SMART START FOR MAGIC MILLIONS

Magic Millions major shareholder, high profile retailer Gerry Harvey, plans to call the Danehill (USA)--Jezabeel (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) filly he secured during yesterday's first session of the glitzy Queensland sale for A\$475,000 "Last Laugh." The filly's owner John Singleton, who owns 25 percent of Magic Millions, joked that his good friend Harvey had not owned a decent racehorse for some time and perhaps the bay filly would improve his luck on the racetrack. "He hasn't had a good horse since the 1950s," Singleton said, adding he had hoped the filly offered by Coolmore Stud would have fetched up to A\$700,000. It was initially announced she had been passed in, but Singleton stepped forward and declared she was for sale without reserve and it was later announced she had been sold to Harvey. The bay filly is the first produce for her dam, winner in 1998 of the G1 Auckland Cup in New Zealand and G1 Melbourne Cup in Australia, each over 3200 meters. She was also named champion older mare at 10 1/4 furlongs and up and champion stayer in New Zealand in 1998. Singleton, a particularly active buyer at recent editions of the Magic Millions sale, declared he would not purchase this year, saying he had two yearlings in the paddock at his Strawberry Hill Stud north of Sydney and would focus on them. "For different reasons they were not suitable for sale and I'll keep them and race them," he said of the pair by Sunday Silence and Danehill. Trainer Rick Hore-Lacy will prepare an Octagonal (NZ)--Lucky Lucaya (Chief's Crown) colt purchased for A\$400,000 by Emirates Park from the consignment of Bahram Stud. That same price was matched when prominent agent Mark Pilkington signed the ticket for a Danehill filly from Golden Slipper placegetter Loving Cup (Aus) (Bluebird). The pass-in rate hovered around 25 percent, which is especially high for a sale that usually boasts a clearance rate of around 90 percent, but which may reflect a catalogue growing rapidly in size; nevertheless, the sale hit the ground running with 28 of 98 yearlings sold fetching more than A\$100,000. Red Ransom's first crop representatives were well received, with Queensland-based John Foote Bloodstock giving A\$320,000 for a colt from top producer Kew Gardens (Fr) (Kenmare {Fr}). POINT GIVEN, TIZNOW TOP ECLIPSE FINALISTS

Defending champion **Tiznow** (Cee's Tizzy) will square off with dual classic winner **Point Given** (Thunder Gulch) and globetrotting juvenile **Johannesburg** (Hennessy) in the quest for the Eclipse Award as Horse of the Year. The Eclipse Award winners will be announced Feb. 18 at the 31st annual dinner, which will be held in Miami Beach, Florida. Last year's three-year-old champion and Horse of the Year, Tiznow is joined by **Lido Palace (Chi)** (Rich Man's Gold) and **Sakhee (Bahri)** in the race for champion older male of 2001. Point Given, whose only loss in 2001 came in the GI Kentucky Derby, secured top three-year-old honors by unanimous vote. The big chestnut was retired with a tendon injury shortly after winning the GI Travers S. in August and is about to embark on his stud career at Three Chimneys Farm. Unbeaten Johannesburg, winner of Group 1 events in England, Ireland and France, successfully handled the switch to dirt with an impressive victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. His fellow finalists are **Officer** (Bertrando), whose five-race streak was snapped in the Breeders' Cup; and **Siphonic** (Siphon {Brz}), who rebounded from his Juvenile third to take the GI Hollywood Futurity. A pair of distaffers are finalists in two categories: **Xtra Heat** (Dixieland Heat) in both the three-year-old filly and sprint categories, while **Tranquility Lake** (Rahy) is under consideration for both champion older female and top turf female.

KEENELAND CONCLUDES

A newly turned yearling colt by Benny the Dip--Magic Paintbrush (Pirate's Bounty) brought a bid of \$55,000 from Bohanon-Walden LLC to top the fourth and final session of Keeneland's January Horses of All Ages Sale. Offered by Viking Stud as agent, the colt is from the family of Dixie Union and Timber Country. In all, 189 head sold yesterday for \$1,845,900 for an average of \$9,767 and a median of \$6,500. Top sprinter Desert Stormer (Storm Cat), a graded-stakes producer in foal to Kris S., topped the sale at \$3.6 million. Over the course of the four-day auction, 936 horses changed hands for a total of \$34,688,000. The cumulative average was \$37,060 and the median was \$12,750. *Keeneland Statistics, p2*

