### ANOTHER VICTORY FOR EYDON HALL

G1 Fillies' Mile winner Gossamer (GB) made for a successful 2001 racing season for owner/breeder Gerald Leigh and his good fortune continued yesterday when **Zibilene (GB)** (Rainbow Quest), a Listed-placed half-sister to both Barathea (Ire) and Gossamer (GB), was introduced as "the belle of the ball" by auctioneer John O'Kelly at the Tattersalls December Sales. She proved to be just that, selling for 1.5 million guineas to Barbara Facchino's Barouche Stud in Co Kildare., Ireland as part of the consignment of Leigh's Eydon Hall Stud. Adrian Nicoll of BBA Ireland, standing alongside the Coolmore team, was underbidder for the four-year-old filly. "I thought my heart was going to jump out of my chest," said Mrs. Facchino, who moved her stud to Ireland from the Isle Of Man two years ago. "We are buying into a lovely family and I thought she had to be good value. I've no idea who will cover her, but our normal practice is to race the fillies and sell the colts." Barouche Stud has a 19-strong broodmare band. Brocattelle, a half-sister to Zibilene, sold with a Machiavellian cover, made 1.7 million guineas in the same ring a year ago. **Born Something (Fr)** (Caerleon), who finished third in a French G3 this year for the Wertheimer brothers, was bought by Sheikh Mohammed through John Ferguson for 820,000gns, with Charlie Gordon-Watson the underbidder. "She is an outstanding individual and comes from a top family with a lot happening," said Ferguson. "We're just delighted to have her. She won't race again, but I don't know which stallion she'll visit." Gordon-Watson's client Tom Wilson, a Northern Ireland businessman, bought **Panache Arabelle (GB)** (Nashwan), dam of Houghton sales race winner Maidaan (GB), for 680,000gns, and paid 575,000gns, for **Arutua** (Riverman), a daughter of the great All Along (Fr), whose four-year-old son Plato (Lure) has been placed in Grade 2 company across the Atlantic. Arutua was offered with a Giant's Causeway covering, something that has proved a good selling point all week. Both will board with Wilson's other mares at Lord Lloyd-Webber's Watership Down Stud. The sale concludes today with a session beginning at 9:30 a.m. *(Stats p2)*

### CHANGES AT NEWMARKET

Newmarket racecourse yesterday unveiled a new-look Cambridgeshire meeting for 2002. The meeting, which runs alongside the Houghton Sales at Tattersalls, features the G1 Cheveley Park S. on the Tuesday and G1 Middle Park S. on Thursday, traditionally separated by a "blank" day. However, that formula will be scrapped from next year, with the meeting now set to run from Wednesday Oct. 2 to Saturday Oct. 5. Friday will now feature the Cheveley Park S., with the G3 Somerville Tattersall S. moved to the opening Wednesday. In further changes announced yesterday, Shadwell Stud have switched their sponsorship of the Cheveley Park S. to the Middle Park S., which will still be held on Thursday. Newmarket managing director Lisa Hancock commented yesterday: "To have four consecutive days will help considerably in the promotion of this top-class race meeting. The victories of Johannesburg and Queen's Logic, Europe's top two-year-old colt and filly, in the two Group 1 races this year can only help to raise the Cambridgeshire meeting's profile and the race programme changes should enhance it still further in 2002. We are delighted that Shadwell Stud are continuing their support for the meeting. The aim is to build the Middle Park S. and indeed the whole of the Thursday card into a major event for Shadwell's breeding operation." Shadwell Estate stud director Richard Lancaster said, "The Middle Park S. is a very important two-year-old race in the racing calendar and this was emphasised this year by Johannesburg's emphatic victory. We wanted to expand our sponsorship involvement at Newmarket, so this seemed a great opportunity for the promotion of Shadwell's breeding operation."

### MAXSE AND WEBBON PROMOTED

John Maxse and Peter Webbon will receive promotions at the Jockey Club from Jan. 1, 2002, it was revealed yesterday. Maxse, who has served in the press office since 1993, will be the Jockey Club's new public relations director, while Webbon, best known for his figurehead role in the foot-and-mouth disease control measures, has been appointed veterinary director.

### POWELL WINS DBS AWARD

David Powell of Catridge Farm Stud has been awarded the Willie Stephenson Memorial Trophy for 2001 by the directors of Doncaster Bloodstock Sales Ltd (DBS), it was announced yesterday. The award, which commemorates the late DBS co-founder and first chairman, is given to the person who has done most in any year to promote the name of DBS. Catridge Farm Stud were the leading vendors at the 2001 St Leger yearling sale, the only sale in Britain and Ireland to record an increase in average and median price this year. Powell also consigned the winner of the 2001 £200,000 St Leger Yearling S. at Doncaster, **Acclamation (GB)** (Royal Applause {GB}). DBS managing director Henry Beeby commented yesterday, "We can think of no more fitting winner of our Willie Stephenson award this year than David, who has become a stalwart at the St Leger Yearling Sales in recent years and was our leading vendor in 2001. His association with Acclamation confirms the quality of the drafts he consigns on an annual basis whilst you could not have a better man to deal with at sales time."

