APTITUDE OFF TO STUD

Aptitude (A.P. Indy--Dokki, by Northern Dancer) has been retired from racing and will stand the 2002 breeding season for a fee of \$25,000 at Prince Khalid Abdullah's Juddmonte Farms in Lexington, Kentucky. One of the leading three-year-olds of last season, the homebred colt, third to Fusaichi Pegasus in the GI Wood Memorial, checked in second behind that rival in the Kentucky Derby three weeks later and went on to finish runner-up to Commendable in the Belmont S. The dark bay blossomed into a major force in the older-horse division this year, with consecutive victories in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup, the GI Saratoga Breeders' Cup and GI Jockey Club Gold Cup. For his 10-length victory in that race, he earned a 123 Beyer Speed Figure, highest of any horse in 2001. Aptitude is a half brother to GI Hollywood Oaks winner Sleep Easy and is out of a half sister to 1979 Belmont S. winner Coastal and champion older horse Slew o' Gold. He retires with a record of 15-5-4-2 and earnings of \$1,965,410.

OFFICER TO RACE IN CAL CUP

The Thoroughbred Corporation's **Officer** (Bertrando), fifth as the odds-on choice in last Saturday's Breeders' Cup Juvenile, was a surprise entry for this Saturday's California Cup Juvenile at Santa Anita and trainer Bob Baffert said yesterday that the plan is to run. "It was a last-minute deal," Baffert commented, "but I thought about it (Tuesday) when he came back (from Belmont Park). He wasn't tired after the race. When I got him off the van, he was full of himself, jumping. I told (The Thoroughbred Corporation Racing Manager) Richard (Mulhall), 'If I owned him, I'd run him back in a week.' So we went and looked at him and I galloped him and it was just like he didn't run, which he didn't." The original plan was to run the \$700,000 two-year-old purchase in the GI Hollywood Futurity, but the conditioner explained further the reasons behind running this weekend. "We want to know what Officer's real style is now and instead of working him up to the Futurity, I'd rather just run him in a race. Maybe we'll get something out of this and we'll know more about Officer. If he gets beat, maybe he's not the horse we thought he was. But I think he is." Gary Stevens will take over for Victor Espinoza in the irons.

EVENING ATTIRE LEAVES 'EM CRYING

Maiden winner **Evening Attire** (Black Tie Affair {Ire}) was all dressed up with nowhere to go turning for home, but found room along the inside at midstretch and edged clear late to spoil the return of Godolphin's **Street Cry (Ire)** (Machiavellian) in yesterday's GIII Discovery H. on opening day at Aqueduct. Seventh in the GI Hopeful S. last year, the gray went to the shelf following a pair of second-place finishes in September and October. Third to Orientate in Saratoga allowance company Aug. 11, he was fourth when stretched to a mile at Belmont Sept. 22 and was most recently sixth over the Elmont turf course with blinkers added Oct. 13. Settled in third along the rail as **No Show Jim** (Devil His Due) and **Dayton Flyer** (Honour and Glory) disputed the pace, Evening Attire was patiently handled and advanced along the inside turning for home. Street Cry, carried wide by **Free of Love** (Meadow Flight) at the head of the stretch, surged to the front at the eighth pole, but could not withstand the late run from the winner. "He was a little rank in the first part of the race, but after that things went great," said winning rider Shaun Bridgmohan. "Down the backstretch he relaxed perfectly and I was in a great spot around the far turn. (Trainer) Pat (Kelly) did a great job with this horse."

The winner of three of four starts at two, including the GIII California Juvenile S., the chestnut put himself on the Triple Crown trail with a victory in the GII Spiral S. at Turfway Park and followed that effort with a good second in the GII Coolmore Lexington S. Forced to miss the Kentucky Derby with an injury, he ran third in the GII Peter Pan S., but was shelved after a 10th-place finish in the Belmont S.. Winless in two starts this season, Globalize retires with a record of 13-5-2-1 and earnings of \$623,650.

BRAHMS INJURED, RETIRED Grade I winner **Brahms** (Danzig--Queenena, by Mr. Prospector) emerged from his sixth-place finish in Saturday's Breeders' Cup Mile with a chip in his left front ankle and has been retired to stud. A \$1 million Keeneland July yearling, he raced for a partnership including Coolmore's John Magnier and Michael Tabor and was on the board in each of his six European starts at two, including a pair of Group 1 placings, but finished seventh in the 1999 Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Purchased by a group headed by Tom Van Meter to race in the U.S., the dark bay was unbeaten in four starts in 2000 and finished the year with graded-stakes victories in the GIII River City H. and the GI Hollywood Derby. Trained by Elliott Walden, the four-year-old was winless in seven tries this year, his best efforts coming when second by a neck in the GII Maker's Mark Mile at Keeneland in April and third to Guided Tour and Captain Steve in the GII Stephen Foster H. on the main track. "We're excited about Brahms going to stud," Van Meter said. "He has a brilliant pedigree and looks to match." A son of champion older mare Queenena, he retires to the Vinery with a record of 17-5-4-4 and career earnings of \$843,226. He will stand for a fee of \$12,500.

