TATTERSALLS DECEMBER HITS THE MARK

The Tattersalls December Sales finished yesterday with results that far exceeded expectations. The average of 37,126 guineas established a new record while the median of 15,000 guineas equalled the previous best. The total turnover of 51,382,950 guineas registered as the third highest total ever. "This has been a truly extraordinary sale," said Tattersalls chairman Edmond Mahony. "There cannot have been one single pundit who would have predicted the trade we have seen here at Park Paddocks over the past two weeks. Yearlings, then foals and finally the breeding stock have all reached record levels." Tattersalls story cont. page 2

DEAUVILLE KICKS OFF WINTER SALE

Deauville opens its doors today for the start of the Winter Mixed Sale, which has added an extra day for the first time this year. Today, 200 yearlings and 60 horses in training will go through the ring, followed by the usual breeding stock sale on Saturday and Sunday, with 671 head to be sold, including foals, broodmares, fillies out of training and stallions. Among the anticipated lots for sale in the horses-in-training session are **Danella (Fr)** (Highest Honor {Fr}), winner of the Listed Prix Isola Bella at Maisons-Laffitte on Tuesday, **Speedgirl (Fr)** (Monsun {Ger}), a full sister to G2 Prix Vicomtesse Vigier winner Speedmaster (Ger) and **Faimara (Fr)** (Homme de Loi {Ire}), a two-year-old half brother to Chichicastenango. Among mares, one bound to attract interest from the consignment of Haras d'Etream is lot 341, **Soul Surfing** (Hennessy), who is out of a sister to Known Fact and in foal to King's Best. Another attraction will be lot 577, **Agnes Lily** (Raise a Cup), dam of the Group-winning Bimbola (Fr), in foal to Grape Tree Road (GB), from the draft of SCEA Ecurie di Tullio. Bimbola sold for 500,000 guineas at Tattersalls Tuesday. The sale also includes other notable mares in foal to sires such as Trempolino, Dansili (GB), Highest Honor (Fr), Linamix (Fr) and Kahyasi (Ire). Of the foals, lot 410, a half-sister to Group 1 winner Heart of Darkness (GB) by Peintre Celebre, consigned by Haras des Capucines, should spark interest, as should lot 480, a Bering (GB) half-brother to GI E.P. Taylor S. winner Choc Ice (Ire). Trading begins at 11a.m. today and tomorrow, with the sale getting underway at 10 a.m. on Sunday.

POLAR FALCON EUTHANIZED Cheveley Park Stud stallion **Polar Falcon (USA)** (Nureyev {USA}), 1991 champion sprinter and sire of G1 winners Pivotal (GB), Exclusive (GB) and Shibuni's Falcon (GB), was euthanized at Rosssdales and Partners' Veterinary Clinic in Newmarket on Wednesday evening following a recent illness suspected to be associated with a lung tumour. The stud's Managing Director, Chris Richardson, said: "We are all extremely sad to have, so suddenly, lost Polar Falcon at a time in his relatively short career, when his progeny were performing at such a high level. Although only small in size, he was large in stature. He was a kind horse with an immense character, who offered us many magical moments both on the racecourse and through his progeny. He will be missed, by not only all of us at Cheveley Park Stud, but also the industry."

GODOLPHIN PURCHASE KAZZIA

Rennstall Wohler's two-year-old filly **Kazzia (Ger)** (Zinaad {GB}) has been purchased by Godolphin for an undisclosed sum. The unbeaten filly captured the G3 Premio Dormello at Milan Oct. 14 after impressively breaking her maiden at Hoppegarten. Kazzia is a half-sister to the Listed winning Kimbajar (Ger) and directly traces back to the champion mare Kandia, whose leading descendants are currently headed by the tough Group-winning Kalatos (Ger) and stakes-winning Krombacher (Ger). This is also the family of Germany's sole Triple Crown winner Konigsstuhl (Ger), along with Surumu (Ger), the most influential sire of the past decade.

