NUREYEV DIES

Hours after his son Stonemason became his 129th stakes winner (*see p.5*), leading sire **Nureyev** (Northern Dancer--Special, by *Forli) died yesterday due to complications from cancer. He was 24 years old. Having sustained a serious fracture to his right hind in 1987 and plagued by fertility problems throughout his stud career, the blaze-faced bay had developed a tumor in his right front foot in August and laminitis became a concern in his left front. "Nureyev was a very courageous horse," said John T. L. Jones, Jr., president of Walmac Int'l. "He wasn't blessed with the greatest fertility in the world, but he cooperated with us, and we helped him put his progeny on the map. He went through a terrible accident [in 1987], and was smart and cooperative enough to help us save him. This time, there wasn't anything we could do for him. Like great friends and great people you know, you're going to miss them." Bred by Claiborne Farm, Nureyev was the \$1.3 million sale topper at Keeneland July in 1978 and raced in the colors of Stavros Niarchos. He captured his only start at two, the G3 Prix Thomas Bryon, and kicked off his three-year-old campaign with a victory in the Prix Djebel before crossing the Channel for a tilt at the G1 English 2000 Guineas. He crossed the line first, but was disqualified for interference and placed last while Known Fact was awarded the Classic prize; nevertheless, he was named champion miler in France. Nureyev began his stud career in France in 1981, siring champion Theatrical (Ire) among 10 stakes winners from his first crop. Moved to Walmac for the 1982 season, Nureyev came up with European champion three-year-old filly Sonic Lady in his first Kentucky crop, and followed that up with Miesque in his second. Having captured both the G1 English 1000 Guineas and the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches, Miesque became the first horse to win two Breeders' Cup events when she captured the G1 Breeders' Cup Mile in 1987-88. She later produced a pair of Group 1 winners in East of the Moon and Kingmambo, now a top sire. Nureyev has sired 129 stakes winners, 28 of which are Group/Grade I winners, from 19 crops to race. In addition to Miesque, both Spinning World ('97 Mile) and Theatrical ('87 Turf) have captured Breeders' Cup events.

EXOGENOUS MAY RACE AGAIN

Exogenous (Unbridled), who suffered a freakish injury when she flipped over in the tunnel prior to the Breeders' Cup Distaff, made a dramatic turn for the better yesterday, raising the possibility that she could race again. "The doctors think that there is a good chance she could race again," trainer Scotty Schulhofer said. "It all depends on how she does from here. But so far she is doing very well and really coming along. The vital signs are good and they are improving." As recently as Sunday morning, Schulhofer was still worried that his multiple Grade I-winning filly would have to be euthanized. The best case scenario appeared to be that she would survive, but would never race again. Veterinarian Dr. Stephen Carr was also optimistic about her future yesterday, pointing out that she was fortunate to have only suffered an injury to the outside area of her brain. "The neurological signs lead us to believe that she has peripheral and not central damage," he said. "I am not a neurologist, but that's my interpretation, that the lesion is on the outer part of the brain and not down deep or in the brain stem." Exogenous' recovery will still take some time. She is on a host of medications, including anti-inflammatory drugs and antibiotics, as well as doses of vitamin E, and will require several weeks of rest. "While it is a longshot that she will race again, it is very remarkable that she is doing as well as she is," Carr said. "That's due to the degree of the injury. If she had fractured her skull, she would not be with us today. Instead, it seems to be nothing worse than a mild concussion." The final decision concerning her future will likely be made by owner Vernon Heath, who was not available for comment yesterday.

CITY ZIP TO NEW YORK City Zip (Carson City--Baby Zip, by Relaunch) has been purchased for stud duty by Gus Schoenborn, Jr.'s Contemporary Stallions and will enter stud at the Cocksackie, New York farm for the 2002 breeding season. A stud fee has not yet been determined. Bred in Kentucky by Adena Springs, the blaze-faced chestnut became just the fourth horse in 76 years to sweep the trio of graded stakes for juveniles at Saratoga, winning the GII Sanford S., GII Saratoga Special and the GI Hopeful S., where he dead-heated with Yonaguska and defeated eventual two-year-old champion Macho Uno. After finishing third in the GI Fountain of Youth S. early in his three-year-old year, City Zip came back to sprinting and added victories in the GII Amsterdam S. and the GIII Jersey Breeders' Cup S. He switched to the turf for his two most recent starts, finishing third in the GII Kelso H. before running ninth in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile Oct. 27. His career record stands at 23-9-5-4 with earnings of \$818,225. "City Zip is the most accomplished two-year-old ever to retire to New York," said Schoenborn. "We are thrilled to be able to offer a stallion prospect of this quality to New York breeders."

