BREEDERS' CUP COMES OF AGE

The Breeders' Cup, newly dubbed the World Thoroughbred Championships, will celebrate its 18th renewal at Belmont Park this afternoon. Three Breeders' Cup champs are back to defend their titles...Hall of Fame trainer Bobby Frankel looks to stop his Breeders' Cup losing streak at 36...a quintet of two-year-olds and a quartet of two-year-old fillies put their unbeaten records on the line in the Juvenile and Juvenile Fillies. The runners can take you on an Express Tour (or a Guided Tour) of Spain, Tranquility Lake, Delaware Township, the Left Bank, the Volga, Johannesburg, Milan, Banks Hill, Lodge Hill and even Pompeii. Bach, Brahms and Mozart will provide the music. You can Bet On Sunshine, play the Flute, Take Charge Lady...but who's better than You? Enough already...let's take a look at the races.

CLASSIC...Last year's Classic confrontation pitted Calbred **Tiznow** against Europe's "Iron Horse," Giant's Causeway, with America coming out on top. Tiznow will try to become the first back-to-back winner of the \$4 million event, but is the four-year-old as good this fall? After a six-month layoff, he returned from a back injury which very nearly cost him his career, but has been unable to return to the winner's circle, finishing third in both the G1 Woodward S. and GII Goodwood Breeders' Cup H. He will face an intriguing challenge from across the pond in the form of **Sakhee** and **Galileo (Ire)**. Sakhee bids to become the first Arc winner to double up in the Classic in his dirt debut. Galileo suffered his first lifetime loss in his latest, finishing a head behind Fantastic Light in the G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown Sept. 8. But only one European contender has ever won the main event, and Arcangues had the benefit of Jerry Bailey, who is tied with Pat Day for the most Breeders' Cup wins by a jockey at 11, in the saddle back in 1993. **Aptitude** could bounce off his 10-length romp in the G1 Jockey Club Gold Cup. So who's the winner? **Include** is set up for a monster race. The bay was sidelined by a splint injury over the summer, but came back to be third in the GII Meadowlands Cup. He runs his best races in his second start back after a layoff (remember the G1 Pimlico Special?) and should give John Velazquez his first Classic. (*Classic*

FOUL WEATHER THREATENS TROPHY

Doncaster was forced to abandon two races on the round course of its meeting yesterday after the fifth race, the DBS October Yearling S., because of heavy rains. That puts today's card, featuring the G1 Racing Post Trophy, in some doubt, despite officials' optimism. John Sanderson, Doncaster's Clerk of the course, said yesterday, "I'm quietly relieved that we've decided to cancel two races on the round course. The reasons for doing it are entirely justified. We had a little problem earlier this afternoon when the stalls got stuck coming off the round mile chute and the Group 1 race, the Racing Post Trophy, is over the round mile. We can sort that out. The straight course is riding OK. There has to be a view early tomorrow morning that it is fit to race on which I'm fairly confident that it will be." Newbury also suffered from excessive rain yesterday on top of already heavy ground, but there are no plans to inspect at present. Monday's meeting at Leicester is subject to an inspection today, while Nottingham is expected to lose Tuesday's card due to waterlogging. An inspection will take place on Monday morning.

PETONG COLT TOPS DONCASTER FINAL DAY

The final session of the Doncaster Bloodstock Sales' October Yearling Sale yesterday ended on a high note following the appearance of the top-priced yearlings of the sale. Of the colts, the star attraction was lot 690, a colt by Petong (GB) out of Odile (GB) (Green Dancer {USA}), consigned by Trickle-down Stud and purchased by Bozzi Bloodstock for 30,000 guineas. Leading the ladies was lot 699, a Bahhare (USA) grand-daughter of Gussy Marlowe (GB) (Final Straw {GB}), consigned by Catridge Farm Stud and sold to David Redvers for 12,000 guineas. Henry Beeby, managing director of DBS commented, "The October Yearling Sales always had a hard act to follow. Last year's sale recorded the biggest overall growth of any 2000 European Yearling Sale with the median rising by 63 percent. Trade at the more commercial end of the market is always hardest hit by any slowdown, but we have been pleased to see a lively trade from start to finish this week, especially as we catalogued over 100 more lots. Therefore, we must be satisfied with a 12.5 percent rise in median over the two-year period."