**GOVERNMENT UPSETS RACECOURSE ASSOCIATION**

Ireland's racecourse association yesterday expressed dissatisfaction with the Irish government's decision to create an extra seat at the Horse Racing Ireland board. Frank Smyth, spokesman for the Association of Irish Racecourses, who are looking to add another seat to their existing one, told *Irish Racing online*: "We originally went along with this in the interests of the industry, but now we see no reason why we should not have the same representation as we do on the Irish Horseracing Authority board." Dennis Egan, the Irish Turf Club's new chief executive, commented: "There may be a perfectly plausible reason for the Minister to have done this but we don't know and, on the face of things, it seems funny. We're curious as to how the Minister said he was not going to change anything and now this change is coming through. But we can't know until we sit down with him." A Department of Agriculture spokesman responded yesterday: "The board was increased from 12 to 13 members to facilitate an additional place for the Irish Congress of Trade Unions. The Congress made a valid case for themselves, it was discussed at Cabinet and it was agreed." Meanwhile, Margaret Davin has been appointed group chief financial officer and Michael O'Rourke director of marketing and communications on the new HRI board.

**BOEUF CLINCHES TITLE**

Dominique Boeuf yesterday rode a double at Marseille Borely to take the 2001 French jockeys' championship, the *Cravache d'Or*, for the third time. He had previously won in 1991 and 1998. Boeuf scored in the claimer on **Paradour (Fr)** (Garde Royale {Ire}) in the third race on the card before following up on **My Little Willie (Fr)** (Le Balafre {Fr}) in the closing handicap. A delighted Boeuf, who was animated passing the winning post on the latter, raised three fingers in the winner's enclosure. That was enough to secure the title, giving him 149 winners to Olivier Peslier's 148 winners.

**INDUSTRY TALKS IN TUCSON** Wednesday's opening session of the University of Arizona's Symposium on Racing featured a varied program that addressed medication, marketing and technology issues. An inspired and humorous speech by Mike Veeck, son of sports innovator and entrepreneur Bill Veeck, provided some excellent insights into how racetrack managers can improve the experience of a day at the track for the average racing fan, as well as new customers. In presenting "The Business of Having Fun," Veeck outlined a thoughtful approach and proven methodology for capturing new customers and keeping existing racing fans coming back for more. Illustrated with stories and anecdotes from his years of promoting major and minor league baseball teams, Veeck's key theme of "fun is good" could be readily adapted to racing. Many of the zany promotions and crazy contests he put on often appeared to be out of step with the mainstream, but they brought in the fans, sold more hot dogs, and garnered much needed media attention. Passion for the sport, detailed planning, fearless innovation, and outstanding customer service are all disciplines that proved successful for Veeck. He contends that racing could embrace these with more vigor and benefit long term through increased attendance and more loyal patrons. Working more effectively using the new media of the Internet was the theme of a panel discussion on web journalism. Representatives from MSNBC.com, CBS Sportsline.com, and ESPN.com spoke on ways that racetracks can get more coverage and take advantage of the unique capabilities that the world wide web offers a "second tier" sport like racing. "There is more opportunity for racing in the New World of the Internet," said Bill Finley, former turf writer for the *New York Daily News* and now with ESPN.com. (Cont. p3)

"Lord Weinstock was very keen to keep him in training, Mr. Tabor loves having an older horse and Golan will be staying with us. I am delighted to be training him at four," Stoute told the *Racing Post*. Golan was also runner-up to Galileo (Ire) in the G1 Epsom Derby and third to the same colt in the G1 Irish Derby. After a mid-summer break he took the G1 Prix Niel at Longchamp Sept. 16 before finishing fourth to Sakhee in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe Oct. 7. John Warren, acting as agent for Lord Weinstock, explained, "It is hard to say what his targets will be next year, but Sir Michael really feels he has a serious chance of proving himself at the top level as a four-year-old. If you had taken Galileo out he have been the winner of the Guineas and the Derby and there should be many opportunities for him next year. He's an ace of a horse and you'd never be frightened to take on anything with him. Everyone is very bullish about his prospects for next season."

**BOSTON HARBOR DEAL COMPLETED** The deal to sell 1996 two-year-old champion **Boston Harbor** (Capote--Harbor Springs, by Vice Regent) has been completed and the seven-year-old has left Kentucky en route to his new home in Japan. Boston Harbor was purchased by the Japanese Bloodhorse Breeders Association in a deal brokered by Narvick International. He will enter stud at a fee of ¥2.8 million (\$22,545), according to The Blood-Horse. First-crop sire Boston Harbor is represented by stakes winner Boston Twist and his progeny have earned \$640,133 to date.
