BULLISH ON KEENELAND NOVEMBER?

Tom Van Meter, who has made a good living the past few years selling Thoroughbreds at sales events all over North America, has a little prediction regarding the upcoming November Breeding Stock Sales. It is a simple philosophy, based on his life and sales experiences, a theory that he hopes will hold true once again. Van Meter's prediction? "Don't believe the pre-sale predictions. All the talk is gloom and doom. They're talking that the sale is going to be down this amount and that amount. You know what? Every time that happens, the market is always up, and I think that is what is going to happen this time," said Van Meter, taking a few minutes out of his pre-sales prep work to provide a little pre-sales pep talk. "I think it is going to be a good sale. People will always come to buy the good stuff. We know that, and that part of the market will be strong. But I think it is going to be strong across the board. I'm going out on a limb, but I think it will be up 10 percent or more all the way across. I think there will be a demand for horses at all levels, and I think people are going to walk away very pleasantly surprised. How's that for a prediction?" The annual Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sales, which, along with Fasig-Tipton Kentucky's select bloodstock auction, are considered the barometer of the overall health of the breeding industry, begins today. It will run every day until the last horse is sold on Nov. 15, with the bidding kicking off at 10 a.m. daily. While Duncan Taylor of Taylor Made is also inclined to ignore the pre-sales prattle, he is not as bullish on the market. "I really don't think the sale is going to be as bad as most people think," he said. "If ever a time that all the things lined up just perfect for a bad sale, I guess it would be now, but I just don't think it is going to be a disaster. My hope is that there are enough people out there, those who have been in the business for awhile, who think there will be an opportunity to get something really good and they'll show up to buy. The combination of those people and the fact that there are going to be fewer horses, give us some hope for a good, strong sale." *Preview cont. p2*

STORMY PICK TOPS FASIG-TIPTON NOVEMBER

With a final bid of \$700,000, Grade I winner **Stormy Pick** (Storm Creek) was the top-priced lot at last night's Fasig-Tipton November Selected Sale in Lexington, Kentucky. The three-year-old filly, sold as a racing or broodmare prospect, was consigned by Raymond Dweck with Taylor Made Sales Agency as agent. Robert Courtney made the winning bid. Stormy Pick captured last year's GI Spinaway and GIII Sorority S. She is a half sister to stakes winner **Expected Program** (Valid Expectation). The top-priced weanling at the sale was hip number 11, a daughter of Forestry who was purchased by Courtney for \$250,000. The dark bay filly, out of I'm No Pussycat (Valdez), was consigned by Taylor Made. She is a half sister to graded stakes winner **Sovereign Kitty** (Sovereign Dancer). Fasig-Tipton yesterday sold 35 horses for \$3,421,000 and an average of \$97,743. *Sale Stats & Top Six Weanlings p. 4.*

Melbourne Cup Facts

Archer (Aus) won the first Melbourne Cup back in 1861 when the prize was worth £1420 and the trophy was a gold watch.....Trainer **Bart Cummings** has claimed a record 11-Cup wins, his first victory was recorded in 1965 with the filly **Light Fingers (NZ)**.....1913 winner **Posinatus (Aus)** was the only horse to win the event wire-to-wire until 1997 victor **Might and Power (NZ)** scored up front..... In 1972 the race was changed to 3200 meters, 18.7 meters or 61.5 feet short of two miles.....Record time for the Cup at its current distance is 3:16.30 set by **Kingston Rule (USA)** in 1990.....The event's purse first hit the \$1 million mark in 1985.....Horses who completed the Caulfield-Melbourne Cups double in the same year are **Poseiden (Aus)** 1906, **The Trump (Aus)** 1937, **Rivette (Aus)** 1939, **Rising Fast (NZ)** 1954, **Even Stevens (NZ)** 1962, **Galilee (NZ)** 1966, **Gurner's Lane (Aus)** 1982, **Let's Elope (NZ)** 1991 and **Doriemus (NZ)** 1995..... The oldest horses to win were eight-year-olds **Toryboy (Aus)** in 1865 and 1938 winner **Catalogue (NZ)**.....Five-year-olds have recorded the most wins in the race, winning on 41 occasions. DISCO RICO RETIRED Four-year-old **Disco Rico** (Citidancer--Round It Off, by Apalachee) came out of his two-length victory in the Oct. 27 Lite The Fuse S. at Laurel with a fracture and has been retired, according to the *Thoroughbred Times*. The Maryland-bred colt won nine of his 17 career starts, including this year's GIII Maryland Breeders' Cup H. and six additional stakes; he was also second five times and third once, earning \$507,244. The bay was purchased for \$82,000 as a juvenile at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's March Sale. Stud plans have not yet been finalized.

