WEATHERING THE STORM AT KEENELAND

Despite dire predictions from many in the breeding industry, the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale opened yesterday with no less than eight mares bringing more than \$1 million each. Last year, only four brood-mares broke the seven-figure barrier on the first day of the sale. Topping the day's trade was **Twenty Eight Carat** (Alydar), in foal to Fusaichi Pegasus. The 11-year-old mare, consigned by Lane's End as agent this time, had been through the ring at Keeneland twice before, bringing \$325,000 as a July yearling and \$235,000 as a November broodmare in foal to Summer Squall in 1998. Her foal of 1998 turned out to be Grade I winner A P Valentine. Elizabeth Moran's Brushwood Stable, which sold the chestnut as a yearling, bought her back for a cool \$4 million. "I didn't acquire her because I had an emotional attachment," Moran said. "I acquired her because she is a nice mare. In fact, I think she's the best mare in the sale." When asked if she was prepared to pay more for the mare, Moran shook her head. "No, that was it...I was hoping that I could get her for less. But I had a competitor. It was a stiff competition." The mare will join the Brushwood broodmare band, which now numbers approximately 30. *(More on the mares, p2)*

Storm Cat Tops the Weanlings...The top-selling weanling on opening day was Hip 37, a daughter of Storm Cat. Consigned by the Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency, the first foal out of the Grade II winner Better Than Honor (Deputy Minister) was purchased for \$1.5 million by Ted Burnett's Josham Farms Limited for a new racing partnership that will include John Sikura and his Hill 'n' Dale Farm. The filly is out of a standout female family--Better Than Honor won the GII Demoiselle S., and is a sister to Group winner Turnberry Isle. Her second dam is Blush With Pride, who won the GI Kentucky Oaks, GI Santa Susana S. and GII Ashland S. The family also has produced graded or group winners Malinowski and Monroe. "I bought her for a new racing partnership in Canada," Burnett, who was sitting next to John Sikura during the bidding, said. "We will probably leave her down here over the winter and then decide where to take her after that." Sikura, who con-

signed the filly on behalf of his Hill 'n' Dale Farm, will retain a half interest.

DARLEY CATCHING UP

While Kieren Fallon suffered a luckless day, missing with all his rides at Nottingham yesterday, chief rival Kevin Darley further closed the gap at the top of the Jockeys' Championship with a double at Redcar. Fallon, sitting on 162 wins, leads Darley by only seven after the latter's success on Sholay (Ire) and Pipadash (Ire). Fallon and Darley's fight could go to the wire as Britain's turf flat season ends at Doncaster on Saturday.

DUNLOP/TEBBUTT NON-TRIERS

Nottingham stewards found trainer Ed Dunlop and jockey Michael Tebbutt in violation of the non-triers rule yesterday. Tebbutt was suspended 10 days for schooling in public aboard Answered Promise (Fr) in the opening maiden and Dunlop was fined £2,000, adding to the £1,000 fine he picked up last week. Answered Promise, who finished fifth, was banned from racing for 40 days.

Gallery God capped a fine four days in France for Newmarket trainer Geoff Wragg, who captured the Listed Prix Scaramouche with Bosham Mill (GB) at Maisons-Laffitte on Friday. Gallery God is a consistent weight-carrying handicapper who put up fine efforts under heavy burdens when third in both the Duke of Edinburgh H. at Royal Ascot June 19 and Prestige H. at Goodwood July 31. Last time he was a respectable fourth in the Listed March S. again at Goodwood Aug. 25 but here he registered his first stakes success with a bold front-running display. Olivier Doleuze was quick to send Gallery God to the front here and crossed over from his high draw to grab the inner rail position. Shadowed by the favourite Ange Gabriele (Fr) (Kaldounevees {Fr}) until that colt started to tread water inside the final half mile, he was faced with a new danger in Darakiyla and Christophe Soumillon entering the straight. Strongly driven from there, he asserted inside the final 1 1/2 furlongs to win comfortably in the end.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR CATALOGUE BLACK-TYPE CHANGED The Society of International Thoroughbred Auctioneers have made several changes to the requirements for North American races which will receive black-type in future sales catalogues. Black-type will not be awarded to stakes which are restricted to maidens; stakes which limit eligibility to horses that have started for a given claiming price; stakes where all horses are eligible to be claimed; or optional-claiming stakes, even if none of the horses entered are eligible to be claimed. The minimum purse value for black-type stakes has been raised from \$25,000 to \$30,000, while the minimum purse value for Listed races has been increased from \$50,000 to \$75,000.

