ARLINGTON TO HOST 2002 BREEDERS' CUP

Ending weeks of speculation, Arlington Park in suburban Chicago was officially announced yesterday as host of the 19th renewal of the Breeders' Cup next Oct. 26. "We are particularly enthusiastic to come to Arlington Park for the first time," said D.G. Van Clief, Jr., president of Breeders' Cup Ltd. and vice chairman of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association. "Arlington is an outstanding, world-class facility renowned for hosting top-flight international competition and providing its fans with an excellent presentation of Thoroughbred racing." Arlington became a potential candidate to host the Cup earlier this year when the Oak Tree Association learned that construction at Santa Anita Park would prohibit it from hosting the event. But a series of legislative hurdles, including necessary funding from the state of Illinois to pay for up to 35,000 temporary seats, proved difficult to clear and as late as the end of October, Churchill Downs, the parent company of Arlington Park, offered itself or Hollywood Park as substitutes. In the end, the state pledged \$1 million in grants over two years, plus additional funds for tourism efforts. Arlington becomes the first new site to host the Breeders' Cup since Woodbine hosted for the first time in 1996. Said Arlington Park Chairman Richard L. Duchossois, "The announcement that the world's racing championship day is coming to the Chicago market and the state of Illinois is a proud moment in the history of Arlington Park and the Illinois racing industry."

SOVEREIGN AWARD FINALISTS ANNOUNCED

The three finalists in each of 15 categories for this year's Sovereign Awards were announced yesterday. Canada's champions will be crowned at the 27th annual Sovereign Awards Gala on Friday, Dec. 14 at the Four Seasons Hotel in Toronto. This year's nominees include last year's Canadian Horse of the Year **Quiet Resolve** (Affirmed), who is up for Top Older Turf Male; jockey Patrick Husbands and trainer Mark Frostad, both of whom were repeat winners last year; and Sam-Son Farms, which pocketed five trophies in 2000, including champion owner and breeder. *The complete listing of the finalists is on p4-5.*

VAL ROYAL OUT OF CUP

G1 Breeders' Cup Mile winner **Val Royal (Fr)** (Royal Academy) will not travel to Sha Tin for the G1 Hong Kong Cup after developing a minor quarter crack. "We discovered the quarter crack about two days ago, but it isn't serious," trainer Julio Canani told *The Blood-Horse*. "We'll give him about a week off and then start getting him ready for winter." **Saddle Up (Ind)** (Bold Russian {GB}) will replace Val Royal in the Cup line-up. The six-year-old gelding won 10 races in his native India, including the Bangalore Derby, before moving to Maylasia, where he won the Silver Plate and was second in both the Queen Elizabeth II Cup and Singapore Gold Cup.

TATTERSALLS MARES OFF TO STRONG START

The 2000 G2 Ribblesdale S. winner **Miletrian (Ire)** (Marju {Ire}) headed a buoyant first breeding stock session of the Tattersalls December Sales in Newmarket yesterday, selling for 700,000 guineas to Reiley McDonald of Eaton Sales, with British breeder Philippa Cooper, owner of Normandie Stud the underbidder. "She was bought for an American client who I can't name, but who wanted a mare to breed to Galileo (Ire), so she will be staying in Europe for at least a year," said McDonald. "She could come to the States eventually, but not necessarily--the client does have some mares over here and it is a European family." He added, "I thought she was gorgeous and was the one I wanted, having looked at an awful lot of the best fillies out of training." Top two-year-old filly **Leggy Lou (Ire)** (Mujadil), winner of the G3 Princess Margaret S., brought the second-highest bid, going for 500,000gns to Coolmore's Paul Shanahan, with John McCormack signing the ticket. "She'll be staying in training, but I don't know much more than that," said Shanahan. (*Toppers, p2*)

 After battling 1999 and 2000 Sovereign Award winner Patrick Husbands throughout the meet, Todd Kabel finally put away the riding title for the 2001 Woodbine season on closing day. Kabel picked up two winners on Sunday's final program to take top honors with 145 victories, five more than Husbands. It was the third Woodbine championship for the jockey, who also topped the standings in 1992 and 1995. Robert Tiller was the leading trainer at the meet with 62 winners, while Sam-Son Farm took the leading owner title with C\$3,241,344 in earnings.