Hollywood Changes Allowance Condition:
 Beginning with the start of the fall meeting Nov. 7, Hollywood Park will relax the conditions for closed allowance conditions (n1x, n2x, etc.), a move intended to attract more horses to the Southern California racing circuit. The conditions, which previously excluded winners of \$3,000 or more, has been changed to \$8,000. "You often get horses that have won several races in South America, none for more than \$6,000," explained Hollywood Park Racing Secretary Martin Panza. "By increasing the money won to \$8,000, trainers will be able to bring more horses to Southern California knowing that they are eligible for a one-other-than where in the past they might only have been eligible for a three other than. This will help owners buying foreign horses recoup their investment faster."

NUREYEV: 1977 - 2001 A three-quarters brother to fellow leading sire Sadler's Wells, **Nureyev** severely fractured his right hind while galloping in his paddock in 1987 and patiently endured a long recovery in a sling. Walmac built a special complex to house their leading stallion after his accident, with his own breeding shed included. Though Theatrical remains his leading son at stud, both Polar Falcon and Soviet Star have carved out solid reputations in Europe, but some of Nureyev's best sons are just embarking on their stallion careers. Both Spinning World and Atticus have had their first runners in 2001, while Arc winner Peintre Celebre's first crop of yearlings have been well received at auction and champion Fasliyev's first foals have arrived this year. Though perhaps best known for getting top-class milers such as Miesque, Soviet Star and Spinning World, Nureyev showed a wide range among his offspring, from top sprinters such as Stravinsky to Epsom Oaks heroine Reams of Verse and the aforementioned Peintre Celebre. In 2001, he has sired three Group 1 winners to date: Juddmonte Farms' Skimming, who captured the 10-furlong GI Pacific Classic on dirt for the second straight year; and Senure, winner of the GI United Nations H. going 11 furlongs on turf; as well as King Charlemagne, who took the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest going six furlongs at Deauville. Nureyev has also been a successful broodmare sire with 98 stakes winners produced by his daughters to date. Champions Desert King (Ire), East of the Moon and Loup Sauvage are all out of Nureyev mares, as are leading sires Kingmambo and Zabeel (NZ). Nureyev covered 39 mares this year, with two of them scheduled to sell at Keeneland November. Only one of them, hip 507, Nuts in May (A.P. Indy) is listed as pregnant.

Long losing runs don't always last forever, as Bobby Frankel and Juddmonte Farms discovered to their joy on Breeders' Cup Day, but it took them 39 and 31 attempts respectively to record their overdue victories. In comparison, the failure of any of the first 17 winners of the Breeders' Cup Juvenile to triumph in the Kentucky Derby looks like a statistic still in its infancy.

You can be sure, though, that this statistic won't faze the owners of the magnificent Johannesburg, because Michael Tabor and the Magniers are constantly striving to break down barriers. How many other owners, after all, would have been bold enough to decline an excellent chance of winning the Arc in order to ask an extremely valuable Sadler's Wells colt, Galileo, to make his debut on dirt in the Classic?

The question asked of Galileo unfortunately proved too difficult, and there must be a chance that the Kentucky Derby will place too great a demand on the stamina of Johannesburg, even though this wonderfully versatile colt finished so well over 8 1/2 furlongs at Belmont.

The picture isn't made any clearer by the fact that Johannesburg's sire, Hennessy, never made it to the races as a three-year-old.

What we do know is that the juvenile Hennessy was fast enough to reel off four impressive wins--one over five furlongs, two over six furlongs (the GII Hollywood Juvenile by 5 1/2 lengths and the GII Sapling S. by nearly 10 lengths) and one over seven furlongs (the GI Hopeful S. by more than three lengths from Louis Quatorze and Maria's Mon).

We also know that Hennessy didn't fare quite so well when he stretched out to 8 1/2 furlongs. Maria's Mon comfortably turned the tables on him in the GI Champagne S., when the chart recorded that the sixth-placed Hennessy "weakened on rail," but there was no disgrace in his defeat in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, when he mirrored the effort of his sire Storm Cat in the 1985 Juvenile. Hennessy failed by only a neck to hold the challenge of Unbridled's Song and it's a great tribute to the quality of the 1995 Juvenile that three of the first four--Unbridled's Song, Hennessy and Honour and Glory--have all sired a Breeders' Cup winner in his first or second crop.

After going down by half a length to Cobra King in a Grade III over seven furlongs, Hennessy was back to 8 1/2 furlongs in the GI Hollywood Futurity, finishing a lacklustre fourth on what proved to be his final appearance.

