DESERT KING COLT TOPS TATTS DAY TWO

A son of Coolmore sire Desert King (Ire) (Danehill) topped day two of the Tattersalls December Foal Sales yesterday in Newmarket, when he was bought for 65,000gns from Charlie Mason's Silfield Bloodstock, who purchased the colt in utero for 22,000gns at Tattersalls 12 months ago. Pinhooker Eddie O'Leary of Lynn Lodge Stud, using the services of agent Margaret O'Toole, outbid Peter Doyle for the colt. "He will be coming back to a sale somewhere next year and I liked his action and his pedigree," said O'Leary. "I love Desert King. I think he is starting off as Danehill did. All his runners look very honest." Juliet Minton and her father Richard Milner's Mill House Stud in Shropshire enjoyed a first venture into the Flat foal market, selling a colt by champion first-season sire Royal Applause (GB) to an overseas-based cash buyer for 50,000gns. Earlier, another cash buyer paid 45,000gns for a Royal Applause colt consigned from Theobalds Stud in Hertfordshire, owned by singer George Michael's father Jack Panos. A Foxhound half brother to recent U.S. stakes winner La Martina will be re-consigned from Ciaran Conroy's Glenvale Stud after being bought through agent Peter Doyle for 45,000gns. "I'm a fan of Foxhound--he's sired about 17 two-year-old winners in America this year and had Mount Abu (Ire) [winner of the G1 Prix de la Foret] over here as well," said Doyle.

2002 GRADED STAKES SET BY COMMITTEE

The American Graded Stakes Committee of the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association announced its listing of 486 graded stakes for 2002 yesterday. That number was an increase of nine races over last year. The number of Grade I stakes remained the same at 101, but four changes within the group were made. Upgraded to Grade I status were the Wood Memorial [3yo, 9f] at Aqueduct, the Shadwell Keeneland Turf Mile [3yo/up, 8fT], the Stephen Foster H. [3yo/up, 9f] at Churchill and the Humana Distaff [3yo/up, f/m, 7f] at Churchill. The Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga [3yo, 9f], which was upgraded to top status only last year, was one of the downgrades this year. Also downgraded were the Oak Leaf S. [2yo, f, 8f] at Santa Anita, the Super Derby [3yo, 10f] at Louisiana Downs and the Swaps S. [3yo, 9f] at Hollywood. The Gulfstream Park H. [3yo/up, 10f] is scheduled for a downgrade in 2003. Thirteen races gained graded status for 2002, while three races lost graded status for 2002 and two more were scheduled for downgrade in 2003. Of the graded races, 20.8 percent are Grade I, 31.9 percent are Grade II and 47.3 percent are Grade III. *For a complete listing of grade changes, see p. 2.*

MUTAMAM SALE VOIDED The sale of GI Canadian International winner **Mutamam (GB)** (Darshaan {GB}) has been voided due to an infection which was discovered upon his return to Britain from his Breeders' Cup engagement. Plans for the six-year-old to be sold to The National Stud by Sheikh Hamdan were called off when the dark bay was diagnosed with a Klebsiella infection during a final veterinary examination. The horse will remain the property of Shadwell Estate Company Limited and will stand at The National Stud as planned. Mutamam is expected to recover fully in time for the 2002 breeding season. His stud fee for next year has been set at £6,000.

HILLS GOING FULL MONTY

British bookmakers William Hill, operators of the country's biggest telephone betting business, are set to create more than 200 new jobs when they open a new call centre in the 'Full Monty' city of Sheffield next January. The company already employs over 500 telephonists in two centres located at their Leeds headquarters. Since the UK Government's implementation of a Gross Profit Tax on betting became effective Oct. 6, the UK is set to become one of the global leaders in betting and Hills are expanding their international telephone business. Representative David Hood said, "It is equipped with state of the art technology, ensuring the operators will be at the heart of all the best sporting action from around the world. One of the factors that influenced our decision to locate in Sheffield was the support the company has received from the City's Inward Investment agency, 'Sheffield First for Investment' and, in particular, its innovative JOBMatch service." Peter Moore, leader of Sheffield City Council, added, "This is fantastic. This is a great vote of confidence in the skills Sheffield has to offer and I am delighted that the Sheffield First for Investment and JOBMatch initiatives, in partnership with Yorkshire Forward, are proving so successful."