PEDIGREE INSIGHTS

SILENCING THE CRITICS

Every now and then, a racehorse comes along--such as Skip Away, Silver Charm or Tiznow--whose outstanding racing record is out of line with his workaday pedigree. Many breeders in the West tend to regard these unlikely superstars with suspicion, preferring not to entrust their better mares to them until the stallions have proved themselves. Unfortunately, the misgivings behind this sort of approach tend to be self-fulfilling, if only because most stallions are only as good as the mares they are mated to.

Perhaps we should sometimes take note of the Japanese attitude to some of these outstanding performers. When Sunday Silence failed to win the whole-hearted support of the Kentucky industry, Zenya Yoshida was more than willing to increase his stake in this great racehorse. To Japanese eyes, Sunday Silence's exploits in the Kentucky Derby, Preakness and Breeders' Cup Classic were of greater importance than the fact that his first two dams were daughters of Understanding and Montparnasse.

The Japanese, of course, have had the last laugh, with Sunday Silence enjoying such phenomenal success that he could be described as Japan's equivalent to Ireland's Sadler's Wells or Australia's Danehill.

Zenya Yoshida had been similarly undaunted a couple of year's earlier when he paid a reported \$4,000,000 for the top European colt Tony Bin, who had changed hands as a weanling for as little as 3,000 Irish guineas.

Tony Bin had earned the equivalent of over \$2.1 million thanks to a record which featured a victory in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe in 1988. Tony Bin had also finished second in the 1987 Arc and had won five Group 1 contests in Italy, earning a Timeform rating of 134 in the process.

Unfortunately, most people couldn't forget that Tony Bin had been inexpensively produced and that his sire, the well-bred Kampala, had won nothing more important than a Group 3. Even the fact that Tony Bin's dam was a half-sister to the excellent broodmare Priddy Maid was of little help.

Had Tony Bin stayed in Europe for his stud career, he would have struggled to attract the very best mares, but Japanese breeders were less blinkered in their attitude to him.

The stallion also helped his cause considerably by siring nine winners from 16 first-crop runners in 1992. He consolidated this bright start the following year, when he took second place on the general sires' list following the victories of his daughter Vega in the Japanese 1000 Guineas and Oaks and of his son Winning Ticket in the Derby.

The sires' title came to Tony Bin in 1994, but he subsequently found Sunday Silence an insuperable obstacle to further championships. Top-class winners continued to flow, though, including three winners--Air Groove, Sakura Chitose-O and Offside Trap--of the fall edition of the Emperor's Cup, or Tenno Sho. Air Groove also took the Horse of the Year award.

Even though Tony Bin died in 2000, he has left a rich legacy this year, with Lady Pastel, winner of the Japanese Oaks, and Jungle Pocket, hero of the Japanese Derby and Japan Cup, among them.

It is interesting that many of Tony Bin's best winners are out of imported mares, including daughters of Northern Dancer, Nijinsky, Caerleon, Lyphard, Nureyev, Seeking The Gold and Blushing Groom. This suggests that he would also have succeeded in the West, given support of this calibre.

Jungle Pocket's victory over a Japan Cup field which included Timboroa, White Heart, Cagney and With Anticipation suggests he could follow in the footsteps of El Condor Pasa. This winner of the 1998 Japan Cup left Japan to win the Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud and finish an excellent second in the Arc.

Jungle Pocket is the best winner so far out of Dance Charmer. This unraced Nureyev mare, who was sold by Gainsborough Stud Management to Patrick Barbe for 72,000gns at Tattersalls' 1995 December Sales, is out of Skillful Joy, a high-class Californian mare who won the Hollywood Starlet S., Del Mar Debutante S. and Linda Vista H.

Jungle Pocket's fourth dam, Poliniss, is also the second dam of Precisionist, who numbered the Breeders' Cup Sprint among his many and varied graded- stakes successes.

One fascinating coincidence in Jungle Pocket's pedigree is that it contains two stallions, Nureyev and Kalamoun, who had a terrific impact on the Thoroughbred despite indifferent fertility. But whereas Nureyev lived to be 24, Kalamoun succumbed to colic in March 1979, at the age of only nine.

Although Kalamoun's output amounted to little more than 120 foals, he sired an astonishing 21 stakes winners headed by the top-class colts Bikala, Kalaglow, Persepolis, Kenmare and Shakapour. As many as 11--roughly 9 percent--were worthy of a Timeform rating of 120 or more, which makes Kalamoun one of the most remarkable stallions of the modern era. Perhaps it's not so surprising, then, that his grandson Tony Bin has greatly exceeded many Europeans' expectations of him as a sire.
