### STRONG START TO TATTERSALLS DECEMBER

The Tattersalls December Sales was off to a strong start in Newmarket yesterday as the one-day Yearlings section realized a record average of 16,967 guineas. The figure rose 15 percent from a year ago and 13 percent from the previous mark, set in 1998. The median was up even more sharply, rising 29 percent to 9,000gns. The day's top-selling lot was hip 141, a son of first-crop sire King Of Kings (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) out of Honor To Her (Sir Ivor), who was purchased for 105,000gns by C. Gordon-Watson Bloodstock. The bay, from the Trickle-down Stud consignment, is a half brother to French Group winner and U.S. stakes winner Savannah's Honor and French Listed winner and Group-placed Anna's Honor. A \$70,000 Keeneland November weanling, he was RNA'ed at \$100,000 at Keeneland September. The colt, offered yesterday for an American-based Irish syndicate, was purchased on behalf of a new client of Newmarket trainer Ed Dunlop's Gainsborough Stables. "I like the sire--Ed has quite a few by King Of Kings--and it is also a good dam line," Gordon-Watson said. "I thought we would have to pay a bit more for him." A French-bred colt by In The Wings (GB), who brought 90,000gns as the day's third-highest priced lot, will be resold during the Dec. 14 Piaget Hong Kong International Sale. Consigned by Voute Sales, agent, he was bought by John McCormack, agent for the Hong Kong Jockey Club. "I buy a few for the sale every year along with Adrian Nicoll," McCormack said. "He is by a proper sire and has a bit of page to him." The Tattersalls December Sales continue tomorrow with a four-day Foals section beginning at 3 p.m.

## HKJC DECRIES HILL'S HONG KONG ACTION

Despite condemnation from the Hong Kong Jockey Club, William Hill bookmakers announced a positive response to Sunday's launching of a new fixed odds betting service on Hong Kong racing. David Hood, head of public relations at William Hill, commented: "With the globalisation of both horse racing and the betting industry in recent years, an increasing demand has been placed upon us to supply a greater range of international products and Hong Kong racing sits nicely beside the services for Dubai we established earlier this year." William Hill's offering includes fixed odds for every race from Hong Kong this year, as well as putting up two or three early price races each day. However, the HKJC yesterday reacted to the move as the latest in a series of "aggressive and well-funded attacks on Hong Kong betting revenues," stating that they, "paint a clear picture as to why Hong Kong must move quickly to amend the existing Gambling Ordinance." That ordinance, which the HKJC says has "grey areas," which, "are being exploited by these and other operators to the detriment of the Hong Kong community." They are calling for the enactment of the Gambling (Amendment) Bill 2000 which will eradicate "unlimited, unregulated and uncontrolled gambling," and therefore discourage "crime and social problems often associated with this form of gambling." The statement went on: "Last year, the Hong Kong Jockey Club contributed more than HK\$1 billion to Hong Kong charities and good causes, and some 10 percent of all Hong Kong tax revenues. Illegal and unauthorised offshore bookmakers contributed nothing to the community and they siphoned off betting dollars that would have otherwise generated valuable community assets through the regulated pool. During a time of economic downturn, Hong Kong must do whatever is required to protect its community assets. The revenue generated by regulated gambling supports many charitable activities while helping to preserve Hong Kong's low tax rates. This resource is at risk." Hood responded: "At this time, we have no intention of offering Tote prices or the exotic bets and we have a maximum win limit of £100,000 per client/per day, so it is unlikely to impact upon the HKJC turnover. We are merely responding to the demands of some of our European-based clients, who own horses in Hong Kong but have no access to the pools and want a small interest in their runners."

## GODOLPHIN SENDS THREE TO HONG KONG

Godolphin yesterday outlined its contenders for the Hong Kong Invitational Series at Sha Tin Dec. 16. Multiple Group 1 winners **Slickly (Fr)** (Linamix {Fr}) and **Kutub (Ire)** (In The Wings {GB}) will miss the meeting, however, a three-pronged Godolphin attack will be led by **Tobougg (Ire)** (Barathea {Ire}) in the G1 Hong Kong Cup. The three-year-old was third in the G1 Epsom Derby and fourth in the G1 Eclipse S., before finishing runner-up to Nayef (USA) in the Oct. 20 G1 Dubai Champion S. at Newmarket. He will be joined at Sha Tin by **Ekraar (USA)** (Red Ransom {USA}), who heads for the G1 Hong Kong Vase and **China Visit (USA)** (Red Ransom {USA}) who will race in the G1 Hong Kong Mile.