Bought for just 3,900 guineas at last year's sale by James Delahooke, the juvenile has only won once, on firm ground in a Pontefract Class F maiden auction race last June. Trying new conditions here, he raced alone on the far side and made all to deny the late thrust of Dudleys Delight, who was charging up the centre of the track. George Duffield said, "I looked across at the halfway and thought there's no-one going better than me, so I just kept slogging on through the muck. I think all-in-all what suited me was the blinkers as he's not keen on horses being around him. We didn't think he would go on the ground and thought that six would be too far so he's made fools of all of us!"

TURF...The surprise decision by Godolphin to run **Fantastic Light** in the Breeders' Cup Turf instead of Arc winner Sakhee has leveled the playing field a bit in this \$2 million event. A triple Group 1 winner this year, **Fantastic Light** was a troubled fifth in last year's Turf at Churchill Downs and faces two rivals who finished ahead of him: **Quiet Resolve** (2nd) and **Mutamam (GB)** (4th). The five-year-old, an exceptional performer over 10 furlongs, has lost his last seven tries over today's 12-furlong distance and may be vulnerable once again. In his most recent start, he defeated dual Derby hero **Galileo (Ire)** in a thrilling G1 Irish Champion S. over a mile and a quarter at Leopardstown Sept. 8. **With Anticipation** has been nearly unstoppable since switching to the turf in April, crossing the line first in his last five starts. The only blemish in that period is the G1 United Nations H. in July, when he was disqualified and placed second for interference. The front-running grey has come back to win both the G1 Sword Dancer H. Aug. 11 and the G1 Man o'War S. Sept. 8 over this course. He could provide a measure of revenge for his dam **Fran's Valentine**, who finished first in the inaugural Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, only to be disqualified to 10th for an incident on the far turn. **Milan (GB)** will seek to become the first St. Leger victor to win the Breeders' Cup Turf. Following his Sept. 15 Classic success at Doncaster, he ran fifth to Sakhee in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe Oct. 7, where he finished strongly after getting caught in traffic. A son of '87 Turf hero **Theatrical (Ire)**, **Hap** will be venturing into unknown territory by running a quarter-mile further than in any of his previous starts. The nine-furlong specialist was a valiant second in the G1 Arlington Million going 1 1/4 miles Aug. 18, then cut back in distance to take the GII Keeneland Turf Mile Oct. 7.

 Sadler's Wells has sired each winner of the Breeders' Cup Turf run at Belmont Park: In the **Wings (GB)** in '90 and **Northern Spur (Ire)** in 1995. Hoping to keep this streak alive is **Milan (GB)**.

 Two trainers have won the Turf twice: **Bill Mott** ('87, '92) and **Michael Stoute** ('96, '00). Mott saddles **Hap**.

 **With Anticipation** will seek to become the third gelding to win the Turf after **Great Communicator** ('88) and **Buck's Boy** ('98).

JUVENILE...The heaviest favorite on the morning line in all eight Breeders' Cup races, unbeaten **Officer** will get his stiffest today. No less than four of his rivals are also undefeated--**Came Home**, **Johannesburg**, **Publication** and **Siphonic**--and the California-bred colt has drawn post two, making it likely that he will need to be used early to secure a good position. He started his career with a pair of dominating wins against state-breds, then handled the rise to graded company with flair in winning the GIII Best Pal S. at Del Mar Aug. 15. Following a professional victory in the GII Del Mar Futurity Sept. 5, he successfully took his show on the road to take the GI Champagne S. over course and distance Oct. 6. He was eased up by jockey Victor Espinoza inside the final sixteenth there, but he'll have to run all the way to the wire this time to maintain his perfect record. Came Home earned the highest Beyer Speed Figure among two-year-olds in setting a stakes record in the GI Hopeful S. at Saratoga Sept. 1, but was forced to miss his Breeders' Cup prep when scratched out of the GII Norfolk S. with filling in an ankle. The speedy colt has come back to train strongly and has the confidence of jockey Chris McCarron, who opted for the Paco Gonzalez trainee over Siphonic. That colt won at Del Mar at first asking before going to Keeneland for the GII Breeders' Futurity Oct. 6, where he posted a front-running six-length victory. Trying to follow in Arazi's hoofprints is Johannesburg, the unbeaten colt trained by Aidan O'Brien. Because he is closely related to Tale of the Cat and from the family of Pulpit, the dirt should be no problem, but he has never gone further than six furlongs in winning Group 1 races in England, Ireland and France.

