### 720 ENTRIES FOR WORLD CUP CARD

Next year's Dubai World Cup card, scheduled for Mar. 23, has attracted a total of 720 entries from 22 countries. The seven-race program is worth \$15,250,000 and will be headlined by the \$6 million G1 Dubai World Cup. There are 300 American entries, 157 from the United Arab Emirates and 62 from Great Britain. "With what has occurred throughout the world over the last few months, we are absolutely thrilled at what we have received and proud of the way the international racing community has unified to ensure the sport continues to expand in the Emirates and around the world," said Les Benton, chairman of the World Cup committee. Among the World Cup nominees are Arc winner **Sakhee** (Bahri), Melbourne Cup winner **Ethereal (NZ)** (Rhythm), champion **Sunline (NZ)** (Desert Sun {GB}) and multiple Grade I winner **Lido Palace (Chi)** (Rich Man's Gold). Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner **Johannesburg** (Hennessy) has been nominated to the G2 UAE Derby, as has the Bob Baffert-trained **Officer** (Bertrando). Breeders' Cup Sprint first and second **Squirtle Squirt** (Marquetry) and **Xtra Heat** (Dixieland Heat) have been nominated to the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen, along with the race's defending champion **Caller One** (Phone Trick).

### DARE AND GO DEAD

**Dare and Go** (Alydar), who gained fame by snapping Cigar's 16-race win streak in the 1996 GI Pacific Classic, died Monday in Queensland, Australia, *Thoroughbred Times* reported. The 10-year-old stallion, standing his first Southern Hemisphere season at Vantana Farm, suffered a ruptured stomach on Sunday night and died the next morning. He was scheduled to stand the 2002 Northern Hemisphere season at Pin Oak Lane in Pennsylvania. Dare and Go sired stakes winners **First Spear**, **Ronnie's Hot Rod** and **Daring Pegasus**.

### BEAUTIFUL PLEASURE TO THUNDER GULCH

Recently retired **Beautiful Pleasure** (Maudlin--Beautiful Bid, by Baldski) will be bred to GI Kentucky Derby winner **Thunder Gulch** (Gulch) in 2002. The nine-year-old stallion is the sire of 2001 GI Preakness and GI Belmont S. hero **Point Given** and 2000 GI Breeders' Cup Distaff winner **Spain**. The six-year-old **Beautiful Pleasure** won six Grade I stakes in her career and earned \$2,734,078. She was named champion older mare in 1999.

### GOFFS NOVEMBER UNDER WAY

Goffs Ireland kicked off their November Sale yesterday with lot 186, a weanling colt by **Foxhound** out of **Clairification (Ire)** (**Shernazar {Ire}**), achieving session-topper status at Ir£27,000. The bay was bought by **Lynn Lodge Stud** from the consignment of **Egmont Stud** and is out of a half sister to 1998 G3 Futurity S. winner **St Clair Ridge (Ire)**. A filly from the first crop of 1998 Irish champion juvenile **Orpen (Lure)** brought a final bid of Ir£25,000 to be the second highest-priced lot in the opening session. Out of **Guana Bay (GB)** (**Cadeaux Genereux {GB}**), the bay filly hails from the female family of champion sire **Prince Sabo (GB)** and was purchased from the consignment of **Whiteoaks Stud** by **Equine Associates**. Selling continues with the second of four foals sessions this morning at 10 a.m.

**YORK WINS BEST RACECOURSE AGAIN**

York racecourse was celebrating yesterday after being named Racecourse of the Year for the fifth time. Boasting a total attendance of more than 265,000 last season, York's knavesmire was also the scene for two of the season's highlights in **Sakhee (USA)** (Bahri {USA}) winning the G1 Juddmonte International S. Aug. 21 and **Mozart (Ire)** (Danehill {USA}) winning the G1 Nunthorpe S. Aug. 23 during its prestigious Ebor meeting. York's clerk of the course John Smith told *PA Sport* yesterday: "It's a tribute to the contribution of everyone connected with York that we have won the award. We are absolutely thrilled to receive the accolade from the Racegoers Club for the second time in five years. It's marvelous. It's followed on from the inaugural Racehorse Owners' award we received last year. Peoples' expectations of facilities are going up and up and, while it will always be the number one objective to attract the highest quality racehorses, we have got to have the facilities to go with it."

**KAAPSTAD COLT TOPS READY-TO-RUN SALE**

A colt by champion sire Kaapstad (NZ) brought a final bid of NZ\$240,000 to top the Select portion of New Zealand Bloodstock's Ready-To-Run Sale of Two-Year-Olds held Monday and Tuesday in Auckland. The bay is the first foal of Dellewood (NZ) (Touching Wood {USA}), herself a daughter of Wandelle (NZ) (Wandering Eyes {GB}), a Group 3 winner in Australia. Consigned to the sale by Fletcher Farm, the colt, who breezed 200 meters in 10.5 seconds in advance of the sale, was purchased by New Zealand Bloodstock on behalf of Asian clients. Four horses were purchased for \$220,000, including hip number 13, an Australian-bred colt by Desert King (Ire). The November foal is out of Alcoban (Aus) (Noalcoholic {Fr}) and is a half to the dam of multiple Australian Group 1 winner Coco Cabanna. For the Select sessions, NZB reported sales on 183 horses for gross receipts of \$10,476,500 and an average of \$57,249. The sale concludes with a general session beginning this morning at 11 a.m.