Prospect Bay to Virginia:

Second-crop stallion **Prospect Bay** (Crafty Prospector-Baltic Sea, by Danzig) will relocate from Vinery Kentucky to Legacy Farm, near Middleburg, Virginia, for 2002. The nine-year-old, a half-brother to top sprinter Caller One, has had 20 winners, including stakes winner Trion Georgia, from his first two crops. His progeny earnings stand at \$923,033. He will stand for \$2,500.

Calder Summer Meet Shows Gains:

The 119-day Calder Summer Meet which ended Saturday realized increases in on-track attendance, daily average handle and total handle. Total handle was \$631,641,042, up 3 percent from a year ago, while the daily average was \$424,657, up fractionally from 2000. On-track attendance averaged 4,967, up 5 percent from last year. For the fifth straight year, Bill White led all trainers, saddling 52 winners. White now boasts more Calder titles than anyone in the track's history with six. The leading owner at the meeting, with 30 wins, was Monarch Stables, Inc. Cornelio Velasquez was the top rider with 144 victories.

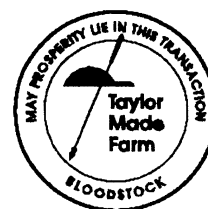

Keeneland November Report, cont.

Thanks a Million...and more...Klaus J. Jacobs and his Newsells Park Stud, a new shooter at last year's November Sale, picked up the day's second-most expensive broodmare, **Volvoretta (GB)** (Suave Dancer) as the last lot through the ring. The four-year-old filly, winner of the G1 Prix Vermeille at three and in foal to the "Iron Horse," Giant's Causeway, brought \$2.4 million. (*more on Newsells Park Stud, p3*)...The Irish Listed winner **Heeremandi (Ire)** (Royal Academy), in foal to supersire Storm Cat, brought the third-highest bid yesterday. The six-year-old mare, consigned by Lane's End, agent, was purchased for \$2,150,000 by John Sikura, owner of Hill 'n' Dale Farm in Fayette County. The bay is out of the grand mare La Dame Due Lac, who is a half-sister to high-class stakes winners Tosmah, Halo, Fathers Image and Maribeau. Heeremandi is herself a half-sister to four stakes winners, and is from the female family that has produced stakes winners Zindabad, Nadia, Flawlessly, Perfect and Laura's Pistolette. "We thought that she would be in the \$2.5 million range," said Sikura. "She's in-foal to the right horse. Now, we just hope to get a little lucky." Sikura confirmed that he purchased the mare for himself and several partners, whom he did not reveal...**Snow Polina** (Tremolino), from the Three Chimneys Sales consignment, was the second seven-figure purchase by Klaus Jacobs, going for \$2.1 million. The six-year-old mare, a multiple graded-stakes winner of \$816,143, is carrying her first foal, by the outstanding stallion Danzig. "We think highly of her, to say the least," said Jacobs' son, Andreas. "There's no doubt that she was an outstanding runner, and her pedigree has a lot of European appeal. The fact that she is in foal to Danzig made a big difference, I think. That is very juicy." Andreas Jacobs confirmed that Snow Polina will join the farm's band of mares in England, adding, "We have not determined who we will breed to her next--we didn't know if we were going to get her or not."...**North of Neptune** (Mr. Prospector), consigned by Lane's End Farm as agent, was purchased by Wertheimer et Frere of France for \$1,950,000. The unraced mare, sold as a broodmare prospect, is out of East of the Moon (Private Account), winner of the G1 Prix de Diane, G1 Dubai Poule d'Essai des Pouliches and G1 Prix du Haras de Fresnay-Le-Buffard; her second dam is the six-time champion Miesque, who captured the GI Breeders' Cup Mile twice

