KEENELAND JANUARY KICKS OFF 2002

Tom Van Meter, co-owner of Eaton Sales, is an eternal optimist. Catch him on the street and ask him how things are going, you are likely to get a "thumbs up" and a big smile. See him at the racetrack, you will most likely get an enthusiastic pat on the back, a sturdy shake of the hand and an invitation to join him in the winner's circle. "You can always hope for the best," he said with a laugh when contacted at the Keeneland sales barns Friday. Van Meter and the rest of the Thoroughbred world will be hoping for the best today when the first major Thoroughbred auction of 2002, the Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale, starts in Lexington. It will be the first chance to put a frustrating 2001 behind and begin a new sales year. "I didn't do too well with my predictions last year, especially with the November Sale, but I am hopeful about the January Sale," said Van Meter. "It's really a pretty decent catalog of horses. The gross, I'm sure, will be down because the number of horses is down, but my hope is that the average will be steady, or even up a little. With fewer horses to choose from, maybe that will help the average. Plus, the sale in December in Europe was strong. I think that our decline last year was based more on the quality of the stock in the sales than the economy or other things. We just didn't have the same quality of horses being offered. We were all out there trying to solve the problems with the caterpillars and worrying about what that would do to the market. In the end, it caused a lot of people to scratch their horses from the sales and that had an impact--a big impact. I think this year will be better, I really do." (KEEJAN cont., p2)

A BEAUTIFUL FIND

Bella Bella Bella (Soft Gold {Brz}) started her career carrying the silks of her breeder, Southern Nevada Racing Stables Inc., but she changed hands after breaking her maiden in her Oct. 25 debut at Santa Anita. The private purchase has proven to be a shrewd one for Team Valor. The three-year-old Cal-bred came back under new management to take the restricted Golden Ballet S. Dec. 8 and she made it three-for-three with a gallant neck victory over **Tamarack Bay** (Dehere) in the GIII Santa Ysabel S. at Santa Anita yesterday afternoon. "Once again, [Team Valor President Barry Irwin] has picked out a good horse," trainer Jenine Sahadi said. "He's got a great eye for a horse and I'm just lucky to be able to have her in my barn." Sent off the 2-5 favorite in the Santa Ysabel, the dark bay tracked **No Turbulence** (Skywalker) through an easy half in :47 2/5 and still had not been asked for run when Tamarack Bay came through along the rail to take the lead on the far turn. But the filly pulled out all the stops down the lane, battling past Tamarack Bay to take the photo. "It was a nice win for her and I think, more importantly, she learned a lot," Sahadi said. The filly will be pointed for the GI Las Virgenes S. Feb. 10.

Keeneland Looking for the Rebound...

Keeneland is hoping that the sales rebound with a flurry, too. The 2002 January catalogue offers 646 broodmares, 138 broodmare prospects, 104 racing or broodmare prospects, 419 yearlings, 84 horses of various other ages and one stallion share. "From year to year, there's a greater variation in quality in January than in any other Keeneland sale...so it's difficult to assess," said Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "You don't know what effect--positive or negative--the general economy will have this year." Despite last year's problems associated with the Mare Reproductive Loss Syndrome, a tragedy of world events and a slumping economy, there are reasons to be excited about the horses being offered in 2002's first major American auction. There are broodmares in-foal to some of the world's top stallions including the great Storm Cat, Coronado's Quest, Deputy Minister, Gone West, Kingmambo, Saint Ballado, Seeking the Gold, Thunder Gulch, Unbridled and Unbridled's Song. In addition, there are a number of mares who are carrying foals of many popular first-year stallions including Anees, Behrens, Dixie Union, Giant's Causeway, Golden Missile, High Yield, Lemon Drop Kid, Stephen Got Even and War Chant.

Ones to Watch...

One broodmares sure to catch a lot of attention is **Sparkling Delite** (Vice Regent), the dam of multi-millionaire Captain Steve, who won the Dubai World Cup a year ago. The 17-year-old mare is back in foal to Fly So Free; carrying a full sibling to Captain Steve, she sells Tuesday. The sale will also highlight several other Grade I stakes winners, including **Rings a Chime** (Metfield), who is in-foal to the popular young stallion Saint Ballado, and Breeders' Cup Sprint winner **Desert Stormer** (Storm Cat), who is carrying a foal by Kris S. Another broodmare worth watching is Our Dani (Homebuilder), the dam of 2001 Grade I winner You. The nine-year-old won only \$11,998 at the track, but is off to a fast start as a broodmare; her first foal, the now three-year-old filly You, won the GI Frizette S. and the GI Adirondack S. last season. There is one dispersal in the sale--Walnut Green will sell 17 horses for Christiana Stables, whose owner Mrs. Jane du Pont Lunger died last year. The four-day 2002 Keeneland January Sale will continue through Thursday, Jan. 10, with bidding beginning at 10 a.m. daily.