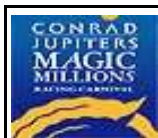

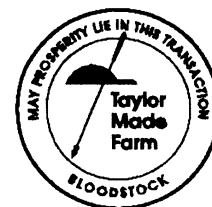

HUGE INCREASES FOR FRENCH PRIZES France Galop yesterday announced several significant boosts to prize money for their stakes races run in 2002. Proposed changes to Group races and increases in their purses were agreed to by the European Pattern Committee during the latter's annual meeting Jan. 4. Of the most significant of those is the new minimum purse for Group 1 races of €150,000. This will lead to an overall increase of 12.6 percent in total prize money for the 26 such races run in 2002. Of the Group 2 races, the 27 run in France will be increased by 10.7 percent, while the total prize money for the 54 Group 3 events is up by three percent. Overall prize money for the 119 Listed races is being raised by 3.3 percent. In other changes, France Galop announced that the G2 Prix Eugene Adam will be moved to Maisons-Laffitte July 14. It will also be renamed as the Prix Eugene Adam Grand Prix de Maisons-Laffitte. That course's G3 Prix de Seine-et-Oise, usually run in September, will be switched with the G3 Prix du Petit Couvert, usually run in October at Longchamp. The latter, now to be run Sept. 12 as a trial for the Abbaye, will be closed to two-year-olds from 2002. Chantilly racecourse will be closed for refurbishment from the day after the G1 Prix de Diane Hermes (French Oaks), resulting in the transfer of the G3 Prix Daphnis July 28 and G3 Prix d'Arenberg Sept. 12 to Maisons-Laffitte and G3 Prix d'Aumale Sept. 12 to Longchamp. The G3 Prix Andre Baboin Oct. 18 will also be transferred from Toulouse to Lyon-Parilly in 2002.

BIENAMADO RETIRED Top turf runner **Bienamado** (Bien Bien--Nakterjal {GB}, by Vitiges {Fr}), who sustained a suspensory injury last week, has been retired. Winner of the G3 Prix de Conde as a two-year-old, Bienamado blossomed as a four-year-old in the United States, capturing the GI Hollywood Turf Cup and GI Sunset H. The blaze-faced chestnut returned to the races in 2001 to add a course-record setting victory in the GI San Juan Capistrano H., then defeated MGISWs Senure and Timboroa in the GI Charles Whittingham H. June 10, covering the 10 furlongs in 1:59 1/5. Bienamado went 16-8-3-0 in his career, retiring with \$1,261,486 in earnings. "We're looking for a place to stand him," co-owner John Toffan told *Daily Racing Form*. "I want to breed him to a few mares."

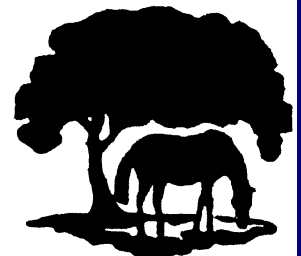
Charles Allen Dies at 76:

LEIGH HORSES TO LEAVE BRITAIN? Successful Thoroughbred owner/breeder Gerald Leigh has threatened to move his horses from England if the Thoroughbred Breeders' Association loses its seat on the British Horseracing Board, as is widely expected. Leigh's announcement came shortly after an equally surprising statement from TBA Chairman Nigel Elwes at Tuesday's Annual General Meeting at the Churchill Hotel in London, during which he vowed to resign his position should the TBA lose its spot on the BHB board. Leigh, who has campaigned such stars as Barathea, Coretta and G1 1000 Guineas hopeful Gossamer, currently has eight horses with trainer Luca Cumani in England and nine other horses split between Florida and France. He told TBA members that he was "shocked" by the potential of being excluded by the BHB, but expressed hope that the situation would be resolved. "It's not a credible argument," he said, referring to the body's exclusion, "and it's disgraceful it should even be contemplated. Breeders should be part of the organization because of their involvement in the industry."

SAVILL STAYS ON

Peter Savill will stand as chairman of the British Horseracing Board (BHB) until June 2004, it was revealed yesterday. A BHB statement confirmed its full support for Savill for another two years in his position to handle "the transfer of Levy Board funding responsibilities and the introduction of commercial data licensing to replace the statutory levy." Savill commented: "In order for the racing industry to flourish in the post-Levy era, it is vital that we build an executive team which can develop the strategy for the future and generate the income streams that will flow from the licensing of our rights. Personally, I am delighted to extend my chairmanship for a further two years to oversee this development as well as ensure that the right financial structure is put in place." Meanwhile, Keith Brown, chairman of the Racecourse Association (RCA), appealed to the bookmakers to adopt a sensible approach yesterday in his annual New Year's message to Britain's 59 racecourses. While championing the positive approach to the foot-and-mouth crisis and media rights deal in 2001, he believed that this year would offer greater concerns: "Uncertainty will dominate the early months of 2002 because of the Levy, the commercial negotiations and the Office of Fair Trading inquiry (into the BHB's commercial policy). Uncertainty is not good for any business--it prevents planning, it delays investment, it impacts on customers and has major financial implications. I sincerely hope that in 2002 wise heads in the betting industry will start influencing the process before it causes serious damage to racing.
