BBC WORLDWIDE SECURES INTERNATIONAL RIGHTS

BBC Worldwide Limited, the main commercial arm of the British Broadcasting Corporation (BBC), will handle the non-betting international broadcast distribution rights for all race meetings held at the 49 British racecourses contracted to *attheraces*, it was announced yesterday. BBC Worldwide and *attheraces* concluded the deal yesterday, with immediate effect as a two-year agreement. The rights include all of Channel Four's races such as the Cheltenham Festival and the five British classics. BBC Worldwide already distributes major race meetings such as the Grand National, Royal Ascot, the Epsom Derby and Glorious Goodwood, exporting them to more than 140 countries and territories around the world. BBC Worldwide's Sport Sales Manager, Richard Hornsby-Smith, said yesterday, "Securing the contract in a competitive pitch against other rival sports distribution agencies is a major coup for BBC Worldwide. Adding such prestigious sporting events to our portfolio is vital in a market that is developing rapidly into other formats. We are looking forward to working with *attheraces* to distribute programming around the world, and working to complement their Internet and Interactive activities." Glyn Williams, Commercial Director of *attheraces* added: "The pitch process involved five strong contenders, with BBC Worldwide Ltd. appointed because of its thorough understanding of the product and the opportunities. Its track record within broadcast distribution, coupled with its multi-national brand and expertise, form a sound basis for a fruitful relationship." Under the terms of the new agreement, *attheraces* will retain the international TV betting rights to British racing.

PROUDWINGS FOR ANOTHER FIRST

Proudwings (Ger) (Dashing Blade {GB}) will become the first German-trained filly to run in the Hong Kong International Races at Sha Tin Dec. 16. The Ralf Suerland-trained five-year-old, who became the first German-bred horse to win a Group race in Britain when she won the G2 Falmouth S. at Newmarket July 11, will race for the final time in the G1 International Mile before being retired to stud. Having won the G1 Prix Jacques Le Marois at Deauville Aug. 19, she was disqualified for interference in the closing stages and placed last. She later ran seventh in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot Sept. 29. Owner/breeder Dr Rolf Wilhems said: "She was not herself at Ascot. [jockey] Yutake Take said he was having to work on her after only 400 metres and she could never get into the race. It just wasn't her, but she is completely over her nettle rash now, and she has just left to go to Japan for the Capital S. over 1600 metres in Tokyo on Japan Cup day. It is a prep race for Hong Kong. We don't know her limits, but she has won very well on fast ground at

Dusseldorf and I don't think she will have any trouble on it. Yutake Take will take the ride again and I'm looking forward to the race."

BAFFERT MORPHINE CASE THROWN OUT A federal judge in Los Angeles dismissed the California Horse Racing Board's ruling against trainer Bob Baffert, according to *The Blood-Horse*. The board had suspended Baffert for 60 days when Nautical Look tested positive for morphine after a May, 2000 race at Hollywood Park. In a 29-page decision, Judge Dickran Tevrizian ruled that Truesdail Laboratories threw away the horse's blood sample. "There is no way to tell if the urine sample was flawed or accurate without the blood and the blood was thrown away on two different occasions intentionally, which was a violation of the due process clause of the 14th Amendment," Tevrizian wrote. The decision could impact several other CHRFB drug-positive cases, including a similar ruling against trainer Bobby Frankel.

She was buried in the infield at Hollywood Park, where she had won her first two races. Trained by D. Wayne Lukas, Landaluce was later voted Champion Two-Year-Old Filly of 1982 over another undefeated filly, Princess Rooney.

As the runners flashed under the wire at the end of the GIII Valley Stream S. two days ago, they provided what could be the defining moment of Forest Wildcat's young stallion career. While everyone was already well aware that this son of Storm Cat has tremendous potential, it was still something of a revelation to see a filly by Forest Wildcat give six pounds and a thorough beating to two promising Storm Cat fillies out of Grade I-winning mares.