DUNLOP/TEBBUTT WIN APPEAL

Trainer Ed Dunlop and jockey Michael Tebbutt successfully appealed against a fine and suspension, originally meted out by Nottingham's stewards, at the Jockey Club's Portman Square headquarters in London yesterday. The original £2,000 fine imposed upon Dunlop for a breach of Rule 155(ii) was quashed as was Tebbutt's 10-day riding suspension for falling foul of Rule 158, both rules covering the failure to give adequate instructions and obtaining the best possible placing for Answered Promise (Fr) (Highest Honor {Fr}) in the Annual Members Maiden S. at Nottingham Nov. 5. Answered Promise's 40-day suspension was also overturned.

WRITERS UP

TIMING RIGHT FOR JAPAN'S RISING SONS

As the local folk down in this corner of the globe say in their colourful vernacular: "They don't call Australia the 'Lucky Country' for nothing." Though the sentiment is far from grammatically correct, generally speaking it is appropriate as well as being accurate. The inhabitants of this vast continent want for very little in regard to everyday essentials, invariably getting to pick and choose top quality goods as they so wish. Even the odd items domestic suppliers are unable to provide can be readily accessed through traditional trading links with Britain/Europe, thanks to a growing affinity shared with the people of America, or by virtue of this blessed land's close proximity to Asia.

It's the very same story with the Thoroughbred industry, really. Which other Thoroughbred breeding and racing region gets to produce its annual foal crop by not only utilising its own pool of quality entires, but also the services of the best credentialed young stallions in the world? For well over a decade now, Australian and New Zealand broodmare owners have been able to send their breeding stock to the leading stud prospects of England and Ireland and France and the United States and, significantly, Japan, due to the simple fact that they are located in another hemisphere with a different covering period.

The availability of visiting stallions from Japan has been a much more recent development and one generating considerably less volume than the more established means. Just over a dozen or so animals owned by Japanese interests have journeyed down to Australasia during the past handful of years, though not all necessarily for the same reasons. The much loved Beau Zam (NZ) (Zamzaan {NZ}), for instance, returned home to New Zealand for his final fling at stud, while Hector Protector (USA) (Woodman {USA}) visited after basically being found surplus to requirements. There have also been sire-sons of the sensational Sunday Silence (USA) (Halo {USA}) afforded the opportunity to spread the phenomenal work of their prodigious forebear further afield, and others still lent out for reasons a little less obvious. Whatever the agenda, the potential benefits of this fledgling arrangement might not have been fully evident at the time but have since become clearly apparent.

At the 2001 VRC Melbourne Cup Carnival, the showpiece of Australasian thoroughbred racing staged at the expansive Flemington racetrack a few weeks ago, the forerunners of this movement captured some of the biggest headlines. First-crop runners of this select group

of stallions left their mark in almost all forms of competition and in each different age category, with a daughter of one particular sire even realising the Antipodean breeder-owner's dream: success in the race that stops a nation. Ethereal's courageous victory in the 3200-metre VRC Melbourne Cup was notable for a whole host of reasons, not least the fact that she was one of 68 live foals produced from Rhythm (USA) (Mr. Prospector {USA})'s first season at stud in New Zealand. The 1989 Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner was recruited by Cambridge Stud in 1996 after having begun his Japanese stud stint four years prior. Though Rhythm made little impact in Japan, the Group 1 deeds of Ethereal at the very least represents some vindication for the support (90 mares in 1996, 76 in '97, 87 in '98 and 51 in '99) the stallion received during his four southern hemisphere breeding seasons in the Shakey Isles.

