FAIR GROUNDS TO SIMULCAST TO ENGLAND

British-based *attheraces*, an on-line television and wagering company, yesterday announced the appointment of Fair Grounds Race Course as their North American representative. The New Orleans racetrack will assist *attheraces* in its efforts to simulcast American racing to England, and vice-versa. Initially, the races will be simulcast and bets will be taken on the Internet at *attheraces.co.uk*, with plans to launch a dedicated digital channel in May 2002. "We look forward to building strong overseas relationships, and see the introduction of British racing into North America as a positive step in expanding the global market for our product," said Glyn Williams, commercial director for *attheraces*.

DEAUVILLE GETS UNDERWAY

The Deauville Winter Mixed Sale started yesterday, with a couple of half-sisters to multiple Group 1 winner Chichicastenango (Fr) taking the spotlight. **Faimara (Fr)** (Homme de Loi {Ire}--Smala {Fr}, by Antheus) topped the day's two sessions, attracting a bid of FF1,300,000 during the offering of fillies and mares in- and out-of-training. Consigned by Philippe Demercastel, the two-year-old filly, who had a second and two thirds from five starts this season, was purchased by Rolland Marcel. Her three-year-old brother Chichicastenango caught a lot of attention this year by taking the G1 Prix Lupin and G1 Grand Prix de Paris and finishing second in the G1 French Derby. His yearling half sister, named **Smala Tica (Fr)** (Loup Solitaire), brought top bid during the day's offering of yearlings. Consigned by Haras du Patis, the filly was purchased for FF420,000 by Gilles Gaetan. The sale continues today at 11 a.m.

SAKHEE WINS FRENCH HONORS Godolphin's **Sakhee (USA)** (Bahri {USA}), who scored a record equalling six-length victory in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp Oct. 7 then finished his season with a second-place effort in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Belmont, has been named the winner of the Hermes Flat Horse Of The Year Award in France. The award is voted on by readers or viewers of Paris-Turf, Equida, Trot Information and Courses et Elevage et l'Eperon as well as journalists in France. Sakhee won the most votes over competition that included stablemate **Fantastic Light (USA)** (Rahy {USA}), **Galileo (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}), **Aquarelliste (Fr)** (Danehill {USA}), **Banks Hill (GB)** (Danehill {USA}) and **Johannesburg (USA)** (Hennessy {USA}). A sculpture by Christian Renonciat, from the Les Chevaux Hermes collection, was presented by Hermes to Godolphin's French representative Diana Cooper at a ceremony in Paris on Thursday. Sakhee will stay in training as a five-year-old and has the G1 Dubai World Cup at Nad Al Sheba Mar. 23 as his prime early season target.

PAUL MELLON TRUST DONATES \$3.5 MILLION The trustees of Paul Mellon's estate have donated \$3.5 million to the Rehabilitation of Racehorses (RoR) charity, it was announced yesterday. The Mellon trust, which already supports the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation in the United States, has now given over \$10 million worldwide to support ex-racehorses. "This money will create a capital fund and underpin racing's responsibility for the welfare of ex-racehorses," said RoR Chairman Brigadier Andrew Parker Bowles. "The RoR trustees will be meeting in January to decide how best to use the funds in accordance with RoR's objectives." Mellon, under the name Rokeby Stable, bred scores of stakes winners on both sides of the Atlantic, including Epsom Derby and Arc de Triomphe winner Mill Reef (USA) and Kentucky Derby victor Sea Hero (USA). RoR trustee Emma Balding said, "Paul Mellon was in the fortunate position of being able to look after his own horses once they had stopped racing. It's marvellous to think that, through his legacy, his caring philosophy lives on in a very practical way, enabling other horses to be cared for."

PUNTERS TO RECEIVE TAX BREAK

Off-course punters in Ireland are on the verge of tax-free betting after bookmakers Paddy Power declared they will absorb the two percent betting tax themselves. Chief Executive Stewart Kenny told the *Irish Times*, "I am hopeful this will be self-financing straight away. Taxfree betting should see turnover dramatically increase. The industry is now financing Irish racing out of its profits even though it is not represented on the new board (Horse Racing Ireland). But that is another day's work." Rival bookmaking chains Boyles and Cashman's indicated they will also follow Paddy Power's lead. Paul Cashman added: "We have to follow suit or else we will be closed down in a week."

NTRA OUTLINES "PHASE 2" DURING TUCSON

FINALE The National Thoroughbred Racing Association and Breeders' Cup Ltd. unveiled its plans for 2002 during yesterday's final session of the University of Arizona's 28th annual Symposium on Racing in Tucson. The NTRA/Breeders' Cup, which will have a combined budget of \$60 million next year, intends to place a greater focus on the divisional races leading up to the World Thoroughbred Championships. To that end, the 2002 television schedule will include three additional hours of live coverage on ESPN and a broader line-up of divisional races on NBC. Hoping to showcase the European horses pointing for the WTC, the programming will also incorporate a small number of foreign races. "Over the course of 2002, we'll present the best, most comprehensive schedule of programming that Thoroughbred racing has ever had," Chip Campbell, the NTRA's senior vice president of media and sponsorships, said. Plans also call for European horses to be included in WTC rankings next season.