 In the two previous runnings of the Breeders' Cup at Belmont Park, both Juvenile winners came out of the GI Champagne S.--Fly So Free, who won the Champagne in 1990, and Unbridled's Song, who finished fourth in his prep.

 Two of today's jockeys have won the Juvenile at least twice--Jerry Bailey (**Siphonic**) in '96, '98 and '00; and Pat Day (**Jump Start**) in '94 and '97.

 Trainer D. Wayne Lukas, who sends out **Jump Start** today, has won the Juvenile five times, in '86, '87, '88, '94 and '96.

F/M TURF...A field of 12 fillies and mares, only three of whom were bred in the U.S., will attempt to take the Filly and Mare Turf, the youngest race in the Breeders' Cup championship. Irish Oaks heroine **Lailani (GB)** is undefeated in seven starts this year. The filly proved she could take her act overseas with a strong effort in the Sept. 29 GI Flower Bowl H. over this course and distance last time out. **England's Legend (Fr)**, a 7 3/4-length winner of the Aug. 18 GI Beverly D at Arlington, had a three-race win streak snapped when Lailani went by her in deep stretch in the Flower Bowl. At seven, **Spook Express (SAf)** is the oldest runner in the field. The bay mare was a troubled third behind England's Legend over this course and distance in the July 14 GI New York H. and again in the Beverly D. She rallied seven wide en route to a 1 1/4-length victory in the Oct. 5 GI Winstar Galaxy at Keeneland last time out.



The first two runnings of the F/M Turf produced the Eclipse champion turf mare: Soaring Softly in 1999 and Perfect Sting in 2000. Jockey Jerry Bailey, who rides **Lailani (GB)** this year, rode both fillies and both fillies were trained by men whose first name begins with J (Jimmy Toner and Joe Orseno).



The two past winners, Soaring Softly and Perfect Sting, were four when they won...there are four four-year-olds in this year's race: **England's Legend (Fr)**, **Kalypso Katie (Ire)**, **Solvig** and **Starine (Fr)**.



Soaring Softly and Perfect Sting are both by sons of Roberto (Kris S. and Red Ransom, respectively). While there are no granddaughters of Roberto in this field (this should help you narrow down your picks), eight of the 12 fillies in this year's race are direct male line descendants of Northern Dancer.



This will be the first year the race is being run at its originally intended distance of 1 1/4 miles.

Due to the configuration of the courses at Gulfstream and Churchill, it was run at 1 3/8 miles.

SPRINT...Don't blink or you'll miss this classic clash of 14 crack sprinters. Defending Sprint champion **Kona Gold** had his seven-race win streak snapped with a runner-up finish behind **Swept Overboard** in the Oct. 6 GI Ancient Title Breeders' Cup H. The seven-year-old gelding, off the board only once in 13 starts at six furlongs, was giving 11 pounds to his rival that day while making his first start in three months. **Caller One** weakened to fourth after setting torrid fractions in last year's Sprint. The four-year-old began his 2001 campaign with a win in the G3 Dubai Golden Shaheen. He has been off since finishing second to Kona Gold in the July 22 GII Bing Crosby Breeders' Cup H., but has been working bullets at Hollywood in preparation for his fourth start of the year. **Left Bank**, coming off a half-length win in the Sept. 22 GI Vosburgh, has won four of five starts at Belmont Park. Europe's best sprinter **Mozart (Ire)**, second in the Irish 2000 Guineas in May, is coming off a win in the Aug. 23 G1 York S. and connections hope that form carries over to the main track.

 **Xtra Heat** will try to become the fourth filly to win the Breeders' Cup Sprint, following in the hoofprints of Very Subtle (1987), Safely Kept (1990) and Desert Stormer (1995). The last two fillies to win the Sprint did so at Belmont Park.

 **Kona Gold** became the second six-year-old to win the Sprint with his victory last year. Should he become the first repeat winner of the race, he'll be the third seven-year-old to earn the win.

 Five 2001 Sprint hopefuls lined up for the six-furlong race in 2000: **Kona Gold** (1st), **Bet On Sunshine** (3rd), **Caller One** (4th), **Delaware Township** (10th) and **Five Star Day** (14th).

