FAIRY KING PRAWN UNDERGOES SURGERY

Two-time Hong Kong Horse of the Year **Fairy King Prawn (Aus)** (Danehill), withdrawn from the 2001 Hong Kong International Mile Dec. 16 after injuring his right front suspensory ligament and inside splint bone, is recovering from surgery in Hong Kong, it was reported yesterday. Dr. Robert Lewis operated on the seven-year-old yesterday at the Hong Kong Jockey Club's Equine Hospital; according to HKJC sources, the procedure involved removing a fractured portion of the splint bone and injecting the strained suspensory ligament. Fairy King Prawn was reported to have made an uneventful recovery, but he will be closely monitored over the next few months. Ivan Allan's colorbearer, a multiple Group 1 winner with 12 victories from his 26 career starts, will need to pass an official veterinary examination before he can return to the racetrack.

CORK & ORRERY AWARDED GROUP 1 STATUS

Royal Ascot will stage an extra Group 1 race this year as the Cork and Orrery S. has been upgraded to celebrate the Queen's Golden Jubilee. Renamed the Golden Jubilee S., the six-furlong contest will be run on the extra day, Saturday, June 22, and boasts more than double prize money at £250,000, bringing the total over Royal Ascot's five days to more than £3 million for the first time. There will be two additional Listed events; Saturday's card will open with the £40,000 Henry Carnarvon S., honouring the Queen's late racing manager. "We have always had Group 1 races between a mile and two-and-a-half miles at the Royal Meeting, so being able to stage a championship sprint as well is a tremendous boost and completes the portfolio," said Nick Cheyne, clerk of the course. "Some of the six additional races at this year's meeting take the roots of the existing Saturday card, such as the Sandringham [registered as the Fern Hill] and the Hampton Court [registered as the New S.], and have been enhanced in terms of status and value. However, two races are Listed for the first time and the seven-furlong Buckingham Palace S. is completely new." Ticket sales for the Royal meeting have already exceeded £1 million in just three days.

ANOTHER STAKES SCORE FOR BATIQUE

Batique (Storm Cat), who ended her 2001 campaign with a victory in the Gill My Charmer H. on the grass at Calder, opened 2002 in the same fashion, taking the Gill Honey Fox H. at Gulstream Park by 2 3/4 lengths yesterday afternoon. The six-year-old is now batting .500 since switching to the grass in her final start of 2000, with four wins from eight turf starts. She also set a course record in the Gill Vinery Matchmaker S. at Monmouth Park in June, leading every step and getting the nine furlongs in 1:46 flat. Racing with blinkers off in the My Charmer, the mare showed a new dimension, coming from off the pace to get up for a half-length score. The 13-10 favorite facing seven rivals in the Honey Fox, the dark bay settled in fifth as they dawdled through a half in :51 3/5, launched a three-wide bid as they raced around the far turn, took the lead at the eighth pole and drew clear.

Wooden Phone enjoyed a strong beginning to 2001, hitting the board in four of five graded stakes, including a win in the GII Strub and a runner-up finish in the GI Santa Anita H. He has raced just once since a fourth-place effort in the Apr. 28 GIII Texas Mile, taking a Nov. 14 optional claimer at Hollywood by a half length, but he recorded three straight bullet works over the Santa Anita track in December. After winning the May 28 GIII All American H. at Bay Meadows and the July 7 GIII Prairie Meadows Cornhusker H., **Euchre** went to the sidelines. He returned with a solid runner-up finish in the Dec. 9 GIII Native Diver H. last time out.

Irisheyesareflying, second in the All American, will be seeking his third straight victory. The six-year-old won the Aug. 19 GIII Longacres Mile at Emerald Downs and the Nov. 3 California Cup Classic H.

Mr. Livingston, a perfect two-for-two over this course, took the Sept. 3 Miami Mile Breeders' Cup H. over this distance before a dull ninth-place finish in the Oct. 7 GII Keeneland Turf Mile. After a two-month freshening, the five-year-old grey tired to fourth in the Dec. 8 GIII Tropical Turf H. at Calder. "I don't think it was the condition of the track that bothered him," trainer Bill Kaplan said. "He was forced outside on both turns and didn't get the best of trips." The consistent **Tijyr** has been on the board in 14 of 17 career starts, including a win in the GII Explosive Bid in March and a third-place effort in the GI Manhattan H. in June. He finished an uncharacteristic 10th in the Tropical Turf H. **Galic Boy**, along with stablemate **Broadway Snowman**, will try to give owner Arthur Appleton victory in the race named after him. Galic Boy is coming off a 1 1/4-length victory in the Nov. 3 GIII R. F. Carey Memorial H., run at this distance over the Hawthorne turf course.

Note: The American Graded Stakes Committee has reinstated the Tropical Park Derby as a Grade III race. The Jan. 1 race had been automatically downgraded after it was switched to the dirt. The winner, **Political Attack** (Hawk Attack) will be credited with a Grade III victory.