FIVE STAR DAY RETIRED Columbine Stable and Kitchwa Stable's **Five Star Day** (Carson City--Reggie V., by Vanlandingham) has been retired and will enter stud next year at Wintergreen Stallion Station near Midway, Kentucky. The five-year-old will stand for a fee of \$10,000. Second to Forestry in the GI King's Bishop S. in 1999, Five Star Day was excluded from that year's Breeders' Cup, but defeated older horses in the GIII V.O. Underwood S. in December. The winner of the GIII Phoenix Breeders' Cup at Keeneland in an abbreviated four-race campaign in 2000, the chestnut returned this season to win Saratoga's GII A.G. Vanderbilt H. prior to an eighth-place finish in last Saturday's Breeders' Cup Sprint. "Five Star Day was the best looking foal we've ever raised at Wintergreen and that's why we paid \$325,000 at Keeneland July just to keep him," commented John Greely, co-owner of Wintergreen Stallion Station. "He's rewarded us with many thrilling moments on the racetrack and we have great expectations as his new career at stud gets underway." Trained by Wintergreen part owner Beau Greely, Five Star Day goes to the breeding shed with a record of 16-6-5-0 and earnings of \$575,365.

CLARK COULD ATTRACT CUP RUNNERS Breeders' Cup Classic hero **Tiznow** (Cee's Tizzy) and fifth-place finisher **Guided Tour** (Hansel) head the list of possible runners for the \$400,000 GII Clark H. at Churchill Downs Nov. 23. "He got back (Tuesday afternoon) and he looks good," trainer Jay Robbins said of Tiznow. "He hasn't been out to walk yet, but he looked good yesterday afternoon when he came back. I think if he were to run again before the end of the year, the Clark H. might be an option." Guided Tour was sold by owner Morton Fink to Buckram Oak Farm shortly before the Classic and will soon be moving to Saudi Arabia. "This may be his last start for me," said trainer Niall O'Callaghan. "He ran a big race in the Classic. The 'dead rail' probably didn't help him. It's hard to know how much it affected him." Guided Tour was second in last year's Clark. The race could also attract Breeders' Cup Sprint also-ran **El Corredor** (Mr. Greeley).

"He may go for the Hong Kong Sprint next month and we'll think about Dubai in March, although we have plenty at home to keep him busy," said Vienna. "He will race for William and Donna Herrick and has lots of opportunities at Hollywood Park and Sanita Anita. We also have the added dimension that he can run on dirt. I suppose he was very expensive for an old gelding." Nuclear Debate, who was trained by John Hammond for a partnership that included his former trainer Lynda Ramsden, was offered to disband that ownership group. Macau trainer Allen Ngai secured G2 Richmond S. runner-up **Prince Dayjur (USA)** (Dayjur {USA}) for 150,000gns. "He will race for my main owner, but will be trained in Hong Kong," said Ngai. The two-year-old **Prince Cyrano (GB)** (Cyrano de Bergerac {Ire}) who was closely beaten in a Chantilly Group 3 race in September, realised 120,000gns and will be moving from Stuart Williams's yard to that of another Newmarket handler, Willie Musson. Bidding begins today at 9 p.m.

FALLON GOES FREELANCE

Kieren Fallon has revealed he will not ride as stable jockey to trainer Sir Michael Stoute in 2001. Fallon, who has ridden **King's Best (USA)** (Kingmambo {USA}) and **Golan (Ire)** (Spectrum {Ire}) to success for the Newmarket handler in the last two runnings of the G1 2000 Guineas, made the revelation to the *Racing Post* on Tuesday. He said: "I will not be riding as stable jockey to Sir Michael next year, but I still expect to be riding for him--he hasn't said anything to suggest otherwise. I feel we've still got a good working relationship, I don't think there's been a cross word between us this year." Stoute yesterday stated: "My stable will not be retaining a jockey for the 2002 season. Not all of my owners wish to use Kieren Fallon, but his association with the stable will continue with those that do. Kieren assures me that he is keen to do so."
