DEAUVILLE DECEMBER CONCLUDES

Lattaquie (Fr) (Fast Topaze--Lady Sharp {Fr}, by Sharpman {Ire}), a half-sister to three stakes winners, brought the highest price on the final day of the Deauville Winter Mixed Sale, bringing a final bid of FF490,000 yesterday. Consigned by Haras d'Etreham, the 11-year-old broodmare is a winning sister to Lady Blessington (Fr), a Group/Graded winner in France and the U.S. who won 11 races and \$585,892; French Group 3 winner Lowell; and U.S. Listed winner Red Cat. She herself has produced six foals, including Bounce Back, a stakes winner over fences. In foal to Tremolino, she was purchased by Eric Puerari. The sale concluded with the aggregate down fractionally, and the average showing a decrease of 16 percent. A total of 62 percent of the horses through the ring sold, down from 65 percent last year.

Note: Interpose GB (Indian Ridge {Ire}), the top seller at Sunday's session, was consigned by Haras de Bernesq and is in foal to Baratheia (Ire). **Baronne Volante (Ire)** (Fairy King), who brought Sunday's second-highest bid, also was consigned by Haras de Bernesq; the seven-year-old mare is not in foal.

HAWKEYE SIGHTS AT SHA TIN **Hawkeye (Ire)** (Danehill) pleased new trainer Michael Jarvis with an impressive turf workout at Sha Tin yesterday. Heading for the G1 Hong Kong Cup on Sunday, the Irish Group 3 winner galloped a mile in company, with his rider reportedly saying he was, "very, very happy" with the workout. Hawkeye, who was fourth to Nayef last time in the G1 Dubai Champion S. Oct. 20 while under Aidan O'Brien's care, was purchased privately by Gary Tanaka after that start. He will be ridden by Gary Stevens.

GERMANS SHAPING UP German challengers **Silvano (Ger)** (Lomitas {GB}) and **Proud wings (Ger)** (Dashing Blade {GB}) continued their preparation at Sha Tin yesterday under the watchful eyes of their trainers. Andreas Wohler was happy with Silvano's routine half-speed gallop on the all-weather track under his regular rider Bianca Sieling. Sieling will give way to regular jockey Andreas Suborics, who will ride Silvano for the remainder of his work between now and Sunday's G1 Hong Kong Cup, Silvano's last run before he retires to take up stud duties at Gestut Farhof. Wohler said, "He's looking very well and although he's had a long season, I think he's in very good form. He had a slight touch of colic just after the Cox Plate, but fortunately it was nothing serious. He had a foot problem just before the Plate, and that fact combined with the lengthy quarantine period before embarking for Australia meant that the race in Australia probably came a week too soon for him. He's been here for two weeks now, and he's been a great traveler all year. His weight is good, he's moving well and I think he's in the form he was in April. It's a tough race of course, but we can only hope for the best." Ralph Suerland

**GENERAL MONASH DEAD**

General Monash (USA) (Thorn Dance {USA}) died Sunday after a paddock accident at Lindsay Park Stud in Angaston, South Australia, according to *Thoroughbred Times*. A half brother to European classic winner King of Kings (Ire), the nine-year-old stallion stood the Northern Hemisphere breeding season at Ballyhane Stud near Carlow, Ireland. From two crops to race, he has sired 29 winners from 70 starters, including multiple group placed Bram Stoker (Ire). On the racetrack, General Monash won the 1994 G2 Prix Robert Papin.

AUSTRALIAN SIRE SERHEED EUTHANIZED

Serheed (USA) (Nijinsky II {Can}), five times Western Australia's leading stallion, was euthanized last week after suffering complications from an injured hoof, according to *The Sydney Morning Herald*. The 21-year-old stallion sired 20 stakes winners, including multiple Group 1 winner Northery (Aus) and Kin Angel (Aus).

David Evans' ultra tough six-year-old mare **Madame Jones (Ire)** (Lycius {USA}) runs again today at Wolverhampton, her third race in four days, in an attempt to secure the all-time British record for number of handicap wins in a season. At the moment she shares the record of 11 wins with two 19th century stalwarts, Misty Morn and Honesty, but will claim the title outright if successful in the seven-furlong attheraces.co.uk Handicap. In her latest attempt, the mare finished fourth in the southwell-racecourse.co.uk Fillies' Handicap at Southwell yesterday, her 56th race of the year.

HOMESTEER WNS CLASCO DE CARBE Jockey Rosemary Homester Jr., the first female rider ever to participate in Puerto Rico's Clasico de Carbe, became the first of her sex to win it as well, taking the 34th edition of the race at El Comandante Sunday, *The Blood-Horse* reports. Riding a three-year-old filly from Panama called **Alexia (Pan)** (El Rey David), Homester, who is based at Calder Race Course, won the race by a neck over Puerto Rican Derby runner-up **Yagrumo** (Groomstick) after running the mile and an eighth in 1:54.56. Alexia becomes the third distaffer to win the "Caribbean Derby." The gray, trained by Erick Gittens and owned by Stud Campo Azul, has now won eight of her 13 career starts, including four stakes in her native country.

MARE IN FOAL TO LOUIS QUATORZE TOPS KENTUCKY FALL MKED SALE **Lovely Ghost** (Silver Ghost - My Lovely, by Graustark), a six-year-old broodmare in foal to freshman sire Louis Quatorze, brought a final bid of \$50,000 to top the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Fall Mixed Sale in Lexington yesterday. From the family of champion sprinter Eillb, winner of the inaugural GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, the gray was consigned by Bona Terra Farm, with the Blake Agency as agent, and purchased by Jack D. Thomas. The sale showed declines in gross, average and median, with the average dropping 26.8 percent and the median decreasing 14.2 percent.