Perhaps Hennessy would have stayed further, with help from his broodmare sire Hawaii, who numbered the Man o'War S. among his wins. However, Hennessy's dam Island Kitty was at her most effective as a juvenile, doing well at up to seven furlongs, and she was a sister to Springing Leopard, a leading sprinter in South Africa.

With only one crop of three-year-olds by Hennessy on the track, information is again in short supply about how much stamina he is imparting to his progeny. This crop contains Distilled, winner of the GII Illinois Derby over 1 1/8 miles, and Keats, winner of the GII Coolmore Lexington S. over 8 1/2 furlongs. Johannesburg is out of a grand-daughter of Damascus and so is Keats, who faded to finish in the rear after helping to force the pace in the Kentucky Derby. **Cont. p6**

Michael Kinane chose Temple of Artemis in favour of his stable companion, but his misfortune proved to the benefit of Seamus Heffernan aboard the Nureyev colt as he seized the initiative here with a bold display of front-running. Stonemason had run exclusively at six furlongs before this contest, being readily outpaced in his last effort when sixth to Miss Beabea (Ire) (Catrail) in the Listed Blenheim S. at The Curragh Sept. 16 after finishing third behind the speedy Steaming Home and Minashki (Ire) in the Round Tower S. there Sept. 2. Here he was set alight from the gate and built an advantage that his stable companion could not make serious inroads on, stretching away under the urgings of his rider in the straight. O'Brien said, "He is a very nice horse and had been working well. The little break probably did him good."

Jockey Christophe Soumillon christened his new partnership with His Highness the Aga Khan by winning his first stakes race in the famous green and red colors. Posting an improved effort, Miliana provided the opening overture for the new relationship in a thrilling finish. She is a filly hitting form at the end of the year, finishing third in the Listed Prix de Boulogne at Longchamp Sept. 1 before being denied by a short head in the Listed Grand Prix de la Region Alsace at Strasbourg Sept. 30. Previously she had made a cross-channel excursion to Epsom June 8 to be fourth in the Listed Princess Elizabeth S. behind Sheppard's Watch (GB). Here she travelled in seventh early as Sugar Mill (Fr) (Polar Falcon) cut out the running. Making her move in the straight, she hit the front with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining where she gained first run on the last closing Kentucky Rose. Holding on in a driving finish, she had just enough to deny that filly and claim her first stakes success.

It looks as though Johannesburg is going to need some assistance from the bottom half of his pedigree if he is to be suited by 1 1/4 miles. He is out of Myth, a two-year-old sprint winner by Ogygian, who gained his stakes wins over seven, eight and nine furlongs.

Perhaps the biggest worry about Johannesburg's pedigree concerns his second dam, Yarn, a sprint winner by Mr. Prospector. When Yarn was mated to Hennessy's sire Storm Cat, the outcome was Tale of the Cat, who struggled to carry his tremendous speed as far as 1 1/8 miles. Bear in mind, too, that Yarn is also the dam of Minardi, a champion juvenile who reverted to sprinting after running creditably over a mile earlier this year.

So is this the pedigree of a future Kentucky Derby winner? I would unhesitatingly have said that it isn't, the only seed of doubt in my mind being that Johannesburg is trained by Aidan O'Brien, a man who believes that nothing's impossible--it merely takes a little longer.

MUTAMAM RETIRED Mutamam (GB) (Darshaan {GB}--Petal Girl {GB}, by Caerleon) has run his last race and will take up stud duties at the National Stud, it was announced yesterday. The Alec Stewart-trained horse was the game winner of the G1 Canadian International at Woodbine Sept. 30 before finishing last of 11 behind Fantastic Light in Saturday's G1 Breeders' Cup Turf at Belmont Park. That race was described by jockey Richard Hills as "a bridge too far" for the six-year-old and he will be retired now after a career which also included seven wins in Group company, highlighted by two consecutive successes in the G3 September S. at Kempton. Stewart told *PA Sport* yesterday, "Obviously I was very disappointed with the way it went for him [on Saturday]. But with the benefit of hindsight, the race may have come too soon for him. Only one horse has won both races before and he had five weeks between races which would have been a help. The race was always going to be a swansong, but it's a shame it didn't quite go to plan. He was an incredibly versatile horse who was top-class at two when he finished third in the G1 Racing Post Trophy. We will all miss him at the yard, but he won't be far away in his new home. I hope his last run won't tarnish his record, he won seven Group races, but it was incredible toughness and durability that was his biggest weapon on the track." Purchased as a yearling for 185,000gns at Tattersalls Houghton, Mutamam won 11 of his 21 career starts and became a millionaire with his win at Woodbine, retiring with earnings of \$1,388,096. Mutamam will stand at a fee of £6,000 Oct. 1 terms.