CLAIBORNE TO SELL AT JUVENILE SALES

Claiborne Farm in Paris, Kentucky, which recently announced it gradually will be downsizing its racing stable this year, also will be represented at the leading two-year-old sales in 2002. Juveniles scheduled to go through the sales ring will be prepared at the Holly Hill Training Center by longtime Claiborne trainer Jane Dunn, and will be sold through Kip Elser's Kirkwood Stables. But, because Claiborne President Seth Hancock is against breezing two-year-olds too early in the year, the farm's juveniles will not be asked to work before Mar. 15. Horses consigned to sales prior to that date will gallop and "two-minute lick" during under-tack shows. The first Claiborne consignment will be offered at the Fasig-Tipton Calder Sale Feb. 26.

AAEP RELEASES SUMMIT REPORT

The American Association of Equine Practitioners yesterday released the official report of the racing industry's first-ever medication summit. Fifteen representatives of national Thoroughbred, Standardbred and Quarter Horse organizations attended the Dec. 4 Summit, which was held in Tucson, Arizona. The key points of agreement reached included: "uniformity in policies across state lines and in all jurisdictions; the creation of a national advisory body to address the development of medication policies and practices, as well as the creation of a national reference laboratory or laboratories to address testing issues; and the establishment of a broad-based funding mechanism to support the recommendations in the Summit report." Jim Gallagher, executive director of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association's Racing Integrity and Drug Testing Task Force, said, "We want to help bring about a positive, lasting change that will benefit all industry participants and supporters. This document represents the earnest contributions of a group far broader and more diverse than that which has ever tackled the issue of drug testing reform. NYRA HANDLE RISES IN 2001 The New York Racing Association, which runs Aqueduct, Belmont Park and Saratoga, showed gains in both daily average on-track handle and total handle during 2001. The NYRA's 257-day season, which included the 18th Breeders' Cup Oct. 27, realized a daily average total handle of \$10,747,635, up 6.3 percent from the previous year. Daily average on-track handle was \$2,055,579, an increase of 4.3 percent. On-track attendance showed only a slight decline, dropping from a daily average of 9,573 two years ago to 9,558 last season. "The reduced takeout and the terrific weather really gave us a boost," NYRA President Terry Meyocks said. "In just the five-plus months, the reduced takeout returned \$17,383,279 nationally."

Philly Park to Host Claiming Crown:

The Claiming Crown is scheduled to be held at Philadelphia Park next year, *The Blood-Horse* reports. The agreement to hold the event at the Mid-Atlantic track has still to be finalized, but Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association President Dan Metzger told *The Blood-Horse*, "The discussions have been ongoing for several months. We're in the final stages of negotiations. It's our intention to hold the Claiming Crown at Philadelphia Park this year." The first three editions of the Claiming Crown were held at Canterbury Park. The Minnesota track, which was involved in the event's development, is scheduled to host six of the first 10 Crowns. This year's running will be held in August or September, with a final date yet to be announced.

SCHEDULE SET FOR SUNLINE

Connections of star Australasian mare **Sunline (NZ)** (Desert Sun {GB}) have outlined a four-start final campaign for the six-year-old in which she may face arch-rival **Northerly (Aus)** (Serheed {USA}) first up in the G1 C. F. Orr S. at Caulfield. Sunline, who has earnings of more than A\$8.8 million with nine Group 1 wins to date, is likely to race in Melbourne--the scene of her two Cox Plate triumphs--for the last time in the 1400-meter Orr Feb. 16. "We'd love her to race in Melbourne this autumn as the crowd there really loves her, as they do in Sydney. It would be great to have a farewell in both cities," co-trainer Steve McKee told Melbourne's *Age* newspaper. "At this stage, she could run first-up in New Zealand on Feb. 9 or in the Orr Stakes a week later in Melbourne. We have to walk a pretty tight line with her, so a lot depends on how quickly she comes up and what we can have her ready for. We will know more in a couple of weeks' time, but she will finish off in Sydney with a race like the Coolmore [G1 Classic, A\$500,000, Mar. 9] on her agenda." McKee said Sunline had been back in work in New Zealand for only a few weeks, but "She's come back well and already shown that she's keen to be doing it again." At her most recent run, Sunline narrowly failed to land her third consecutive Cox Plate when beaten by Northerly in the race. It was thought the Cox Plate would be the last showdown of Australia's two best gallopers, but now it appears likely that Northerly and Sunline will have one more clash in the Orr Stakes before they head in opposite directions, with trainer Fred Kersley considering an international tilt for Northerly. The pair have met only twice, with Northerly gaining narrow victories in both the Feehan S. and Cox Plate last spring. Northerly is also back in work and yesterday his trainer Fred Kersley said the five-year-old would be back at Flemington this March to defend his Australian Cup title. But plans are still to be finalised for his international debut this autumn. Kersley and his wife Judith fly to Dubai in two weeks to look over facilities for the World Cup in late March, but the trainer yesterday hinted Northerly might yet have his first run on the international stage a little closer to home. Kersley and Northerly's part-owners are also weighing up whether to aim the horse for the S\$3 million Singapore International Cup on May 11 instead of Dubai.
