### UNFUWAIN DEAD

**Unfuwain** (Northern Dancer--Height Of Fashion {Fr}, by Bustino {GB}), sire of champions Alhaarth (Ire) and Petrushka (Ire), died Wednesday of what was termed "a serious neurological condition which developed suddenly at the end of last week," according to a press release issued by Shadwell Stud yesterday. A full autopsy was ordered to determine the exact cause of death. The 17-year-old stallion had suffered a series of malignant growths in the past, most recently in November, but had been given a clean bill of health and was scheduled to cover a full book of mares in Britain this year at Shadwell's Nunnery Stud in Norfolk. A multiple group winner who captured six of 10 career starts, Unfuwain went to stud in 1989, standing at the Nunnery alongside his half brother, the English 2000 Guineas and Epsom Derby winner Nashwan. From nine crops to race, Unfuwain sired 27 stakes winners and six Group 1 winners. His top runners have included G1SW Alhaarth, who was named champion two-year-old colt in Britain and highweight miler in Ireland at four and is himself enjoying a successful stud career in Ireland; and the brilliant Petrushka, who reeled off victories in the G1 Irish Oaks, G1 Yorkshire Oaks and G1 Prix de l'Opera and earned honors as champion three-year-old filly in England and Ireland. The bay also sired star fillies such as 2000 G1 Sagitta 1000 Guineas winner Lahan (GB), 1999 G1 Nassau S. winner Zahrat Dubai (GB), 1994 G1 Irish Oaks heroine Bolas (GB) and Lailani (GB), who won the G1 Irish Oaks, G1 Nassau S. and G1 Flower Bowl Invitational H. last season and is one of three finalists for the Eclipse Award as champion turf mare. "Unfuwain was a most wonderful horse to deal with," Shadwell Stud Director Richard Lancaster said. "He was much underrated throughout his stud career, but in the last few years he produced a number of performers who will ensure his memory lives on for many years. He had immense courage and will be remembered with great affection by all who had any dealings with him." Ron Lott, who was Unfuwain's Stallion Man throughout his stud career, added, "What a thrill any Stallion Man would have had looking after him through all his troubles--no problem, pal. He started slowly, but what an impact he has now had at stud...it was really 12 years of pure pleasure..."

### MONARCHOS RETURNS SATURDAY

Kentucky Derby winner **Monarchos** (Maria's Mon) will make his first start since finishing third in the Belmont S. on Saturday at Gulfstream Park. The four-year-old colt will face four rivals in the day's sixth race, a \$40,000 allowance-optional claiming event at a mile and a sixteenth. Monarchos, sidelined since June with a hairline fracture, is a perfect three-for-three over the Gulfstream oval, including an impressive victory in the G1 Florida Derby last spring. He is expected to start next in the Feb. 9 G1 Donn H. To date, the John Ward trainee has won four of nine starts and has earned \$1,715,630.

### OAKS WINNER BIREME DEAD Bireme (GB)

(Grundy {Ire}), who won three of her four career starts, including the 1980 G1 Epsom Oaks, was euthanized last Thursday at age 25, the *Racing Post* reports. The British-bred gave her owner/breeder Dick Hollingsworth, who passed away last year, his only Classic success, but had to be retired after that race due to injury. "Bireme was a very, very good filly who never reached her full potential," her trainer, Dick Hern, told *Racing Post*. "She got slight tendon trouble in the Oaks and was on the 'easy' list and she got loose on the Downs. The lad fell off, got winded and couldn't get up in time to catch her--because she stood looking at him. She then took off with her tail in the air and went for home as hard as she could leg it, right across the West Ilsley-East Ilsley road before she crashed in the lane. She cut and bruised herself so badly that she never ran again. It was quite a shame because she had bags of potential and nobody knows quite how good she could have gone on to be." While at stud, the mare produced 12 foals, including Yawl (GB), winner of the G3 Rockfel S.

### NEW RECORDS FOR IRISH RACING

Brian Kavanagh, chief executive of Horse Racing Ireland, has expressed himself delighted with the final figures for betting, attendance and prizemoney for Irish racing in 2001, *Irish Thoroughbred Marketing* report. Despite a drop in attendance by 4.3 percent, attributed to the effects of the seven-week shutdown in the spring and enforced rescheduling of the popular Fairyhouse and Punchestown Festivals due to the foot-and-mouth crisis, betting with the Tote and on-course bookmakers reached new heights. Prizemoney also increased by 37 percent on the previous year's total. Kavanagh, describing the figures as "very satisfactory," is also looking towards a bright future. "Horse Racing Ireland will be working closely with the racecourses to increase the attendances in 2002 and to broaden the appeal of racing," he said. "With the establishment of Horse Racing Ireland in December, we have a structure and funding plan which will enable us to put strategies in place to ensure the continued development of the Irish racing and bloodstock sectors. We have already announced an increase of 8.6 percent in prizemoney for the current year."

**PEDERSEN, MANGURIAN MERIT ECLIPSE** The National Thoroughbred Racing Association has announced that California senior steward Pete Pedersen and leading owner/breeder Harry T. Mangurian Jr. are co-recipients of the Eclipse Award of Merit. The award honors an individual's lifetime achievements in Thoroughbred racing. Pedersen, a California steward since 1955, has also written for *Daily Racing Form*, the *Los Angeles Times*, the *San Francisco Chronicle* and *Thoroughbred Times*. "I'm delighted for all officials," Pedersen acknowledged. "I feel this is recognition for all of them. So I accept this for all of those who work every day to protect all the various personalities and factors involved in presenting a horse race to the public." A native of Rochester, NY, Mangurian developed Mockingbird Farm in Ocala, Florida into a cradle of leading sires: during the past five years, Mockingbird freshman sires ('97, Diablo; '98, End Sweep; '99, Rizzi; '00, Storm Creek; '01, Valid Expectations) have led the nation in either money or races won. Mangurian has led all breeders in North America from 1999 through 2001 in earnings and races won. "I'm thrilled and honored to receive this award," Mangurian said. He recently sold Mockingbird Farm to Eugene Melnyk.

**Golden Gate Fined:**

The California Horse Racing Board has fined Golden Gate Fields \$10,000 in the death of the filly Silicon Sally last January, according to *Thoroughbred Times*. Silicon Sally suffered a shattered and dislocated knee during the running of a maiden special weight race on Jan. 11, 2001, but a series of mishaps and mechanical failures prevented the fatally injured filly from being euthanized for 30 minutes. The filly's owner Bent Creek Racing and trainer Jeff Bonde filed a lawsuit against Golden Gate, which is owned by Magna Entertainment Corp., in November. The California track has since implemented new procedures for the horse ambulances.

**Breeders' Cup Foal Nominations Drop:**

A total of 15,020 foals were nominated to the Breeders' Cup program last year, a decrease of 4.84 percent from 2000. It was the first decline in nominated foals since 1992. Of the 36,100 foals registered to The Jockey Club in 2001, 38.7 percent were nominated to the Breeders' Cup program. In 2000, 40.2 percent of The Jockey Club's 36,700 registered foals were nominated to the Breeders' Cup. "Considering the declines in the Kentucky foal crop due to MRLS, our nomination numbers overall remain very strong," said D.G. Van Clief, Jr., president of the Breeders' Cup Ltd. "This year's foal nomination figures are indicative of the breeding industry's support for the Breeders' Cup and NTRA programs and a keen awareness of their importance to the continued growth of the sport." Nominators paid a one-time fee of \$500 per foal by Oct. 15, 2001 to make their foals eligible to the Breeders' Cup for their entire racing careers.