FREUD TO LAKLAND **Freud** (Storm Cat - Mariah's Storm, by Rahy), a full brother to European champion and GI Breeders' Cup Classic runner-up Giant's Causeway, will begin his stud career at Lakland North LLC in Hudson, New York next year. The three-year-old colt broke his maiden at The Curragh in Ireland in May and was third in the G2 Cork and Onery S. at Royal Ascot in June. He retires with a win, two seconds and a third from 12 starts for earnings of \$44,088. The bay will stand for a fee of \$5,000, live foal.

RCI TAKES ACTION ON NEW MEDICATIONS The Board of Directors of the Association of Racing Commissioners International have ruled on two substances "deemed detrimental to the sport," it was reported yesterday. Acting during its annual winter board meeting in Tucson, Arizona, the Association's Drug Testing Standards and Practices Committee recommended that benzyppiperazine (BZP) be classified as a Class I substance. That status is given to medications which are considered the most harmful to both the horse and the sport of racing. BZP, a formerly unclassified designer drug used recreationally by humans, has been detected in post-race tests on horses in Massachusetts and New Hampshire. The DISP also recommended that the possession or administration of the Class 2 drug erythropoietin (EPO) be punished appropriately. The recommendations were made in the hopes of deterring horsemen from using the drugs in the future, and were unanimously approved.

With a slight tweak here and there, the eulogy penned by Shakespeare for Cleopatra will do pretty well for Nureyev, the magnificent stallion who died at the age of 24 in November.

"Age cannot wither him, nor custom stale his infinite variety" would be a fitting tribute, because this exceptional son of Northern Dancer was still very much at the top of his game when he died.

When Momentum won the GIII Native Dancer H. two days ago, he became no less than the 11th individual

Group/Graded winner to represent Nureyev this year (including one in Australia and one in Japan). No fewer than four of his representatives scored at the highest level, with Skinning taking the Pacific Classic, Senure the United Nations H. and Clement L. Hirsch Memorial Turf Championship, King Charlemagne the Prix Maurice de Gheest and Black Hawk the Yasuda Kinen.

The 11 Graded winners also demonstrated the infinite variety of Nureyev's talents. While capable of dispensing excellent sprinting ability to such as King Charlemagne and Estintaj, Nureyev was just as likely to come up with a Senure or a Skinning, horses who possessed enough stamina to make their mark at 1 1/4 miles or beyond.

This mirrors his past achievements. Alongside sprinters of the quality of Stravinsky, Soviet Star and Polar Fabon, his long list of Grade I winners also features mile-and-a-half horses of the calibre of Theatrical, Peintre Celebre and Reams of Verse.

At the same time, many of his finest moments came at around a mile, thanks to such as Miesque, Spinning World, Sonic Lady and Zizal.

Nureyev's 11 Graded winners are also infinitely varied in other ways. Among them are two juveniles, four three-year-olds, four five-year-olds and a seven-year-old. Bear in mind, too, that this impressive tally wasn't gained with the aid of three-figure crops. Far from it. Because of his perennial fertility problems, Nureyev had only 30 named foals born in 1998 and 28 in 1999, yet the 30 three-year-olds include King Charlemagne (G1), Crystal Music (G1), Toroca (G1-placed, G3 winner), Momentum (GIII), Bonnard (G1-placed), Stunning (G2-placed, Listed winner) and the unbeaten Binary File.

Altogether, Nureyev boasts the exceptional figures of 18 percent stakes winners to foals and 10 percent Group/Graded winners, putting him neck-and-neck with Danzig, another member of Northern Dancer's 1977 crop.

One area in which Nureyev's offspring tend not to show infinite variety is their optimum racing surface. He will

always be regarded as very much a turf sire, but he occasionally comes up with very effective performers on the main track, headed by Skinning and Atticus. Istintaj also gained his 2001 Graded victories on dirt and now Momentum has underlined his versatility by winning the Native Diver H. on dirt just three months after he had won a Listed race on turf in England.

Momentum's English exploits, which included three wins and two seconds from seven starts, earned him the very creditable Timeform rating of 115, and his connections must now be excited at the number of options open to him.

It now seems strange to relate that Momentum was led out unsold at \$45,000 when he was offered as a yearling at Keeneland's September Sale. Perhaps potential buyers were not prepared to gamble on a colt born as late as May 28, even though a late foaling date is nothing new among Nureyev's good winners (Polar Falcon, another Group 1 winner who failed to attain his reserve as a yearling, was a June 1 foal).

Momentum's dam, In prudent Love, wouldn't qualify as one of the best racemares ever sent to Nureyev -- she won three races on turf and a total of around \$50,000 from 18 starts. What's more, she was sold for as little as \$9,000 in January 1995. However, she possessed one quality essential to a mate for Nureyev -- excellent fertility -- and Momentum is her ninth foal in 10 years.

In prudent Love is also a well-bred individual. Her dam, Donna Inez, was a stakes-winning half-sister to Ferdinand, winner of the Kentucky Derby at three and the Breeders' Cup Classic at four, when he was Horse Of The Year. Momentum, like Ferdinand, is by a son of Northern Dancer and it isn't hard to envision this very late foal also developing into a formidable four-year-old.