**MUTAFWEQ RETIRED** **Mutafaweq (USA)** (Silver Hawk {USA}--The Caretaker {Ire}, by Caerleon {USA}) has been retired from racing and will stand his first season at stud at Wood Farm Stud in Shropshire, England, according to *Racing Post*. The five-year-old stallion won the 1999 English St Leger, as well as the 2000 G1 Deutschland Preis and G1 Canadian International and 2001 G1 Coronation Cup. Mutafaweq will stand for £2,500. "It's very exciting to get such a good-looking horse who will appeal to all types of breeders," Bill Bromley, owner of Wood Farm Stud, told the *Racing Post*. "There is a shortage of first-season sires around in Britain this year and I think we've set him at a very favourable price for breeders."

As a racemare, Best In Show didn't quite live up to her ambitious name, winning nothing more important than the Comely S. in 27 appearances. Everyone, though, would agree that this daughter of Traffic Judge has thoroughly merited her title from the moment she made her debut at stud in 1969.

By 1982, Best In Show was being voted Broodmare of the Year, thanks to her daughter Blush With Pride, who won the Santa Susana S. and Kentucky Oaks to become her dam's fourth individual Group/Graded winner. Best In Show's award also no doubt reflected the achievements of Best In Show's unraced first foal, the Buckpasser mare Sex Appeal, who had already been represented by one champion, Try My Best, and was soon to be represented by another in El Gran Senor.

Move the story on nearly 20 years and Best In Show's family looks even more exceptional, thanks to the broodmare exploits of six of her 11 daughters. In addition to Sex Appeal and Blush With Pride, they included the fast Sir Ivor fillies Monroe and Minnie Hauk, their unraced sister Show Lady and the unraced Nijinsky filly Nijinsky's Best.

Nijinsky's Best bred the high-class turf horse Yagli, a winner of three Grade 1s in '99, while Show Lady is the second dam of the Australian Group 1 winners Hurricane Sky and Umatilla. Blush With Pride, for her part, has produced three Group/Graded winners and the best may yet be to come in the shape of her two-year-old Maryinsky. This Sadler's Wells filly raced like a future Classic performer when second in the G1 Fillies' Mile in September. Another member of this family went close to winning another of Europe's Group 1 juvenile contests when Castle Gandolfo--a colt out of a sister to El Gran Senor--was second in the Criterium de Saint-Cloud.

However, the two daughters I'm focusing on here are the sisters Monroe and Minnie Hauk. Monroe's greatest achievement has to be her Zafonic colt Xaar, who was rated Europe's best juvenile by a margin of eight pounds in 1997, but she also numbers the French Group 3 winner Diese among her three Group winners. Diese is keeping up the good work, her second foal being the high-class Nureyev horse Senure, a dual Grade 1 winner on turf this year. Diese's third foal, the fast Danzig horse Speak In Passing, has also done well this year and would have landed Friday's GIII Hollywood Turf Express H. except for Swept Overboard's late lunge to victory.

Minnie Hauk has contributed to the family's fame by producing two Group 1 winners to sons of Northern Dancer. To Sadler's Wells she produced Chief Contender, a good long-distance performer, and Aviance, a Northfields filly who easily won the G1 Heinz "57" Phoenix S. in 1984. Predictably for this family, Aviance immediately made a big impact as a broodmare, her first three daughters being the Private Account filly Chimes of Freedom, who won Group 1s at two and three; the Riverman mare Imperfect Circle, runner-up in the G1 Cheveley Park S.; and Chimes of Freedom's sister Piquetnol, second in the G1 Prix Marcel Bousac.

By a strange coincidence, the ex-European contenders for the GI Hollywood Derby included Denon, who had become the first son of Aviance to win a Group race when he took the G3 Prix de Fontainebleau in April, and Chimes of Freedom's son Aldebaran. The pair

The Hollywood Derby isn't the only indication that this branch of the Best In Show family is still going from strength to strength. Piquetno's Storm Cat filly Dietrich, a \$2,000,000 yearling purchase, has won two of Europe's leading five-furlong events this year and Imperfect Circle's son Spinning World is busily signaling that he is going to be every bit as effective as a stallion as he was as a racehorse--and he was very good indeed at around a mile.

Spinning World, who shares the same sire, Nureyev, as Senure, brought his career to a fitting climax when he won the 1997 GI Breeders' Cup Mile. He promptly took up residence at Ashford Stud, siring a first crop of over 120 foals. Even allowing for the size of this crop, he has made a very encouraging start, with 15 individual winners headed by the Group-winning Quad's Melody, the Listed winner Chan Chan and the very talented Tendulkar, who very nearly won the G1 Dewhurst S., Spinning World's interesting prospects also include King of Happiness, who won a lot of admirers when he made a winning debut in England in August, and Spinning Tales, who handled the dirt very well when he scored recently at Aqueduct.

By Ashford's standards, Spinning World wasn't in huge demand early this year, after his return from a season in Japan. His 84-mare book was less than half the size of some of his stud companions' totals, but you can be sure that he'll be extremely busy once again