That Forest Wildcat filly, of course, was Forest Heiress, who has tasted defeat only once in five starts. That defeat came on the one occasion that Forest Heiress ventured as far as 6½ furlongs, in the GII Astarita S., and there must be a question about how far she will eventually stay. Her willingness to be rated in her latest win certainly improves her prospects, but she is a sister to Forest Heir, a fast three-year-old who gained the second of his stakes victories in the Crank It Up S. over five furlongs in June.

Forest Wildcat, too, had distinct stamina limitations. His history provides one of the most extraordinary rags-to-riches anecdotes of recent years. By the time he appeared at Fasig-Tipton's Midlantic sale as a four-year-old in December 1995, his record stood at only four wins from 13 starts, for earnings of just under \$50,000. Forest Heiress' owner-breeder, the

New Farm of Eb and Nancy Novak, was able to buy the son of Storm Cat for only \$57,000--a far cry from the \$325,000 he had cost at Ocala as a two-year-old.

Forest Wildcat had been off the track for much of 1995, but his new trainer, Ben Perkins Sr., quickly transformed him into a formidable sprinter. After winning his first start of 1996, Forest Wildcat carried bottom weight of 109 pounds to victory in the GIII Maryland Breeders' Cup H., leading throughout to equal the Pimlico track record of 1:09. By the time Forest Wildcat recorded his next stakes victory in the GIII Finger Lakes Breeders' Cup S., when he again led virtually throughout, Fred Seitz of Brookdale Farm had purchased a half-interest.

Seitz has never had cause to regret becoming involved with the horse. Forest Wildcat again equalled Pimlico's six-furlong track record, this time under a burden of 122 pounds, when he easily won the Ben Cohen S. and he produced another front-running victory in the Phoenix Breeders' Cup S., which improved his record for the year to five wins from seven starts. There was talk of Forest Wildcat finishing his career in the Breeders' Cup Sprint, but the race went by without him and he retired to Brookdale at a fee of \$10,000. It's a measure of how far he has come that his fee for next year is listed as private.

Pure, unadulterated speed was obviously Forest Wildcat's main asset, even though his sire was a GI winner over 8½ furlongs and his half-sister Queen Alexandra won three graded stakes over 1 1/8 miles. With a background like this, Forest Wildcat is bound to sire a proportion of winners which stay better than he did, the best example so far being the excellent turf filly Snow Dance, who has two graded victories over 1 1/8 miles. Snow Dance, though, is out of a mare by the Kentucky Derby hero Spectacular Bid, whereas Forest Heiress' dam Penniless Heiress is by Pentelicus, a specialist sprinter who equalled Arlington's 6½-furlong record as a six-year-old.

Forest Heiress' fourth dam, Stavroula, was a sister to the great Nashua, and her third dam, New Love, has numerous very successful descendants. In addition to becoming the dam of Determined King (GI American Derby), New Love produced two good broodmares to Distinctive. One, Distinctiveness, is the dam of Distinctly North, a tremendously fast English colt; and the other, Forest Heiress' second dam Royal Ties, did even better, numbering Louis Quatorze's dam On to Royalty among her three stakes winners.

Perhaps the incentive to send Penniless Heiress to Forest Wildcat was provided by the success enjoyed by Forest Wildcat's half-sister Queen Alexandra, a million-dollar earner by New Love's son Determined King. In other words, Queen Alexandra is by a son of New Love out of Victoria Beauty, whereas Forest Heiress is by a son of Victoria Beauty out of a grand-daughter of New Love.

The other incentive for pairing Forest Wildcat with a Pentelicus mare is that the mating represents the very popular Storm Cat--Mr. Prospector cross. Storm Cat has sired major winners from daughters of Mr. Prospector and Forty Niner, and his matings with mares by Fappiano, the sire of Pentelicus, have this year produced the GIII winner Batique and the GI-placed juvenile Magic Storm.

CORRECTION: Monday's *TDN* reported that the winner of the G1 Premio Roma, **Shibuni Falcon (GB)** (Polar Falcon--Shibuni {GB}, by Damister), had failed to win past the Listed level earlier in his career. In fact, the four-year-old won the G2 Premio Guido Berardelli as a two-year-old. We regret the error.