 Beginning with Cherokee Run in 1994, four straight Sprint winners were from the crop of 1990. The four-year-old was followed by Desert Stormer, Lit de Justice and Elmhurst.

MILE...While three trainers have won the Breeders' Cup Mile twice with one horse, none have won it twice with different horses. Julio Canani, trainer of 1999 winner Silic (Fr) and Neil Drysdale, trainer of last year's winner War Chant, both have solid chances to break that trend today. Canani sends out David Milch's five-year-old **Val Royal (Fr)**, who most recently won the Oct. 7 GII Oak Tree Breeders' Cup Mile in brilliant fashion off a seven-month layoff. He is six for nine lifetime and Canani reports that the injuries that have kept him on the sidelines in the past are not affecting him now. Drysdale has two chances in here with **Irish Prize** and longshot **Sarafan**. Irish Prize put together a three-race winning streak this summer, taking the GIII Fastness H. and the GI Shoemaker Breeders' Cup Mile at Hollywood, then shipping to Churchill Downs to annex the GII Firecracker H. He was given a three-month break and came back to run a good fourth from the widest post in the GI Atto Mile at Woodbine Sept. 9. The chestnut unluckily drew the outside post again and will break from the 13-hole. Neither Val Royal or Irish Prize have experience over the Belmont turf, but one entrant who holds a distinct home-turf advantage is **Forbidden Apple**, who is seven-for-11 in his career over the Belmont turf. More specifically, he owns five wins from seven starts over the Widener course, where the Mile will be run. He most recently won the GII Kelso H. Oct. 6 for the second year in a row.

 Foreign favorites at Belmont...The last two times the Breeders' Cup took place at Belmont Park, foreign-based horses justified their favoritism with victories. Royal Academy won by a neck at odds of 2.80-1 in 1990 and Ridgewood Pearl (Ire) won won by two lengths as the 2.55-1 favorite in 1995.

 What home turf advantage? Fifteen of the 17 Breeders' Cup Mile winners had *never* competed over the turf course on which they won the Mile. The two winners that did have experience over the course were Royal Heroine (Ire) at Hollywood in 1984 and Opening Verse at Churchill in 1991.

 Where are all the women? For the second year in a row, there will be no fillies or mares competing in the Mile. The only other years where no females were in the race were 1992, 1997 and 1998.

JUVENILE FILLIES...Of his six Breeders' Cup entrants, Bobby Frankel says he feels most confident about his starter in this race. Will **You** be the one to break his now-infamous 0-for-36 streak?. Frankel has reason to believe. You was a dominating winner of the Oct. 6 G1 Frizette, running her record to three-for-four. She'll start the heavy choice, and has the versatility to sit off the early speed duel which could shape up between the undefeated New York-bred **Shesastonecoldfox** and GII Sorrento S. winner **Tempera**. But she faces some intriguing opposition, including several undefeated competitors. **Habibti** won the GI Del Mar Debutante before missing the GI Oak Leaf with a fever. **Bella Bellucci** has also never been beaten and sports a win in the GII Astarita Oct. 8 on this surface. Neil Drysdale looks for his seventh Breeders' Cup winner with Michael Tabor's filly and has added Lasix to improve his chances. With only two starts each, however, either of the pair would become the most lightly raced winner in Juvenile Fillies history. **Shesastonecoldfox** has never faced open company, but has won her four starts by a total of 26 lengths, and **Take Charge Lady** won her third straight in the Oct. 5 GII Alcibiades at Keeneland. In a gritty group, will Frankel's confidence be rewarded? The good news: of his 36 Breeders' Cup disappointments, the only race he hasn't lost is the Juvenile Fillies.

 No Juvenile Fillies winner has come into the race with fewer than three starts: **Habibti** and **Bella Bellucci** each have just two.

 Both of **Sophisticat's** parents lost their Juvenile starts in a squeaker: Storm Cat was second by a nose to the '85 victor, Tasso; while Serena's Song lost the '94 Juvenile Fillies by a head to stable-mate Flanders

 Two freshman sires get their first crack at Breeders' Cup glory: Langfuhr (**Imperial Gesture**), who is represented by seven winners and looks for his first black-type winner here; and Open Forum (**Jealous Forum**), second among first-crop sires with 15 winners.

