home in the Dewhurst on Champions' Day. Carrying the colours of Sir Alex Ferguson, boss of Manchester United FC, the 'Rock' came to represent the popular appeal of racing, turning up for the big days and always giving his all. His Doncaster conqueror provided a boost for David Loder there and cruel fate intervened to rule him out of the Dewhurst rematch. Loder has so far surprisingly failed to record a Group 1 success with his two-year-old team, but many believed that only Dubai Destination's setback denied that. The way he quickened to pick up the 'Rock' at Doncaster before winning eased down suggested he was a colt of the highest order. Yet it may be **Hawk Wing (USA)** (Woodman (USA)) who shades them all in 2001. O'Brien's massive colt beat stable companion and subsequent G1 Gran Criterium winner **Shobkhov (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells (USA)) by three lengths in the G2 Futurity S. at The Curragh in late August before returning to that track to impress all in the G1 National S. the following month. Kinane barely moved on the colt that day yet he picked up Naheef (Ire) in a few strides before setting his seal on the race. The last time Kinane had such an easy ride in a big




race at that track was on the great Montjeu (Ire) in last year's Tattersalls Gold Cup. Of the fillies, **Quarter Moon (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}) incredibly was breaking her maiden in winning the G1 Moyglare Stud S. at The Curragh in September. She could be anything, but we have a clearer idea of the merit of the unbeaten pair **Gossamer (GB)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}) and **Queen's Logic (Ire)** (Grand Lodge {USA}). The former was streets ahead of her peers on the soft in both the G3 Prestige S. and G1 Fillies' Mile. Her brother Baratheia (Ire) was a larger and less precocious individual and she may find that many of those behind her at two have surpassed her by next summer. Queens' Logic put up one of the best performances of the year by a two-year-old in the G1 Cheveley Park S. at Newmarket in October, beating the smart **Sophisticat (USA)** (Storm Cat {USA}) by seven lengths. It is an unusual thing to say that a winner of a Queen Mary can only improve at three but that boks the case with this filly, who also took the G2 Lowther S. at York in August. She has scope to improve at three and should she bag a first Classic for Mick Channon back at Newmarket next May, she will bring the house down. Like Johannesburg and the 'Rock,' she progressed throughout a long season and increased her superiority over the remainder. She is undeniably one of a handful of stars that have made the 2001 juvenile season one of the most exciting in recent memory. Vintage stuff indeed.

The chestnut colt, who was consigned by Viking Stud, Inc. (Rick Littrell), agent, will be trained by O'Callaghan for his stable patron Donna Moore. The two-day sale continues today at 10 a.m.

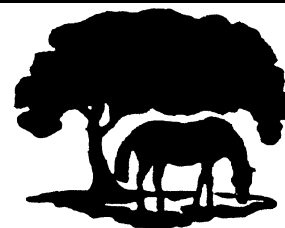

Back in 1995, Gulch seemed to have claims to being considered the rightful heir to his aging sire, Mr. Prospector.

As a racehorse he had displayed most of the qualities demanded by breeders, including precocity, speed, durability and courage, even though he had to contend with his connections' ambitions to turn him into a Triple Crown contender.

Those ambitions were fired by Gulch's victory over Gone West in the Wood Memorial over 1 1/8 miles and, to be fair, he didn't disgrace himself in the classics, coming from behind to finish sixth in the Kentucky Derby, fourth in the

Preakness and third behind the runaway winner Bet Twice in the Belmont. Even so, it was hard not to think that we saw the real Gulch when he dropped down to a mile for the Metropolitan H. 12 days before the Belmont, when he showed his appreciation of the change of distance by defeating the tough older horses King's Swan and Broad Brush.

As Principal American Racehorses of 1987 pointed out so tellingly: "Gulch was a natural sprinter or miler. His career record at a mile or less was 7-for-10; beyond a mile he was 1-for-11."

Although he went on to finish second in a couple of Grade B over 1 1/8 miles, this statistic held good at four, when Gulch's five wins at up to a mile included the Carter H., Met Mile and Breeders' Cup Sprint. The title of champion sprinter became a formality.

As Gulch was generally considered to have very good conformation for a son of Mr. Prospector, the only doubt about his prospects as a stallion centered on the fact that his first three dams were daughters of Ramunctious, Seven Corners and Snow Boots. Even so, the fact that his dam Jameela was a triple Grade I winner of over a million dollars largely allayed these fears.

The fears disappeared altogether when Gulch came up with the Grade I winners Great Navigator and Wallenda (winner of the Super Derby) in a first crop of 40 named foals. It was his third crop, though, which really made his name. Three of the 50 named foals in this crop--De Niro, Harayir and Thunder Gulch--became Group or Graded winners at two years, but this proved to be just a prelude to a magnificent 1995. Thunder Gulch, of course, swept to the title of champion three-year-old, taking the Kentucky Derby and Belmont Stakes in the process; Harayir took four important races at up to a mile in England, including the G1 1000 Guineas; and Torrental won the G1 Prix Jean Prat.

Bearing in mind that two of these three Group 1 winners were out of granddaughters of Northern Dancer, Gulch seemed to have the world at his feet. Unfortunately, he hasn't so far matched that vintage 1992 collection. There were no Grade I winners in his next four crops and the larger crops he sired after his fee went up to \$60,000 in 1996 have also struggled to achieve that very high level. The only Group 1 winner from his 1997 crop is the Japanese colt Eagle Café (NHK Mile Cup) and it wasn't until Nayef took last Saturday's Darley Champion Stakes that Gulch finally hit the G1 target with a member of his 1998 crop.

While Gulch can no longer be considered the heir to Mr. Prospector's crown—Kingambo, another of Lane's End's Mr. Prospector stallions, is one of the sons with far stronger claims—his ability to come up with the occasional big horse will ensure his continued popularity at his 2002 fee of \$50,000.

Nayef is sure to remain a fine advertisement for his sire, as there is a strong possibility that he will be even better next year than this. A magnificently bred colt, Nayef had looked a true champion during a brief campaign last year, only to lose his form temporarily as he grew.

I describe Nayef as magnificently bred largely because he is a son of Sheikh Hamdan's exceptional mare Height of Fashion, who died last year. Nayef is the last of her 11 living foals and her sixth stakes winner. The story goes that Height of Fashion was sold by her breeder, Queen Elizabeth II, because it was feared that this high-class filly was too big to succeed as a broodmare. It took Height of Fashion no time at all to disprove this theory, as her first four foals were the Group 3 winner Alwasmij, the top-class Unfuwain, the exceptional Nashwan and the stakes-winning Mukdham. All four of these were colts and Nayef, her fifth colt to race, has maintained her sons' outstanding record.

Although Height of Fashion's daughters weren't a match for her sons, all three of her daughters by Gulch's sire Mr. Prospector earned black type. As you'd expect, Sheikh Hamdan has retained all five of Height of Fashion's daughters, sending them to such stallions as Sadler's Wells, A.P. Indy, Storm Cat, Danzig, Unbridled, Darshaan and Lihix in recent years. The chances are, then, that there are still many more chapters to be written in this great mare's story.
