PAGA PAYS OFF IN MONROVIA

Looking to pick up her first U.S. graded win in the last graded stakes of the year, **Paga (Arg)** (Montreal Marty) was sent off the 2-1 favorite in yesterday's GIII Monrovia H. at Santa Anita and lived up to her odds, closing like a rocket to win by 1 1/4 lengths. A two-time Group 1 winner in her native Argentina, the bay was purchased privately by R.D. Hubbard and Edward C. Allred after beating the boys in a Group 1 event at San Isidro last December. Given nearly eight months to get used to her new surroundings, the South American filly made her North American debut in the Aug. 8 Osunitas H. at Del Mar and posted a front-running victory. She had started just once since, vying for the lead before weakening to be third in the GIII Violet H. at the Meadowlands Sept. 28. Using different tactics this time, Paga was allowed to settle off fractions of :21.81 and :44.33, but finished full of run for the victory. "We thought it would be good for her to get a lesson in taking back and finishing, and it worked out well," trainer Dick Mandella said. The filly will be pointed for the GII Buena Vista H. Feb. 18.

To inbreed, or not to inbreed: that is the question which breeders will be mulling over in the run-up to the coming breeding season.

Once again, the 2001 season showed that close inbreeding can pay major dividends. Skimming, who is inbred 2x3 to Northern Dancer, added more than \$1.3 million to his bankroll; Sylvester Lady, a filly inbred 3x3 to Nureyev, won the German Oaks; and Anabaa Blue, who is inbred 2x4 to Riverman, triumphed in the French Derby. Then there was the exceptional success enjoyed by the progeny of Danehill, a stallion inbred 3x3 to Natalma.

The past year also provided many success stories where the inbreeding was a little less intense, such as the Preakness and Belmont victories of Point Given, a colt inbred 4x4 to Raise A Native, and the repeat Breeders' Cup Classic win by Tiznow, who is inbred 4x4 to Northern Dancer.

However, the Northern Dancer phenomenon has become so all-pervasive that I have recently found myself having to contemplate matings which produce not just two or three lines to this great stallion, but FOUR. Fearing that you can have too much of a good thing, I have been casting around for alternatives, but this is sometimes easier said than done.

Last year, there were 252 individual Group race winners in Europe, of which only 45 possessed pedigrees with no inbreeding in the first five generations. Fewer than 10 of these 45 had pedigrees free of either Northern Dancer or Mr. Prospector, so their rarity makes them potentially very valuable as future stallions or broodmares.

One of these rare specimens is Cozzene's very good son Mizzen Mast--a product, along with the inbred Skimming, of Juddmonte Farms.

Mizzen Mast's form in France established that he's a highly capable performer when conditions are in his favor. After taking the G3 Prix de Guiche by an impressive six lengths, he again tried to lead throughout when a good second to Chichicastenango in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris. Unfortunately, the yielding turf was very much against him when he made his American debut in the GI Secretariat S., and he fared little better with conditions in his favor in the GII Del Mar Derby. He bounced back in great style, though, taking the Bien Bien S. on a firm turf track by 3 1/2 lengths from Momentum, who went on to win the GIII Native Diver H. on dirt.

The plan, of course, was for Mizzen Mast to tackle the GI Hollywood Derby, but heavy rain forced his withdrawal and a major change to his program. With the Malibu S. representing the only remaining Grade I opportunity over a suitable distance in 2001, Mizzen Mast was allowed to take his chance on dirt for the first time. His performance was a revelation. Despite stumbling at the start, he recovered to win easily, in a style which suggests that he has a very bright future on dirt.

Although Mizzen Mast has run well over 1 1/4 miles, the possibility exists that he is going to prove best at up to 1 1/8 miles, the distance of his Prix de Guiche success. His American wins were gained at a mile and then seven furlongs.

It is probably no coincidence that his sire, Cozzene, gained his four Graded successes from a mile to 1 1/8 miles, even though he managed to finish a good third in the GI Man o'War S. over 1 3/8 miles. It's worth remembering, too, that Cozzene won three times on the main track and very nearly won a stakes race on dirt, even though he later became known as a turf specialist.

Although Mizzen Mast has a pedigree free of such widespread influences as Northern Dancer, Raise A Native, Bold Ruler and Hail To Reason, that's not to say that his pedigree is in any way unfashionable.

His sire has proved just as effective at stud as he was on the track, siring performers of the calibre of Alphabet Soup, Tikkanen and Star of Cozzene, and his dam, the Graustark mare Kinema, has the distinction of being a daughter of the celebrated broodmare Mrs. Peterkin.

When Kinema came on the market as a yearling in 1984, she cost Juddmonte no less than \$2,200,000. Mrs. Peterkin had already been represented by three stakes winners, including the California Oaks winner Whydidju (like Kinema, sired by one of Ribot's best sons) and the Kentucky Oaks winner Sweet Alliance. Sweet Alliance had also hit the headlines, producing a Northern Dancer colt--Shareef Dancer--which sold for \$3,300,000 as a yearling before going on to win the Irish Derby. Thanks to Mizzen Mast, Kinema now ranks as the fifth daughter of Mrs. Peterkin to have produced a graded-stakes winner, so this remains a very good family indeed.