WRITERS UP

2001 IRISH RACING REVIEW

The year 2001 was a truly remarkable one for Irish racing. There were some who believed that it would be difficult to repeat the achievements of last year's stars Sinndar (Ire) and Giant's Causeway (USA), but what trainer Aidan O'Brien achieved this year was quite incredible. The master of Ballydoyle's achievement of training 23 Group 1 winners worldwide is unlikely to be bettered by anyone except, perhaps O'Brien himself.

O'Brien saddled **Mozart (Ire)** (Danahill {USA}) before his stunning victory in the G1 July Cup at Newmarket and the trainer was still discussing tactics with jockey Mick Kinane as the horse left the parade ring. Mozart did not exactly set the world alight on his first start of the year, when he was well beaten in the Listed 2000 Guineas Trial Leopardstown in April. O'Brien seemed disappointed after his charge was subsequently beaten in the G3 Desert King S. at The Curragh in May, but everything soon fell into place. Mozart nearly stole the show at The Curragh when he just missed to stable companion **Black Minnaloushe (USA)** (Storm Cat {USA}) in the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas. How can a horse almost snatch an Irish Guineas on soft ground over a mile and come back a couple of months later to clock 57.20 seconds for a five-furlong dash at York (in the G1 Nunthorpe S.)? Everyone would love to know, but that can certainly be attributed to O'Brien.

Galileo (Ire) (Sadler's Wells {USA}) won on his seasonal debut in the Listed Ballysax S. at Leopardstown in April and it looked as if there would be a fair amount of improvement to come. He collected the G3 Derby Trial at that track the following month en route to Epsom, and simply bolted in the G1 English Derby to provide his sire with a belated first victory in the Classic. There was a huge crowd at The Curragh July 1 and it was at the back of everyone's minds that Mick Kinane had still to break his Irish Derby hoodoo. In the event, Kinane had an armchair ride aboard Galileo and he coasted home to beat Morshdi (GB). He went on to to beat **Fantastic Light (USA)** (Rahy {USA}) in a memorable duel in The G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot and the pair renewed rivalry at Leopardstown in September in the G1 Irish Champion S. After another terrific battle, Galileo suffered his first defeat at the hands of that rival.

Imagine (Ire) (Sadler's Wells {USA}) proved herself as one of the best fillies of her generation when she captured the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh in May and then landed the G1 Epsom Oaks. Injury curtailed her career and she was retired in September.

It is possible that the best is yet to come in the shape of **Johannesburg (USA)** (Hennessy {USA}). He rounded off the year with a brilliant victory in the G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Belmont Park to bring his haul of Group or Grade 1s to four. He began his unbeaten run in May and in the process rattled off seven victories, six in stakes company. What is perhaps most significant about Johannesburg is that he won Group 1 races in Ireland, England, France and America. Whatever else he achieves, he will be remembered as the horse who provided O'Brien with his first Breeders' Cup winner.

Mick Kinane made a brave attempt to win the jockeys' title, but Pat Smullen, who was riding as well as ever this season, gained back-to-back titles after a sustained three-way battle with Kinane and Johnny Murtagh. Murtagh once again proved himself to be one of the best jockeys in the world by riding several big race winners while Pat Smullen rode his first Classic winner when **Vinnie Roe (Ire)** (Definite Article {Ire}) took the G1 Irish St Leger at The Curragh in September. O'Brien became the first Irish-based trainer since Vincent O'Brien to become champion trainer in Britain and he was also crowned champion trainer in Ireland.

DOUBLE HOMICIDE AT JERSEY FARM Two people were found dead yesterday on the back porch of a house on Robert Camac's Thoroughbred Farm in Salem County, New Jersey. A 9-1-1 call was received at approximately 8:30 a.m. and police arrived to find the bodies of a middle-aged male and middle-aged female, both victims of gunshot wounds. They were pronounced dead at the scene. "We are presently treating the investigation as a double homicide," said Salem County Chief Detective Chuck Miller to KYW Newsradio 1060. KYW-TV in Philadelphia reports that a third person was injured in the incident. No suspects have been arrested. Police are withholding the names of the victims until next of kin are notified, but Philadelphia Park security said that Camac, a perennial leading trainer at the track, did not arrive at his barn as expected yesterday morning.