 Bob Baffert (**Habibti**) is the only trainer in the race to have saddled a Juvenile Fillies winner, Silverbulletday in 1998.

 **Shesastonecoldfox** would become the first New York-bred Breeders' Cup winner from 18 starters from the Empire State.

DISTAFF...This year's Breeders' Cup Distaff is quite similar to the 1991 contest at Churchill Downs, where seven three-year-old fillies--including the top two finishers Dance Smartly and Versailles Treaty--competed against a suspect group of older distaffers. A total of six sophomores were entered this year, but only five will run, as **Fleet Renee** tied up Thursday and was scratched Friday morning. The two top choices in the betting are expected to be **Exogenous** and **Flute**, who ran first and second in the GI Beldame at this track and trip Oct. 6. Exogenous has always shown talent, but became a new filly when she put blinkers on two back. Flute won the GI Kentucky Oaks and the GI Alabama this year ran well in the Beldame, even though she was beaten for the top spot. **Starrer**, **Unbridled Elaine** and **Two Item Limit** round out the sophomore representatives. Of the older entrants, **Spain** appears to have regained the form that carried her to victory in last year's Distaff at odds of 55-1. She was beaten only 1 1/2 lengths by Exogenous in the Beldame, and was forced to steady in deep stretch, would could have cost her second place. The biggest gamble on Breeders' Cup Day will be made by the Ackerley Brothers, who have put up \$400,000 in supplemental fees to run **Miss Linda (Arg)**.



Miss Linda and **Tranquility Lake** both show an affinity for racing on the front end. That style has gotten the job done in the Distaff four times: *Lady's Secret* in 1986, *Sacahuista* in 1987, *One Dreamer* in 1994 and *Escena* in 1998.



Prep School: Only one winner of the Distaff has ever prepped for the race at the same track where she won, and that was *Hollywood Wildcat* at Santa Anita in 1993. The *Spinster S.* at Keeneland is statistically the most effective prep, having produced eight winners and four runners-up.



Belmont Park was the site of two of the three most dominant Distaff victories. *Bayakoa (Arg)* won in 1990 by 6 3/4 lengths and *Inside Information* set the standard by which all Breeders' Cup races are judged with her 13 1/2-length victory in the slop in 1995.



Trainer **Wayne Lukas** won three Distaffs in a row when the event was contested at 10 furlongs. He then went winless for 12 years after the race was shortened to nine furlongs until finally breaking through with *Spain* last year.

THREE SCRATCHED FROM CUP

There have been three late scratches from this year's Breeders' Cup. **Numerous Times** (Numerous), the undefeated winner of the GI Atto Mile, was withdrawn from the Mile after injuring his right front ankle Thursday afternoon. "We X-rayed him and found no break, which is quite good," trainer Sid Attard said. "It seems he has strained those ligaments in the ankle. It's quite a disappointment, because we thought we were good here, but we have to do what's right for the horse." Two-time Grade I winner **Fleet Renee** (Seattle Slew) will miss the Distaff after tying up yesterday morning. The filly's trainer, Michael Dickinson, also scratched his Turf candidate **Slew Valley** (Valley Crossing). Dickinson reported that the four-year-old was coughing. The pre-entry and entry fees for all three horses will be fully refunded.

GUIDED TOUR SOLD

Guided Tour (Hansel), a five-year-old gelding, has been sold by Morton Fink to Buckram Oak Farm. The names of both owners will appear in the Breeders' Cup program, but Buckram Oak will assume 100-percent interest after the Classic. The purchase price was not disclosed.

CLASSIC ANGLES

Three jockeys have accounted for 12 of the 17 runnings of the Classic--Jerry Bailey, Pat Day and Chris McCarron have won four apiece.

The first six winners of the Classic were bred in Kentucky, but only three of the last 11 were born in the Bluegrass State.

An outside post has been no hindrance to Classic winners in the two previous editions held at Belmont Park. Unbridled broke from the far outside, post 14, to win in 1990; and 1995 hero Cigar came away from post 10 in an 11-horse field.

Three-year-olds have won seven editions of the Classic, four-year-olds have taken it six times and five-year-olds have been successful in four runnings.

I've had horses with James [Eustace] since he started, and I've always had every confidence, but it's just taken a bit longer than I thought. It is a special day for him because he doesn't have the greatest of opportunities and a Group race is a Group race."