and is also the dam of Kingmambo and Miesque's Son. "You have to like what you see, and you can see what you read. It is a great family," said Alain Wertheimer. **Storm Cat Season Sells for Red Cross...** At the conclusion of yesterday's session, a season to Storm Cat, donated to the American Red Cross by owner W.T. Young and Overbrook Farm, was purchased for \$450,000 by Kenny Trout and WinStar Farm. "Mr. Young and Overbrook Farm will make a decision on where the proceeds from the sale will go," said Paul B. Hay, executive director of the American Red Cross. "It is the policy of the American Red Cross to allow the donors to earmark those kinds of funds. Certainly, they will have the potential to donate the funds to the Relief Efforts that were established after the tragedy of Sept. 11, but it will be up to them to designate where they would like the funds to go." He added, "We do want to publicly thank both Mr. Young for making the donation and Keeneland for placing the season on the auction today. We are truly thankful to both of them for their generosity."

“New” Kid on the Block

Klaus Jacob's Newsells Park Stud made a splash at last year's November Sale, acquiring 11 horses for \$5,012,000, including \$1.8 million purchase Mousse Glacee (Fr). Newsells easily eclipsed those figures during yesterday's opening session. After signing tickets on a total of 20 horses and accounting for gross receipts of nearly \$9.4 million, Jacobs was the leading buyer on opening day.

A Swiss national, Jacobs is part of the family which founded the German coffee company which carried their name. The company is now part of the Kraft Foods conglomerate. He purchased Newsells from Isaam Fares at the beginning of 2000, and is also the owner of Gestut Fahrhof near Hamburg, which races GI Arlington Million winner Silvano (Ger). Their focus at this year's sale was on building the broodmare band at Newsells, according to Andreas Jacobs, son of the owner.

“We came here looking to buy black-type broodmares in foal to good, quality stallions,” he said, adding that little consideration was given to staying at home, given the ongoing terrorist threat. “Our emotions are down to a certain extent, but we have a plan and that plan is to build a nice stud.”

In addition to \$2.4 million purchase Volvoretta (GB), who sold in foal to Giant's Causeway, and \$2.1 million buy Snow Polina, carrying a Danzig foal, they also bought stakes winner and GISP She's Classy (Boundary) in foal to Saint Ballado for \$525,000, French Group 3 winner Tamise (Time For A Change) in foal to Giant's Causeway for \$500,000 and Peruvian champion and U.S. graded-stakes winner Natalie Too (Irish River {Fr}) in foal to Montjeu (Ire) for \$490,000.

Newsells, counseled by Robert Acton, former adviser to Sheikh Mohammed, will continue to be active at the upcoming mixed sale at Tattersalls.

Roger That

Roger Devenport knows a thing or two about successful weanling purchases. The resident of Lexington was at Keeneland three years ago and, after going to a bid of \$230,000, took home a gray filly by then first-crop sire Unbridled's Song, a filly he named Unbridled Elaine. Just nine days after the latter's come-from-behind win in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, Devenport was back at Keeneland and left with two more weanling fillies he hopes will continue his good luck.

“You have to be lucky in this game, you have to follow your gut,” he said of his two purchases, hip 96 by first-year weanling sire Forestry, and hip 101, by Saint Ballado. A 15-year veteran of the Thoroughbred game, Devenport got his start racing quarter horses in Wisconsin and campaigned a “Quarter Horse of the Year” in the late 1970s. He is proud of the fact that he chooses horses on his own, relying solely on his trained eye and experience and not on the opinions of others.