IMUS LOSES ENTIRE BREEDERS' CUP BANK-ROLL Radio talk show host Don Imus and his handicapping partner, Mike Francesa, lost the entire \$90,000 bankroll that the National Thoroughbred Racing Association put up for them to bet, for charity, on the Breeders' Cup, the *Thoroughbred Times* reports. As there was a guaranteed minimum donation no matter the outcome of the duo's wagers, the NTRA will ante up an additional \$50,000 for the NTRA Charities-New York Heroes Fund. Despite the fact that Imus and Francesa failed to cash even one ticket, NTRA spokesman Eric Wing told *Thoroughbred Times* that the promotion achieved its purpose of "raising awareness for the Heroes Fund and promoting the World Thoroughbred Championships." Wing added, "We are still very pleased with how it all worked out. At times, it's hard to quantify, but you know when you are dealing with Imus and Francesa that you get your money's worth and then some. It pervades their conversation and goes well beyond the mere reading of a commercial spot."

Sent off the second choice, Riskaverse sat off the pace before making a four-wide rally on the second turn. She took over in the stretch and drove clear to the wire. "When I asked her at the quarter-pole, she darted forward and was pretty game through the stretch run," said winning jockey Robbie Davis. "I think she's twice the filly on grass as opposed to the main track."

Riskaverse will be back on the turf for her likely next start, the GIII Miesque S. at Hollywood Park on Nov. 23, where she may again meet runner up Lujien Lujien.

The bay filly was coming off a sixth-place effort in the Oct. 14 La Lorgnette S going 1 1/16 miles. Sent off the second choice in the field of five, Poetically pressed the pace before drawing clear down the lane for an easy win. "She had some problems in the spring and she's just now starting to come around, but today, she was right there from the get-go and finished up very well," said winning jockey David Clark. "This was, by far, the best she's felt all season. She felt like herself again."

Keeneland November: Bucking Bearish Trends...

Despite Van Meter's optimistic prediction, the events of 2001 have not been kind to the Thoroughbred industry. Since the spring, the horse business has been hammered by a series of unfortunate events. The first blast came back in May, when it was determined that an outbreak of Mare Reproductive Loss Syndrome was causing many of the world's best Thoroughbred mares to abort, and many others to not get pregnant. That is one of the reasons the number of mares and weanlings entered in this year's fall sales have declined. The second hit came when the North American economy experienced an overall slowdown that has negatively impacted the stock market and many potential bloodstock buyers. The third crisis came just about a month ago, one day into the Keeneland September Yearling Sales, when the World Trade Center and the Pentagon were attacked and, subsequently, the world was spun into a war on terrorism that continues today. The combination of all these factors have left many people wondering about the future of the Thoroughbred industry, and worried that the business may join the world's economy in a dramatic downturn. "People have been reluctant to travel," Van Meter said. "Some people are holding onto their money a little tighter. You can see the impact of both of those things [at the sales]...there may not be as many of the foreign interests here to look and buy. But I think the fact that there are fewer horses in the sales will definitely help overall. There is quality in the sale."

Quality Over Quantity...

There is not, however, the quantity in this year's sale. Last year, Keeneland offered 5,111 lots. This year, the catalogue has 4,116. But Keeneland will have more than its share of top attractions. The list of glamour girls includes Grade I winners Lazy Slusan, Dreams Galore, Golden Ballet and Gourmet Girl. Cee's Song, dam of 2000 Horse of the Year Tiznow, will be offered carrying a full brother to the two-time Breeders' Cup Classic hero. Lost the Code, dam of 2001 Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Squirtle Squirt, will also be for sale, in foal to Cat Thief. A half brother to Squirtle Squirt, by Langfuhr, is also listed in the catalogues. Keeneland will offer broodmares who are in foal to some of the world's most respected and high-priced stallions, including the likes of A.P. Indy, Danehill, Danzig, Deputy Minister, Fusaichi Pegasus, Giant's Causeway, Gone West, Kingmambo, Lemon Drop Kid, Saint Ballado, Seattle Slew, Seeking the Gold, Storm Cat, Thunder Gulch, and the recently deceased Nureyev and Unbridled.

Well-bred Weanlings...

The weanlings on offer include sons and daughters by A.P. Indy, Deputy Minister, Exploit, Forestry, Gone West, Kingmambo, Sadler's Wells, Saint Ballado, Seeking the Gold, Storm Cat, Stravinsky, Thunder Gulch and Unbridled. Geoffrey Russell, Keeneland's newest director of sales, said, "We're seeing many positive signs, including strong interest among both domestic and international buyers. We're guardedly optimistic. Obviously, there are some unusual factors in this year's sale, but we're ready. The consignors are ready. Hopefully, the buyers will be ready."