### Val Royal & Nuclear Debate in Turf Festival:

Trainer Julio Canani confirmed yesterday that Breeders' Cup Mile winner **Val Royal (Fr)** (Royal Academy) will start next in Saturday's Gill Citation H. at Hollywood Park. "He worked a half-mile [in :49.40] at Santa Anita this morning," Canani said. "He will run in both the Citation and in Hong Kong [Mile, Dec. 16] next month." Also aiming for a Hollywood/Hong Kong double will be crack European sprinter **Nuclear Debate** (Geiger Counter), who will make his U.S. debut in Friday's Gill Hollywood Turf Express. The six-year-old gelding, who was recently purchased by trainer Darrell Vienna at England's Tattersalls October sale, is also expected to start in the Dec. 16 Hong Kong Sprint. Nuclear Debate will face **Swept Overboard** (End Sweep), fourth in the Breeders' Cup Sprint, in the Turf Express.

She went on to win four more Group 1 events in her career and was named High Weight in 1992 as a juvenile in Ireland, and 1994-95 as an older mare in Great Britain. Her second foal to race, three-year-old **Djebel Amour** (by Mt. Livermore), is slated to make her fifth lifetime appearance this afternoon in the sixth race on the Churchill Downs card, a mile allowance event. The \$360,000 Keeneland September yearling is two-for-three on the dirt and was a four-length winner in her most recent start, a Churchill allowance Nov. 2.

The weekend was a big one for owners New Farm and trainer Ben Perkins. Not only did their Forest Wildcat filly Forest Heiress, take the GIII Valley Stream S. on Sunday, but also on Saturday, the GII Mrs. Revere S. was taken by Snow Dance, another daughter of Forest Wildcat--in whom New Farm still have a major interest--and their crack sprinter, Delaware Township, ended his career with a win in the GI Frank J. De Francis Memorial Dash.

Delaware Township has enjoyed a real banner year in 2001, also winning the GI Forego H., GII Forest Hills H. and Damitrius S. Delaware Township is a son of veteran Florida standout Notebook. A descendent of Bold Ruler through Raja Baba and Well Decorated, Notebook was a versatile runner. At two, he won four of five starts, including a pair of New York-bred stakes over seven furlongs and nine furlongs, as well as the 8 1/2-furlong GII Brown & Williamson Jockey Club S. The following year, Notebook showed to better advantage over shorter distances, capturing the GIII Best Turn S. and the Joe Palmer S. over six furlongs and the Mike H. at a mile. Kept in training at four, Notebook won just once in six starts, taking the six-furlong Hollie Hughes H.

Standing at Ocala Stud Farm, Ocala, Florida, throughout his career, Notebook has been one of the stalwarts of the Florida stallion community. To date he has sired 29 stakes winners from his first nine crops, and in addition to Delaware Township, these include the ill-starred GI Acorn S. winner Three Ring, and other graded-stakes scorers Take Note of Me, Scratch Pad,

Delaware Township is the first starter for his dam, Sunny Mimosa, an unraced daughter of the Northern Dancer stallion Sunny North. Sunny Mimosa began her career in a distinctly unpromising fashion as, prior to Delaware Township, she produced an unraced filly by Dawn Quixote, and then slipped three years in succession. Since then, Sunny Mimosa has foaled Chicago Joe, a winning son of Unreal Zeal, the current two-year-old filly Cherry Hill Girl, by Tactical Advantage, and a brother to Delaware Township who realized \$115,000 at this year's Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July Yearling Sales. This year she foaled a colt by Valid Wager and was bred back to Cat Thief.

Delaware Township is the best horse to emerge from his family for some considerable time. Sunny Mimosa is half sister to three stakes winners, none of which ever earned graded black type. Two of these were by Fire Dancer, like Sunny Mimosa's sire Sunny North, a son of Northern Dancer, but the biggest winner has been the Silver Buck gelding Shower of Silver, an earner of almost \$250,000. Sunny Mimosa's granddam, Champagne Shower-by the Hail to Reason horse, Hail the Prince--won the Vallejo S., but she is the only stakes winner produced by Delaware Township's third or fourth dams. Further back, Delaware Township's fifth dam, Love, is also third dam of In Fijar, winner of the 1980 renewal of the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains.

In general terms, Notebook has had rather a modest record with Northern Dancer line mares. In fact to the end of last year, Delaware Township was the only one of his top 15 earners to be out of a mare from that line. He does, however, have another 2001 stakes winner out of a Sunny North mare, in the shape of Alice's Notebook, who has now earned \$247,000. Perhaps a key is that Sunny North is out of a mare by In Reality, who appears in at least seven of Notebook's stakes winners.

It is also interesting that Notebook has sired two graded-stakes winners out of mares carrying Damascus, among them his only other Grade 1 winner, Three Ring. Damascus was a grandson of the stallion Sunglow. Sunny North's granddam Double Sun is by Sunglow, and out of a mare by Sunglow's grandsire, Sun Teddy. So there is some background similarity between the pedigrees of Notebook's two Grade 1 winners.