“I like to look and see what the sire did on the track,” he explained, “but the mother to me is more important than the sire, way more important. You don't see a good individual without a good mother.”

What They're Saying

Will Farish, Lane's End: “Well, after that [selling the \$4 million session topper], I feel a little better than I did before. It was a tough sale. Maybe we are going to have to reevaluate some of our sales strategy. I just think that a lot of them didn't bring as much as we thought they would. I don't know if people are being a lot more selective or what, but I just think that the market is a little bit softer than it has been.”

Dan Rosenberg, Three Chimneys Farm: “We had a fantastic sale. We sold one mare for \$2.1 million and another for \$2.4 million, and we had 13 sell from 14 through the ring. Everything far exceeded our expectations. As far as the rest of the sale, I am not a good prognosticator, but the buyers seem to gravitate to the good horses and these horses sell for a lot of money. The rest seem a bit shallow.”

Emmanuel de Seroux, Narvick International: “I think that the market today was very strong. The good horses sold very well, but I thought the middle market was difficult. I think it is readjusting at the moment. The next two or three days will be a repeat of today, but the rest of the sale will be very tough. Once all of the big buyers leave later this week, I think it will become even harder.”

MINARDI TO WALMAC Minardi (Boundary--Yarn, by Mr. Prospector), the champion two-year-old in England and Ireland last year, has been retired and will enter stud at Walmac Int'l in Lexington, Kentucky next year, Walmac owner John T. L. Jones, Jr. announced yesterday. The three-year-old won two of his three starts as a juvenile, taking the G1 Heinz 57 Phoenix S. by five lengths before ending the season with a 1 1/2-length tally in the G1 Middle Park S. He was the high-weighted two-year-old on the International Classification at 123 pounds. The dark bay, who sold for \$1,650,000 as Keeneland September yearling, was also third in this year's G1 Irish 2000 Guineas. Overall, Minardi had two wins, a second and a third from his eight career starts for earnings of \$290,500. A half-brother to the dam of Johannesburg and Tale of the Cat, he is out of a half-sister to Pulpit. "Walmac is very pleased to have a representative of this successful family added to our stallion roster," Jones said. Minardi will stand for a fee of \$12,500.

NEXT STOP FOR TIZNOW: UNKNOWN Two-time Breeders' Cup Classic winner **Tiznow** (Cee's Tizzy) will not be running in the Nov. 23 GII Clark H. at Churchill Downs, according to Michael Cooper, majority owner of the 2000 Horse of the Year. "Nobody ever asked me about it," Cooper told *The Blood-Horse*. "I think somebody caught [trainer] Jay [Robbins] off guard and asked him about the possibility of running, and he just said it was possible. The horse's feet got destroyed over that track last year; it was stone hard. If he's going to race again next year, I certainly don't want him starting the year off with bruised feet." He added, "If Tiznow and Lido Palace (Chi) are to meet, it'll probably be in the G1 Dubai World Cup. We did mention the possibility of running in the GI Hollywood Turf Cup [Dec. 1], but that would be just an experiment." Plans for the four-year-old champion have not been finalized and no firm decision has been made whether the colt will race again next year. "I'm going to Kentucky Friday to talk to some people. There are six or seven farms interested in him, and several of the people I have a lot of respect for," Cooper said. "On one hand, I'd still love to win the GI Hollywood Gold Cup and GI Pacific Classic, but there's also something to be said for going out a win-

ner."

Just five weeks after Gerald Leigh's Gossamer had put up a very impressive display to win the G1 Meon Valley Stud Fillies' Mile, the same owner was again looking forward to next year's Classics after his Act One had confirmed his potential by winning the G1 Criterium International.

Any breeder would be proud to have produced Group 1 winners of the calibre of Act One and Gossamer in a single crop, but Leigh's achievement looks even more spectacular and praiseworthy when I point out that his Eydon Hall Farm produced only 10 foals in 1999.

