PIVOTAL START FOR TATTERSALLS FOALS

The Tattersalls December Foal Sales began with a brief and low-key session yesterday afternoon at which the top price of 36,000 guineas was paid for a January-born colt by Pivotal (GB)--Magical Veil (GB) (Majestic Light) offered by Witney Stud. Owner Andrew Christou, recent purchaser of Winterbeck Manor Stud near Grantham, bought the colt who will be trained in the name of Holistic Racing by Ian Balding and his son Andrew. "His configuration was superb and I feel that Pivotal is going to be a leading sire," said Christou. "I would look to have no more than 15 to 20 horses and quality is what I am looking for and will be after mares with good blood next week." Christou also bought Mozart's half-brother by Polish Precedent for 30,000 gns at the Houghton in October. The turnover, for just 48 lots sold, was predictably well down on last year's larger session while the average and median also failed to match the 2000 figures. The sale continues today, with a session beginning at 10 a.m. when prices should increase.

VAL ROYAL HEADS HONG KONG SELECTIONS

A total of 56 horses representing 10 different countries have been selected to participate in the 2001 Hong Kong International Races set for Sunday, December 16 at Sha Tin Racecourse. The group is headed by GI Breeders' Cup Mile hero **Val Royal (Fr)** (Royal Academy), who will take his shot in the GI Hong Kong Cup over 2000 meters. That event, the final in the Emirates World Series, has also attracted GI Arlington Million victor **Silvano (Ger)** (Lonitas (GB)) and **Jim And Tonic (Fr)** (Double Bed (Fr)), third to Fantastic Light in the 2000 renewal of the Cup. Those two combatants faced off in the GI Audemars Piguet Queen Elizabeth II Cup at Sha Tin in April, with Silvano getting the better of his fellow globe-trotter by 1 3/4 lengths. **Falvebn (Aus)** (Aannon (Aus)) and **Morlic** (Housebuster), one-two in the 2000 GI Hong Kong Sprint, should vie for favoritism along with **Nuclear Debate** (Geiger Counter) this time around. The multiple Group 1 winner, ninth as the 8-5 favorite a year ago when racing for trainer John Hammond, was purchased to race in the U.S. by conditioner Darrell Vienna and was fifth in the GI Hollywood Turf Sprint in his stateside bow last Friday. Arthur Appleton's **Forbidden Apple** (Pleasant Colony) carries the hopes of America in the GI Hong Kong Mile. The six-year-old, a solid fourth in the Cup a year ago, comes into this shorter event in sharp form for Christophe Clement, with a victory in the GI Kebo H. two back and a runner-up finish to Val Royal in the BC Mile. The home team could have its best shot in the Mile with **Electronic Unicorn** (Housebuster). Fifth in 2000, the five-year-old gelding comes into this year's race on the heels of a victory in the Chevalier Cup at Sha Tin last weekend. Also in with a good shot is the five-year-old mare **Proudwings (Ger)** (Dashing Blade (GB)), disqualified from a victory in the GI Prix Jacques Le Marois earlier this summer and winner over the past weekend of the Capital S. in Japan. **Dalapur (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) is back to defend his title in the GI Hong Kong Vase over 2400 meters. His chief competition should come in the form of G2 Dubai Sheema Classic winner **Stay Gold (Jpn)** (Sunday Silence). The seven-year-old prepped with a fourth-place effort in last

DARLEY JOINT-PRESIDENT OF JAGB

CLARKE GETS YARMOUTH

Sir Stanley Clarke's Northern Racing Limited company has reached a deal to run Yarmouth racecourse for the next 125 years, it was revealed yesterday. Clarke, who also runs Bath, Hereford, Newcastle, Sedgefield, Uttoxeter and Brighton, said yesterday, "Great Yarmouth has a bit of magic about it and can re-establish its position as an important visitor attraction and an improving asset to the resort. It will benefit from being part of a larger racing group."

MEDICAN RELAXING INTO NEW HOME

Medican (GB) (Machiavellian (USA)), winner of the G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown July 7, has settled in well to his new surroundings at Cheveley Park Stud in Newmarket. The four-year-old, who also took the G1 Lockinge S. at Newbury May 19 and G2 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot June 19, may cover Cheveley Park's own filly Regal Rose (GB) (Danehill (USA)), winner of the G1 Cheveley Park S. at Newmarket last September before being retired in August. "She has been pencilled in, but we haven't confirmed our nominations yet and he needs a certain number of older mares in his first season," Cheveley's Julian Dollar said yesterday. "Fortunately we have a very high class of broodmare and he will cover some nice mares of ours. We have had plenty of interest and we are delighted - he is not full yet, but he will be." Allen and Audrey Murray's Murrur Farm in Darlington, Maryland, next season. A multiple Grade I performer, second-crop sire Our Emblem rebcoates from Clabome Farm in Kentucky and will stand the 2002 season for \$4,000. A full brother to Miner's Mark and Traditionally and a half to My Flag, the dark bay is the sire of **Uncle Punk**, winner this season of the Inaugural S. at Arapahoe Park. He is represented by 21 winners and his progeny have earned \$758,080 to date. Disco Rico was retired after fracturing his left front leg when winning the Oct. 27 Lite the Fuse S. at Laurel, one of five stakes wins this season. The four-year-old won the GIII Jersey Shore Breeders' Cup in 2000 and the GIII Maryland Breeders' Cup this year. He will also command a fee of \$4,000.