Mizzen Mast is by no means the first high-class representative of Cozzene to have Ribot in his pedigree. The Breeders' Cup Classic winner Alphabet Soup and the Group 1 winner Environment Friend both have dams sired by sons of Ribot, while the Breeders' Cup Turf winner Tikkanen and the Grade III winner Hasten To Add have second dams by sons of Ribot.

Mizzen Mast therefore represents a very potent combination of bloodlines, and a few more top-level performances will ensure that, once he retires to stud, he will receive strong support from the legions of breeders anxious to find an outcross for their mares.

XTRA HEAT MAKES 2002 DEBUT Top sprinter **Xtra Heat** (Dixieland Heat), who won nine of 13 starts and just shy of \$1 million last year, will make her 2002 debut in today's \$75,000 Interborough H. at Aqueduct. The four-year-old filly, who numbered the GI Prioress H. and GI Stonerside Beaumont S. among her victories at three, ended her 2001 campaign against the best sprinters in the world and acquitted herself admirably, finishing second by a half length in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint and third, beaten 3 3/4 lengths, in the GI Frank J. DeFrancis Memorial Dash. "It's been fun," trainer John Salzman said. "She has taken us on some ride." As for how he expects his stable star to kick off the new year, Salzman said, "I've been very happy with her. She's the type of filly that's always doing well, always ready to run." Xtra Heat, carrying top weight of 125 pounds, gives from 11 to 14 pounds to her seven rivals in the six-furlong Interborough.

FOREST CAMP TO AIRDRIE STUD Forest Camp (Deputy Minister--La Paz, by Hold Your Peace), a Grade II winner of \$339,984, has been retired and will stand the 2002 breeding season at Mr. & Mrs. Brereton Jones' Airdrie Stud near Midway, Kentucky. The four-year-old, a \$675,000 Keeneland July yearling who captured the GII Del Mar Futurity as a juvenile and the Pirate's Bounty H. at three, ended his racing career with a fifth-place finish in the GIII Vernon O. Underwood H. at Hollywood Park Dec. 2. Overall, the dark bay posted four wins and two seconds from his 11 starts. He will stand for a stud fee of \$10,000. Brereton Jones, who purchased the colt privately, told *Thoroughbred Times*, "I think he'll be well-received. He was a brilliant two-year-old and people do look for that." He added, "He's a high-quality horse and we've got him at the right price. When people see him, they'll realize they have to breed to him."

BLANK END TO 2001 Severe frost cancelled out all scheduled meetings yesterday, including Wolverhampton's all-weather card. Following a 10 a.m. inspection, the meeting was abandoned due to frozen lumps in a troublesome part of the course. Clerk of the course Fergus Cameron told *PA Sport*: "There's about 60 yards of track, that's all, that is affected. The sun has been out for two hours, but it is still -3 Celsius in that section. Elsewhere it's about +2 Celsius, but we got down to -9.5 Celsius last night." Chief attraction was due to be the record-equaling and record-making attempt by **Madame Jones (Ire)** (Lycius {USA}) in the betdirect.co.uk H. David Evans' six-year-old mare was on target for a record 12th handicap win in a calendar year, and a record-equaling number of wins by a filly or mare in a season. Cameron, also clerk of the course at Southwell, was optimistic as he looked forward to the survival of the all-weather meeting today. "At this stage we are raceable and we would expect to be racing tomorrow afternoon. Minus five is being indicated for tonight and we have everything set up to work the track tonight. We are doing everything we can to ensure that racing takes place. I'm afraid most of our staff are going to be working tonight," he said. Meanwhile, Ian Renton, racing director of Arena Leisure, owners of Wolverhampton, Southwell and Lingfield, challenged the description "all-weather". "It's not all-weather really. We've tried to call it winter-flat racing, but unfortunately it was called all-weather racing when it first started and the name sticks. In exceptional conditions--and we had nine and a half degrees of frost last night--even fibresand and other surfaces can't cope. We can cope with an awful lot of conditions and we have just installed a new track down at Lingfield which we hope will be able to cope with conditions down to about -12 Celsius which would probably be as good as almost anything. But even in those circumstances, we have had problems before when the track is raceable. The police say the roads are unsafe for traveling so we have to abandon for other reasons." All of yesterday's national hunt meetings were abandoned, while today's action at Cheltenham, Exeter, Catterick, Leicester and Plumpton will also not take place. Tomorrow's meetings at Ayr and Folkestone are also under threat from the frost, which also hit Ireland yesterday, claiming the only fixture at Gowran Park, and today's card at Fairyhouse.

NEW YEAR BLANK FOR ITALY

There will be no racing in Italy for the first time on New Years Day today due to the change to euros, with racing set to resume in the country tomorrow. The new betting unit in Italy will be one euro, and the minimum bet will be two euros with the tote and three with the bookmakers. Therefore the betting combinations for the trio and tris bet will be doubled, as the minimum betting unit has so far been L1,000, slightly over 0.5 euros.

The youngster's dam, Australian Group 1 winner **Joie Denise (Aus)** (Danehill {USA}), was one of a small group of Arrowfield mares sent to Japan to be covered by the 1989 GI Kentucky Derby winner on Southern Hemisphere time. The resulting foal, Sunday Joy, sold by Arrowfield Stud acting as agent for breeders John Messara and John Singleton, was sold to Singleton for \$510,000 at last year's Magic Millions yearling sale. The 16-year-old stallion has stood his entire career in Japan at the Yoshida's Shadai Stallion Station and has sired nine champions and 65 stakes winners from eight crops to race.