The lesson to be learned is that Leigh is reaping the rewards of concentrating heavily on quality, rather than quantity. Those 10 foals, all by proven stallions, included four by the great Sadler's Wells and others by Rainbow Quest, Nashwan, Kris S., Machiavellian and In The Wings.

Arguably of even greater significance is the fact that the Eydon Hall broodmares had almost invariably shown high-level ability on the track. Leigh started the 1998 breeding season with only 14 mares (one owned in partnership), but as many as seven of them were Group winners and 11 of the 14 were black-type performers. Even though the Eydon Hall broodmare band has since grown to 22, scrupulous quality control still applies, with 10 of the 22 having won at Group level.

As I detailed after Gossamer's Group 1 win, Leigh landed a major coup in 1989 when he bought the Group-winning Korveya after she had failed to reach her reserve at Keeneland. In next to no time, the mare was represented by the Classic-winning colts Hector Protector and Shanghai, and Leigh sold Hector Protector's yearling sister--later to win three Group 1s as Bosra Sham--for a sale-topping 530,000 guineas at the 1994 Houghton Sale.

Leigh decided to reinvest some of his profits at Deauville a couple of months later, where Korveya's Group-winning half-sister Proskona was being culled from the Niarchos family's Haras de Fresnay le Buffard. Proskona, a daughter of Mr. Prospector, had been a very good racemare, winning five times from six-to-seven furlongs in 1984 to earn a very high Timeform rating of 127.

Unfortunately, Proskona had proved less effective as a broodmare, failing to produce a black-type performer during the intervening 10 years, and Leigh's adviser Alexandra Scrope was able to buy her for the equivalent of around 92,000 guineas. Leigh had already invested in this branch of the family in 1992, when Proskona's daughter Noesis was represented at the Deauville sales by a yearling filly by Baillamont. Even though the triumphs of Hector Protector and Shanghai were still very fresh in everyone's mind, this filly cost the equivalent of less than 7,000 guineas.

Both buys have paid dividends, largely with the help of Nijinsky's son Caerleon. Proskona's three-year-old Caerleon filly Calista won two Listed races over a mile in France this year before failing by just a head to catch Love N' Kiss S. in the GIII Pebbles H. on her American debut last month.

Proskona's cheaply bought granddaughter, named Summer Sonnet, was Listed-placed over 1 1/4 miles and has made a tremendous start as a broodmare. Act One is her third foal, following two good Caerleon fillies in Summer Solstice, a Listed winner at around 1 1/2 miles in France, and Summer Symphony, who was second in last year's G3 Prestige S. and G1 Fillies' Mile.

Insights cont.

Act One's dam is by Baillamont, a triple Group 1 winner by Blushing Groom. It is easy to see why Summer Sonnet was sent to Caerleon, who had three Group winners from 20 foals out of Blushing Groom mares, but the choice of In The Wings is less obvious. His sire Sadler's Wells has a distinctly ordinary record with daughters of Blushing Groom (I may have to revise that statement after Blush With Pride's daughter Maryinsky gets a chance to tackle more than a mile next year).

In The Wings has also failed to shine so far with his small number of foals out of Blushing Groom mares. It must be stressed, though, that mares by sons of Blushing Groom are a different proposition to mares by Blushing Groom himself, because the mares which produced the sons also exert their influence.

Perhaps In The Wings was chosen simply because, at his 1998 fee of IR£15,000, he represented very good value for a horse whose 1997 representatives had included the top-class Singpiel and the juvenile Group winners Central Park and Thief of Hearts. In The Wings's continued success--six Group winners in 2001--has led to his fee rising to 25,000 Euros (which is approximately IR£19,700 or \$22,400). He's well worth the extra, though, because he is one of the rare stal-

lions capable of getting 5 percent Group winners.