24 LINE UP FOR MELBOURNE CUP

Although void of any obvious superstars, Tuesday's running of the Melbourne Cup appears to be a very competitive event on paper. **Sky Heights (NZ)** (Zabeel {NZ}) showed modest form earlier this fall, but showed great improvement last time in a brilliant come-from-behind second-place finish in the Oct. 20 G1 Caulfield Cup. **Persian Punch (Ire)** (Persian Heights {GB}), who ran third in this race back in 1998, reeled off two wins in Britain this summer, including the Aug. 2 G2 Goodwood Cup. Most recently, the nine-year-old was an unlucky fourth in the G1 Irish St Leger Sept. 15 at The Curragh, a race that produced 1993 Melbourne Cup winner Vintage Crop (Ire). The eight-time group winner is most likely making the final start in a career which has spanned six seasons and 42 starts. **Ethereal (NZ)** (Rhythm), one of four mares in the 24-horse field, has gained valuable support following her impressive defeat of 17 others in the Caulfield Cup. The 4-1 morning-line favorite, winner of the G1 Queensland Oaks this summer, looks for the third Group 1 win of her career. **Give the Slip (GB)** (Slip Anchor {GB}), who gained fame as the pacesetter for stable mate Fantastic Light, along with entrymate **Marienbard (Ire)** (Caerleon), will attempt to give Team Godolphin its first Melbourne Cup victory after having been blanked out for the past four years. Marienbard, second in the G2 Grand Prix de Deauville Aug. 26 and third behind Vinnie Roe (Ire) in the G1 Irish St Leger last time, has drawn jockey Frankie Dettori half-way around the world for the ride, so he must be considered an honest threat. *Full field p. 6*

Coming off a third-place effort in the Sept. 3 Gil Del Mar Derby, the Irish-bred colt fell back to last early. He moved up two wide on the turn, split foes with a furlong to run and drove clear. "Even though we're in the jockey's race [at Santa Anita], I told my agent that I wanted to come up here and ride this horse," said winning jockey Alex Solis. "I think he's a horse with a big future. We can be leading rider next year or maybe at Hollywood, but I didn't want to lose this horse. He has a lot of class." Humberto Ascanio, assistant to trainer Bobby Frankel, added, "This is a very nice three-year-old. We think he has a nice future. We always thought he was something special. I was a little concerned on the turn when they bunched up, but Alex did a great job of getting him through. He really kicked down the lane." Owner John Amerman said the Nov. 25 GI Hollywood Derby could be next for Blue Steller.

FIRST FOALS

Coolmore always seems to have one of the top two commercial prospects every time a group of stallions makes its first sales appearances, and this year's November sale is no exception--the two leaders in number of Book 1 foals are Ashford's (Coolmore's American arm) Stravinsky and Taylor Made's Forestry, with 12 each. There's certainly been a noticeable drop in the number of weanlings catalogued by the leading commercial prospects. Last year, in a 14-day, seven-catalogue November sale, there were six stallions (three from Ashford) with 25+ weanlings from their first crops throughout the whole sale. This year, there is one--Stravinsky, with 30.

Last year, Tale of the Cat had 39 catalogued, and Grand Slam had 37. Twenty stallions who stand at 14 different farms have 10 or more weanlings catalogued throughout the sale. Last year there were 24. Six of this year's 20 are by Storm Cat, headlined by Taylor Made's Bob Baffert-trained duo of top sprinter Forestry (17 in the sale) and unbeaten two-year-old Exploit (14).

Forestry, raced by Aaron and Marie Jones, won the GI King's Bishop; Exploit, who raced for Bob and Beverly Lewis, was a Grade II winner at two and three in an abbreviated six-race career.

There are also four American Classic winners among the 20, including the three successive winners of the Kentucky Derby/Preakness double--Silver Charm ('97, 15 in the sale); Real Quiet ('98, 12); and Charismatic ('99, 11). Victory Gallop, the '98 Belmont winner, has 17. Interestingly, only seven of the 55 foals catalogued by these four are in Book 1.

FIRST MARES IN FOAL

In this group, Coolmore's competing with itself. Ashford now stands the two stallions with the most mares in foal in the sale, Giant's Causeway (20) and Fusaichi Pegasus (17)--but Giant's Causeway stood in Ireland this year. Some shipping companies had good contracts.

With estimates that up to 30 percent of the 2002 Kentucky foal crop was lost to Mare Reproductive Loss Syndrome, it's perhaps not surprising that significantly fewer stallions who covered for the first time earlier this year have double-digit numbers of mares in foal in the Keeneland November catalogue; nor, perhaps, that the leader didn't stand in Kentucky. In 2000, there were 17 stallions with 10+ mares catalogued in foal in the November sale; this year, there are just seven. The two Ashford headliners have 37 mares in foal between them in the sale, and all 37 are in Book 1.