A New Twist has proven consistent in her short career. The chestnut broke her maiden impressively at Belmont last July before placing in a Belmont allowance Oct. 25. Last time out, she finished second behind Forest Heiress in the Gill Valley Storm S. Nov. 18. Sent off the second choice to turn the tables this time, she assumed the early lead and repelled all challenges from her accomplished foe before cruising to victory. "I wasn't surprised that she beat Forest Heiress this time around," trainer John Kimmel said. "She kind of ducked and was intimidated by her in the stretch in their race in New York." He added, "I think she's a special kind of filly. She's a lot like her mother [Twist Afleet], and her mother was the fastest filly that I ever was around."

MOMENTS OF JOY (m, 5, Lost Code--Valiant Sweetheart {SW}, by Danzig), a 1/2 to Special Moments (Home At Last), MSW, \$303,715, won back-to-back starts over the Gulfstream dirt last winter, but had been off the board in seven of eight outings since. Seventh in a Churchill allowance last time out Nov. 13, she was ignored at 21-1 in this off-the-turf affair despite her stellar record at the oval. Nice Boots Baby destroyed Laurel maidens by 10 lengths after sprinting wire-to-wire in her debut Oct. 25 and used the same tactics to score a handy win in an allowance at this course and distance Dec. 6. The odds-on favorite in her stakes debut, she was asked to settle off the pace early, but the change in strategy did not affect the outcome as she eased clear late despite refusing to change leads until the last stride. "I was surprised we didn't out-break Al Max Diner, but once we were behind, I didn't want to rush my filly," said jockey Mario Pino. "I though she was real impressive. For her to completely switch running styles like that says a lot." According to owner/trainer Tony Dutrow, the filly will likely head to the six-furlong Dearly Precious S. Feb. 16 before stretching out later in the year.

"That was a bad move."

Owned by Lord Howard de Walden's Plantation Stud, the five-year-old has not been seen since a fifth-place finish behind stablemate Sandmason (GB) (Grand Lodge {USA}) in the G2 Hardwicke S. at Ascot June 22 in a year which saw Cecil win just 47 times. However, Leslie Harrison, manager of Plantation Stud, told *Racing Post* that the trainer's lack of success in 2001 had no bearing on the decision to move the horse. "We think that in France he will get the ground he so obviously needs, which he will not get here," Harrison said. "Epsom and Ascot stumped him up--he was badly jarred up after Ascot, having had a hard race at Epsom, and it was a bit too much for him." Harrison added that a return trip to Britain is possible "when the ground is right," he told *Racing Post*.

GODOLPHIN OUTLINE CHALLENGE TEAM Sakhee (USA) (Bahri {USA}) heads Godolphin's team aiming at the Maktoum Challenge Series. Sakhee, the winner of the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp and runner-up in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Belmont Park in October, will prep in one of the races in the series, widely recognized as the traditional build-up to the G1 Dubai World Cup at Nad al Sheba Mar. 23. ALLAN DECRIES HKJC VETERINARY DEPARTMENT

Trainer Ivan Allan lashed out yesterday at the veterinary department of the Hong Kong Jockey Club for what he deemed an "unhelpful" attitude surrounding the recent operation on his superstar **Fairy King Prawn (Aus)** (Danehill {USA}). Allan brought in Dr. Robert Lewis from the U.S. to perform the surgery, the third time he has turned to Lewis to operate on one of his horses, but added that there have been problems in the past getting official permission from the HKJC for the doctor to work in Hong Kong. Despite a smoother process this time, the conditioner wishes the HKJC would do more to improve domestic veterinary care. "Hong Kong racing must have the best sports medicine and be a centre for veterinary excellence if it is to be a centre for racing excellence," Allan told the *South China Morning Post*. "There are vets who specialise in this kind of operation and the Jockey Club should do more to employ those specialists on a permanent basis, or at least have a register available for owners and trainers to use," he added. HKJC Director of Racing Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges was quick to defend the veterinary care afforded to their horses. "The general standard is very good and trainers generally are very happy with the service we provide," he told the *South China Morning Post*. "The Club is very willing to help bring in specialists for certain cases and we are ready to do all we can to help trainers and owners."

THE OTHER 'KING PRAWN' EYEING DERBY

Jeune King Prawn (Aus) (Danehill {USA}) ran his record to six wins from seven starts with a 3/4-length victory in the Sports Club Golden Jubilee Divided H. in Saturday's finale over 1400 meters at Sha Tin. The four-year-old, owned by Philip Lau Sak-hong of Fairy King Prawn fame, was making his first start since last June and was drawn wide, but showed excellent speed and held off **My Honour (USA)** (Zilzal {USA}) for the win. Trainer P F Yiu told the *South Morning China Post* that the immediate goal for the colt is the Derby Trial, but that the G1 Hong Kong Derby over 2000 meters Mar. 17 remains the ultimate target. "Up to a mile we know he has no problem, but we will find out whether he can run 2000 meters in the Derby Trial," the trainer said.