NYRA ANNOUNCES \$34 MILLION STAKES SCHEDULE The New York Racing Association announced yesterday its schedule of 180 stakes worth \$34.725 million for the 2002 racing calendar. The highlights include three \$1 million races: the GI Belmont S. June 8, the GI Travers S. Aug. 24 and the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Sept. 28. The schedule includes 129 graded stakes, 39 of them Grade I. "We're pleased to offer rich purses for every division," said NYRA racing secretary Mike Lakow. "We want to do our best to present the best racing possible to our fans both locally and at simulcast outlets nationally."

SYMPOSIUM FOCUSES ON BETTER BETTOR TREATMENT From Thursday's presentations at the University of Arizona's Symposium on Racing it was evident that racetracks' most important customers are bettors and their needs must be addressed and better served. An opening session on "Analyzing the Marketplace" featured presentations all focused on account wagering and using customer preferences to tailor racing programs so that handle is maximized and horse-players are better served. Account wagering customers and handle are growing monthly as more and more jurisdictions have approved what Jim McAlpine, CEO of Magna Entertainment Corporation called "the future of our business." Magna is eager to launch their account wagering system in California in January 2002, and will do so with telephone and Internet betting offering full video streaming of all races. Satellite and cable television will follow soon afterwards. "This represents our greatest opportunity yet," said McAlpine, "and we'll soon find out if California account wagering is a road to riches or just another fragmentation of our customer base." Magna is the nation's largest owner of racetracks and numbers Gulfstream Park, Golden Gate, Bay Meadows, and Santa Anita among its stable of properties. In an attempt to move forward in the longstanding dispute over product exclusivity that Magna and other tracks have had with TVG, McAlpine revealed that his company had spent 11 months in negotiations. Magna's offer to exchange reciprocal, non-exclusive media and account wagering rights with TVG was rejected earlier this week. "The industry is best served with multiple television distribution channels," contends McAlpine. "Give the customers a choice and service will improve." It now appears that Magna's account wagering customers may not be able to bet on TVG partner tracks and that TVG will not have access to content from Magna properties. Dr. Margaret Ray, Visiting Research Scientist at the University of Arizona, presented an in depth statistical analysis of how wagering patterns are influenced by many race day factors.

She then broke down the analysis further by comparing handle from account wagering, simulcast, and on-track bettors. Large fields, turf races, more exotic bet-types, and the absence of overwhelming betting favorites resulted in larger handles. Account wagering patrons appeared to be more sophisticated handicappers, generated larger per capita handles, yet tended to shy away from betting on two-year-old races. All categories of players appeared to be stimulated by larger fields and higher quality racing. The Symposium concludes Friday with the NTRA's annual review of the programs and initiatives implemented in 2001 and an update on their vision of racing's future.

Tattersalls chairman Edmond Mahony continued, saying, "The smallest Tattersalls December Sale for many years has become only the third to achieve turnover in excess of 50 million guineas. Quality has never been more sought after with a record 102 six-figure prices, but the key element to this year's December Sale has been the consistency of the demand. [This year] has not always been an easy year with foot-and-mouth [disease] overshadowing the early months, and global economic uncertainty dominating the news in the aftermath of the tragic events of September 11, but our annual turnover has only been bettered twice before, and it has been a great boost to the industry to end on such a high note." On the final day, three-year-old **Countess Sybill** (Dr Devious), a maiden winner at Killarney for Willie Mullins in July, topped the session at 36,000 guineas. Charlie Oakshott, manager of Whitsbury Manor Stud, bought the three-year-old. "She was a lovely filly and is for a client of the stud. She could be covered by Mister Baileys," said Oakshott.