John Deere Signs On

In related Symposium news, the manufacturing company John Deere, presenting sponsors of the \$2 million Breeders' Cup Turf this year, has formed a multi-year marketing partnership with the NTRA and Breeders' Cup Ltd. which gives them entitlement rights to the race and to the races included in the Breeders' Cup Turf division leading up to the main event. John Deere will also be the presenting sponsor for the inaugural Great State Challenge, to be held next December at Sam Houston Race Park in Texas. Modeled after the WTC, the six-race \$1.5 million Challenge will feature horses representing the horsemen's associations from those states which are NTRA members. The state which picks up the most points in the one-day event will receive a trophy.

TVG Responds to Magna Comments

Responding to the comments made by Magna Entertainment Corporation President and CEO Jim McAlpine during Thursday's session of the Symposium, Mark Wilson, president and CEO of TVG, issued a statement yesterday. Magna, unsuccessful in negotiating a deal with TVG for its network of race-tracks, had attempted to get the racing channel to forego its usual exclusivity requirements, urging free enterprise. The statement read, in part, "Magna's position that racing can still have a broadly distributed presence on television without content exclusivity means one of two things: it either demonstrates a clear lack of understanding of the television and entertainment industries or, to the contrary, it demonstrates Magna's understanding that, as the global media and entertainment industry continues to consolidate, it is unlikely that Magna will be able to compete successfully in this market and is only trying to keep TVG, which has already demonstrated the ability to do so, from succeeding. Content exclusivity--without it, you cannot get the sport on television." He added, "We regret that we are forced to respond to Jim's statements and certainly hope that we don't have to negotiate through the media. TVG has been engaged and responsive throughout this rather lengthy negotiating process with Magna. We remain willing to negotiate a mutually beneficial deal with Magna, if one is possible."

SUSPECT ARRESTED IN CAMAC CASE Trainer Robert Camac and his wife Maryann have been identified as the victims of an apparent double homicide at their farm in New Jersey Thursday and Salem County officials announced yesterday that a suspect has been arrested in the case. Wade Russell, the 36-year-old son of Maryann Camac, has been arrested and charged with two counts of first-degree murder. He is being held at the Salem County Correctional Facility in lieu of \$1.8 million cash bail. Camac, 61, one of the top conditioners at Philadelphia and Delaware Parks, saddled more than 1,800 winners during his four decades of training. His best runner was millionaire and three-time Grade I winner Jolie's Halo, who was bred and owned by longtime client Arthur I. Appleton.

XTRA HEAT SCRATCHED AT AQUEDUCT Top sprinter **Xtra Heat** (Dixieland Heat) was entered in today's Garland of Roses H. at Aqueduct, but had to be scratched after contracting a mild illness. "She coughed a bunch of times and left a handful of feed [Friday] morning," trainer John Salzman said. "Looks like she may have gotten a little sick with the weather changing back and forth. I don't want to take a chance with her--there are too many other races out there. She's been too good to us." The three-year-old filly will be pointed to the Jan. 1 Interborough H. at Aqueduct.

CONQUISTADOR CIELO RECOVERING Claiborne Farm stallion **Conquistador Cielo** (Mr. Prospector), the 1982 Horse of the Year, is in good shape after undergoing surgery on Wednesday, it was reported yesterday. The 22-year-old stallion exhibited colic symptoms Wednesday morning and was taken to Hagyard-Davidson-McGee equine clinic in Lexington, Kentucky, where a one-hour surgery was performed to remove a lipoma, a benign tumor made up of fat cells. In all, six feet of small intestine were removed and resected. "He's doing great, all his vitals are good," Claiborne's assistant manager Gus Koch told *Thoroughbred Times*. "He's bright, and has a good appetite." Conquistador Cielo caught the attention of the racing world when he set a track record in winning the GI Metropolitan H. over older horses, then added a 14-length triumph in the GI Belmont S. five days later. He is represented by graded-stakes winners Alannan and Lexicon in 2001. Claiborne lost leading sire Unbridled in October after that stallion was unable to recover from two abdominal surgeries.

RECORD STAKES SCHEDULE AT CHURCHILL Churchill Downs has released a 2002 stakes schedule with record total purses of \$8.275 million, headlined by the \$1 million Kentucky Derby and the \$500,000 Kentucky Oaks on the first weekend in May. The Louisville oval will host five Grade I events in all, including the \$750,000 Stephen Foster H. and the \$200,000 Humana Distaff, which were upgraded for the 2002 season. The \$100,000 Matt Winn S., a six-furlong race for three-year-olds named in honor of the legendary track president, will be run for the first time on May 11. "We have been working for many years to make the stakes schedule at Churchill Downs as attractive and competitive as any in the country and we believe the 2002 schedule is our strongest ever," said Don Richardson, senior vice president of racing.