The result of the Group 1 VRC Victoria Derby was similarly sculptured and is of no less relevance. The winner, Amalfi (NZ), and fourth horse home, Sircarn Damon (NZ), are first-crop sons of the Arc winner Carnegie (Ire) (Sadler's Wells {USA}), while the third placegetter, Pentastic (NZ), was conceived during the first season the former top-class British stayer Pentire (GB) (Be My Guest {USA}) ventured to these parts. Shuttled to New Zealand (the former for three consecutive seasons, the latter for four) from their permanent base in Japan, neither could have been expected to do much more than have representatives of their oldest local crop figure so prominently in the first Group 1 Derby conducted for the generation.

Maybe just as significant as these aforementioned achievements was the Listed stakes victory of Flashed in a 2-year-old fillies event run over 1000 metres for the more precocious members of the age group. This naturally gifted juvenile is a daughter of Fuji Kiseki (Jpn), a striking black son of Sunday Silence recognised as the very first Japanese-bred and -raced entire used on a dual hemisphere basis. The fact that Fuji Kiseki also produced the third placegetter in the very same black-type contest is not only a triumph for the Arrowfield Stud organisation which showed the foresight to negotiate such a ground-breaking deal, but also a very encouraging sign for the broodmare owners which sent their mares (105 in 1998, 55 in '99 and 64 in 2000) to be covered by this magnificently proportioned individual during his sojourns Down Under.

Needless to say, these events augur well for an Australasian thoroughbred industry now likely to accommodate an increasing number of Japanese-owned stallions during future southern hemisphere breeding seasons through the great good fortune of actually being the right place at the right time.

WEKIVA SPRINGS TO DOUBLE DIAMOND

FARM *Wekiva Springs* (Runaway Groom--Jetting Angel, by Tri Jet) will return to Double Diamond Farm, the Ocala, Florida farm where he was bred and raised, for the 2002 breeding season. The 10-year-old stallion won the 1996 GI Suburban H., GI Gulfstream Park H., GII Brooklyn H. and the 1995 GII San Fernando S. From his first two crops to race, *Wekiva Springs* has sired three stakes winners. "It's always nice to bring a quality stallion like *Wekiva Springs* to Florida," said Double Diamond Farm owner Don Dizney. "The timing for *Wekiva Springs* coming to Double Diamond is perfect. We succeeded in our goal of obtaining full books to him early and believe this gives him the best opportunity for success at stud." *Wekiva Springs* previously stood at Pin Oak Stud in Versailles, Kentucky.

Making his first start in the Northern Hemisphere, *Franbulo* posted an impressive late-running victory. The dark bay had captured the G1 GP Municipal de Vino del Mar in March and closed out his Chilean campaign with a 6 3/4-length victory in the G2 Clasico Pedro del Rio Talavera July 19. The newly turned five-year-old, unhurried early, was still seventh after three-quarters in 1:09 3/5, but unleashed a strong run up the center of the track to win going away.

ACT OF REFORM (c, 3, Lit de Justice--Bionic Soul {MSW & GSP, \$219,770}, by Bionic Light), a 1/2 to Grab N Go (Furiously), SW, \$126,000, remained unbeaten on dirt with this sharp effort. The bay colt won two of his five starts in England for Roger Charlton, with both victories coming over the all-weather, and he was repatriated following a win at Southwell last September. Second in the Robsphere S. over the Gulfstream lawn in March in his stateside bow, he followed that up with a third in Keeneland's Transylvania S. Apr. 6, but didn't make another appearance until Oct. 13, when fifth in the Franklin S. over the Keeneland turf. Eighth in an Aqueduct allowance Nov. 9, he was sent off at 7-1 in his first dirt try in the U.S. Never far back, he came three wide in the stretch and finished well to post a three-length success.
